In Brief

World Book Day

Fotheringhay Bridge road closure update

The road bridge over the Willow Brook just outside Fotheringhay on the road to Nassington was closed for safety reasons in February.

Scheme preparation work has commenced to repair the accident damaged parapet. There is still a significant amount of work to be undertaken.

NCC has reviewed the traffic management (closure) and concluded that it is not feasible to reopen the road to traffic, to ensure the safety of all road users and to repair and open the bridge as quickly as possible.

Irthlingborough residents urged to contact police with information about anti-social behaviour

Officers in Irthlingborough are appealing for the public's help following a number of incidents of anti-social behaviour in the town.

Local residents have reported several instances where young

people have been riding bikes up and down High Street obstructing traffic

and putting the safety of pedestrians and other road users at risk.

A number of preventative measures have already been put in place by the police and local council, including targeted youth intervention work, and together with partner agencies, officers are working hard to find longer-term solutions to the issue.

Support from the community is vital to this and Sergeant Jane Bettles is urging more people to get in touch with any information they may have about when and where this is happening and who is responsible.

She said: "We really need the public's support

to help us identify who is responsible for this anti-social behaviour. We also need as much evidence as possible about when and where such incidents are taking place.

"Although riding bikes up and down the street may seem a relatively trivial matter, it is the manner in which it is being done that is causing annoyance and distress to local people, as well as being a potential risk to people's safety.

"We're aware of discussions on social media about this, and we really need people to share whatever they know and name those responsible, in confidence, so we can take action against the group of young people who are causing this nuisance behaviour.

"If you see an incident

taking place, please note the date, time and location, as well as a description of what is actually happening.

Officers will be carrying out enforcement activity and increased patrols in order to take action against those involved and provide reassurance to the local community.

Sgt Bettles added: "I would urge anyone with any information to get in touch as soon as possible, either by calling 101 or emailing us at SCT-EastNorthantsCentral@northants.pnn.police.uk, and we will contact you to arrange a convenient time to take a statement.

"Your information will be treated in confidence, however, if you would prefer to remain anonymous, you can also call Crimestoppers on 0800 555111.

Genealogy jottings

Have you ever wandered round a cemetery and looked at the beautiful carvings on some of the graves? It may seem at times that they have been placed randomly, but they can provide clues to the lives of our ancestors.

For example, a beehive carved into the memorial was often used by the Freemasons and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. It symbolises human industry, faith, education, and domestic virtues. If you find one carved into your ancestor's gravestone, it could also provide another avenue to explore, to discover further their history. I have seen graves where theatre masks have been carved to denote that the 'resident' worked in the entertainment industry. The village in which I used to live – a completely landlocked county, by the way – has a churchyard where you can see the memorial to one chap comprising some rocks with an anchor embedded therein. Yes, he was a sailor.

One of the most popular is that of a dove, representing the Holy Spirit. Another is a heart – symbolising love.

On a visit to Scotland, I was also intrigued to see the final address of the incumbent neatly carved. Yes, it was the full address, complete with house number! No postcode though, this was in the days before they were used.

So, the next time that you have the chance to visit a graveyard in search of your ancestors, take a moment to take in the surrounding monuments.

Editor's notes

Despite the fluctuating weather conditions, there is a very definite feeling of spring in the air and it's only two weeks 'til we put the clocks forward on 26th March. There is the usual variety of spring arrival dates, with the meteorological start already behind (1st March) and the spring, or vernal, equinox on 20th March. Nonetheless, changing the clocks, and the very obvious change to lighter evenings, always seems to be the best measure of the changing seasons.

This time of the year also brings other changes, particularly those of a financial kind. By the time we go to print the Chancellor will have set out the government's spending plans and we already know that East Northants Council

(ENC) will increase our Council Tax contributions by around £5 per year, which seems a reasonable increase given the pressures on the services being provided. And the Parish Council which costs residents most remains Oundle, with the difference between them and the least expensive being around 10%.

