New police and fire community hub for Oundle #Futures

The historic Fletton House building, which was built as an infirmary in 1900 but is now owned by Oundle Town Council, has recently undergone a major refurbishment programme and now provides a home for a wide range of community groups as well as the police and fire officers.

inside the building was officially opened by Assistant Chief Constable Rachel Swann and the former High Sherriff of Northamptonshire, Anne Burnett.

ACC Swann said: "This new facility gives the people of Oundle wonderful access to the police and fire services in a building which is also home to a number of other facilities and agencies, such

as Oundle Town Council and East Northamptonshire Council.

"It will bring officers right into the heart of the community.

"I am particularly pleased about that as we had to

close the front counter at Oundle Police Station in April. This new facility will mean that, despite this, we'll still be able to meet with the public and listen to their concerns and problems."

As well as the public sector organisations, Fletton House also has meeting rooms, a dance studio, an arts and crafts room, a nursery, a youth club and a cafe.

The former High Sherriff of Northamptonshire, Anne Burnett, who lives close to Oundle, welcomed the police's move into the building.

She said: "This will certainly allay people's concerns that there would be no police presence in Oundle following the closure of the front desk in April.



"By having an office in Fletton House, the police will be able to engage well with the community. It's a positive move for Oundle."

The creation of the police and fire hub inside Fletton House came as a result of work under the Futures Programme, an intensive study to find out how policing should work in Northamptonshire in the future.

Fletton House is also opposite the existing Oundle police station, which will remain an operational base for officers in the town.

Genealogy jottings

Do you remember last time that I mentioned websites such as Ancestry and Find My Past? A word of caution: the indexes for these websites have been transcribed and the original could be open to misinterpretation. Therefore, a badly written name on the original might be transcribed as a 'best guess' by the transcriber. Even if you are making notes from originals in a Record Office, it is possible to become unstuck. Years ago, I was in the Suffolk RO in Ipswich, happily noting down masses of baptisms, marriages and burials from the Theberton Parish Registers. Then it dawned on me: there were far too many names for there to be just one family – the gaps between

births were unrealistic, for instance. Going back over the originals, I realised that the handwriting of the Parish Clerk back in the 1700s was not as clear as I first thought. I was researching the surname 'Bailey'. However, there was also a family by the name of 'Barley' and the records showed a very rushed letter 'r' so that it looked just like an 'i' but without the dot over it. Back to the beginning I went...

So, bearing this in mind, if you are looking for an ancestor online, but cannot find them, it is always worth using 'wildcards'. This is

where you insert a * in place of a letter, or series of letters. Even on a first name, things might not be as you thought. An ancestor named Louise might be recorded as Louisa, and so not appear when you search for her under Louise. Using this as an example, you could then try Louis*.

Over time, you learn these tricks but the key is to think laterally and not have the blinkers on. People read things differently and, if you take a peek at the 'Ask the Experts' section of my forum you will see that quite often a second opinion is sought.

One plea while on the subject of letters: please use a computer if at all possible – while we don't refuse to publish handwritten letters, they have to be transcribed into a form which the publishers can deal with and that takes

time.

Turning to a more mundane issue, have you started the Christmas shopping yet? Only five weeks to go now but I'm sure the well organised among you will have got the job underway, if not finished! For most, the angst of last year's last-minute rush doubtless caused an early New Year's resolution to do better this time; however, hanging onto that thought is difficult when it seems there are so many other things to be done. We shall be taking some of the Christmas and New Year load off ourselves this year because we won't be publishing a Nene Valley News on 2nd January 2016 and the last edition of 2015 will be 19th December.



Councillors debate health, sport and wellbeing in East Northamptonshire

Healthy and active lifestyles were the key subjects at a recent Issues Debate at East Northamptonshire Council. The meeting was a great opportunity for members of the council to debate the future of health, sport and wellbeing in the district.

Opening the debate, Cllr Steven North, Leader of the Council, outlined the projects and strategies that will drive East

Northamptonshire to be a healthier and more active place to live.

With the upcoming procurement of a new leisure management contract, councillors talked at length about the partnerships that will be built to ensure East Northamptonshire leads the way with active recreation.

