Long-established shoe businesses lace up deal

Two businesses with a combined history of almost 300 years have completed a takeover deal.

Cottons of Oundle – a family shoe firm dating back to 1871 – has been bought by Lincolnshire-based North Shoes,

whose own roots go back to 1876. Cottons, based at 7 Market Place, Oundle, will trade as North Shoes from the end of July and all six full

and part-time members of staff have been taken on as part of the deal.

Managing Director Anne Cotton, the fourth generation at the head of R C Cotton and Sons Ltd, said: "I will be sad to see the business go out of the family but my father, Stuart, and I recognise this is the right time for it to happen.

"We are a stand-alone independent shoe shop in a small but vibrant market town with a thriving business, amazing staff and hugely loyal customers. James North approached me about buying the business — we wouldn't have sold to just anybody.

"It feels right to hand it over to someone like James, whom I have known for some time. I know he shares my ideas about business.

"We could have kept running the shop and then one day closed, but this way the town is going to be assured of a good quality independent shoe shop for many years to come.

"It's amazing that two such

old-established independent shoe shops should be coming together in this way."

James North, the fifth generation at the helm of Bourne-based North Shoes, said: "I am absolutely delighted to have acquired Cottons of Oundle. We have looked at it for some time. It is the right fit for us – a lovely, independent, long-established shoe business in a lovely market town.

"We want to carry on offering what they have been offering as a quality family concern, including the links with Oundle School. We will continue to sell all of the brands they have offered and maintain the same high quality level of service, bringing the Society of Shoe Fitters expertise to the business."

The deal increases the North Shoes stable to five shops, with stores also in Peterborough, Stamford, Bourne and Cambridge, and James revealed: "We're always looking for more shops – so, if the right fit comes along..."

Wildlife news

Moving house is one of the most stressful experiences affecting our lives, and recent personal experience has shown that if the change also involves returning to the area of your birth the whole thing can be even more dramatic. Nothing ever looks quite the same as we remember, and if there has been any major development in the area it can look almost like a foreign country. The same must be true of wildlife when any form of upset occurs, which is why we try to avoid, for example, disturbing birds on nests in case they should move out, leaving behind eggs or even, in the worst case, young ones.

Among the many changes in our area in the past quarter of a century or so, one of the most significant for the plants and animals was the extraction of materials such as gravel and iron ore. Green fields disappeared under the impact of heavy machinery, and valuable and important land could have vanished as

more building risked driving away even more wildlife. But the river Nene came to the rescue, helped by a number of volunteers, and the geology of the land presented a series of holes which filled with water to leave a chain of lakes along what historically was seen as a 'highway' for waterfowl heading cross-country, often leading towards the estuary of the river Severn, where the wildfowl refuge was created by the late Sir Peter Scott. This chain has now become known as the 'Nene Wetlands', with some sections also being a series of 'Lakes and Meadows', where before it was primarily just meadows, and then not always of the best quality for livestock. We have been left with a wonderful range of wildlife 'on our doorstep'. Our 'own' river Nene is giving us a chance to broaden our knowledge of a whole range of species, a chance not always available so close at hand.

Genealogy jottings

How's the research going? Have you started yet? Living with my Gran from the day that I was born and having her spark my interest, I cannot remember a time when I was not following it. However, what has – or will – pique your curiosity?

The nice thing about researching your family history is that you don't have to know a great deal to get started. A certain amount of nosiness... erm... curiosity does help, though! I was assisting someone in the Oundle Library the other day (I am there between 8:30am and 10:30am on the first Wednesday each month) and we were looking for a chap in Normanton, Yorkshire at the turn of the century. He had been in the army during the Boer War and had an address from his attestation papers. Before I knew where we were, as well as finding the address on the 1901 census, I had delved into Google maps and found where the house had once stood. Although no longer there, the houses on the other side of the road were still standing and gave us a good

idea of the type of accommodation in which the chap and his family once lived.