There is the prospect of financial support from ENC for some organisations in the District as our article on Cash for Community Groups demonstrates. It seems we have our

own local version of the Tadcaster bridge saga. You may recall that the main road through the Yorkshire town was cut when flooding damaged an ancient bridge. Locally, the direct road link between Fotheringhay and Nassington is unusable because of damage caused by a vehicle or vehicles to the bridge over the Willow Brook. Obviously, this venerable structure needs careful handling when it comes to repairs and Northamptonshire County Council Highways have put in place a diversion which is necessarily lengthy because of the paucity of bridges in the area. The current estimate for the completion of works is June 2017. Meanwhile, locals and local businesses are suffering delays and disruption.

Cash for community groups

Are you a local group needing money for a community project – running activities for a club; restoring a village pond or play area; improving facilities at your village hall, for example?

We'll look no further! Funds are available from a variety of sources for groups requiring £500, £5,000 or even £50,000 through grant-giving bodies operating locally.

East Northamptonshire Council (ENC) is holding a free information day about the sorts of funding streams available to community groups on Thursday 27th April.

The day, held at East Northamptonshire House in Thrapston, will be run in two halves. Entrance to both is entirely free:

- 10am–12noon: presentations from funders, giving 'hints and tips' as to how best to apply for their grants.

This is a sit down event, so places are limited and will need to be booked. Please try to send only one or two representatives, to make space for all.

- 1pm–3pm: a Funders' Fair, where community groups can drop in any time to talk to funders and find out who could help with their projects. No booking needed.

Both sessions will run entirely independently, so come for as much, or as little, as you like.

Su Davies, External Funding Manager at ENC, will be present on the day to give funding advice to groups and signpost them to funders who can help their projects.

Su said: "The event will give community groups the chance to speak directly to funders, outline their projects and find

out immediately whether they'd be eligible for funding support. This can save a lot of time when preparing a bid."

A wide range of funders will be attending the event, including The Northamptonshire Community Foundation; The Mick George Community Fund; Northamptonshire Sport; Tesco's Bags of Help; Charity Bank; Peterborough Diocese Historic Support and of course, the Council's own grant programmes. Voluntary Impact Northamptonshire and Northamptonshire ACRE will also be present to give advice.

If you are a not-for-profit body with a constitution and a bank account, you have a good chance of finding a funder who could help you!

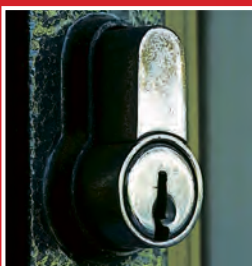

Oundle triumphs at debating tournament

As a means of encouraging a more competitive edge to debating lower down the school, Stamford School organised and hosted the first local inter-schools debating tournament (Stamford, Oakham, Uppingham and Oundle) for pupils in Years 10 and 11.

The event, which was chaired by Stamford's Debating President, was held in the Oswald Elliott Hall on Thursday 2nd February. An audience of 300 pupils supported the teams and offered their own views in the lively floor debates.

The competition comprised two heats and a final with each school putting forward either one or two pairs to compete. Oundle took two teams: Tatiana North (16) and Tom Riegels (16) as the team for the first round took on Uppingham, opposing the motion that 'Space exploration

was a waste of money' – a subject in which Tom took a particular interest as this was the theme of his current research project. The other first round between Stamford and Oakham featured the motion that 'Autonomous vehicles would make driving safer'.

With Oundle winning their first round, their second team of Danila Mikhaylov (15) and Declan Boyle (15) proceeded to the final against host school Stamford's second team. The motion for this round was 'We should permit the use of performance-enhancing

drugs in sport'.

Stamford's Design Technology Department designed a plaque – the Oswald Elliott Trophy – which included the arms or badges of the four participant schools. The plaque was awarded at the end of the afternoon to Oundle.

English teacher and Head of Debating at Oundle, Helen Wells commented: "The aim is that this will be an annual competition with the schools taking it in turn to host the event. Oundle's Debaters were delighted to be invited and are very grateful to Stamford for setting up such a competition."

Gilbert & Sullivan in Oundle

Oundle G&S Players' latest production of HMS Pinafore, staged at the Queen Victoria Hall in West Street, gained popular approval from enthusiastic full-house audiences during the recent week-long performances.

