Older person's bus passes now available online

Customers can now apply for an older person's bus pass online by visiting the Northamptonshire County Council website at www.northamptonshire.gov.uk.

The new online service has been introduced to make it easier for people to apply for their first age-related bus pass at the click of a button. Customers can also renew or replace a lost, stolen or damaged older person's bus pass using the new online system.

An older person's bus pass allows the holder to travel for free on any local bus service in England from 9.30am to 11pm, and all day at weekends and on bank holidays.

Cllr Michael Clarke, county council cabinet member for transport, highways and environment, said: "Our new online service is a fantastic way for people to apply for an older person's bus pass or renew or replace their existing bus pass from the comfort of their own home or on the move using their smartphone."

The entire process can be completed online. The website will check the applicant's eligibility by running a background verification check and the bus pass will then be sent to eligible customers by post.

Customers must have access to a computer with a webcam to use the online service, or be able to upload a photo, and they must have an email address.

Alternatively, customers can continue to apply for an older person's bus pass or renew their bus pass in person at any Northamptonshire library.

Also, people who can use a computer but don't have one at home can use a PC at any library if they bring along a photo of themselves on a memory stick or camera card.

To apply or renew an older person's bus pass online, visit buspass.northamptonshire.gov.uk.

People are eligible for an older person's bus pass when they reach

state pension age, which is dependent on sex and year of birth. To find out when they are eligible, applicants can visit www.gov.uk/calculate-state-pension.

All disabled-related bus pass applications and renewals will still need to be made in person at a library in order for proof of disability documents to be checked.

Staying green in East Northants

Recycling is not a new concept. We have all seen the adverts, heard the slogans and lived with the boxes, bags and bins. But still there are some people who don't appreciate the importance of recycling or understand what can and cannot be recycled. East Northamptonshire Council explains.

If East Northamptonshire stopped recycling and put all of its waste into landfill, it would add nearly £1 million pounds to the cost of managing waste in the district (and that is just to pay the landfill tax bill). Whilst it would mean using the same trucks and staff to collect waste, the council receives assistance from Northamptonshire County Council for every ton of material that they save from landfill, in the form of recycling credits. Without these the waste collection service would need to make a bigger demand on the portion of council tax that is allocated to East Northamptonshire Council. As all public services are looking for ways to make services cheaper and more efficient, stopping recycling collections would therefore be a backward step.

East Northamptonshire Council makes no money from the recycling they collect. Any money that is made (from the selling of the end resources) is used to offset the collection, transporting and sorting costs. By collecting waste this way, not only is the country able to make the most of valuable resources, but the council can minimise the amount of money they need from the council tax payer to run collections.

East Northamptonshire Council can only collect materials that there is a market for. Many of the lower grade plastics do not undergo the recycling process well and there is little that can be done with the material. The higher grade plastics, which are usually what plastic bottles are made from, have more uses as a recycled product and so there is a higher demand for these from manufacturers.

Bedding, clothing, shoes, children's toys, food and garden waste have been found in the recycling sorting facility. These can cause the plant big problems, as clothes get wrapped around the mechanical sorting equipment and organic materials block or cover technical sensors. If this happens, the plant must operate at a quarter of its usual speed to try and deal with all of the problems these materials cause. As a result, many sorting facilities impose a limit on the amount of material that can be included within the recycling stream, that is not recyclable. For East Northamptonshire, that limit is no more than five per cent. If the percentage is higher than this the council will incur additional costs.

So what can be recycled in East Northamptonshire? Please put as many of the following as possible in your green lidded bin:

- Aerosols (empty)
- Cans and tins (food, drink and pet food)
- Cardboard (including greetings cards)
- Foil (clean please)
- Food and drink cartons
- Glass jars and bottles
- Paper (newspapers, magazines, catalogues, junk mail and directories)
- Plastic bottles (please remove lids)
- Plastic packaging (food trays, margarine tubs and yogurt pots)
- Shredded paper



Your recycling bin will be left if it contains any of the following:

- Animal bedding
- Bedding
- Black sacks
- Cable ties
- Carrier bags
- Clothes or shoes
- Crisp packets or sweet wrappers
- Electrical items (such as kettles or toasters)
- Food waste
- Green waste
- Hard plastics (such as CD/DVD cases, storage crates or washing up bowls)
- Metal items (such as saucepans, cutlery or knives)
- Nappies or wipes
- Plant pots.
- Plastic toys
- Polystyrene packing or beads
- Shrink or bubble wrap
- Wiring
- Wood

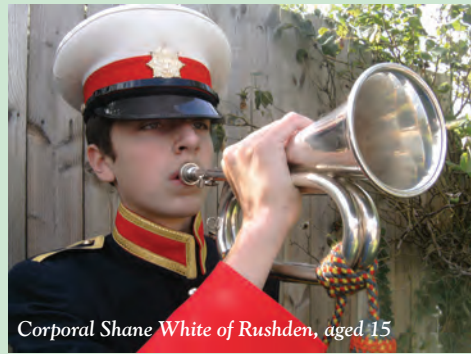
Somme buglers

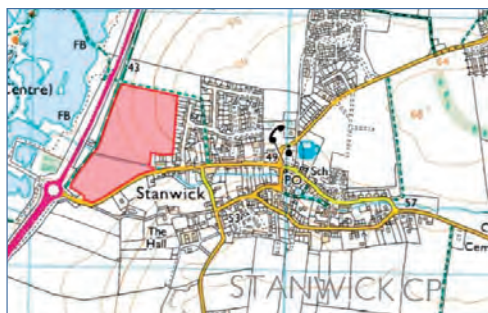

Household Enquiry Forms – the whys and wherefores

Some of you will receive a Household Enquiry Form as part of the changes to the voter registration system. This form is being sent from East Northamptonshire Council to those who were not re-registered automatically and are still to be invited to register.