If you are new to research, you might wish to consider taking a local college course to develop your skills – there are also online courses available. One of the most useful that I have discovered is provided by The National Archives on palaeography and is available as an online tutorial. This is excellent for helping you to understand handwriting from the 1500s to the 1800s. Family History magazines are also very useful for helping you to discover what other resources are available to you. They don't just offer advice as to how to go about your research but also have interesting articles covering social history. It all helps to 'put flesh on the bones' of your research!

Northamptonshire County Schools Challenge 2017: great ideas, brilliant presentations

A huge congratulations to the Northamptonshire County Schools Challenge (NCSC) team from Huxlow Science College who finished second in this year's competition.

This is an annual competition in which Year 8 students across the county are asked to develop an enterprising idea which will help other young people who are struggling with a specific social issue. This year's theme was Drugs and Psychoactive Substances.

"Well done team, you were amazing, and so close to winning. Great support from staff

too. A great night to see young people at their very best. Some great ideas brilliantly presented. Well done to all schools who took part," said one Huxlow parent who attended the Grand Final at the Lighthouse Theatre in Kettering on Monday 10th July. The Huxlow team narrowly lost out on the title to Kingswood Academy.

"Well done to all eight teams this evening, you all performed superbly and should be proud of yourselves – you are a credit to your schools," said a representative for the NCSC after the final.



Community Facilities Fund opens for applications

A fund to support the development of public facilities throughout the district is now open for the fifth year!

The Community Facilities Fund (CFF) was set up by East Northamptonshire Council (ENC) using money it receives from central government as new homes are created in the district. This 'New Homes Bonus' is based on the number of properties added to the Council Tax base each year, including new builds and empty properties being brought back into use.

Constituted community groups, including voluntary organisations and charities, as well as town and parish councils can bid for grants of up to £50,000 for capital projects which aim to enhance the district and benefit the whole community.

Previous projects have included building and construction work (such as Benefield Cricket Club, who received £18,900 to improve their facilities), as well as purchasing large items of equipment (like Raunds Town Council, granted £20,000 for a bandstand).

Councillor Steven North, Leader of East Northamptonshire Council, said: "As new homes are built, the demand on community facilities often increases, so it makes sense to use some of the money we get from central government to help develop these projects.

"Last year 12 community groups benefited from this fund, including Rockingham Forest

Trust and Denford Church. Over the next couple of years, we will see new facilities take shape and hope that all of them will make an important contribution to local people's health and wellbeing, with an increase in active recreation.

"Now another round of funding is open and we're looking forward to seeing what our local communities bid for to help make East Northants an even better place to live, work and play in."

In the last round, Bulwick Village Centre was awarded £4,500 for improvements to the Centre. Colin Deans, who helped lead the project, is very pleased with the new facilities:

"The project is now completed and has gone extremely well. Villagers are very impressed with the outcome. The funding has made a significant difference to the Village Centre. New young families are now using the Centre, with baby changing facilities for parties."

Council agrees Rushden East master-planning vision

The vision for a new Sustainable Urban Extension that will provide good quality housing and employment within high quality and well-connected environments has been approved by East Northamptonshire Council.

Councillors endorsed the broad master-planning vision and objectives that will help create 'new and distinctive neighbourhoods that will offer a high quality of life for all'.

Located to the east of Rushden and Higham Ferrers, beyond the A6 Liberty Way, the Rushden East Sustainable Urban Extension forms part of the council's planning strategy and is included in the North Northamptonshire Joint Core Strategy

(JCS), which was adopted in July 2016.

The Sustainable Urban Extension will 'enhance the image of Rushden and Higham Ferrers and will be well-connected to and integrated with both towns. It will contain around 2,500 new homes along with new employment, social and community facilities, and a high quality landscape setting that enhances biodiversity.'

The purpose of the development is to achieve sustainable development to meet

rising population pressure which also helps to protect rural areas from over-development.

Steven North, leader of ENC explains: "The eastern expansion of Rushden will build upon the existing strong sense of local community, and will help form a distinctive place, whilst ensuring that it appropriately integrates and connects with the existing towns of Rushden and Higham Ferrers.

