Double honours for Elaine

Elaine Nicholson, who founded a charity that started life in an Oundle residence, has recently been awarded a Queen's Honour, an MBE, for services to Education and Asperger's syndrome awareness.



Action for Asperger's, a unique charity that provides autism-specialist counselling for lives affected by autism and Asperger's syndrome, was born in 2008, and ticked along steadily from Elaine Nicholson's home address until a move to offices in Barnwell in August 2012. At this point the charity registered formally with the Charities Commission, and in its first year grew from 20 clients to 480.

The charity moved to larger, seven-roomed premises on the Corbygate Business Park in April 2015 to cope with year-on-year growth of over 80%. Currently, the charity has over 1,400 clients UK-wide, with around 5% coming to them from overseas via Skype/Facetime counselling. The charity also runs

outreach surgeries in North Yorkshire, North Wales, and Birmingham. School and College counselling is another service the charity provides for children and teenagers affected by autism and Asperger's syndrome.

In addition to receiving good news about the MBE on Friday 10th June, only the day before Elaine received news that she was to be the 551st 'Point of Light'. The Prime Minister David Cameron said, in his personalised letter to Elaine: 'You have dedicated yourself to raising awareness and understanding of how to best support people with Asperger's syndrome and other variations of Autism. It is wonderful that, through Action for Asperger's, you are using your considerable professional skills to support over a thousand people.'

Points of Light refers to a scheme whereby outstanding individuals, who are making a change in their community, are recognised by the Prime Minister.

Elaine said of her MBE award: "I was astonished to hear the news that I was being made an MBE by Her Majesty. It was only after much detective work that I learnt that it was the mother of one of my young male clients – a lad who has been in my care for the past four years – who had contacted Action for Asperger's charity Trustees and begged the question, 'Is anyone doing anything about this?' I understand that this was the catalyst for various heads getting together and the award subsequently being made."

"I am delighted to have been thought of so highly, and happily accept the MBE on behalf of all the clients I have seen, shall continue to see, and am yet to see. Long may Action for Asperger's continue its vital work."

Here at the NVN we feel particularly proud of Elaine and her achievements because she worked with us for almost two years as a member of the newspaper's Editorial Board. Many congratulations Elaine.

Editor's notes

It's difficult to focus on local issues in this edition because the big day is almost upon us! By the time we print our next edition we will know the result of the EU Referendum which is being held, as if you hadn't noticed, on 23rd June.

Right now the result looks to be on the proverbial knife edge, with a telling chunk of voters still undecided. Doubtless, both sides of the debate will be trundling out their big guns in the last few days before the poll in an attempt to gain our support, especially that cadre of the undecided who will be so crucial to the result.

The Bookmakers, who have a significant interest in this matter, currently have 'Remain' as favourites but only just and with the odds shortening on 'Leave'. So, it seems likely that the result will be close; is it possible that it will be too close to provide any real confidence in, or comfort from, the outcome? Not surprisingly, it's very difficult to get odds on a tied result; akin to there being no winner of the Grand National! Heaven forbid that the Electoral Commission should still be overseeing recounts by the time we next go to press.

Whatever the outcome, it seems certain that

there will be problems ahead for the Tories as they try to patch up the internal differences illuminated by the Referendum and get down to managing the Government through the remainder of this Parliament. The great temptation for us is to see the Referendum as a sideshow and the result as immaterial because we know that the British will rise above any problems and make the best of the result; that's fine but why make life more difficult than it needs to be?

One notable feature of the Referendum debate, which persists even at this late stage, is the public's perception of the poor quality of information available upon which to base a decision. Certainly, politicians of every stripe have been guilty of adhering to the adage attributed to Mark Twain, 'Get your facts first then you can distort them as you please.'

Sadly, at this stage it's too late to do much more than complain about this problem and get on with making a decision based on your own experience and understanding. Surely, the worst position of all for the individual voter will be to fail to use your vote and then regret your lack of influence on the outcome.

