Battery causes explosion in back of waste truck

East Northamptonshire Council is pleading with residents to take more care when disposing of batteries following an explosion and a fire in the back of a waste collection truck.

Collection crews reported an explosion that rocked the vehicle and that could be heard at the

far end of the street as they travelled along Grumbold Avenue in Raunds.

Thanks to the swift actions

of the crew, the vehicle was parked on a grass verge away from cars parked along the street, the fire service responded quickly and the entire load of waste was dumped to allow for thorough dowsing whilst the road was closed to ensure public safety. The fire crews from Raunds and Rushden identified the cause of the fire as a nickel-cadmium battery, the sort used in everyday household items such as remote control toys and torches. Such batteries should not be placed in waste or recycling bins as they contain chemicals that can ignite and should be disposed of at battery recycling points.

Leader of East Northamptonshire Council,

Steven North, said: "While these items may seem harmless, they could have dangerous implications for our waste collection crews, the public and the environment.

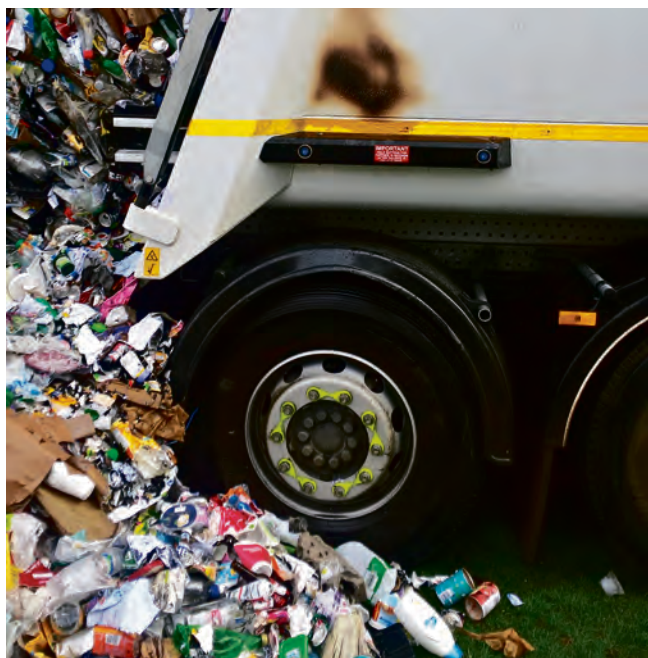
"We're asking all residents to please keep everyone safe by not putting hazardous waste into household bins but making use of the battery recycling points in shops and household recycling centres.

"We also ask residents to consider the financial cost implications of incorrect disposal. Because of this situation, six tonnes of recycling had to go to landfill as it was contaminated,

as well as the cost of the fire crews, the waste crews who supported the situation and kept collection rounds running, the damage to the truck and the clear up costs. Please dispose of these items in the proper way."

Stuart Smith, Operations Supervisor for Kier, praised the crew for acting quickly in dumping the load in a safe place before the fire could disable the truck's hydraulics, which likely saved the truck from being consumed by the fire: "Our crew did exactly what they needed to do to prevent the fire spreading and creating damage to people or property. We would appreciate all residents being vigilant in ensuring hazardous materials are not put in their bins but disposed of as indicated on the ENC website."

Editor's notes

Don't forget to change your clocks this weekend, putting them forward one hour but bearing in mind that some devices are clever enough to make the change themselves. This gives us one additional hour of daylight in the evenings in which to take advantage of the hopefully spring-like weather we might expect to enjoy in the next few weeks.

There are a couple of reminders about waste disposal in this issue. First, the residents of Raunds have cause to be grateful for the quick thinking of a refuse collection crew, and the local fire service, who dealt with the aftermath of a battery which had been placed in household waste only to explode. Second, it seems we need to pay more attention to identifying items of everyday waste which can be recycled and those which can't; some of the items listed in the 'Ridiculous Six' article from East Northants Council seem to be obvious but others may not be, so it's worth

looking through that list to ensure that you're getting it right. In both cases the errors made are costing money and we will be footing the bill.

After our earlier comments about potholes on the A605 near Warmington, it seems that someone has been busy because over a fairly short stretch of the road a number of holes have been filled. The finish doesn't look particularly professional but it does mean there is less of a threat to your vehicle's suspension and tyres. We presume this is part of the next phase of the Northamptonshire Highways repair programme involving pre-surface patching; as stated on the Council's website, 'this started on 1st March and is seeing heavily potholed areas of the highway patched in preparation for the extensive "surface dressing" programme.'

