Genealogy jottings

Have you found a coat of arms for your family? You might think that, if you have found one for the surname(s) that you are researching that it also belongs to you. Not so, I'm afraid – well, not unless you can show descent from nobility. Heraldry in the UK is very tightly controlled, with the College of Arms being the body that are in charge for England, Wales, Northern Ireland and the Commonwealth. Scotland has the Court of the Lord Lyon King of Arms. However, it is possible to purchase your own entitlement to arms and you would need to send in your CV to the College of Arms for them to grant it.

In making their decision, they would take into account "awards or honours from the Crown, civil or military commissions, university degrees, professional qualifications, public and charitable services and eminence or good standing in national or local life." Once granted, a petition would be drawn up and you would need to pay a fee – currently £5,875, which is no small change!

Editor's notes

Without knowing the background details to our article on the compulsory purchase of a property in Rushden it's difficult to be anything but in sympathy with the actions of the District Council. Obviously, housing is in short supply so bringing this property back into use must be a sound idea; moreover, no one likes to see buildings falling into disrepair and causing a neighbourhood to look rundown. Perhaps East Northants Council would like to consider how this option, currently applicable to domestic accommodation, might be extended to the commercial property which is Ashton's derelict Riverside Inn.

There is further good news on the housing front in Rushden too. The development of the former Grenson shoe factory on Allen Road has resulted in 32 homes for affordable rent and 14 shared ownership properties. The scheme benefitted from the grant from the Homes and Communities Agency and it's good to see this type of site, formerly a centre of employment in the town, being brought back into use for the local community.

Meanwhile, it's disappointing to hear that the County Council has rejected an application by Oundle Town Council to have the Fletton Fields site, off the Glaphorn Road, registered as a 'Town Green'. The decision was based on the report of an independent inspector who

took the view that insufficient evidence had been provided to confirm that a significant number of residents of the town had used the site for 'Lawful Sports and Pastimes' over the past 20 years. While it's true that the town benefits from a number of open spaces, most of these are owned by Oundle School and are not generally available for public use. Should one suspect that this will prove to be a very convenient decision for anyone wishing to develop the site for housing and how will that sit with the emerging Oundle Neighbourhood Plan? Perhaps the decision will be appealed.

Have you had your 'flu jab' yet? The injected flu vaccine is offered free on the NHS annually to adults over the age of 18 if they are at risk of getting flu (this category includes everyone aged 65 and over), pregnant women and children aged six months to two years (again if they are at risk of flu). You can have your NHS flu vaccination at your GP surgery, a local pharmacy offering the service or your midwifery service if they offer it for pregnant women. Some community pharmacies now offer flu vaccination to adults (but not children) at risk of flu including pregnant women, people aged 65 and over, people with long-term health conditions and carers. If you have your flu-jab at a pharmacy, you don't have to inform your GP – it is up to the pharmacist to do that. You can find out more about the flu jab at www.nhs.uk.

Council uses compulsory purchase power to resolve empty Rushden home

As part of its active empty homes programme, East Northamptonshire Council has taken possession of a three bedroom house in Rushden that has stood vacant for eight years.

Despite the house starting to fall into major disrepair, complaints from neighbours, being liable for full Council Tax and attempts by ENC officers to engage with the owner about bringing the property back into use, it remained vacant.

As a final resort, the council sought a Compulsory Purchase Order (CPO) which can be used where owners refuse to take action to bring a property back into use, where an owner cannot be traced or where a property has been empty for a long time and is causing a nuisance or is a danger to the public.

Throughout the lengthy process of seeking the CPO from the Secretary of State for the Department for Communities and Local Government, the council continued to offer help and support but the owner was not prepared to bring the property back into occupation and

so it was transferred into the council's ownership on 5th September 2017.

The house and garden will now be cleared and options for its future considered.

Leader of the Council, Steven North, explains: "Whilst we try to give owners of empty properties every opportunity to bring accommodation back into the market for use, we are prepared to take enforcement action."

"In this instance, every opportunity for help and advice was given to the owner but wasn't taken up. I'm pleased to say that the property is now owned by the council and will shortly be brought back into use to provide much-needed housing in the Rushden area. This will hopefully send a positive message to all owners of long-term empty homes that this council is committed to meeting housing needs through bringing empty homes back into use."

The battles are staged in the idyllic Northamptonshire village of Southwick, Nr Oundle (PE8 5BL). The site nestles between the church, the cricket field and the thatched community pub, The Shuckburgh Arms.

