Raunds Christmas carol service

Special guests the Mayor of Raunds, Ms Helen Howell and her deputy Mr Nick Beck joined the huge congregation which filled St Peter's Church Raunds to enjoy St Peter's Church of England Academy school's special Christmas carol service.

Each class performed carefully rehearsed carols and readings, and there was the opportunity for the grown-ups to sing their favourite well-known carols.

A journey through the Nene Wetlands

Covent Garden-style street performances and characters from nature and history will soon be inviting Rushden shoppers to explore the wildlife spectacles on their doorstep thanks to a ground-breaking wildlife and heritage project.

The Wildlife Trust for Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire and Northamptonshire's (BCN) Into the Valley has secured £662,800 from the Heritage Lottery Fund to:

- Create a major new

- 270-hectare nature reserve – the Nene Wetlands – from seven disconnected wildlife areas, three of which are currently closed to the public.
- Protect, restore, and

- manage new and existing habitats for wildlife – providing new access routes and interpretation will complement the outstanding natural value of the site as an internationally important

destination for breeding and overwintering birds. Into the Valley will encourage shoppers at the Rushden Lakes leisure and shopping destination – due to open in spring 2017 – to embark on an adventure through nature and time at a place where wildlife, industrial history and modern retail culture come face-to-face. Shoppers will be invited to take a walk down Wild Street from the precinct to the natural world.

Wildlife and historical characters will introduce Secret Spectacles beamed live to screens in the Visitor Centre; a new path network will bring people up close and personal to the sights and sounds of nature; and an interactive programme of learning and experience activities will inspire young and old to get involved and become wildlife enthusiasts.

The developer of the Rushden Lakes centre, LXB, is also funding

a major new lakeside Visitor Centre – the first for Wildlife Trust BCN. This will act as a gateway for people to access and enjoy the wildlife of the Nene Wetlands. The eco building will be zero energy and will also feature a green roof which will absorb rainwater, provide insulation and create wildlife habitat.

This section of the River Nene, and its connected gravel pits, is essential for the journeys of more than 20,000 migratory birds each year. It is known as one of the best places in the world to enjoy the spectacle of thousands of overwintering birds.

It is expected that more than 500,000 people will visit the Nene Wetlands each year.

The Nene Wetlands will offer everything from easily accessible areas to quiet tranquil experiences, something for everyone from shoppers to expert naturalists!

Dear Editor,
Our local councils will shortly be deciding the amounts of tax they need to collect from us for 2017/18.

Readers may be aware that Northamptonshire County Council have been asking for people's views on a proposed 3.95% increase, which includes 2% needed to help with the high cost of adult social care.

In common with the district councils, the county taxation amounts have changed little for some years due to restrictions imposed by the present government. I presume this was thought necessary following the doubling of charges under Labour.

However, as is well known, such restrictions were not imposed on town and parish councils. For the town of Oundle, the precept for an average band D property has risen to 87% more than it was prior to 2010/11. It's also now about 40% more than Oundle residents pay to the district council; prior to 2010/11 it was 13.7% less.

Oundle's total precept is currently £387,885 which is about £105,000 more than the average for other similar sized towns in the east Northants district. It includes a 15.2% increase for the current year when inflation had flatlined, even going negative at one point, during the preceding year.

In view of the above, I anxiously await the 2017/18 precept figures and trust there will be little or no increase this time – possibly a reduced amount?

Have you made any New Year resolutions? Perhaps to get all of your research in order so that you don't end up ordering the same certificate more than once? It has been done... Possibly research a particular ancestor and find out as much as possible about them? Maybe follow a female line rather than the male line of a family? Whatever you have decided to do, the long dark evenings of winter are the ideal time to hunker down and the time will pass before you know it!

Then again, it might be the social conditions of the time that interest you. If you look at a census of 1891, for instance, you will see a family listed with a / marking the end of a group of people. This shows one household. It is not until you see a double line // that you will have reached the end of a dwelling. Therefore, you could find as many as five households living in one house! If the building still exists – and many of them do – you may be able to find it on Google Maps for instance if you are unable to visit the location personally.

My great grandparents, Caleb and Millicent Goldsmith, were living in Earlswood Road, Redhill with their four eldest children. (They were to produce another nine over the next 15 years). They are shown with another family in the same house – a widow, her two children and two lodgers – making a total of 11 people in one house. The house still exists and is probably home to just one family these days. But what must have conditions been like back in 1891? Caleb would have been out at work all day – he was a baker – leaving Millicent to look after their growing family. Looking at the house, they probably just had two rooms – the toilet would most likely have been outside and certainly shared between all eleven!