While on the subject of highways, we are grateful for the following statement from the leader of Northamptonshire County Council, Heather

Smith, about the bridge at Fotheringhay: "Unfortunately the bridge is really narrow and the entire side of the bridge was knocked into the water. In circumstances like this Highways would normally put concrete blocks there to protect motorists from going over the edge but there is not enough road width space. There is a massive gaping hole that a car could easily go over at night in the dark. It is just too dangerous to have the road open even for restricted traffic. I have been pressing for the Environment Agency to try to speed up the permit Highways have paid for as Highways need to be able to put scaffolding in the river below to rebuild the side of the bridge. I will continue to press for the permit but was told this takes two months. Rebuilding the stone wall is not a huge job once the permit is given so I sincerely hope it will be done sooner than June. I will keep chasing."

We will pass on any more information as soon as we get it.

Food bank for Oundle

The Anglican, Baptist and Methodist churches in Oundle are working together to establish a food bank in Oundle and the surrounding area. Although the need for food parcels in a time of crisis is not likely to be great, it is known that there have been instances of genuine need.

Because large numbers of clients were not anticipated, the plan was for the food bank to operate as an offshoot of the Corby Food Bank, under the auspices of the Trussell Trust (www.Trusselltrust.org), with Corby providing administrative and logistic support, and having general oversight. The Oundle supermarkets would supply collected food items, and these would be pooled with Corby to ensure a balanced stock to meet dietary needs. Clients would be referred to the food bank by 'referral agencies' who would also be able to advise them on the problems that had given rise to their crisis.

A welcome initial supply of food came from the Oundle and Thrapston Weight Watchers who cleared their cupboards and contributed a goodly amount of non-perishables.



The food bank opened at the Methodist Church in Drummingwell Lane on 24th January, for one hour every Tuesday; but after five weeks, no clients had been issued with food vouchers. Few referral agencies had been appointed, but Corby were reluctant to appoint others as they were finding that they had overcommitted in the amount of support they could give.

The decision was taken, regrettably, to close temporarily while alternative arrangements could be made – and discussions are taking place with the Stamford Food Bank, who have

already helped clients in the Oundle area. The hope is that the Oundle Food Bank can open again soon, working closely with the Stamford Food Bank.

Verrucas – Demons of the Feet

Ok, I'm going to confess. I had a verruca for eight years and thought it was a corn. I know, I know, with my level of medical training you'd think I knew the difference, but, just as the cobbler's children never get shod, the osteopath's toes never get examined.

Still, it means I have a pretty good understanding of the disgust you feel as an adult when you realise you've got one of these beasts on your foot.

Podiatrist Ann Exton says that part of the problem with verrucas is that people often think they are corns. Once you've realised it's a verruca things don't actually get much simpler as they are notoriously hard to get rid of.

Home remedies include: putting electrical tape over it, soaking it in vinegar, putting banana peel on it, planting a potato at the bottom of the garden, standing in squashed slug and selling the verruca to someone else!

Ann says that the only one of these that is likely to help is the electrical tape or gaffer tape, though there's no actual research to confirm this (there's also no research to prove that

using a parachute will save your life if you jump out of a plane, so we can't always rely on research!)

Ann's main advice for verrucas is:

- Ointments from the chemist can work, but are not suitable for diabetics and people with some other medical conditions/allergies, so check with the pharmacist first.
- Follow ointment instructions accurately – if it says reapply every day then do it, or it won't work.
- Wash your hands – verrucas can spread to other areas of the body.
- Keep your verruca covered when walking barefoot in areas where other people walk.
- If the ointment doesn't work a podiatrist can try more heavy duty ointments, or freezing techniques, to help it go away.

Top Tip: If you're more than 6 years old don't be ashamed about a verruca – they're far more common in adults than you'd think.

Thrapston Farmers' Market

Thrapston Farmers' Market has welcomed new stalls this year as its reputation in the area grows. Farmers' Market celebrates 15 years

Higham Ferrers Farmers' Market is held in the historic market square between 9am and 1pm on the last Saturday of each month, except in December when it is moved to the last available Saturday before Christmas.

The market is accredited to the FARMA Association and is a very successful monthly market, with over 20 stalls each offering something different.