Keen to emphasise that the debate was not just about sport, Cllr North added: "This is not just

about sport and leisure; it is more about supporting active lifestyles. This is an opportunity to support our residents up and down the district in the long and short term, either through outreach work, grants or different facilities.

"The Leisure and Procurement Working Party will now meet to discuss the key points from this Issues Debate and set the scene for the future."

Ensure a safe and peaceful festive season this year

Present wrapping, Christmas lists and ordering a turkey are the priorities for many families as the festive season approaches. But Christmas is no time to forget crime and fire prevention messages. To help people ensure they have a happy, peaceful and safe celebration, the Prevention and Community Protection Department for Northamptonshire Police and Fire has released some seasonal safety messages.

Festive fire safety

Ensure you have a working smoke alarm installed on all levels of your home. Test your smoke alarms weekly.

Never leave cooking unattended and do not cook under the influence of alcohol. Always turn off kitchen appliances when you have finished cooking.

Never leave candles unattended, and remember to keep decorations, cards and wrapping paper away from candles, fires, lights and heaters.

Make sure fairy lights are switched off before you go to bed or leave the house. Also, do not use old and

worn sets of fairy lights. Check that they confirm to the British Standard (BS EN 60598).

Don't overload sockets; ensure there is only one plug per socket. Always turn off plugs when they are not in use, except those that are designed to be left on, like freezers.

Make sure you and any visitors know the agreed escape plan for your home, in case of fire.

Shop safely

When Christmas shopping, be aware of how much you are carrying with you. iPods, digital cameras, mobile phones and extra cash to buy presents mean you could be a target for thieves.

When out and about at Christmas, don't leave your bag unattended. Keep your purse safe in an internal pocket and don't carry your pin number with you.

Seasonal socialising

Don't leave your drink unattended. It takes a matter of seconds for someone to tamper with your drink.

Carry a personal safety alarm and make sure you

plan your journey home. If you use a taxi, ensure it is registered. If you have to walk home, walk with a friend and stick to well-lit, busy streets. Make sure someone knows the route you are taking.

Prevent burglaries

Keep presents out of plain view of windows. They will draw attention to your house and its contents.

Be cautious when using social media such as Facebook – you could be advertising that your home is empty if you post holiday pictures or a countdown to a holiday.

Invest in a timer to open and close curtains or turn on lights. Alternatively, ask a trusted family member or neighbour to pop in and do this if you are away.

Dispose of boxes and rubbish discreetly, as discarded boxes can alert people to the fact that there are new and valuable items in the house.

Finally, please remember to check on older relatives and neighbours this Christmas, to ensure their safety at this time of year.

Oundle pupils experience old traditions and new trends during special school trip to China

Over the October Exeat, a group of Oundle School pupils who are studying Mandarin visited China, providing them with the opportunity to observe and experience both the traditional culture and the modern life of China – from dragons, lanterns and chopsticks to the many bright signs and shining lights, skyscrapers, shimmering smartphones and an everlasting rush hour!

The pupils spent the first five days of the trip in a primary school in Meishan,

teaching English to pupils from Grade 1 to Grade 5.

Head of Chinese, Hua Yan commented: "The most interesting finding, according to all the Oundle participants, was that all the Chinese pupils were especially attentive and had an unbelievable memory to retain the English they were taught compared to Oundle pupils own when it came to retaining Chinese words."

During the first week, pupils stayed with host families. Apart from offering their host buddies private English tuition in the evenings, they also

attended workshops which included traditional Chinese calligraphy and paper cutting. In addition, the pupils had a few afternoons off to explore the city and its culture with their host families.

What impressed the pupils most during their homestay was the generosity and kindness of their host families. After an emotional farewell with the host families, they headed for the skyscrapers and bright lights of Chengdu, the capital city of Sichuan Province, for the last four days of the trip which

consisted of travelling and sightseeing.

The first day there was spent visiting gardens and the Temple for Zhuge Liang, a strategist of Three Kingdoms, and the Cottage of Du Fu, a Tang Dynasty poet. Pupils found themselves in breathtaking forest type gardens where they walked through brooks and bamboos whilst taking in the scent of flowers, and hearing Chinese music in the distance. The evening ended with souvenir shopping at a traditional street market, and watching Sichuan Opera where the

performers changed their face in a blink.

