New development boosts space for wildlife in Nene Valley

Irthlingborough Lakes and Meadows



A huge new Wildlife Trust managed nature reserve is to be created linking together four precious fragments of wildlife habitat, thanks to a planned leisure and shopping complex.

After a long delay it was announced last week that Rushden Lakes – a new multi-million pound leisure and shopping development in the heart of the Nene Valley – has been given the go-ahead by Secretary of State, Eric Pickles.

The Wildlife Trust has been working very closely with the developer LXB Properties as the development sits within the Upper Nene Valley Gravel Pits Special Protection Area, internationally important for the wetland birds that spend the winter there.

Only 31 acres of the 222-acre site will be developed, with a mixture of shops and leisure facilities; including a home and garden centre, shops on three terraces, space for up to four waterfront restaurants, a hotel and crèche, a boathouse/activity centre and a lakeside visitor

centre.

The Wildlife Trust will take on the management of the other 191 acres as a nature reserve, which will link together four of the Trust's existing nature reserves in the area to form one giant 660-acre space for wildlife. This will enable the Trust to build on the fantastic land restoration and community engagement work that it has been delivering at Irthlingborough Lakes and Meadows funded by a £1m Heritage Lottery Fund grant.

The cost of the reserve management will be paid for by the developer, which sees the nature reserve as a key selling point for the new retail scheme, with the potential to attract a huge number of visitors each year.

As part of the scheme a network of greenways will be constructed, enabling greater visitor access to this part of the Nene Valley and beyond whilst ensuring that the sensitive wildlife is protected. In addition to this a visitor centre will be built by the lakeside, using some of the highest sustainable building techniques.

Save a lifebelt designs unveiled on the riverbank

The winning designs of a competition to design an anti-vandalism message for essential life-saving equipment on our waterways were unveiled at a special riverside ceremony hosted by East Northamptonshire Council.

The council ran a competition for under 18s to design a message or a picture to be placed inside lifebelts along the River Nene, to make a vandal or thief think twice before messing with this vital equipment. The winning designs were unveiled at Ringstead Upper Lock on 19th June ready for Drowning Prevention Week. This was the first competition of its kind in the UK and saw over 270 entries submitted.

The winners, along with their families and friends, were invited to the ceremony where they met and were congratulated by the competition judges: East Northamptonshire Council's Chairman Gill Mercer, Schools Swimming Manager (Northamptonshire County Council) Steve Jackson, Nene and Lincolnshire Waterways Manager (the Environment Agency) Sue Cant and Sector Commander (Northamptonshire Police) Inspector Inam Khan. The designs were then placed on each of the lifebelts along the river.

Councillor Gill Mercer, Chairman of East Northamptonshire Council, said: "It was very exciting to see the winning designs placed on the lifebelts and we all hope that they will help to deter vandalism of life-saving equipment along the River Nene. Well done to all who took part and please stay safe near the water."



Irthlingborough Methodists refurbish Community Rooms

Builders moved on site recently to completely refurbish and upgrade the Community Rooms at the rear of the Methodist Church in College Street, Irthlingborough.

The halls complex was opened in 1960 and is now in urgent need of refurbishment and upgrade, to meet the needs of both the church and the community of

Irthlingborough in the 21st century.

Briefly the upgrade consists of:

- Reconfiguration of lobby, toilet and kitchen area to provide better facilities for the disabled
- New fitted kitchen
- Installation of a platform lift from the lobby to the large hall
- Complete rewire
- New heating system

- Complete redecoration
 - Replacement of all windows
 - New roof to outside porch and other outside maintenance work
 - Addition of suspended ceiling and large hall and stage area
 - New flooring in toilets, vestibule and kitchen
- The Irthlingborough Methodist Church is grateful for a grant of £26,000 from

the Methodist Church Fund for Property (www.methodist.org.uk) towards the approximate £150,000 cost of the project. It has also gratefully received grants from Biffa Award (www.biffa-award.org), the East Northamptonshire Council Community Facilities Fund, The Methodist Church Northampton District and Nene Valley Circuit, The Bernard Sunley Charitable Foundation, The Hunter Rowe Trust, The Maud Elkington Charitable Trust, The Garfield Weston Foundation, as well as

financial support from the church's congregation and other individuals.

Work on the project began on 2nd June and is likely to run until mid-September.

Sacks for summer gardening

Sunshine and rain throughout June mean the flowers have grown like crazy. Unfortunately, it means the weeds have too. If you're sprucing up the garden for summer, take advantage of the East Northamptonshire Council garden waste sack service.

You can fill the 75 litre compostable sacks, which cost £15 for 10, with grass cuttings, hedge trimmings, weeds, dead plants and flowers, prunings and leaves.

Once filled, the council will collect three or more sacks at a time from the usual refuse collection point, within 10 working days of being notified. You will be told of the collection day in advance.

East Northamptonshire Council also offers a fortnightly wheeled bin recycling collection of green waste for £51.50 for a year.

Building opportunities in Irthlingborough

A near £1 million development on the outskirts of Irthlingborough has transformed a disused piece of land into an area of opportunity for local residents who are looking to lay claim to a home of their own through shared ownership.