What were the living conditions like for your ancestors?

Editor's notes

First, a happy New Year to all our readers. How are your New Year's resolutions progressing? In this edition we have the prospect of help for those who have set their sights on doing something more energetic in the coming year: in Higham, the Ashgrove Clinic is offering consultations to encourage health awareness and help fix your aches and pains; in Oundle there are walking football sessions; and, if you are still casting around for something new in the New Year, you might try becoming a reading helper with the Beanstalk charity.

Whatever your views on the new retail development at Rushden Lakes, whether you regard it as a magnificent opportunity to improve the job count in the district or see it as a contributory factor in

the inevitable decline of local town centres, our article in this edition demonstrates that the site will do more than pay lip service to the needs of local wildlife. A recent visit to the site, hosted by Wildlife Trust for Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire & Northamptonshire, provided the opportunity to see first-hand the excellent work being done by the Trust. It seems that a visit to the new development will enable those set on retail therapy to shop knowing that their friends and family in need of a little more exercise and fresh air can stroll around the lakeside paths and look at the wildlife.

The new Deenethorpe development of a garden village is moving forward and promises to provide a raft of new homes in a 'self-contained' setting. This option seems vastly preferable, albeit not if

you live in the existing hamlet of Deenethorpe, to the more usual piecemeal expansion around existing town centres which cannot then be expanded to provide the infrastructure needed to support the new homes.

Doubtless, there is more bad weather to be endured before we get to spring and consequently we can expect a further deterioration in the condition of our local roads. The A605, particularly between the Oundle and Warmington roundabouts, already seems to be in a very poor condition with little prospect of significant repair work before the weather does improve and even then it will be in competition with other roads in the county for the available pot of funding. Meanwhile, be sure to drive carefully on all our roads and watch out for the inevitable potholes.

Following a terrific festival in early May, when the Saxon Hall was packed for some of the finest festival acts in the country, the Festival Committee ended 2016 by inviting the much loved Albion Christmas Band to kick off Christmas.

Veterans Ashley Hutchings and Simon Nicol (50 years on from forming Fairport Convention) were joined by Northamptonshire's Simon Care and the lovely voice of Kellie While.

Manor School Sports Hall was filled with beautiful Christmas music and festive

readings, to the delight of the packed audience and the band, who were "over the moon" with their reception in Raunds.

There will be no rest for the Festival Committee as their thoughts turn now to the 2017 Festival (27th-30th April). In keeping with the tradition of featuring many

different kinds of music, the Saturday Night Special dance will be headlined by The Swing Commanders – an exciting mix of 1940s classics, boogie-woogie, western swing, 50s jump jazz and more! The Festival will also welcome the hilarious Les Barker and The Askew Sisters,



who won the Spiral Earth traditional album award in 2015.

On Sunday the festival will close with two of the

UK acoustic/folk scene's finest singer-songwriters, Jez Lowe and Steve Tilston. They will be bringing their fleet-fingered musicianship

and songs of social injustice to 'Celtic Connections' in January and the organisers are proud to be able to bring them to Raunds.

Council issues decision on supermarket sign

A planning inspector has agreed with councillors and officers that an illuminated totem sign outside a Rushden store must be removed as it is not in keeping with the visual amenity of the area.

Councillors and officers first raised concerns after receiving a planning application for two free standing six-metre high illuminated signs for the new Lidl store in Rushden.

The application was refused on the grounds that 'the proposed

advertisement would adversely affect the character and visual amenity of the area, including views into/out of the conservation area. The proposal is therefore contrary to national and local planning policies.'

Unfortunately, one totem sign was put up between

the committee making its decision and the decision notice being issued shortly after and so the council's enforcement officer served a notice to remove it. The planning decision and the enforcement notice were appealed against but on 12th December 2016 an inspector dismissed both

appeals and agreed with East Northamptonshire Council that 'the sign does harm the setting of the conservation area and the character and appearance of the surrounding area.' He also said that at 'an important and attractive entrance to the town and the conservation area... the totem stands out and...

looks incongruous and wholly out of place. It also seems to be over-large and dominant.'

Ward member, Councillor Barbara Jenney said: "We're really pleased that the planning inspector agrees that this sign is at odds with the area and agree that from certain angles, it dominates and is

out of place.

"Planning officers and councillors have worked hard to show how the sign harms the setting of the Rushden conservation area and the character and appearance of the area."

Planning officers are now in communication with Lidl to agree a date for removal of the sign.





I use heating oil to power my home, but I'm struggling to cover the cost. It's hard for me to

cut my energy use to save money, as my daughter's asthma gets worse if I turn the heating down too low. Is there anything I can do to cut my bills?