The second day was spent enjoying private tours of two Chinese companies, exploring China's business world and technology.

The last full day in Chengdu began with visiting a giant panda breeding base, and ended with shopping at the world's biggest shopping mall, which also had two 5 star hotels and its own beach!

Pupil, George Garber (15) commented: "I can confidently say that with every day that passed all

the speaking around us started to become clear and towards the end of the week, I could understand longer and longer chunks of a sentence. The trip turned out to be so much more than just about learning the Chinese language though. It made me realise how diverse the world is. How amazing it is to see that a few time zones away and ten hours on a plane could lead you to a completely different world. The way of life, the culture and the social understanding are simply so different from ours."





Seek free guidance on pension freedoms six months on

October marked six months of freedom and choice for pensions and Central and East Northants Citizens Advice is encouraging eligible people in Northamptonshire and Bedfordshire to seek free guidance with Pension Wise, to make sure they understand their options.

The new pension freedoms, introduced in April, mean people over 55 who have a defined contribution pension now have the option to take their pension savings as an annuity, cash lump sum or flexibly over time.

Alongside these changes the government launched Pension Wise – a free, impartial service to help people approaching retirement understand their options, so they can make informed decisions about their pension pot.

Local face-to-face Pension Wise appointments are available in Northampton, Wellingborough, Towcester, Daventry,

Bedford, Kettering and Corby. Since the service's launch six months ago, it has been helping people understand the range of options now available.

Martin Lord, Chief Executive at Central and East Northants Citizens Advice, said: "Pension Wise helps people make sense of their pension options. In the last six months, we have had a range of different questions about the new freedoms: from cashing in 25% of a pension pot tax-free to how a decision might affect any benefits someone already receives.

"Pensions can be confusing. Pension Wise offers people an opportunity to seek guidance to understand their options before they make any final decisions. We encourage people to visit us to book a free guidance session."

Squids in for a 20-minute feast – Quick stuffed squid

We're coming to a really busy time of year when everyday cooking can become a chore; you just want to be able to put food on the table quickly and you don't want it to cost too much either. With even more stress and coughs and colds around than usual, it's important to eat good food too, so stir fries, omelettes or meat and roasted veg are all easy choices. But if you get bored with having the same old things, you can still try new things without spending more time or money.

Squid is the same price or cheaper than chicken and beef cuts, is quick and easy to prepare and cook, can go in the freezer until you need it and certainly makes a change! Soft cooking chorizo adds a spicy earthiness to any dish, so tuck some away in the fridge for when you need it. Black pudding is a cheap way to add nutritional value to this meal, but if you don't like it just use more chorizo or add some bacon.

Quick stuffed squid – serves 2
1 onion – diced

2 cloves garlic – peeled and diced
Butter for frying
5cm to 10cm piece of spicy chorizo*
Optional: 50g to 100g black pudding*
Handful of boiled new potatoes*
*Chop these items to a similar size – you're going to stuff them in the squid, so make them small enough to fit
Chilli – fresh or dried flakes
100g or more of prepared kale
2 large or 4 smaller squid with tentacles
Squeeze of lemon

Soften the onion in butter, then add the garlic, chorizo, black pudding, new potatoes and chilli to the pan and fry until the potatoes are coloured and the chorizo browning. Make sure you take the tentacles

out of the squid, and then spoon some of the chorizo and potato mixture into each squid. Push the rest of the mixture to one side of the pan, add some more butter and fry the squid and tentacles briefly on all sides to add some colour. Then remove the squid from the pan, put in an ovenproof dish and put them in a medium oven whilst you finish. Add the kale to the remaining mixture in the pan, turn the heat down and put a lid on to wilt the kale – this will take about 5 minutes. Check the seasoning – add more chilli if you like. Dish the kale mixture onto warm plates and place the squid on top. Finish with a good squeeze of lemon.

If this recipe is a cephalopod too far for you, just put a fried egg or two on top the kale mixture instead.