"Rushden East will be a mixed-use development which offers a good balance of jobs, homes and local facilities that can be accessed by all. Good transport links, connections with Rushden and Higham along with high quality green space and infrastructure will make this a very desirable place to live, work and play."

Rushden East will provide affordable and starter homes, homes for older people, larger executive homes, and opportunities for custom and self-build homes in an area where demand is high.

Councillors, officers and developers are working on a master-plan which will go out for consultation where the local community and stakeholders will have the chance to comment. The master-plan will describe how the new development will look and provide a structured approach to creating a clear and consistent framework for development.

The development is likely to be completed in the early 2030s and is currently being promoted by a development consortium which includes the Duchy of Lancaster, Barratts and Taylor Wimpey.



The garden advice for summer you must read

With summer in full swing, we're sharing the advice of local garden nursery, Olive Grove Oundle, who are on hand to impart their gardening wisdom, so that we can all have an outside space to enjoy this year.

Maintain potted plants

July is the month that plants look their best, particularly those in pots, so you'll need to stay on top of caring for them as the weather gets warmer (we hope!) and the rain stops. Stick to a regular watering schedule, especially in drier spells, and feed your plants as required.

If flowers, such as roses, need

deadheading then do this regularly to encourage new growth – short stems just need the flower head removing, while you can remove the entire stem on longer stemmed plants.

Take care of your grass

As the mercury continues to rise, your grass can begin to look a little worse for

wear.

Rather than use a sprinkler, use the water from your water butt and ensure that you have the sprinkler head on your watering can for an even distribution of water.

Brown patches can also occur if the grass has been cut too short and the soil dries out, so raise your lawnmower blade by around 1cm to keep the grass longer.

Add a Mediterranean Touch

If you can't get away on holiday, then bring the Mediterranean to your garden with some European plants.

Olive trees make a great addition and focal point to an outside space and can be purchased in a variety of sizes and styles.

Position your tree in the sunniest spot in your garden, which also has shelter from wind as during the winter cold, chilly winds can do damage to an olive tree.

Olive trees are relatively self-sufficient, and require little feeding and or watering as they are extremely drought tolerant.

Hedge maintenance

Now is the time to prune trees and hedges in your garden in order to maintain their growth.

As general advice, we recommend that you examine the tree or hedge you need to trim, to ensure you know where each cut needs to be made to achieve an even cut. When cutting, make sure you step back regularly to assess where you need to go over again.

If you need to cut to a specific design, then you can create a guide out of cardboard or wood and move this along as you make each cut.

Accessorise


Summer is the chance to enjoy your garden and all the hard work that you put into maintain it all year round, so make it a place that you can relax and spend time in with a few garden accessories.

Solar powered lights will ensure that you can entertain once the sun has gone down, and can be hung across fence panels, wrapped around tree trunks or used to highlight certain areas of the garden.

Add outside cushions to furniture for a cosy touch, and blankets draped over the side if the weather turns chilly.



Spready Stick from Manor School, won the most original idea trophy (supplied by The East Northants College). Their idea is for an on the go device that easily spreads your favourite preserves/spreads for bread,

waffles and croissants. Working like a Pritt Stick, you just twist and spread and you can purchase refills for it too.

Welcome to my monthly business column. Each month I will be visiting one of the diverse range of businesses across the district with a view to promoting and giving a boost to our local hard working industries. This month I visited the Ashgrove Clinic in Higham Ferrers and discovered a local business with some surprising celebrity links.

The clinic is tucked away just off the Kimbolton Road in a very nice period detached house set in its own gardens on Lancaster Street. I was welcomed by Claire Short who established the clinic with her husband Steven Bruce 11 years ago. They met each other when they were studying in London and were both students in the same class. Her husband Steven was a Lieutenant Colonel in the Royal Marines for 28 years which is a dramatic career change for anyone. Steven is also the local Community First Aid Responder and runs First Aid courses. This is perfectly natural for Steven as Royal Marines are trained to rescue people, so it makes sense.