Households that use heating oil often struggle to cut their costs as they don't have the same ability to shop around as those who are on grid. They are also more commonplace in areas like East Northamptonshire,

where homes are also often a fair bit older and more difficult to heat. But there is action that you can take to cut costs and save money, without having to turn down the heating.

Stocking up on oil now, before temperatures start to drop, can help you to avoid the high costs of buying during the winter. The cost of oil is usually at its highest in December, January and

February, as extra demand can push up the price. Make sure you shop around for the best price and ask suppliers about flexible payment options if you struggle to pay the whole cost up front.

Joining an oil club is also a great way of saving money, as you can often get a better price by clubbing together with others and buying in bulk. This will also cut down the number of trips the oil supplier needs to make, which could reduce delivery costs and is better for the environment.

To see if there's an oil club in your local area, put your postcode into the oil club

Your Health Matters

1. Whiplash at 0 mph?

"How's it possible?" I hear you ask. "Surely you need to be in a car accident to get whiplash?"

Actually, no, you don't need to be in a car accident to get whiplash. Plenty of people get whiplash from falling over, from falling off horses and from being knocked sideways.

But you're right, whiplash at 0 mph isn't common. The scenario I'm talking about is sitting at your desk. Ok, so it's not technically whiplash, but sitting at a desk without breaks can cause a lot of problems both in the neck and elsewhere in the body.

So what can you do to prevent it?

- 1. Take breaks.** The most important thing to remember is not to sit for too long. Even if you do none of the other things on this list remember this one. Whether you have the most expensive ergonomic chair available, or you sit on a dining room chair at your desk, sitting for long periods is not good for you. So don't do it.
- 2. Sit square to your computer, book or paperwork.** Don't twist to one side

to avoid the plate, pile of paperwork or cat sitting on your desk. Move the plate/paperwork/cat and sit straight (remember the cat goes on your lap; the plate in the sink, not the other way around.)

- 3. Mouse with the other hand.** If your arm aches change it to the other hand. It's not as hard as it sounds.
- 4. Don't curl up on the sofa with your laptop.** Curl up with the cat instead and only use your laptop at a table.
- 5. Take another break!**

Top Tip: Give your neck and shoulders a break too. If they ache try rolling your shoulders around – it's like giving them a nice cup of tea.

£1,000 fine for Rushden fly tipper

A woman from Rushden was fined over £1,100 recently for fly tipping in East Northamptonshire.

East Northamptonshire Council (ENC) was called to investigate a fly tip at Rushden's Goulsbra Road in November 2015.

Miss Chloe Bee also failed to return a Section 108 questionnaire, which is a legal requirement, in relation to the waste found, which included household waste, paper, cans, bottles and general rubbish.

Magistrates found Miss Bee guilty and ordered her to pay £1,126, made up of a

£660 fine, £400 costs and a £66 victim surcharge.

Waste Services Manager at ENC, Charlotte Tompkins, said: "The Waste Management Team work tirelessly to deal with incidents of fly tipping in the district. If you receive a request for information regarding an investigation, the best course of action is to complete the form with as much information as possible.

"Fly tipping is a crime that costs each and every

taxpayer. Make sure you don't unwittingly become a waste criminal by making sure you use a licensed waste carrier to remove ANY waste from your property."

From the ENC Chairman

I hope that all readers of Nene Valley News enjoyed a Merry Christmas. We now look forward to the coming year.

I take this opportunity to record my appreciation for the work of my 39 Councillor colleagues.

In our two Policy Committees – Policy and Resources and Planning Policy – they debate and then decide on many issues. Planning Management Committee members have a quasi-judicial role in hearing and deciding on applications for planning permissions. Licensing Committee members sit in panels of three to hear and decide on applications for licences required for alcohol sales, related matters and taxi operators. The Scrutiny Committee reviews policy decisions ‘called in’, while the Governance and Audit Committee and the Joint Standards Complaints Committee’s roles are self-explanatory.

I also record my appreciation of the work

of our council’s officers – the professionals, who provide advice, without fear or favour, implement decisions taken and ensure that the work is properly done. While councillors, elected, are politicians, officers serve on the express basis that they are politically neutral in their work. This is the, considerable, strength of our British system.

Local government ensures that its statutory duties and general powers are the responsibility of councillors elected locally, close to their communities, with elections every four years.


Readers will appreciate that the work of the Chairman is very much ‘the tip of the iceberg’ with the rest of the work of the council done by his or her councillor colleagues. I chair the meetings of the full council – normally six

every year – which take the most important decisions, like the budget. At full council meetings I call the speakers and rule on points of order: so my role is like that of a referee. The rest of my work is ceremonial.