New state-of-the-art offices, with private areas for more sensitive appointments such as registering a death, are now being built in Central Library.

Relocating to the library means that the Registration Service will be able to offer appointments on Saturdays for the first time.

The move follows the recent successful relocation of Corby, Oundle and Towcester Register Offices to their respective libraries, where customers registering births are now introduced to library staff who explain the benefits of joining their baby to the

library and the children's services on offer there.

County Council Cabinet Member for Public Health and Wellbeing Cllr Robin Brown said: "Libraries in Northamptonshire are increasingly becoming a hub for a wide range of community services.

"Moving registration offices in Northampton from the Guildhall to Central Library will make it easier for people to access those services and customers will benefit from the extended opening hours at our libraries.

"By bringing the services together, parents who want

to register a birth, for example, can then find out about library membership and children's centre services – all in one place.

"If the model continues to be a success, we will look to relocate the remaining three offices in Kettering, Wellingborough and Daventry in due course."

Central Library will be the statutory register office for the county and the venue for marriage and civil partnership registrations. It will also display the notices for all upcoming marriages and civil partnerships in the county for the statutory period.

All registrations are by appointment only, which can be booked by visiting www.northamptonshire.gov.uk/appointments. Customers can register their events at any office in the county.

Networking is good for you

As hopefully you know, word of mouth is the most powerful form of referral for your business. Therefore networking with like-minded business owners is one of the best ways to promote your business and should certainly be part of your marketing efforts.

However, there are a few things to consider to get the most out of networking.

Firstly, it is not a short term win – networking requires an investment of your time in order for it to be successful for you. People that you meet need to get to know you, like you and trust you before they are confident enough to do business with you directly or refer you to one of their connections. Don't expect to visit a couple of networking events and get results; ideally, depending on how often a group meets, you should be looking for at least a 3-6 month commitment before you can expect results. Of course this depends on the nature of your business and how easy or hard it is for people to understand it and provide

you with an appropriate lead.

Secondly, as networking is about developing relationships and building rapport, don't go to a meeting in "sales mode". The majority will not have come to buy anything and you stand a high chance of turning people off and having the opposite effect that you desire if you are trying to push your product or service onto unsuspecting attendees.

Do, however, educate people about your business, share knowledge, help people and present yourself as the expert in your field, so that people are drawn towards you; recognising your skills, talents and services, building up your credibility in the process and increasing your chances of a successful business lead.

Remember the old

adage that you have two ears and one mouth – you should use them in that proportion; listening and learning about other businesses and how you might benefit from a relationship with that particular person.

Be prepared when you go networking: have business cards and marketing material, know your elevator pitch (your introduction) – this should focus on the benefits of doing business with you as you are trying to

establish your credibility, have a plan of who you ideally want to meet at a given meeting and if possible, go along with some referrals for other attendees. The best way of encouraging people to refer your business is to lead by example and refer

others.

Also don't commit the cardinal sin of not following up on leads that you are given – this is a sure way to turn people off giving you any future referrals if they know you didn't bother getting in touch.

Desborough continued the higher intensity of their play in the early stages of the second half, pressing the home side at every opportunity. Play became disjointed and error strewn though as neither side built up any momentum. Charlie Butt did have one great run into the area surging past his man and firing his cross through the six-yard box to be picked up by Scott Joseph beyond the far post but he could only fire over from 12 yards.

Tommy Berwick became Diamonds' first substitution and he made an immediate impact as he grabbed the vital second for Diamonds just two minutes later. Charlie Butt's long throw from the right was flicked on to Berwick on the far post for him to swivel and fire low and hard past Jones in the Desborough goal.

Diamonds appeared to be seeing the game out comfortably with Andy Hall coming close with a side footed lob that keeper Jones just held, but there was a final sting in the tail from the visitors. Dodci Agbenu picked up the ball 25 yards from goal and fired in a

speculative effort that found its way into the net off the left hand post.

Diamonds seemed to have to win this game three times, having dominated the opening stages only to be pegged back, taking a late lead only to be pegged back again, and then winning a penalty shoot-out when they faced a cup exit.

It was their first win in three attempts in the NFA Hiller Cup and they now progress to the semi-finals