Sunday 8th October is the date for this year's extravaganza and hostilities will commence after the town crier has introduced King Conker and Lord Robartes (English civil war reenactment regiment) with the junior competition at 10.30am followed by the main championships at 11am. Presiding over the heated duels to find the 2017 World Champion is emcee Mike Sewell from BBC Radio 5 live.

If all the conker action is too exciting take some respite with the extensive fringe events, including The Juggling Workshop, Pub Games, Climbing Wall, and English Civil War Living History Encampment plus music from

local bands. Guide Dogs for the Blind will provide a practical demonstration showcasing their amazing skills.

Feeling peckish? Head over to the pub for some refreshments or sample some of the delicious fare from the various food stalls around the arena.

The culmination of the day's event is the crowning of the eventual victors. This usually

occurs after 3pm. The day concludes as you wade through the weary and exhausted combatants littering the battlefield, these poor inconsolable figures lie amongst the piles of smashed weapons and broken dreams.

The proceeds from the day are channelled predominantly to organisations supporting the blind and visually impaired (total to date £415,782.99).

Wildlife News

“Expect the unexpected” is good advice for many activities, but particularly for anyone interested in wildlife and the countryside. Plants and animals always have conditions where they prefer to grow, and especially breed, but they are free to choose; if surroundings, especially the food supply, are good they can move into unexpected spots. For example, we can find plants growing in cracks in walls or even roads, which certainly would not look suitable. Of course, they may find that all is not well and they are likely to die.

That crossed my mind recently when out walking. The first time I saw a cormorant, many years ago, was at the seaside; that was expected, because there they could find the fish which are their main diet, and we know that fish need water. Now, in our own patch, we have large areas of water, and (hey presto!) cormorants are gradually realising that food is there for them, so they can do their dives into the water inland as well as along the shore. The conditions may also be easier than on the

open sea though, like us, they may have made some changes by accepting new tastes.

They look slightly different from the usual black birds we are accustomed to seeing, like jackdaws for example. Their bills have a little hook at the end, which may help to hold their prey because they are hunters, looking for and living by their skill and efficiency in chasing living creatures. They dive under water for their meals, and elsewhere in the world they are sometimes pressed into unwilling service by local fishermen, who release them with twine round their neck so that they can be hauled in after a catch, before their digestion starts to work on their dinner.

Because of their underwater swimming, cormorants have developed their own system of drying wet plumage; not by trying to shake off the water like a dog but by standing on the shore or in the shallows and literally hanging their wings out to dry. The wing joints then give it a characteristic shape like an upside-down capital W – watch for it when you see them in our wetlands.

A very special public appeal

In times where there are so many appeals from various charities and good causes, all worthy of your hard earned cash, I have to say this appeal reached down deep into my heart.

I write this with the greatest respect for the bereavement midwives who work in all our hospitals and who give vital support to parents who have suffered the loss of their newborn babies. My heartfelt sympathies go out to all the parents and families who have suffered such a loss which is heartbreaking and difficult to come to terms with.

I had the honour of meeting a wonderful and empathic nurse, Bereavement Midwife Stephanie Fretter who was appointed as Kettering General Hospital's Bereavement Midwife last October and who has launched this very special appeal.

She explained the need for your old cross stitch threads and fabric (Aida) which has been used and can continue to be used to create handmade personalised memory cards for the memory boxes. These also contain teddies, hand and foot prints, photographs as well as other personalised items which will be precious to the bereaved parents as it will be all they have to remember their babies.

The items that really touched my heart were

the exquisite little handmade cribs which were trimmed with lace and had handmade embroidered pillows and bedding in them which were clearly made with a lot of love for the babies' last journey. Heavenly Gowns also offers baby burial gowns, so a lot of thought has gone into ensuring the parents are supported in every way in their final moments with their baby. Every family is offered a memory box which the local Sands (Stillbirth and neonatal death charity) community provide and make. The cards are of various designs, from which the parents can choose and contain the precious photographs of their baby.

KGH's maternity bereavement service is supported by Sands which is a national bereavement pathway that aims to improve the quality of care for bereaved parents.

Stephanie, KGH's bereavement midwife, has over 30 years' experience and previously worked in India and in the outback in Australia for the aboriginal community. Stephanie supports the bereaved parents as long as they need her which can be up to a year, as anniversaries are often painful for the parents who have lost their child.

Parents are offered emotional and practical support for stillbirth and neonatal death. They

are supported through the painful process of saying goodbye, creating memories, naming the baby, making a decision about the funeral and are also given support afterwards with follow up appointments and advice. Parents often want to spend a few days with their baby, who is placed in a cool cot especially designed for this purpose. The cool cot gives vital time for the parents to be with their child. KGH has only one cool cot and is currently fundraising to raise the cash to purchase another one.