The 10 homes located off Finedon Road at 'The Lanterns' have been built by Bloor Homes and Spire Homes to meet growing demand for affordable housing.

Fire Service prosecution for hoax caller

A serial hoax caller has been sentenced following a prosecution by Northamptonshire County Council's Fire and Rescue Service.

At Northampton Magistrates Court Rizwan Ahmed Bashir, of Abbots Way, Northampton, received three concurrent six-month custodial sentences, suspended for two years, plus a 12-month supervision order and £580 in costs.

The court heard recordings of the calls made by Bashir, who had

continually contacted the Fire and Rescue Service insisting that he was reporting genuine emergencies.

The conviction sends a strong message that this kind of behaviour is not acceptable and that Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service will not hesitate to take action against hoax callers.

Chief Fire Officer, Martyn Emberson said: "Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service takes this type of activity very seriously and I am

extremely pleased that we have been able to successfully prosecute this prolific hoax caller. Making hoax calls is simply not acceptable. It means that fire crews and other resources are diverted from where they are really needed, such as at road traffic collisions or genuine fires. This not only puts people's lives at risk but wastes both time and money."

Councillor André González De Savage, County Council Cabinet Member for Strategic

Infrastructure, Economic Growth and Public Protection said: "Hoax callers are extremely irresponsible and this

behaviour will not be tolerated. Modern technology means we can trace every call. We can have a phone cut off where

we can prove it's been used for a hoax and, as has happened in this case, we can refer to the police for a prosecution."

Summer pleasures

By Catherine Burbage

One of summer's pleasures is picking a deliciously ripe, homegrown strawberry and eating it while it's still warm from the sun. Unfortunately, the slugs in my garden agree, so when we'd finished fighting over the few strawberries which had remained unscathed, the children suggested we bought some from a shop like normal people.

As we have some great, local strawberry producers who grow more varieties than the ubiquitous Elsanta, we went to Lutton (near Oundle) and bought them direct from the farm.

It's surprising how many strawberries we can get through just with good cream, but as the season wears on there are some which eventually remain unappealing at the back of the fridge. Similar to bananas, it is worth freezing strawberries if they're starting to go past their best and then use them in cooking. Smoothies make a fast breakfast by just whizzing together some milk, yogurt, strawberries, maybe a raw egg and a shake of cinnamon or a mint leaf; or put yogurt, whipped cream and frozen fruit in a food processor to make instant ice cream.

This recipe would make a refreshing, simple end to a barbecue and is ideal for using up strawberries which are going soft in places. If you prefer not to use alcohol, try a berry flavoured drink in place of the wine.

Gently heat the wine, sugar, cordial, orange zest and juice, star anise and pink peppercorns until the sugar is dissolved. Leave to cool and flavours to infuse.

Sieve the liquid (to remove orange zest etc.) into a blender and add 200g of hulled and chopped strawberries. Blend until smooth. A froth might form on top – if you don't like the look of it, allow the liquid to settle and skim off froth with a slotted spoon. Taste the liquid and add more sugar or liquid as you fancy (a drop of Pimm's might be nice in this as well!).

Prepare the remaining strawberries and chop into small pieces. Divide evenly between 4 individual serving dishes, pour the liquid over the top and finish with a generous spoonful of whipped cream.

Strawberry Soup

STRAWBERRY ISLANDS

Serves 4

½ bottle of rosé wine

25g of sugar

New monthly farmers' market in Thrapston starts 6th September

Saturday 6th September will see the launch of a brand new monthly farmers' market, hosted in the small market town of Thrapston, East Northamptonshire. The market will run every first Saturday of each month and will be held along the High Street in the heart of the town. The market will run from 9am to 1pm.

The market will feature a range of stalls selling locally grown, reared and produced food and drink – all within as small a radius of Thrapston as possible. It will be a true farmers' market, aiming to meet the requirements of FARMA, which is the regulating body for farmers' markets in the UK. Sellers will have to be from the local area, as close to Thrapston as possible. They must be growing, producing or rearing the food and drink themselves – not 'buying it in'.

Products which have been made, like baked goods, meals and drinks, must use as many locally sourced ingredients as possible. This way, the shopper knows that the goods they are buying are truly local.

Thrapston Farmers' Market is being set up and run by a small, experienced team in Thrapston. The team is passionate about supporting small producers from the surrounding area and offering the local community a chance to buy fresh, local food straight from the person who grew it, reared or made it. A key aim is to create a lively community event every month, bringing everyone together in Thrapston town centre.

As this is a community-led market, all funds raised by the farmers' market will go back into promoting the event and supporting Thrapston town centre. Retailers and business owners themselves will be able to decide how they

want profits to be spent. It might be in the form of new street furniture, plantings around the town, new signage or town promotions.

Charlotte Croser, chair of the organising committee and owner of Jollys Toys says: "Thrapston Farmers' Market is being run by a community group, for the community – those who live in and around the town, and those who work and run businesses here in Thrapston. We want the market to attract new shoppers to our town centre, which has a lot to offer in the way of independent shops, cafes and service offerings. It is important to the organising team that the market celebrates local food and drink and promotes new start-ups, but at the same time it complements and enhances what Thrapston offers every day of the week."

