# Wellingborough cadets make flying visit to aerobatics team

A group of cadets from Wellingborough's 378 (Mannock) Squadron were recently invited to the home of the legendary air show display team The Blades, for a tour of the aircraft and to find out more about what it takes to be an aerobatic stunt pilot.

The cadets travelled to Sywell aerodrome in Northamptonshire where they were treated to a behind-the-scenes tour of the team's hangar and shown around the four Extra EA-300s display aircraft made famous by their air show

performances.

Being RAF Air Cadets, the young visitors were keen to learn that The Blades team is made up of former RAF Red Arrow pilots with more than 30,000 flying hours combined, making them some of the most experienced

display pilots in the country.

For budding future pilot, Cadet Alexis Spillane, 13, this was a great opportunity to discover more about a career in aviation. After the tour she said: "Last month I had my first ever flight with the Air Cadets which I loved, and now I can see what opportunities may be out there if I stick with wanting to be a pilot one day."

Mark Cutmore, The Blades Team Leader, said: "As the only aerobatic display team in Northamptonshire, the cadets' visit presented a fantastic opportunity for the team

to give something back to the local community by inspiring and educating a younger generation. I was really impressed to learn that the cadets knew so much about aerodynamics, and I'm sure many of the cadets will have exciting careers in the aviation industry in years to come."

378 (Mannock) Squadron is currently recruiting for new cadets. Young people can join from age 12 (school year 8) up until they are 17 years of age. Activities open to the cadets at Wellingborough include flying, sports, target shooting, adventure training and leadership.

During the Squadron's training nights, every Monday and Wednesday, the cadets are given the building blocks to learn practical skills and to earn real qualifications. Awards, such as BTECs in Aviation Studies or Public Services, are available to cadets which are the equivalent of up to four GCSEs at grade A-C.

# Oundle Council Elections update

We have received the following statement from East Northants Council about the forthcoming election of Councillors in Oundle:

"As you will be aware, this council received a valid request for elections to be held in respect of the nine current vacancies at Oundle Town Council. Nominations for candidates were sought

with a view to combining the election with the Police and Crime Commissioner election. However, at the close of the nomination period only one valid nomination form was received by this council and that nominated person, Duncan Butler, was duly elected to the town council.

"The remaining eight vacancies cannot be filled by co-option, as an election was

requested, so the call for nominations process will have to be repeated. If next time more valid nominations are received than vacancies, a new polling date will be

required. This has not been set yet but will be in July. Once the date is set, the call for nominations deadline will be published in accordance with the relevant legislation."

## Genealogy jottings

On my wall I have a sampler made by my great-grandmother. She has embroidered her name and the date so that it reads, 'Ann Mascall, 1866, aged 10'. A good clue to when she was born! However, whilst she would have been taught sewing skills by her mother, it made me wonder what hobbies and pastimes, if any, our ancestors enjoyed. Whilst reading the newspapers of the day, I have seen advertisements for dancing lessons, articles about fishing – as a sport, rather than as a means of finding food – horse racing, as well as clubs and societies to which people belonged.

Things were very different a couple of hundred years ago. There was very little spare time to be had until towards the end of the 19th century. The 1871 Bank Holiday Act gave workers a few days' holiday each year as well as most people having each Sunday off and day trips to the newly built piers at the seaside became fashionable. Sport – both playing and watching – started to become popular. If a house was lucky enough to have a piano, the family would

stand around it and sing. Board games also started to become more widespread; the game of Ludo was introduced from India in about 1880. Photography, invented by Henry Fox Talbot in 1835, also started to become prevalent, especially with the well-to-do families. However, you may well find photographs of your ancestors, not just standing or sitting in a studio but also with items that depicted the interests of which they were fond. I wonder if anyone who is following their ancestors in Raunds has any photographs of an ancestor who was in the cricket team? Their inaugural match took place in the summer of 1862 against Ringstead, which Raunds won – with 33 runs to spare!

Time to have a rootle amongst those photographs that you have to see if there are any clues!

## Editor's notes

As I'm sure you know, 23rd April is St George's Day. In the typically understated way of the English, at least when compared with the other home nations, we seem to make less of our patron Saint and it's certainly the case that we can't claim George as our own without noting that he is shared with many other Christian nations, cities, professions and organisations.

As with many other myths and legends, the truth about George is less than clear but the most credible, or should that be the story best suited to our needs, is that he was a soldier in the Roman army some 1800 years ago whose parents were Christians of Greek background. George's father Gerontius was a Roman army

official and it seems to be that connection which determined that George became an officer in the Roman army in the Guard of Diocletian; unfortunately, the Emperor eventually ordered his death when George was about 30 years old because he wouldn't divert from his Christian faith.