The produce varies from Aberdeen Angus beef, organic eggs and vegetables, to Italian

peppers, organic pork and lamb, free range poultry, pork in all its forms in addition to pickles, pies, fresh fish, cupcakes, olives, baklava, fruit and honey, preserves, traditional bread, plants and cheese.

When you visit the market you are able to purchase fresh produce direct from the stallholders and ask any questions with regards to the provenance. They are always willing to offer you their advice and even some recipes.

The FARMA association visits and inspects the market to ensure it complies with a strict set of rules and to ensure that all the stallholders are operating within the rules.

Extra activities are regularly provided, such as the market's Birthday in April and a visit from Father Christmas, along with a

brass band in December. And in July the annual free Prize Draw Raffle will be held.

Oundle Farmers' Market is on the 2nd Saturday of every month, 8.30am-1.30pm. The market is well established, covering meats, bread, vegetables, cakes, fruits, fish, plants and street food. During the Easter weekend, 14th - 17th April, take some time out to make Easter crafts and enjoy a breath of fresh air by following the Easter themed trail around the lake to win a small chocolate treat!

National Championships again for Town Band!

Rushden Town Band has definitely got something special going on! Seven years ago, it played in the Fourth Section of the banding world. Since then it has gone from strength to strength being promoted through the sections and, in January 2017, was promoted to the First Section.

On 11th March, the band took part in the First Section Midland Area competition in Bedworth, for the first time in their history. Out of sixteen bands, the band came second being praised for its musical rendition of 'The Land of the Long

White Cloud' composed by Philip Sparke. This placing qualifies them for the National Brass Band Championships at Cheltenham later this year. This will be the fifth time in seven years that the band has reached the Nationals.

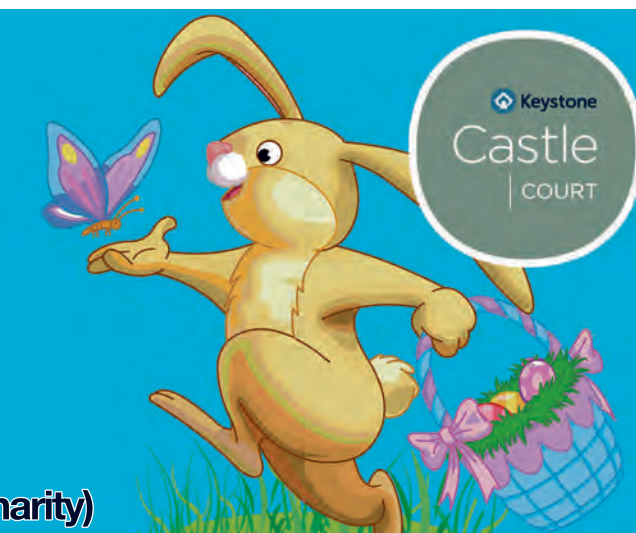

From the East Northants Council Chairman

On 11th March I was the guest of the Mayor of Peterborough at Peterborough Cathedral for the Last Night at the Proms concert he sponsored in support of the Mayor’s Charities.

The music was provided by the band of the Royal Anglian Regiment. Peterborough Cathedral was the right venue for this important occasion: the history of the Cathedral goes back a long way. On 18th March I was the guest of the British–American Committee, at the Stukeley Club, Alconbury RAF Station. Colonels Cullen and Yu, respectively Wing and Group Commanders are transferring out to other duties and took this opportunity to say farewell to our local communities. Many American service personnel and their families live “off base” and are always good neighbours. This is a valuable underpinning of Britain’s alliance with the United States.

We look forward with confidence to a continuing happy association with new USAF commanders. In our British democracy, as also in former British colonies etc which progressed to independence, first and foremost the USA, the ‘civil authority’ namely the government, has the last word. The Government declares war, when necessary and makes peace. Governments make the laws, including the raising of money for all purposes, military as well as civil and those governing military discipline. The Armed Services chiefs decide and manage strategies and tactics; Ministers decide the political and diplomatic dimensions; the two sides debate frankly – in

private!
In Britain we also have the ‘regimental system’ in which soldiers (at any rate until they progress beyond the rank of major) serve with their regiments and, significantly, regiments tend to recruit in particular counties, making for links with local communities. This makes for community cohesion and effective military performance – the latter essential, now that mass armies, etc dependent on conscription are no longer relevant and we depend on voluntary enlisted professionals, who need to be supported on the ‘home front’ by their families.
Readers will know that two of my Chairman’s Charities are the Royal Anglian Regiment Benevolent Charity and the Gurkha Welfare Trust. My Civic Dinner on 27th January, attended by the Lord Lieutenant, the Chairman of Northamptonshire County Council, the

Mayor of Oundle and other guests, raised a total of £570 for these two charities.

