Secretary of State gives green light to Rushden Lakes

Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, Eric Pickles has given the go ahead for the Rushden Lakes development to start.

In October 2012, East Northamptonshire Councillors voted unanimously to grant planning permission for the old Skew Bridge Country Club and dry ski slope on the edge of Rushden to be developed into retail units, restaurants and a lakeside visitor centre, along with a hotel, leisure club and boathouse.

Under planning rules, the application was referred to the Secretary of State

who determined that the decision should be reviewed at a public inquiry which took place in June 2013.

The official confirmation states: "The Inspector recommended that planning permission should be granted subject to conditions. For the reasons given [in the report], the Secretary of State agrees with the Inspector's recommendations."

Cllr Steven North, Leader of East Northamptonshire Council, says: "This is great news for East Northamptonshire as it will provide local people with a better retail offer on their doorstep as well as new jobs and a

regenerated site that has become a blot on the landscape.

"The leisure opportunities will add to the Nene Valley project that encourages people to make the most of the river and help to give better access through a footbridge and cycleway across the A45.

"Rushden Lakes will complement rather than compete with the High Street, and many local retailers are keen to see this happen as it will bring more people to Rushden than ever before."

Andy Sawford MP says: "I am very pleased that Rushden lakes has finally

been given the go ahead. This will provide a great boost to jobs and the economy in East Northamptonshire and I have strongly supported the development. I gave evidence at the Inquiry and have consistently pushed for a decision to be made. After a year's delay I hope we can now get on with the development as soon as possible. I have always been mindful that the Rushden Lakes development will bring challenges to existing town centres across the county but it would not have been right to block this important opportunity for people in East Northamptonshire. I want all our town centres to succeed in the five towns that I represent and I will do my best to support them in the future."

Tom Pursglove, Conservative Parliamentary Candidate for Corby & East Northamptonshire says: "The decision to grant planning permission for the Rushden Lakes development is a huge boost for our area. Local people have campaigned vigorously for this development and this victory is testament to their efforts – particularly those of 'Yes to Rushden Lakes'. This decision is evidence that the Prime Minister's long-term economic plan is working and is delivering for local people."

Oundle School pupils to perform in Edinburgh

A talented cast of Oundle School's Sixth Form actors have been rehearsing **Just by Ali Smith in preparation for the Edinburgh Fringe Festival in August.**

The play, originally commissioned for the National Connections Festival, is a dark comedy, an absurdist take on British national identity and the British concept of justice, featuring corpses impaled with umbrellas, a blind judge, townspeople who speak in synchronised verse, and an amnesiac malaprop cop: Kafka meets Alice in Wonderland.

Robbie Younger (18) plays Albert, and the role of Victoria is played by Livvy Sellers (18). They are admirably supported by Emma Kelsley-Pein (17), Georgie Anstey (18), Alex Wallitt (16), Monica Dahiya (16) and Annabelle Sherwood (17), with Polly Halstead (17) as stage manager.

Livvy Sellers will be starting a course at Central Drama School later this year.

Performances in Edinburgh will run from 12th to 17th August at 4.50pm in Paradise Green at St Augustine's, on George IV Bridge.

English teacher, Andrew Martens, commented: "Pupils have worked hard on this production over many weeks and are hoping to do Oundle proud at the Edinburgh Festival. They will be spending a couple of days in Oundle getting the show up to scratch with some intensive rehearsals, before travelling up to Edinburgh for a week of performances. As well as performing their own show, pupils will also immerse themselves in the experience of the world's biggest arts festival."

Emma Kelsley-Pein said: "Just is certainly a challenging play to work on. It is far from run-of-the-mill and as a result we have to really push ourselves and think outside the box in terms of how we are going to portray our characters and our interaction with others onstage. The political nature of the play is thought-provoking and also encourages us to consider the wider effects of imbalances of justice and power. We are, I'm sure I can speak on behalf of the whole cast, really looking forward to what promises to be an unforgettable week in Edinburgh."

Cable ties to replace waste sacks

East Northamptonshire residents who currently do not use the wheeled bin system for disposing of their rubbish will soon take delivery of waste cable ties which will replace the blue waste sacks.

It has been found that many residents are only using the blue sacks as outer liners for other sacks. So, rather than residents double bagging their waste they can just simply place a cable tie around the top of any refuse sack and place this out. This reduces the amount of plastic bags being collected and disposed of.

The cable ties have been successfully trialled for six months for residents requiring extra capacity and no issues with their use have been raised.