Saint George's exploits with the dragon are rooted in a legend brought back with the Crusaders. In the fully developed Western version of events, a dragon or crocodile makes its nest at the spring providing water for the city of 'Silene' (perhaps modern Cyrene in Libya). Consequently, the citizens have to move the creature to collect water; they do this by offering at first a sheep and, if no sheep can be found, then

a maiden as a substitute. The victim is chosen by drawing lots and one day this happens to be the princess; she is offered to the dragon but then Saint George appears on his travels. He protects himself with the sign of the Cross, faces and slays the dragon and rescues the princess. The locals, of course, abandon their ancestral paganism and convert to Christianity.

Colourful stories which established George as a popular Saint and protector and resulted in official elevation of his feastday in 1415. When the Reformation severely curtailed the number of Saints' days in the calendar, St George's Day was among the holidays that continued to be observed.

## Council takes litterer to court

**A litterer was fined nearly £500 this month after he was caught dropping rubbish in East Northamptonshire.**

A resident witnessed and caught on video Northamptonshire's Jason Hornby dropping litter from a fast food takeaway near the Needle & Awl pub (between Higham Ferrers and Rushden) on 3 October 2015.

East Northamptonshire Council (ENC) issued Mr Hornby with a £75 fixed penalty notice for littering, but he did not pay and so the matter was put before the Northampton Magistrate on 5th April 2016.

Mr Hornby was found

guilty of littering and was ordered to pay a total of £495, which includes a £75 fine, £20 victim surcharge and £400 legal costs.

Waste Manager of ENC, Charlotte Tompkins, said: "The roads and streets of the county are strewn with rubbish and it costs residents hundreds of thousands of pounds to remove it. No one wants to see our countryside in this state and this council operates a zero tolerance policy for anyone found to be littering in the district.

"We're very grateful to our witness for coming forward with a report and evidence of Mr Hornby littering. This case is a great example of how we can all work together to show it's not acceptable to throw rubbish, and make sure the minority are punished."





## AFC Rushden & Diamonds Youth retains FA Charter Standard – What is it? What does it mean?

In order for a football club to attain Charter Standard status, it needs to meet certain criteria laid down by the FA. This includes each and every coach holding valid certificates for Emergency First Aid and Safeguarding Children and full DBS check. Each team within the club must have at least one coach who is FA Level 1 qualified. Each club must also have at least one coach who holds the FA Age Appropriate Introductory Module and also one coach who holds the FA Youth Award Module 1.

Once a club has achieved this status, it has to be reviewed annually and if the criteria are not met, then the Charter Standard status can be removed from the Club. AFC Rushden & Diamonds first achieved Charter Standard status in 2007 and has retained the status each year since.

Obtaining Charter Standard status means that the club has attained a certain standard in terms of its coaching team, and has a defined code of conduct. It also means that the club is entitled to use the FA Three Lions Crest on all marketing and business materials. We are also able to obtain support from the FA with funding applications.

When the Charter Standard status is awarded each year, the club receives £100 worth of Nike match balls and one free Nike team kit. The club can also obtain free tickets for England Youth and Women's Internationals (on application).

Just over two years ago I was asked to take on the daunting role of FA Charter Standard Coordinator, meaning that it became my responsibility to ensure that the club retained its Charter Standard status. This is no mean feat; given that we currently have 22 teams looked after by 24 coaches and other support staff. I need to ensure that all qualifications are current and valid, making sure that coaches are booked onto refresher courses when required. I also work in conjunction with our Welfare Officer to ensure that all DBS checks are completed on time and renewed when they expire.

It can be challenging at times as all the coaches are volunteers and have busy lives outside of football, with work and family commitments but we are all committed to the club and work hard to ensure that we make this club the best we can.

I am really pleased to state that the club has been awarded Charter Standard status again this year and I would like to thank everyone involved with the club for their help and support in making the club what it is.

Without the time, dedication and commitment that everyone puts in, we could not be a Charter Standard club. This doesn't mean that my work is done for another year though! I will be constantly checking when qualifications are due for renewal and chasing coaches to ensure that they are booked onto the relevant courses to keep their qualifications current.

All the best, see you at an under 10s game soon.

# Cook5 winner joins John Vincent in the LEON kitchen

The latest winner of the Cook5 competition, Charlotte Foster, joined LEON co-founder John Vincent for an afternoon of naturally fast cooking at LEON HQ in Borough Market, London.

Ten year old Charlotte Foster from Stanwick, Northants scooped the £2.5k prize after uploading five savoury dishes to the Cook5 website.

Charlotte's winning recipes included Christmas Tree Twists made from puff pastry, passata and herbs, cheesy bacon parcels and a wide-eyed 'Minion' salad, topped with an oversized cucumber and olive eye!

John Vincent and LEON co-founder Henry Dumbleby established Cook5 in 2013 with the aim of getting more children aged 5-15 to learn how to cook at least five savoury dishes before they leave school.

In 2012 they had been asked to conduct a review of school food by the then Secretary of State for Education, Michael Gove. While researching food technology lessons the pair found the majority of lessons were about baking biscuits or muffins, rather than proper dinners. They also discovered research showing fewer than half of families eat together every day and that 60 per cent of 18-to-25 year olds leave home without being able to cook five simple things.