Don't let the 'Ridiculous Six' ruin your recycling!

Last year, East Northamptonshire Council (ENC) recycled over 46% of household waste in the district. Due to the fantastic efforts made by residents, this figure is forecasted to rise this year. But there are important dos and don'ts that the council is encouraging all residents to remember.

Residents are being urged to remind themselves what can and cannot be recycled in a bid to cut down contamination in our recycling bins, as unfortunately there are limits to what can be collected for recycling.

ENC wants to help residents to stop putting the wrong items in their recycling bins, as this led to a 12% contamination rate in 2016.

You can help by getting to know the 'Ridiculous Six' and making sure nothing on this list goes in your recycling bin.

1. Garden waste

A separate collection service is offered for this, please see www.east-northamptonshire.gov.uk/gardenwaste for more information.

2. Electrical items

These can be taken to your local Household Waste Recycling Centre, visit www.northamptonshire.gov.uk/HWRC for more details.

3. Nappies

Grey/black lidded bin, please.

4. Tissues/kitchen roll

Grey/black lidded bin, please.

5. Expanded polystyrene

Grey/black lidded bin, please.

6. Black sacks/carrier bags

Grey/black lidded bin, please.

Councillor Steven North, Leader of ENC, said: "The returns we receive on good quality recycling can be put straight back into our services. However, when we receive contaminated recycling, these returns can turn into costs – to the tune of ten times that of what could have been gained from a bin of good quality recycling. So we're asking residents to make sure they are putting items in the correct bin to maximise all opportunities to recycle."

ENC's Waste Manager, Charlotte Tompkins, added: "We have instructed our crews to be more vigilant in spotting contamination, so you may see greater numbers of red tags being issued over the district in the coming months."

"With your help, we can cut down contamination, helping to reduce both service costs and our impact on the environment."

If bin men find any contaminants in your recycling bin, they may issue your bin with

a red tag. A red tag means that ENC has not been able to empty your recycling bin due to it being contaminated with the wrong materials.

If you receive a red tag, there's no need to worry, but there are a number of things you can do:

- Remove any items of contamination from your recycling bin. This will ensure it is collected next time around. Head to www.east-northamptonshire.gov.uk/recycling for a reminder of what can/cannot be

recycled.

- If your bin is full, you can present recycling in clear sacks and/or cardboard boxes. You can put out as much recycling to the side of your bin as you like and it will all be collected (provided it is not contaminated and presented appropriately).
- You can take any excess recycling and/or waste to your local Household Waste Recycling Centre (HWRC), run by Northamptonshire County Council. There are 10 HWRCs in the county and you are entitled to use any one of them as a Northamptonshire resident. Please visit www.northamptonshire.gov.uk/HWRC for locations and opening hours.
- If you feel you're still struggling, or are unsure of what the contamination is, please call the Waste Management team on 01832 742026.

Tribute to Northants history as proposed Garden Village is named

One of the area's most famous historical families will be remembered in the naming of a new garden village near Deenethorpe.

Tresham Village is the name chosen by the landowners for the proposed community of up to 1,500 homes, associated facilities, shops, business premises and generous green spaces, all built on part of the 600 acre airfield site located between the villages of Deenethorpe and Benefield in East Northamptonshire.

The project is one of 14 schemes across the country that will share £6 million funding plus ongoing support from the Government's Homes and Communities Agency. This is to help East Northamptonshire Council (ENC) work with the landowner (Brudenell Estates) in preparing a detailed masterplan and delivery strategy.

The connection between the Brudenell Estates and the name Tresham is steeped in history.

Sir Thomas Tresham (1543-1605), a prominent Catholic landowner in Elizabethan Northamptonshire was the creator of three notable buildings in Northamptonshire – the extraordinary Rushton Triangular Lodge, the Market House at Rothwell and the unfinished Lyveden New Bield.

Tresham also dedicated much of his life to collecting books, many of which can be found in the Tresham/Brudenell library at Deene Park – the home of the Brudenell family for over 500 years and over 14 successive generations. The book collection was given as a dowry when Tresham's youngest daughter Mary married Thomas Brudenell. Mary spent many years living at Deene Park.