To identify who is eligible to vote, the council needs to know who is resident at each address in the district. The Household Enquiry Form is not a registration form. Instead, it provides the council with information on who lives in the household so they can then invite occupants to register to vote, if needed.

If you receive one of these forms, you need to include the name and nationality of all those resident who are eligible to register to vote. You can register to vote if you usually live in the UK and are aged 16 or older. You must also be a British, Irish or European Union citizen, or a Commonwealth citizen who is able to remain in the UK. If anyone listed on the form is not living at your address, their name can be crossed out.

Please make sure the Household Enquiry Form is completed and returned in the pre-paid envelope as soon as possible. By law, you need to provide the information requested on

the form and ensure it is correct, to avoid penalties. You should complete and return the Household Enquiry Form even if you have already registered to vote online or returned an Individual Registration Form.

If you are struggling to complete the form yourself, please consider asking a family member or friend to help you. Otherwise telephone East Northamptonshire Council on 01832 742119, but please be aware that the call will take several minutes.

Top grades for Oundle School Sixth Form pupils

Oundle School pupils have produced another record-breaking performance in their Sixth Form examinations, with 25 per cent of the results at A* grade.

In addition, pupils have achieved 59.4 per cent of grades at either A* or A. Given that the percentage of A grades has fallen nationally for the third successive year, the school is extremely pleased with the performance of its pupils.

Eighty pupils were awarded three A grades or better and 35 pupils achieved four A grades or better. Both of these figures represent an improvement on 2013.

Twelve pupils scored at least four A* grades, beating the previous record by 50 per cent. Ellie Cook, Chris Gilmartin, Viren Pandya, Rosie Vince, Abby Wong and Brian Wong each scored five A* grades.

Twenty-two top distinction (D1) grades were awarded on the Cambridge Pre-U

course; this is graded higher than the A* at A level. As a result, 13 Oundelians so far have confirmed their places at Oxford or Cambridge Universities.

Pupil performance was strong across all subjects, with over 30 per cent of grades awarded at A* in art, economics, mathematics, further mathematics and physics.

The Headmaster, Charles Bush, said: "I am delighted that Oundle pupils have performed extremely well, confirming the excellent findings of the inspectors from the ISI earlier in the year.

"The results represent tremendous efforts by both pupils and teachers. We are grateful for the academic leadership shown by this group of pupils during their time at the school and are proud of all their achievements. They deserve real congratulations on their success and have set up some wonderful opportunities for their futures."

Back to school breakfast bake

Breakfast is a bit of a difficult one in our house. I don't like the sugar filled cereals or breakfast bars, and the kids want a bag of crisps and a chocolate bar walking up the road to school.

So we've reached a bit of compromise with milk based smoothies some days, homemade cake when I get round to it (at least it's made with eggs, natural fat and no-one notices if I reduce the sugar a bit), and complete failure on other days. Here's another option though: a savoury flapjack which mixes eggs, oats, butter, cheese and bacon giving slow release carbs, natural fats and protein – and it looks like something most kids would eat.

Cheese and bacon flapjack

- 2 eggs
- 50g butter
- 100g grated cheese
- 150g porridge oats
- 2-3 rashers cooked bacon
- Pinch mustard powder (to bring out the flavour of the cheese)
- Seasoning

Method

- 1 Grease and line a 19cm square

- baking tin. Pre-heat oven to fan 150C, standard 180C, gas mark 6
- 2 Break the bacon into small pieces. Mix together the oats, cheese, bacon pieces, mustard powder and seasoning.
- 3 Melt the butter. Lightly beat the eggs. Pour the eggs and butter into the dry ingredients and mix thoroughly.
- 4 Press the mixture firmly into the tin and bake for about 25 to 30 mins.
- 5 When cooked, allow it to cool slightly and mark into squares. Allow to cool completely and break into pieces.
- 6 Leave it lying around nonchalantly at breakfast but obviously don't suggest anyone eats it (especially not teenagers). Hope

somebody does – it'll make a good snack to take into work anyway.

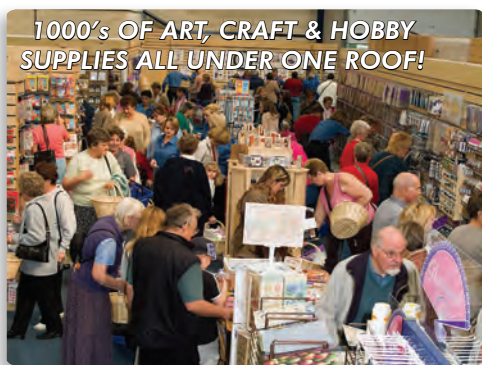

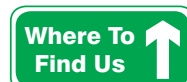

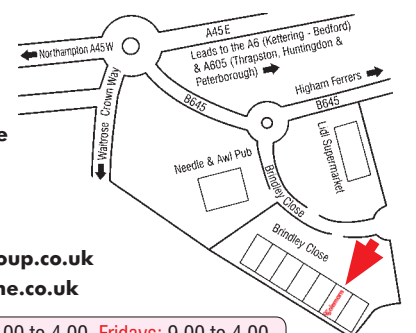
