The Great British Food Festival comes to Kelmars Hall, Northamptonshire!

This summer the stunning Kelmars Estate in Northamptonshire hosts the Great British Food Festival for the first time. The event, to be held over the weekend of 23rd-24th July promises to be a foodie feast.

The line-up includes over 80 best of British producers and street food vendors, celebrity chef demos, talks, kids cookery lessons, great live music, a 'Cake Off' competition and 'Men v Food' challenges.

The Chef Demo stage hosts a headline name each day, with Miranda Gore Browne taking the lead on Saturday and Luis Troyano (both Great British Bake Off) on Sunday. They will each take centre stage at 12noon and 3pm on their respective days. Alongside the celeb chefs, some of the best regional talent will be showcasing their skills; so from baking tips to fine dining know-how the demo theatre is the place to be for any budding chef.

On top of cooking up treats on the demo stage, Luis and Miranda will be judging the popular Great British Cake Off, where amateur bakers compete head to head in two baking

categories (see www.greatbritishfoodfestival.com for details and to enter) – and best of all, the public get to try every entry!

Luis said: "I love doing the demos and the Cake Off. It's great to try all the cakes the public bring in, always great fun and people love getting involved."

A popular addition to the programme of events has been the in-house Forager, Adele Nozedar, who leads small groups around the estate searching for wild foods. The walks take place daily and can be booked in advance or on the day. Adele usually finds some fabulous and unusual treats from the wild products she has foraged throughout the day. A real eye opener!

There is entertainment for all the family throughout the bank holiday weekend, including kids' cookery lessons, free circus skills, Free kids' crafts as well as some children's rides. There will be fantastic live music throughout the day with a play list packed full of top local bands and artists, so you can do some shopping, grab some food and then have a well

Maybe your ancestors were the ones providing the entertainment! I wonder how they stepped into that world from whatever background that had been born into. Whichever of the performing arts they ventured into, theirs will be a fascinating story. Maybe they travelled from town to town; maybe they sought the bright lights of the big cities. Here is a miscellany of some of the occupations that you might come across:

- Book Boy – Turned the pages of the large book of music for the conductor when indicated. He also kept the library of books in order, handed out the music to the performers and collected them after the

- Fireman – In charge of fire extinguishing apparatus in theatres, music halls, etc; made periodic tests of all water hydrants; had to be in attendance at all public performances and was responsible for keeping exits clear. One of my great uncles had this as his occupation back in the 1901 census!
 - Key Grip – The person in a film crew who was (and still is today) in charge of the camera equipment.
 - Prestidigitator – Magician
 - Sprechstallmeister – Circus Ringmaster
 - Vedettes – Female singers and entertainers skilled in Latin styles of singing and/or dancing and/or acting.
- Please be aware that this is just a small list of occupations that your ancestors from the field of entertainment might have done. You will probably find a lot more!

Editor's notes

So, 'tis done and we are leaving the European Union! Or is it? While the result was close, it was surely sufficiently decisive for us to be able to draw the proverbial line under the event and move on. No matter what your view of the result it is just that – the result – and there seem to be no grounds for further discussion, much less a rerun of the referendum, in whatever shape. We now need our politicians to coalesce and provide the leadership and direction which the situation demands. As suggested in the last Editor's Notes, the British people are able to overcome most problems and find a way forward, so let's get on with it. It's noteworthy that in our district the 'Leave' vote was higher than the national average at 58.8%, doubtless a consequence of the campaign waged by local MPs.

Staying with politics but at the ultra-local level, and with apologies for highlighting Oundle again, the Town Council currently has only six 'elected' Councillors pending elections on 28th July to fill the remaining eight places left vacant after the incredible raft of resignations earlier this year. However, we understand that there are now fewer nominees than was originally the case, so

residents may again be left with Hobson's Choice. No doubt those who volunteer their time to act as Councillors do so with the best of intentions and they must be greatly frustrated because of the difficulties in bringing about improvements. In Oundle matters have been complicated because a number of Council staff have recently quit while the Town Clerk remains on sick leave with little prospect of an early return; moreover, it appears that the current contract for the delivery of services in the Hub has not been renewed. None of this suggests that this is a cohesive outfit.

There was also an obviously high level of discontent among residents at the town meeting a few weeks ago, with attention focused on the huge pay increase for the Town Clerk and the significant uplift in the Precept. Add to the mix ongoing concerns about the County Council's plans to sell off part of the Middle/Junior School's playing field in order to finance the change in the education system and we have a pretty muddle. We have tried to obtain comment from the Council but without success; we would welcome any comments they wish to make.

The demand registration survey is available to complete online via the homepage on the Superfast Northamptonshire website at www.superfastnorthamptonshire.net.