Genealogy jottings

I do so love reading old advertisements! They can give you such an insight into what was happening back then. One example that I found in the Stamford Mercury of 9th June 1899 reads: Labourer (Farm) wanted – Good all-round Man (married) Wages 15s, good cottage and garden (in centre of small town and close to work) rent free. Refs. Nowadays, they would not get away with stipulations such as advertising just for a man – and married at that! Similarly, just women were expected to undertake domestic duties, as demonstrated in this advertisement of 20th April 1883: Help (Useful) – Young Person, not under 25, wanted. Must be able to cook, a good seamstress, and accustomed to children. Thoroughly domesticated. References and particulars. I love the "Useful" part!

Both of my grandmothers met their husbands through domestic service, miles away from where they originated. One was born on the Essex/Cambridgeshire border and met her husband in Hertfordshire, where she was a domestic servant and he delivered

the clean laundry to the house! I wonder if my grandmothers answered such advertisements – or if they found their positions through word of mouth. Whichever way it was, it just shows that people were prepared to travel for work.

Another reason for reading the old advertisements is to find out what was happening in your town or village at the time – what sort of shops were there? Are any still in existence? Some towns and villages also have guided walks where you can discover the history of where your ancestors once lived. There are Guided Town Walks from Oundle Library. Please contact them on oundlib@firstforwellbeing.co.uk for more information or pop along to the Library and ask. Why not find out about tours that might be taking place in the town or village of your ancestors!

When it is the turn of your teddy, your name will be called and you will then see your teddy having a fun ride on the St James Tower Teddy Zip Wire.

Your teddy will also receive a certificate of bravery.

Rides cost £1 per bear. Registration is from 2.20pm and rides will start at 2.30pm.

All proceeds will go to St James Church. Photos and videos of bears are permitted.

All zip wire staff have been trained to follow the Teddy Zip Wire Health and Safety Rules:

- There is no age restriction on bears.
- All bears must agree to wear a safety harness and name tag.
- All bears must follow the instructions of the zip wire staff.
- Where possible all bears must ride the zip wire individually.
- Tiny baby bears that are too small to wear their own harness will be allowed to ride inside the harness of a trained adult bear. (Trained adult bears will be available for this purpose).
- Sorry but extra tall bears, taller than 60cm, (2ft) will not be allowed to ride at all due to teddy harness safety restrictions.

From the East Northamptonshire Chairman

On 18th May at its Annual Meeting, East Northamptonshire Council (ENC) elected me as Chairman for the coming year in succession to Cllr Marika Hillson. Marika was a well respected Chairman, she will be a challenging act to follow. I live in Oundle, my wife was born in Oundle and we married in Oundle. I have served as an East Northamptonshire councillor since 1999 and, concurrently, for three terms as a county councillor.

One of my duties as Chairman will be to preside at meetings of the full council, call the speakers and rule on points of order – with the advice of the Chief Executive of ENC, David Oliver. I look forward also to the work of representing our district at community events.

The three charities I have nominated for my year are the National Autistic Society, who do excellent work throughout the country and

in East Northamptonshire; the Royal Anglian Regiment Benevolent Charity, a Charity which supports serving soldiers, injured soldiers, veterans and their families in need or distress; and the Gurkha Welfare Trust, who provide similar support to Gurkha soldiers, veterans and their families. Royal Anglian and Gurkha battalions have fought together most recently in very testing conditions in Afghanistan. Each of my

three charities will receive one third of all donations from ticket sales for my functions.

On 25th May I was Anglian Water's guest at the Royal Opening of Diddington Reservoir Resilience Scheme at Grafham by HRH Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh. This Scheme is very important for water resource resilience in the East of England and has associated environmental, economic and social benefits. Many

other civic dignitaries were present. Prince Philip noticed my Chairman's Chain and asked me where East Northamptonshire was. Having been a naval officer he was interested in establishing his bearings! This was a great day for our region as a whole.

On 26th May, accompanied by Cllr Steven North, Leader of ENC, I presented Community Facilities Fund (CFF) awards at Ringstead Village Hall, in support of Ringstead Parish Council's purchase of new chairs, renewal of heating system and redecoration; at Stanwick, towards the costs of the Community Garden and Playground; and at Raunds, for football pitch facilities.