The Director, Gill Potts, once again created an entertaining evening of comedic song and dance, ably supported by outstanding principals, and backed by a well drilled chorus and orchestra conducted by Musical Director, David Milsted. Set in the 1920s, the costumes enhanced by the lighting made it a vibrant and colourful spectacle.

This G&S favourite is a satirical comic opera in two acts. The story takes place aboard the ship HMS Pinafore. The Captain's daughter, Josephine, is in love with a lower-class sailor, Ralph Rackstraw, although her father intends her to marry

Sir Joseph Porter, the First Lord of the Admiralty. She abides by her father's wishes at first, but Sir Joseph's support for the equality of humankind encourages Ralph and Josephine to overturn conventional social order. They declare their love for each other and eventually plan to elope. The captain discovers this plan but, as in many of the Gilbert and Sullivan operas, a surprise disclosure changes things dramatically near the end of the story.

Council Tax increase of £5 a year

East Northamptonshire Council (ENC) has decided to increase its share of Council Tax due to the uncertainty about future Government funding.

At the Budget meeting on 1st March a number of options were discussed to safeguard services in the future. The increase agreed unanimously will be an extra £5 per year for a Band D home, or 10p a week.

The Council takes only around 8p in every pound of the total Council Tax collected, with the rest of the money going to Northamptonshire County Council, Northamptonshire Police and Crime Commissioner and town and parish councils. Only 8% of what is

collected goes to ENC to run the services they are responsible for.

Cllr Steven North, Leader of ENC, said: "We currently have the lowest Council Tax of any council in Northamptonshire, and almost the lowest in the country.

"Investment in our communities is a priority as shown by our £1m commitment to local projects through our Community Facilities Fund.

"We will continue to look for savings but due to uncertainty about future government funding and because we want to continue to invest in our communities, we propose a very small increase, which for a Band D property works out over the year at £5; we think that represents good value for money."



East Northants Snooker League

Windmill Mecca have secured themselves the League Champions Trophy in the penultimate week. Congratulations go to them for an outstanding performance over the past five months. Despite some difficult matches over the past four weeks, including a loss and three draws, they have done enough to win the league with a week to spare. Back to the future at St Peter's Church, Oundle

Layers of remarkable ancient history are being lovingly uncovered as part of an extensive programme of continuous modernisation by St Peter's Church in Oundle for the benefit of the local community.

In a series of projects designed to develop, improve and enhance the church building as a place of worship – but also as a major venue for local events – a fascinating glimpse into its past is being unearthed which has also shed greater light on the town's former residents and the history of local schools.

The ultimate aim of the St Peter's Parochial Church Council (PCC) is to continue to navigate through, and negotiate with, Church of England and English Heritage (as well as other interested heritage societies) building regulators. The PCC has jumped over bureaucratic hurdles frequently during the past decade. But more patience will now be required to achieve the possible construction of other community facilities, such as a kitchen, within the footprint of the church building. The plan is in keeping with the mission to attract and

support local residents and organisations as they use the building more often for all types of occasions. Raising money for this project will, in time, become a priority.

The recent phases of building work began with the installation of stylish and robust wrought iron gates at the west door. This was followed by the transformation of the main entrance to include welcoming automatic glass doors and a brand new ramp for wheelchairs and pushchairs. The ancient Lady Chapel was then re-ordered to give a much needed multi-functional space. Next, cutting edge technological equipment was put in to provide a modern audio-visual system for the building.

Phase 5 is now in progress to re-configure the interior of the west end including the building of a choir balcony, crèche and toilets. The latter was becoming a vital requirement; one annual community event hosted in the church is a massive wine tasting event by a local firm to which more than 500 people are invited to sup – with just one loo cubicle currently available for necessary visits thereafter!

Watch this space.

From the East Northants Council Chairman

On 2nd February I attended the formal reopening of the Oundle Church of England Primary School at its re-locate site at the former Middle School premises on Cotterstock Road.