Robert Brudenell explains what the historical connection means to the family: "Much of Deene has now been restored and this deep sense of history and the tribute to our Tresham ancestors further reinforces the link with local history and captures the optimism of a new chapter for the Brudenell family in Northamptonshire.

"The opportunity that Tresham Village

presents the Brudenell Estates and the surrounding communities is a great example of the family mantra 'the past to cherish and the future to relish.'"

ENC Councillor Roger Glithero is Chairman of the Garden Village Project Board, which includes representatives of the district, county and parish councils. He said: "It's a fitting tribute to the impressive architecture of Sir Thomas Tresham's buildings that this new garden village will bear his name.

"We're looking forward to working with the Brudenell family and the local community on this exciting proposal, which could provide wonderful facilities in a superb environment."

Tresham Village will be the working name for the project while detailed plans are being worked up and tested. As with naming proposals for any new development, ENC is inviting comments from interested parties such as the Royal Mail and Parish Council to make sure that the chosen name is not offensive, misleading or likely to cause confusion. Anyone wishing to comment should do so by 30th April by writing to info@nnjpu.org.uk or post to the North Northamptonshire Joint Planning Unit, C/o East Northamptonshire Council, Cedar Drive, Thrapston NN14 4LZ. The final decision on the name will be made by the Brudenell family. It is important to emphasise that giving a working name to the proposed Garden Village does not prejudge the outcome of the planning application process that is to come.

Consultation on a draft masterplan is scheduled to take place this summer and could lead to a planning application later in the year. If the proposals get the go ahead, development could start around 2020. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Northamptonshire County Council intend, not less than seven days from the date of this Notice, to make an Order the effect of which will be to prohibit traffic from proceeding along that length of Duddington Road, Wakerley as set out below.

LENGTH OF ROAD TO WHICH RESTRICTION APPLIES:
That length of Duddington Road, Wakerley from Main Street to A43.

REASONS FOR RESTRICTION: The restriction is required for safety during bridge inspections.

PERIOD OF CLOSURE: The proposed Order will come into effect on 10th April 2017 and will continue in force for a period of eighteen months. An application may be made for the approval of the Secretary of State for Transport for the Order to be extended if this proves necessary. However, the restriction specified will have effect only at such times and to such an extent as is indicated by the display of signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016.

EXPECTED DURATION: It is expected that the road will be restricted for one day.

ALTERNATIVE ROUTES: use A43, A47, Luffenham Road, Tippings Lane, Main Street, Wakerley Road and Main Street.

Chess Corner



John Robinson Knockout Competition

Following on from victory against Chess Mates B in the previous round Rushden's A team were drawn against Chess Mates A in the semi-final. The night got off to a bad start when Rushden's top player, Hugh Murphy, had to pull out due to illness. No replacement player was available as the B team were playing in the League on the same evening. This meant that board 5 was uncontested and ceded to Chess Mates. The captain James Gardner provided the following report:

Black (James Gardner) played a Petrov Defence against English International Chris Ross. Chris played 5.Nc3 to enter into the variations where white castles queenside and plays for an attack. Black followed suit however with his King placement and once the Queens and Rooks came into the middle game, the position was left equal and a draw agreed.

A significant victory was achieved by white (John Gardner) on board 4 against Chess

Mates' Eva Ressel. This was a Queen's Pawn game where white's c pawn stayed at home in favour of piece play in front of the pawns, with the Knight coming to c3. John went on to win an exchange in what was a quite tactical game in patches and duly converted the material advantage into a win.

On boards 2 and 3 both Saj and Richard were significantly outgraded by their opponent but played some great fighting chess before succumbing to Chess Mates' heavy artillery.

Saj played a King's Indian Attack on board 2 to achieve a good position out of the opening. His opponent found himself lumbered with an isolated Queen's Pawn. Saj was unable to take advantage of this and prematurely pushed his queenside pawns. Black countered effectively and overran Saj's position, making good use of

the light squared weaknesses left behind by the advancing pawns on c4 and b3 in particular.

On board 3 white opened with e4 and Richard Ellis played a Pirc Defence creating a half-decent position out of the opening with the potential to create play on the queenside to counter white's central advantage. Solid positional play by white neutralised black's queenside pressure and created more menacing threats through the middle. This eventually led to the winning of the key black e5 pawn and then another pawn, leaving white with a won endgame.

In the end Rushden were unable to compensate for the loss of their top player and lost 3½ - 1½ after a gallant fight. Once again Rushden miss out on having a team competing in the final.