The results of the demand registration survey will help us to understand current levels of demand for superfast broadband services and follows up previous surveys undertaken in 2013. In particular, it will provide useful information to telecoms providers thinking about opportunities in the county, whether commercially or for the next stage of the Superfast Northamptonshire project, which is now coming forward.

We want to hear from you, so please get involved and complete the survey.

Please let your friends, family and colleagues know too and help to spread the word through your networks. We want to hear from as many people as possible by 30th June whilst the survey will stay open until 30th September 2016.

Whilst the survey results will be useful information to telecoms providers, please be mindful that completing the survey does not in itself guarantee proposals will be confirmed in your area either commercially or as part of any plans secured through the next steps for Superfast Northamptonshire Stage 3. This is because other investment and technical considerations also affect the ability to bring forward new broadband networks. However, it could make a difference and the County Council remains focused on its ambition to see countywide coverage of superfast broadband.

The survey should only take a few minutes to complete online.

Children in Need funds come to club for disabled youngsters

BBC Children in Need has awarded £64,981 to fund three years of holiday activities for the Young Inclusive People (YIP) club at the Pemberton Centre in Rushden.

With the help of Su Davies, External Funding Manager at East Northamptonshire Council (ENC), Aspirations Wellbeing, who manage the centre and run the club for young people living with a disability, are delighted to receive funding for project staff, session materials, safety clothing, trips out and activities including sports and arts.

The YIP club meets Tuesday evenings during term time at the Pemberton Centre in Rushden, for young people who are living with a disability. It's the only club of its type

in the county and draws children from across Northamptonshire to come along and enjoy a variety of activities with their carers. The club includes in its diverse membership young people with physical disabilities; young people with mental disabilities, such as autistic spectrum conditions and young people with complex needs.

Jackie Ackroyd, Activities Coordinator for Aspirations Wellbeing explains how helpful the funding is in providing a comprehensive programme of activity suitable for the members' needs: "This funding

will allow us to develop the club offer, including providing activities during the summer holidays. With this money, we can provide a three-year programme providing an even better experience for our members.

"Many families with a disabled child find too many barriers to day trips, but the club can offer the support needed to make these wonderful opportunities happen. We can offer tailored provision for our members to enjoy new experiences and their families to feel secure in them being well looked after.

"As well as trips out, we plan to introduce a community project to the programme, where we work with a local organisation to provide a day of volunteering each year. This will enable the children to integrate better into the local community and break down barriers

on both sides.

"The first purchase will be t-shirts for every member to give a sense of identity and pride in the club as well as help them to be seen in a crowd."

Su Davies, External Funding Manager at ENC, adds: "We're delighted we have been able to identify

this funding opportunity and the grant application has been successful.

"The YIP club provides valuable support and is well regarded by parents and the community. This money will help ensure the club can continue to grow and I'm sure its members will continue to thrive."

Local landmark restored

Introducing four new 'four legged' police recruits

Four new 'four legged' police recruits have arrived who will be working across the four forces of Northamptonshire, Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire.

The East Midlands Operational Support Service (EMOpSS) has recruited four new trainee police puppies called Riggs, Lionel, Olly and Mac.

Riggs and Lionel, who are 18 week old Dutch Herders, will be based with PCs Mark Haywood and Stu Hazard in Nottinghamshire; eleven week old Olly, a German Shepherd, will be based with his handler PC Jon Peacock in Lincolnshire and his brother, Mac, has a Northamptonshire handler – PC Ian McDonald. They will, however, work across all four forces of the EMOpSS collaboration during their working career.

They are all general purpose police dogs who will be trained to work in a variety of conditions including searching for suspects or missing people, locating dropped or hidden objects and chasing suspects and detaining them.

On Monday 27th June they were brought together for a puppy training day in Nottinghamshire where they did some basic tracking exercises in the morning and spent the afternoon at White Post Farm for environmental and 'socialisation' training – getting used to lots of people and other animals.

Inspector Annie Reavley from the

EMOpSS Dog Unit, said: "We are delighted that four new trainee puppies have joined the East Midlands Operational Support Service.

"Working as a four force team we've been able to take the best training practices from each force and use them to train our own puppies. Some forces were training their own puppies, others would only take dogs once they were 12 months old.

"There are pros and cons to both systems but taking these dogs on from such a young age means we know all their strengths and weaknesses from the very beginning which does mean they will receive the best possible training tailored to their individual personalities. Once their training is complete they will work across the East Midlands helping to find missing people, detain violent offenders or recover vital evidence.

"The puppies really wowed the visitors at the farm park and were happy to be stroked by lots of children and adults. They were introduced to all the animals at the farm to get used to the smells and noise. They were curious but not anxious indicating they should become confident dogs who will be able to work in challenging environments."

On 8th June, with many other civic leaders, I was the guest of Colonel Young Yu, USAF, Air Base Group Commander at Alconbury Royal Air Force Station.