Your waste should be placed in a refuse sack and must be secured with one of the cable ties supplied. You need to use one cable tie per sack and refuse crews will only collect standard sized sacks up to 90 litres in capacity. It is requested that you don't overfill the sacks as the crew needs to be able to lift them safely without splitting. If you have any blue sacks left over then please use them up and you don't need to use cable ties with them.

Each household will receive 100 blue cable ties for general waste and 100 clear sacks for recycling which should last until 30th June 2015. If you have any questions, please call 01832 742026.

Higham and Rushden U3A celebrate 5th birthday

The Higham and Rushden U3A celebrated the 5th anniversary of their foundation in May, with a talk from a local celebrity speaker, Reverend Richard Coles, the parish priest of St Mary the Virgin Parish Church in Finedon and Radio 4 presenter of Saturday Live.

Rev Coles gave a sincere, but light-hearted talk about his interesting life, from his time as a choirboy at Wellingborough School, which he admitted he left with little in the way of qualifications, to his stellar career as a self-taught soprano saxophonist.

He notably achieved a number one hit in 1986, with 'Don't Leave Me this Way' with his lifelong friend, Jimmy Sommerville and their group The Communards. A life in theatre and music followed, with work for the BBC providing regular employment.

His calling to the church, from his self-

admitted atheism, came following a visit to St Mary's Cathedral in Edinburgh. A consultation with a psychiatrist, concerning his overwhelming feeling of confusion about his faith, led to a meeting with a priest, who suggested that studying for a theology degree might prove rewarding.

This was followed by two years of training for ministry in the Anglican Church at The College of the Resurrection in Mirfield, West Yorkshire. After time in parishes in Boston, Lincolnshire and Knightsbridge in London, Rev Coles by chance saw an advertisement for an incumbent in the Peterborough Diocese for Finedon Church. The village had been without a vicar for several years and he thought it would be a wonderful opportunity to serve in a parish so near to his Northamptonshire roots. He was appointed as the parish priest of St Mary the Virgin, Finedon in January 2011.

Lights Out in East Northamptonshire

Community Facilities Fund continues to support local projects

An East Northamptonshire Council fund to support the development of community facilities throughout the district has received 34 Expressions of Interest and will now see 16 groups move to the second stage of bidding.

The Community Facilities Fund (CFF) was set up in 2013 by East Northamptonshire Council, using money it receives from central government as new homes are created in the district. This 'New Homes Bonus' is based on the number of properties added to the Council Tax base each year, including new builds and empty properties being brought back into use. The total available in 2014/15

for CFF grants is over £200,000.

Leader of East Northamptonshire Council, Steven North, says: "Members decided to use a proportion of the New Homes Bonus to invest in community-based projects taking place across East Northamptonshire and with grants of up to £50k available, this fund is a great way for communities to improve where they live, work and play.

"Last year, we awarded £284k across 13 projects ranging from new play equipment to village hall improvements, many of which are already making an important contribution to local people's health and wellbeing. This year, we've seen applications for developing pocket

parks and refurbishing community halls which will only improve the community offer for new and existing residents."

High scoring projects have now been shortlisted and are being invited to stage two of the process where they will make a full

application. Councillors will then consider each application and make a decision on final awards in September of this year.

Ferdi's Kitchen

Sardinhas Assadas com Salada de Pimentão – Grilled Sardines with Bell Pepper Salad.

Summer is upon us and thoughts turn to barbecues and lazy summer days spent in Europe's western-most country: the culinary delight that is Portugal. Evocative memories of sitting at a harbour-side fish shack tucking into platters piled high with sardines fresh off a rustic, outdoor barbecue and thin-cut potato chips spring to mind. A languid sea breeze, bright sunshine, ice cold beer and white wine. What better way to spend a few glorious hours rediscovering your inner hedonist? Bom apetite!

Serves 4 as a starter.