The Bishop of Peterborough planted a commemorative tree. All of us guests formed an excellent impression of the school: the teachers are dedicated and the children polite, cheerful and eager to learn. This reflects considerable credit on the professionalism of Mrs McMurdo, the Head Teacher, and her colleagues.

On 11th February, as an ex-officio member of the University of Northampton Court, I was the guest of the Vice Chancellor at the

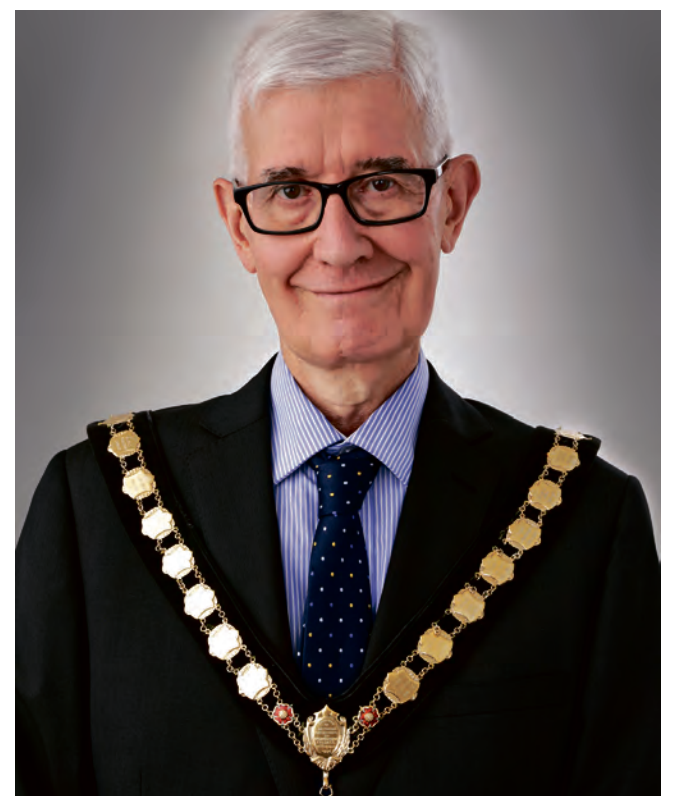
university's graduation ceremonies. Graduands had achieved their degrees in the Faculty of Business and Law. The official lunch before the ceremonies provided an opportunity for informal discussions with the High Sheriff and the Chairman of the Board of Governors about wider issues.

On 1st March East Northamptonshire Council (ENC) set its Budget for the coming financial year, starting 1st April. ENC's Council Tax precept pays towards ENC's services:

the main services are waste collection; many environmental health duties including food safety inspections; the emptying of dog waste bins on public land; and the licensing for pubs' alcohol sales; housing services, including our duty to accommodate homeless people; and the determination of applications for planning permissions – the latter an even more responsible duty, in the light of central Government's recent white paper on housing.

Councils are a vital element of our democracy: within the framework of laws councils, led by councillors, elected every four years by voters in our communities and accessible to their constituents, take the decisions for the delivery of their councils' services. In present times, when there are constraints and pressures on public expenditure – national and local – councils' decisions on their annual budgets call for careful thought. Readers will appreciate that there are limits within which councils can increase their Council Tax precepts.

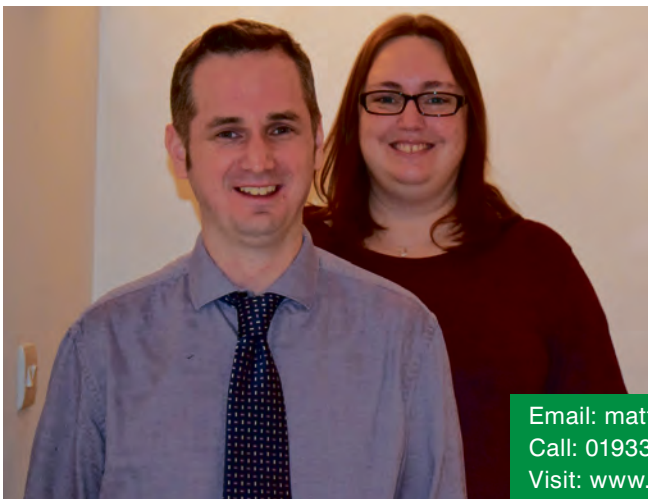

Cost-effective energy solutions

"I'm worried by how much money I spend on gas. My home is draughty and I turn the heating on even in summer. How can I cut my bills?"