During the remaining months of my Chairman’s year I expect to raise more donations for my three Charities: the National Autistic Society; the Royal Anglian Regiment Benevolent Charity; and the Gurkha Welfare Trust.

Northamptonshire County Council has joined together with other local authorities and adoption agencies in the region to help find loving families for vulnerable children.

The new partnership is formed of 10 local authority and voluntary adoption agencies across the East of England, covering Cambridgeshire, Buckinghamshire, Bedfordshire, Norfolk and Northamptonshire.

The initiative supports the Government’s drive to speed up the time it takes to find adopters for children waiting for a family. In the future, approved adoptive parents will be able to find out more quickly about children who are waiting for a family across the whole region rather than just in their local area.

The agencies also hope it will help to recruit more adopters for children who often wait longer to be placed with a family,

including children who are part of a sibling group, or from a black or minority ethnic background.

Northamptonshire County Council cabinet member for corporate parenting Cllr Suresh Patel said: “This is an exciting opportunity for prospective adopters to find out more about the children across the region who are in need of a stable, loving home.

“By working in collaboration with our new regional partners, we can also increase the potential pool of adopters for the hundreds of children in need of a new home, while enabling partners to develop wider support services and share skills and resources.”

Anything goes...

Cole Porter’s effervescent, escapist musical comedy Anything Goes opened on Broadway in 1934 with America in the throes of the Great Depression. In today’s comparatively egalitarian western world, the social divide on trains, planes and cruise ships is defined by First Class and Economy. Back then, the great ocean liners which provided the backbone of intercontinental travel had high society voyaging in luxury on the upper decks while the lower decks were crammed with desperate migrants investing every last penny in search of a better life.

Wellingborough Amateur Operatic Society’s Anything Goes is set on just such a liner named S.S. America. We think of it as Cole Porter’s show – he wrote both music and lyrics – yet the show’s original quartet of book writers also included another literary eminence, PG Wodehouse. We associate

Wodehouse with Jeeves and Wooster but in 1934 all that was yet to come. At that point Wodehouse had a string of hit musicals to his name, written with various collaborators, and only published his first comic novel that same year. Anything Goes was his last work for the musical stage.

Ethel Merman created the role of Reno Sweeney on Broadway. Wellingborough Amateur Operatic Society’s Reno is played by Johanna Beech.

Former Deenethorpe Airfield set to become a Garden Village

The Government has announced that it will support work on a proposed 'Garden Village' at Deenethorpe Airfield.

The new village, including up to 1,500 homes, community facilities, shops, business premises and generous green spaces, would occupy part of the 600 acre airfield site located between the villages of Deenethorpe and Benefield to the east of Corby.

The Deenethorpe Airfield project is one of 14 schemes across the country that will share £6 million funding plus ongoing support from the Government's Homes and Communities Agency. This is to help East Northamptonshire Council work with the landowner (the historic Deene Estate) in preparing a detailed masterplan and delivery strategy. It will pay for extra staff capacity, specialist advice (such as design and viability) community engagement, and various studies.

The Leader of East Northamptonshire Council, Councillor Steven North, is delighted with the announcement of Government support: "This is an exciting project and it's great that the Government is backing it as one of the first new Garden Villages in the country. We have supported the principle of a new village for a number of years and,

with this Government funding, we can now work with the Deene Estate to ensure that the proposal is of the highest possible standard of design and sustainability and addresses concerns and opportunities identified by local communities."

Development Manager Aldred Drummond, speaking for the Deene Estate, has also welcomed the Government support: "The Estate has owned this land for over 500 years and is determined to use its landholdings and long-term stewardship to create a model for sustainable rural living, with exemplary standards of design and community facilities. The uniqueness of the site is its scale at over 650 acres, with around a quarter to be built on, which gives unrivalled potential for a true garden village with masses of green space. We are working closely with the Joint Planning Unit and East Northamptonshire Council in refining our masterplan and this funding, and the national recognition that comes with it, is a major boost."

The Council has set up a Garden Village Project Board, including representatives of the District, County and Parish Councils to

oversee the project.

The Chairman of the Project Board, Councillor Roger Glithero, is keen to emphasise the importance of local input: "The Project Board is already aware of some local concerns, including the potential impact of traffic to and from the development and pressures on local infrastructure. We have held a workshop with key technical stakeholders such as environmental bodies, the highway authority and providers public services, to consider the emerging Garden Village proposal. We have asked the Estate's