INGREDIENTS

8 fresh sardines, whole
1 cup coarse sea salt
Extra virgin olive oil for drizzling on cooked sardines
Flat leaf parsley – chopped for garnishing cooked sardines
Ground black pepper
2 lemons or limes cut in half

For the Bell Pepper Salad

4 bell peppers – mixed colours: 2 red, 1 green and 1 yellow or orange
1 red onion
Extra virgin oil for dressing salad
Cider or white wine vinegar
1/2 cup flat leaf parsley chopped (extra if serving with boiled potatoes)
Salt
Black pepper

METHOD

- Sprinkle half the salt on a baking tray. Place sardines on the salt and cover with the remaining salt. Place sardines in the refrigerator for 60 minutes.
- Put the peppers on a hot grill and char the skin, turning until all the skin is blackened. Remove from grill and place in a sealable plastic bag or a glass bowl covered with cling-film. Leave for 10 minutes.
- Finely slice the onion, chop the parsley and place in glass salad bowl.
- Remove peppers one at a time and rub the charred skin off. It doesn't matter if a few little black bit remain as it adds a barbecue/smoky taste to the salad. It is easier to remove the skins under running water but this reduces the smoky flavour. Slice the peppers into strips and add to

the onions and parsley. Dress with salt, ground pepper,

vinegar and olive oil. Toss gently to combine all the ingredients.

- Remove sardines from fridge and brush most of the salt off. Dab sardines with kitchen paper to ensure they are completely dry. Season with a grind of black pepper.
- Ensure the grid on the barbecue is very clean. Brushing well with a metal brush to remove any residue is necessary. Brush grill with kitchen paper or a brush dampened with a little vegetable oil to prevent the fish sticking.
- If you have a fish grid, place sardines in and close; otherwise place sardines directly onto the grid. The temperature should be medium hot and, if possible, the grid should be about 5cm (2 inches) from the coals which have no visible flames.
- Place the lemon or lime halves cut-side down on the grill for about 4 or 5 minutes. This gives the juice a wonderful smoky flavour.
- Cook for 3–4 minutes (depending on how hot the fire is) and flip grid or carefully flip the sardines with a spatula. Cook for another 3–4 minutes. Try not to turn them more than once as the sardines will become quite tender and break apart.
- Place on a platter and drizzle with olive oil and a sprinkling of chopped parsley. Garnish with chargrilled lemon or lime halves.
- Serve with the Bell Pepper Salad and boiled potatoes (peeled and tossed with olive oil, salt, pepper and chopped parsley) or a pile of crispy potato chips.

CHEF'S NOTES

Traditionally the sardines are left whole, un-gutted, but they must be very fresh. If you are using defrosted sardines or if you are only going to use the fresh sardines a day or two after purchase, then it's best to gut them. Take extra care when turning them, as they will be more fragile when gutted.

An ice cold bottle of Vinho Verde from Portugal's northern-most province, Minho (on the border with Spain), is the perfect accompaniment. Or just a well-chilled beer.

Discovering church wall paintings

Our regular feature gives a flavour of the history in East Northamptonshire.

Church interiors have altered over the centuries. What is seen today is often the result of work carried out in Victorian times.

The early churches would have had painted walls, woodwork and monuments. Over the centuries themes of wall paintings changed, reflecting different religious ideas. They were used to beautify the church and to illustrate Bible stories and the lives of saints. The medieval congregations would be illiterate but understand the meanings conveyed in the paintings. Eventually wall paintings were seen as less important, or no longer in keeping with new religious ideas. Many decayed, were

whitewashed over, or lost when plaster was removed from the walls during renovation. The tradition did not completely disappear and there are Victorian and 20th Century wall paintings often based on medieval conventions of design.

In the county there are over 40 churches with wall paintings, often in poor condition. In East Northamptonshire St Leonard's Church, Glapthorn has fragments of 13th Century paintings, including two of St Christopher. Other paintings (rather faded) of him can be found at All Saints Church, Aldwincle and All Saints Hargrave. He is shown carrying the infant Christ to safety across a dangerous river. He became the patron saint of travellers.

The Day of Judgement or Doom was usually painted across the chancel arch, impressing the horrors of Hell and the joys of Heaven on the congregation. An example of this can be found at St Mary the Virgin and All Saints Church, Nassington along with other wall paintings.

Amongst the medieval wall paintings in St Peter's Church, Raunds two have moral themes, Pride and the Seven Deadly Sins and another version of worldly

pride, the Three Kings and Three Skeletons. The Kings scorn the Skeletons; however they say to the Kings 'As you are now so were we. As we are now so shall you be.'

The future of these wonderful paintings is in jeopardy as the whole church is now in need of major repair. A campaign,


Great Past, Greater Future, has raised £90,000 so far towards the £1 million needed to save the church. Details of how to donate to the appeal can be found via the 4 Spires Benefice website www.4spires.org

In the chancel of St Mary the Virgin Church, Titchmarsh there are Victorian wall paintings by Miss Agnes Saunders, as well as the earlier painted

memorial by Elizabeth Creed to the poet John Dryden.