On 1st June, again accompanied by Cllr North, I presented CFF awards at King's Cliffe, towards



the costs of a replacement minibus; in Oundle, towards the clubhouses at the tennis and rowing clubs; and at Brigstock WI Hall, who were supported with costs towards the installation of a toilet. The CFF helps community groups help themselves in providing and enhancing the

environmental, recreation and social facilities that we all value. Look out for ENC's quarterly publication, ENCircle, for photographs of my visits, coming through your doors in July.

Local MP opposes Fineshade development

Local MP Tom Pursglove recently visited Fineshade Wood to see for himself the likely impact of any development in this part of the ancient Rockingham Forest. While he was on the site he spoke with a group from the Friends of Fineshade and confirmed his opposition to the Forestry Commission's proposal to allow Forest Holidays to develop a large holiday complex within the wood.

Fineshade, which is managed by the Forestry Commission, is one of the largest remaining parts of Rockingham Forest and consists of an ancient mixed broadleaf and conifer woodland with way-marked walks, car park and visitor centre. It's estimated that the Wood receives 100,000 visits per year for walking, cycling and watching wildlife but a large part of the wood is threatened by the development of a large holiday camp comprising 70 log cabins. The development was rejected by the local planning authority early in 2015 but Forest Holidays are working on a new application and their ecological surveyors have been working in the wood this spring. However, the

new North Northamptonshire Joint Core Strategy is set to give Fineshade even greater protection, placing the wood inside a newly defined "Area of Tranquility".

Tom Pursglove said: "To my mind, what should happen is the Forestry Commission and Forest Holidays should have another look at this. The local opposition is overwhelming. I'm going to be writing to the Chief Executive of the Forestry Commission to ask for a meeting to talk about this as soon as I leave here later today. I think there are some really serious concerns that are being raised and they need to be heard and they need to be acted upon. In our area

we need more amenity space not less, we need more community facilities not less. We certainly don't need unacceptable and unnecessary development in our woodlands. We need to protect them for generations to come. This is a beautiful spot and it must remain so. I just don't think that Fineshade is a suitable site to be developed in the way that is proposed. I would argue that it's been incorrectly categorized as a site that is suitable for this sort of development and the Forestry Commission need to go back to the drawing board, have another look at this, review the situation and I believe they should walk away from this proposed development."

Fought by the Allies over nearly five months, the Battle of the Somme was one of the major battles of World War One and for many of us has come to define the loss and suffering of the war. By the end of the first day 19,240 soldiers had been killed and

nearly twice that number wounded. It remains the bloodiest day in the history of the British Army.

In Oundle, the U3A's military history groups will be giving a talk about the battle at Oundle Library.

"One of the most tragic aspects of the Battle of the Somme was that many of the men lost weren't professional soldiers but were part of Kitchener's Volunteer Army," says Brian Buckley, leader of

one of the groups involved. "Historians will continue to debate the necessity and effect of the battle, and to question the politics and military tactics. Our talk will look at all these things and we'll tell some personal stories which illustrate the courage and suffering of the soldiers."

The talk begins at 11.30am on Friday 1st July at Oundle Library. Free admission. Everyone welcome.

Summer meadows at National Trust sites in the East Midlands

Did you know that it's National Meadow day on Saturday 2nd July?

Although only in its second year, this national event is helping to raise awareness of the important part meadows play in the UK's natural and cultural heritage. Once there was a natural wildflower meadow in every parish – today only 2% of the meadows that existed in the 1930s remain. When in keeping with the history of the places they care for, the National Trust make great efforts to restore these areas of natural beauty.

Meadows and grassland are great places for whiling away summer days. They are home to a range of wildlife including wildflowers, fungi, birds, beetles, moths, butterflies and small mammals, to name but a few. As well as providing a habitat for creatures great and small, they have environmental benefits too. These include water retention to prevent flooding and carbon storage (capturing carbon dioxide from the atmosphere).

The National Trust has a selection of flower rich meadows and pastures across the East Midlands.