The good news is that there are a few different ways you can use less energy, and also pay less for what you use.

Start by finding out if you can get a lower price for your gas. Find a copy of your latest bill so you can see how much you're paying per unit. Then use Citizens Advice's online energy price comparison tool at <https://energycompare.citizensadvice.org.uk/> to check if a different supplier is offering a cheaper deal.

If you do find a better offer, call or email the new supplier and ask to move to the tariff you've identified. They'll inform your old supplier and switch you over to their supply. This normally takes 17 days.

www.east-northamptonshire.gov.uk/sss. You can sign up for a personalised offer before 20th March 2017 and this is very likely to offer a good value deal – but ideally you need to consider what the whole of the market has to offer including any Warm Home Discount to which you may be entitled.

You should also look into improving your insulation, such as getting draught excluders or cavity wall insulation. Energy Champions at Citizens Advice can help explain what could work best for your home and the potential costs involved.

Depending on your circumstances, you may be eligible for financial assistance to help you meet the cost of your bills, as well as any improvement works to your home.

Nene Valley Business News

Welcome to my March 2017 business column. I will be in a different town every month featuring a different business, with a view to promoting and giving a boost to our local hard working industries. This month I had the pleasure of visiting Alfred Sargent & Sons shoemakers in Rushden.

This was a significant visit for me as I was a former Finance Director for another well-known shoe manufacturer in Northamptonshire and the visit brought back many memories of my time in the industry and the good people who work in it.

The business was established in 1899 by Alfred Sargent together with his sons and I am pleased to say is managed by the fourth generation of Sargents, Mr Paul Sargent.

I was given a guided tour of the business which had a wonderful friendly atmosphere, reinforced by the fact that generations of families still work there. One former employee, Mrs Mary Burditt, had received an MBE from the Queen for working in the business for 62 years. She is now 102 years old and lives in a local care home.

As well as Finance Director I was also responsible for quality control in my former job and I have to say the quality of the footwear at Alfred Sargents was exceptional. The employees show pride in their work and the attention to detail is paramount to producing these beautiful handmade shoes.

I was interested to see that Alfred Sargents had invested in the brand name called 'Budapester', after the shoemakers to the Hungarian Court. The budapester is one of the best-known varieties of men's footwear; a derby style shoe with broguing and a double sole is what makes the budapester truly one of a kind. The brand name was established here in 1992 and has been successfully exported to the European market.

Beautiful quality hand-made shoes

Alfred Sargents pride themselves on their quality shoes that are made to last and offer an after sales service. Owners have sent their much loved shoes back to Sargents years after they have purchased them to be repaired and some pairs were manufactured as long as 30 years ago – that's good old fashioned manufacturing, made to last!

Paul stated that the worst part of the body to make for is the feet and you have to have a vast range of 'lasts' to produce a large range of sizes. Sargents produce hundreds of styles and have a team drafting new designs for customers seeking a custom made shoe. The team will work with the customer to create their specific shoe design, picking out the right leathers and stitching and drafting up the design to suit the customer. On my tour I noticed a young employee hand drawing some beautiful embellishments of his own design which gave a traditional shoe a wonderful modern twist.

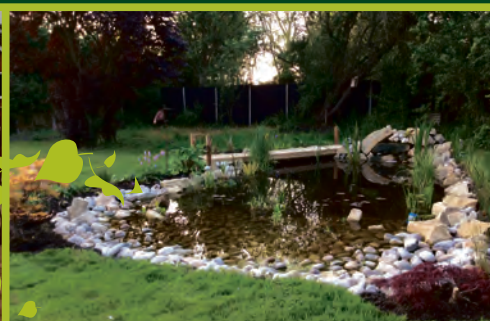