As part of John and Henry's work on the School Food Plan they got cooking back onto the National Curriculum for children up to 14 years old. To get more children back into the kitchen at home they founded the Cook5 competition, which encourages children to upload and share their dishes. They can win cash as well badges and prizes for showing off their

culinary skills.

Cook5 champion Charlotte Foster said: "I love cooking. It's really relaxing and I get to be creative. I cook with my mum, or sometimes with my brother Christopher. I'd really recommend Cook5 to anyone. It's great fun."

Charlotte's mum Sue Foster said: "We have had so much fun with Cook5. The kids have always been keen preservers and bakers but hadn't done much 'main meal' cooking with them until Cook5. It has encouraged them to make healthy meals that taste and look good. They've cooked 20 new dishes in the last year.

"I think anything that encourages kids to get cooking both at school and at home is a good thing. I would encourage all parents to have a go. I have had no training in food but everything we've learned about cooking we have learned together."

LEON co-founder John Vincent said: "Cook5 is all about positivity; we've kept our recipes simple so children, and their parents, who don't usually cook feel they can have a go. Cooking is like alchemy; you can spin gold from really basic materials. We want to get more and more children back into the kitchen and experience that magic for themselves."

Taking part is easy peasy. Children can visit [www.leonrestaurants/cook5](http://www.leonrestaurants/cook5) and start uploading pictures of the savoury dishes they have produced. Every participant who reaches the target of cooking five dishes will receive a Cook5 certificate and a Little Leon e-book. Every month, the person whose recipe receives the most 'votes' from friends and family will win £50. And everyone who cooks five

dishes will be entered into a Grand Annual Prize Draw for £500. An additional prize of £2000 will be awarded to the school that gets the most students cooking five dishes, to invest in teaching cookery.



# Council warns of funding threat to planned education improvements

**Plans to improve the standard of education in East Northants may be under threat according to a recent letter sent to local parents by Northamptonshire County Council.**

Despite NCC's previous assertions that funding was in place for the transition from a three to a two-tier system of education, it now seems that a large proportion of that funding relies on the sale of school assets classified by NCC as 'surplus education land'.

A number of these assets, namely school playing fields

in Oundle, are not only used by schools but also by the wider community, and are not felt to be surplus by many of the local population.

Before playing fields can be sold, permission must first be granted by the Secretary of State for Education and although the restructure and its associated building works was approved by NCC's Cabinet back in November

2014, NCC did not apply for permission to sell the Oundle sites until April 2016.

Furthermore, NCC's funding plan appears to assume that the two playing field sites in Oundle can be sold for their full developmental value – an assumption that appears unfounded, due to neither site being designated as a site for new housing in the

RNOTP development plan. Indeed, a recent planning application submitted by NCC for housing on the Fletton Field in Oundle (a playing field situated just off Glapthorn Road) was unanimously rejected by East Northants District Council.

The letter, sent by County Councillor Heather Smith (Oundle) to parents of school children within the East Northants cluster and dated 15th March, states: 'Regrettably, without the proceeds from the land sales, it may be necessary for us to revise not only some of the planned building work but also the refurbishments and new equipment we had hoped to deliver for the benefit of pupils across East Northamptonshire.'

Cllr Smith's letter has caused much concern among local parents who are left wondering which of the planned improvements will now go ahead and which will be sacrificed.

When asked why the receipts from the sale of the playing fields were included in the budget for the transition before permission to sell them had been applied for and how the funding shortfall might be overcome, Cllr Smith stated: 'We can confirm that there is absolutely no possibility of NCC increasing borrowing. There is a process being followed for land disposals that has to take its course and until we are clear of the outcome we are not prepared to speculate on changes to the originally planned work programme.'

Julie Grove, Chair of the Oundle Recreation and Green Spaces Group which campaigns to retain Oundle's playing fields for use by the local population commented: 'Regardless of any opposition by the local community, the ultimate decision as to whether land is surplus and may be disposed of lies with the Secretary of State

for Education. With that decision still in the balance, funding from the sale of these pieces of land has never been guaranteed.

'If these land sales are so crucial to funding education improvements, why did NCC fail to apply for the relevant permissions and secure their highest value before embarking on a complete overhaul of the education system?

'Why did they commit to a £22m spend that they can't now cover? Why did our County Council gamble with our children's education rather than securing funding first and then committing to the restructure?'

With the uncertainty surrounding the sale of the fields and even if sold, the likelihood that they will not reach development value, it seems that parents in East Northants will be in for a long wait before they know which of the promised improvements will be cancelled.

A wide variety of stalls come along each month, many of which are not found at nearby markets. From sweet and savoury baked pies, biscuits and cakes to cheeses, fresh meat and produce, as well as cider, beer and locally produced

wine, you will find plenty to enjoy and treat yourself to. Every product has been grown, produced and made within a 40-50 mile radius of Thrapston, but

many within only 10 miles.