In Derbyshire, Longshaw has a group of hay meadows, at Grouse Inn Fields. Here the National Trust has been working hard

to enhance the diversity of wildlife by following traditional haymaking techniques over the last 20 years. The meadows are at their best in June when visitors can spot marsh orchid, common twayblade, milkwort, moonwort, chimney-sweeper moth and six spot burnet (moth). They can be accessed by parking at Hay Wood car park and walking a short distance on the footpath towards the Grouse Inn.

Calke Abbey has not one, but three established summer meadows surrounding the historic mansion. They are known as the "meadow lawns" but are managed as hay meadows. The array of flowering plants includes meadow saxifrage, twayblade and bee orchids but the distinctive colour of yellow rattle is often what catches the eye first.

In Lincolnshire, take the Monksthorpe Chapel walk from Gunby Estate, Hall and Gardens and the track passes by a fine example of a traditional meadow. The Hunger Hill Meadow is wetter than some but has a spectacular array of wildflowers and butterflies, as well as a less common plant called great burnet.

In Northamptonshire at Lyveden, the three

established wildflower meadows are home to many plant species including oxeye daisy, yellow rattle, lady's bedstraw, black knapweed and some native hardy orchids. The meadows support a variety of creatures too, especially common blue and meadow brown butterflies, brown hares, and skylarks. For ease of access for visitors, lines of an Elizabethan parterre are mown into one of the meadows, and mown paths are added to another.

At Canons Ashby the wildflower paddock attracts a variety of butterflies and insects. The inclusion of plenty of picnic benches makes it the perfect location for a summer afternoon and some bug hunting.

Carl Hawke, National Trust Wildlife and Countryside Adviser said: "Hay meadows were created from cleared shrub or woodland throughout the countryside as a vital source of animal feed in winter. They are "shut-up" for the summer months and allowed to grow before being cut for hay and stored until the winter. Because our aim is to restore and maintain the places in our care with historical accuracy, sometimes we convert land back to meadows or pastures. It's great for visitors to get a true feel of how estates were run but it's also fantastic for wildlife. I'm pleased to say that we've seen a few less common species of plant and insects returning to some of the sites."

Enjoy the perfect summer day by packing a picnic and heading out to appreciate the sights and sounds of a meadow nearby.

Chess Corner



It's a few weeks since I reported on Rushden's sad exit from the John Robinson Knockout Competition, made even sadder by the fact that we drew and were eliminated on the tiebreak rule (again)! The victors were Chess Mates A who went on to face Kettering A in the final. Kettering A made a good start with a win for Graham Arch and draws for David Walker and Jonny Martin. In a break with tradition, the report on the match is compiled by our illustrious Chairman, Nik Puryer, who reports in his own inimitable style.

"In terms of grading, this year's JRKO Finalists were quite fairly matched with Kettering evenly strong throughout and Chess Mates having a slight advantage on the top two boards and being led by one of the country's best blind players, Chris Ross, who has been invited to play in the Blind Olympiad team later this year (good luck Chris!)"

"The match started with a poultry limp on Bd2 when David Walker & Frank Kamau cluckety-clucked out by agreeing 'a Grandmaster draw' after only 10 moves – Boooooo! Hiiisssss! The same result then

befell Bd3 but not for want of trying as Nigel Young and Kettters Captain Jonny Martin had teased and tested each other to prove the draw. With three games in play and the score level Graham Arch put the Kettters 2-1 up with a devastating Queen & Bishop incision on Dave Curran's trapped and uncastled King. Advantage Kettering, needing only a point from the two remaining games to take the trophy – one win or two draws.

"Here's the rub: Chris Ross was winning on Bd1 for Chess Mates and opponent Peter Jaszkiwskyj was in deep time trouble, but Chris Keech was easily winning for Kettering on Board 4, which would give Kettering the match regardless of events on Bd1. The Kettters were smiling, on the verge of offering the handshakes, and nipping in and out of the bar to filch the poker players' leftover food (indeed Graham Arch returned with a rather nice looking pie quickly spotted and noted by game reporter Nik) as they all gathered around Bd4 to enjoy watching Chris Keech play out a Queen and 400 storming pawns endgame against Jefta Jawi's two miserably