The organising team is hard at work sourcing local producers and has already confirmed a dozen fantastic stalls selling delicious products which are new to the market and right on the doorstep. The team is keen for Thrapston Farmers' Market to have an identity of its own, and for it to introduce new and exciting products to taste, buy and enjoy.

Time Trail – Twywell

Places of worship and their burial grounds often provide a good source of local and family history.

A few country churches also have connections with people of national importance. The 12th century St Nicholas Church in the small village of Twywell is one such church.

It has remains of Roman, Saxon, Norman and medieval architecture and artefacts; for instance Norman doorways, windows and font and a 13th century Easter Sepulchre.

In the churchyard is a headstone to Lewis Warren, who was killed at Slipton iron ore pits in 1881. He was 22 years old and his fellow workers erected the headstone in his memory. Iron ore had been extracted and smelted by the Romans but large-scale workings in this area date from the mid-19th century.

However, it is other events in the 19th century that are perhaps the most interesting in the long history of St Nicholas Church. In 1874

Horace Waller became Rector of Twywell. He was an anti-slavery activist, writer and as a member of the Universities' Mission to Central Africa had worked as a missionary.

He became a friend of the missionary and explorer Dr David Livingstone. After completing his medical training Livingstone went to Africa where he worked for over 30 years. His most famous exploration was to trace the source of the River Nile. When he died in 1873 his assistants Abdullah Susi and James Chuma, a former slave, were determined that he should be buried in England. They embalmed his body and wrapped it in bark.

After a hazardous 800-mile journey taking many months, they brought his body back to London. They also brought his journals to Rev Waller and he compiled and edited them.

The beautifully carved choir stalls in St Nicholas Church, installed as a memorial to Rev Waller, depict slaves being freed and African animals.

The Rev Waller was also a friend of General Gordon, often referred to as Gordon of Khartoum. The General served in the Crimea, China and the Sudan and mapped the Upper Nile.

Like Waller and Livingstone he was against slavery. The Bodleian Library, Oxford has numerous letters from him to Rev Waller. The General presented three stones from Calvary to St Nicholas Church and the church organ was dedicated to him.

Walk of Remembrance planned for Irthlingborough's Great War soldiers

The Irthlingborough War Memorial and the Memorial in St Peter's Church record the names of 151 men of this small town who made the supreme sacrifice in the First World War.

Between 2004 and 2008 members of the Historical Society successfully researched the story of each man and also collected photographs of the majority of them. This information is recorded in a leather-bound volume, which is perpetually on display in St Peter's Church.

As a tribute to those men, the Society will create a Walk of Remembrance along Irthlingborough High Street, around the Cross and up Finedon Road by displaying a small photographic memorial to each man. The memorials will be displayed in

the windows of houses, shops and businesses, on the railings around Parsons Green and on trees leading to the War Memorial. They will be on display from Friday 18th July to Sunday 3rd August.

On Saturday 19th July from 10am to 2pm and Sunday 20th July from noon to 4pm the Society will be staging in St Peter's Church an exhibition '..... and then they were gone!' The archive photographs will follow the route from the Cross to the station taken by the first contingent of men who marched off from Irthlingborough to the Front on 6th August, 1914.

The exhibition will also be shown on Parsons Green on Saturday 2nd August as part of the Town Commemoration which is being led by Irthlingborough Town Council.



Chess Corner

A few weeks ago I reported on a Grand Master game from the recent European Team Championship in Croatia. The scene was round six with Miso Cebalo of Croatia playing white against Eugeni Vasiukov of Russia.

Cebalo tempted Vasiukov into moving his King forward into an indefensible position leading to Vasiukov resigning after only 13 moves. This has now been topped and my spy on the world chess scene has informed me of a Grand Master game leading to resignation after 11 moves.

The scene was the chess super tournament held in Stavanger, Norway. The protagonists were the Italian, Fabiano Caruana and Norwegian, Magnus Carlsen, the current World Champion.

This was a blitz game played under tight time constraints. Fabiano decided to Castle as quickly as possible and in doing so made a basic error. Fabiano was playing black and on the seventh move he moved his Knight

to 'a6'. There is a saying in the chess world that a Knight on the rim is dim; Caruana was about to prove this big time! While Caruana was concentrating on castling Carlson moved the Queen out into an attacking position on Fabiano's Rook. The coup de grâce came when Carlson took Fabiano's 'dim' Knight with his Bishop; to retake the Bishop he would have to expose the Rook to Carlson's Queen. At this level to go a piece down leaves no alternative but resignation.

For those familiar with chess notation I reproduce Fabiano's faux pas below:

1. d4 e6 2. e4 d5 3. Nd2 c5 4. Ng3 cxd4 5. Nxd4 Nf6 6. exd5 Qxd5 7. Nb5 Na6 8. Nc3 Qd8 9. a3 Be7 10. Qf3 O-O 11. Bxa6 Bl.