Colonel Yu and his staff, American and British, gave us presentations on the work of this command, in particular that of the Joint Analysis Centre at the strategic level and the joint working of the Base Fire and policing

services. As always, our reception was very friendly. Cooperation between the British and American armed services goes back to the Second World War, in particular with the inter-allied and inter-services Allied Forces Headquarters


is very relevant to present challenges, worldwide.

On 9th June, with other Chairmen and Mayors, I was the guest of the High Sheriff of Northamptonshire, Caroline Brocklehurst, at Charlock Farm, near Towcester. Mrs Brocklehurst had been a guest at East Northamptonshire Council's Annual Meeting on 18th May when I was elected to the Chairmanship.

Council supports Food Safety Week 2016

East Northamptonshire Council is supporting Food Safety Week, a campaign led by the Food Standards Agency (FSA), from 4th-10th July.

The campaign aims to increase the understanding of 'best before' and 'use by' dates and reduce food waste by encouraging consumers to eat, cook or freeze food before it goes off.

In the UK seven million tonnes of food and drink is thrown away from homes every year, the majority of which could have been eaten. Wasting this food costs the average household £470 a year!

This year the FSA is focussing on ways to waste less food – safely. Here are three top tips to help reduce food waste:

1 Know the difference between 'use by' and 'best before' dates

'Use by' dates are the most important to consider, as these relate to food safety.

'Best before' dates are about quality, not safety. When the date is passed, it doesn't mean that the food will be harmful, but it might begin to lose its flavour and texture.

2 Don't trust the sniff test!

Food can look and smell fine even after its use by date, but that doesn't mean it's safe to eat. It could still be contaminated. You cannot see, smell or taste the bugs that cause food poisoning.

3 Freeze

The freezer is like a pause button, so you can freeze foods right up to the 'use by' date. Once defrosted, the pause button is off, so it's best to defrost food as required and eat within 24 hours.

Citizens Advice steps in to help struggling tenants

Evictions and disrepair are top of the agenda for award-winning advice charity.

Local charity Central and East Northamptonshire Citizens Advice says demand for advice from tenants is on the rise. With big changes still being made to the benefits system, increasing pressures placed on councils and housing associations, and a legion of 'buy to let' landlords out there, the environment for tenants, or those looking for rented accommodation is tougher than ever, says the charity.

That's why, hot on the heels of the development of its Pension Wise service, (Nene Valley News 04/06/16), Central and East Northamptonshire Citizens Advice is promoting its

specialist housing advice services for residents of East Northamptonshire.

Solicitors Michael Goulden and Olusegun Ajayi (pictured) have

recently been appointed and join an established team of caseworkers led by Lisander Whiby, Head of Casework Services and Projects. The new team, which operates out of Northampton, provides detailed advice and casework services to their clients under the legal aid scheme, which is still available to deal with certain types of issues, despite significant restrictions being imposed in other areas of law. Ms Whiby reports: "It's unfortunately the case

that there is a widespread perception that legal aid has not just been restricted, but has gone altogether, but that's simply not the case. In fact, where we do work for a client under legal aid, it supports an end to end service, including representation at court if necessary."

Recent research from the Citizens Advice service's national body revealed income insecurity was clients' number one concern, with up to 4.5 million adults thought to be in some form of insecure work.

"In this context," reports Ms Whiby, "it's not a surprise to us that those living in rented accommodation continue to struggle and we also recognise that in some cases, the tenant's position might be the result of their landlord's financial difficulties. One way or another our service is here



to help."

The further development of the service comes at the end of a difficult time for the charity in East Northamptonshire, but as Ms Whiby reports, the future is looking decidedly better.

"We've not had a high street presence in the area

for some time, and that's very much down to funding, but with new high profile funders coming on board all the time, we think local people will find our service more accessible before

long, and in the meantime, we're very keen to promote our more specialised services, because we know that people want us to be available to help them with the problems they face."

On 6th July, the church will be filled with the sounds of a music recital by well-known organist James Parsons and Stamford harpist Ellie Turner, featuring pieces by Handel and Bach. Tickets are £10 per person and include light refreshments.

The events will round off with a Fizz and Jazz evening on 7th July from 6pm-9pm featuring Nassington Brass Band. There will be craft stalls and an auction to peruse while you enjoy a summer's evening in one of the village's beautiful private gardens. Felt making workshops with Caroline Kisby and botanical painting classes will take place daily throughout the event. There will also be a silent auction to bid on an original watercolour by Royal Horticultural Society triple medal-winning artist Norma Gregory.

only was it the birthplace of King Richard III, who was recently reinterred after his remains were discovered underneath a car park in Leicester; it is also where Queen Elizabeth I publicly had her cousin, Mary Queen of Scots, beheaded after finding her guilty of plotting to kill her.

Cllr Hobbs, who arranged a grant to purchase the standard, together with the Mayor of Irthlingborough, Cllr Allan Short and the Deputy




