Lottery grant for Ringstead Cinema

For the last three seasons Ringstead Cinema has been given technical support by Oundle Cinema and has used their Outreach equipment.

Now Ringstead has received a Big Lottery Fund grant enabling the purchase of a new projector and blackout blinds.

Oundle rower enjoys summer of success

Over the summer, Oundle School pupil, Anna van de Braak (16) represented Oundle School Boat Club (OSBC) at two prestigious rowing events including the British Rowing Junior Championships, where she and her fellow crew members received bronze medals.

At the British Rowing Junior Championships on 20th July, Anna competed in a composite Junior Women's Eight. Featuring rowers from five clubs in the eastern region, the crew came third overall, claiming the bronze medal.

There was a strong field, with the race being won by Henley Rowing Club, who

went on to represent Great Britain over the summer. This was the first national medal for a number of the crew members, including Anna.

At the Henley Women's Regatta back in June, Anna was part of a composite crew, racing in a Junior 16 Quad with rowers from Hollowell Scullers, St Neots Rowing

Club and Stowe School.

Rowing Coach at Oundle, Jeff Roche, commented: "The crew had limited training time, and with only three practice sessions before the regatta the crew performed well in the time trials and were one of the 16 crews to qualify for the knockout side-by-side racing. Their first round race against Star Rowing Club was close, but a good row from a well-drilled Star crew meant that the composite crew were beaten by one-and-three-quarters lengths. Despite the loss, it was a promising performance from the girls and a great opportunity to compete at a prominent event."

Anna said: "The experience of both regattas has been absolutely amazing. It was my first year competing at these events, and although we had very little time training together we also did our own training separately. I was thrilled to

receive a bronze medal."

Anna has spent the last year developing her technique and fitness in a single scull. Following a tough easter quarter when the local river was flooded, Anna went on to compete at the National Schools' Regatta in her single and battled through knockout rounds to make the finals of two different events at the Star Regatta in June. Anna will be the Girls' Captain for OSBC for the coming year.

Mr Roche added: "Training to compete at this level is never easy and it has been good to see Anna rise to the challenge and make the transition to training regularly with more purpose and consistency. Her experiences show that there are opportunities for those with the drive and ambition to compete at a high level, and I hope that she can use these achievements to motivate herself and others in the coming year."

School drama group plays to Edinburgh Fringe

Over the summer, a cast of Oundle School pupils rounded off their school drama careers in style with their production of *Just at the world's largest arts festival, the Edinburgh Festival Fringe.*

The pupils returned to Oundle in early August for rehearsals before travelling to Edinburgh for seven nights of further rehearsals and performances at Paradise in St Augustine's, just off the Royal Mile in the heart of the Fringe.

Just, a play by the Booker nominated writer Ali Smith, originally commissioned for the National Connections Festival, is a dark comedy whose political themes are couched in the absurdist traditions of Kafka, Ionesco and Brecht. At the centre is a corpse impaled with an umbrella, a blind judge, townspeople who speak in a comic chorus, an amnesiac malaprop cop, and a passionate outsider mourning an agrarian age. Their story is one of personal tragedy, the perversion of justice, a community's sinister undertone, told with Ali Smith's trademark wit and wordplay.

Play director and Oundle School English teacher, Andrew Martens, commented: "After working so intensely as a group, the cast formed a tight unit and gave consistently stellar performances to appreciative audiences, including many current and old Oundelians in Edinburgh for the festival."

Emma Kemsley-Pein said: "Just was certainly a challenging play to work on. It is far from run of the mill and as a result we had to really push ourselves and think outside the box in terms of how we were going to portray our characters and our interaction with others onstage."

"The political nature of the play is thought provoking and encouraged us to consider the wider effects of imbalances of justice and power. I'm sure I can speak on behalf of the whole cast when I say it was an unforgettable week in Edinburgh."

When not on stage, the pupils enjoyed the Royal Mile and other areas packed with festival-goers, handing out fliers to prospective punters, and soaking up the atmosphere of such a unique cultural experience.

Everyone took full advantage of the vast opportunities to enjoy the wealth of theatre on tap, and by the last night each pupil had seen at least 20 different shows over the course of the week.

The cast included pupil leavers Robbie Younger (18), Livvy Sellers (19), and Georgie Anstey (18), with current pupils Emma Kemsley-Pein (17), Alex Wallitt (17), Monica Dahiya (17), Annabelle Sherwood (17), Dylan Martens (16), and Polly Halstead (17) as stage manager.

Livvy Sellers will be starting a course at Central Drama School later this year.

Higham choir honours Henry Chichele

On the Monday and Tuesday of the August Bank Holiday, the choir of St. Mary's Higham Ferrers travelled to Canterbury to sing evensong, close to the tomb of Henry Chichele, Higham's benefactor, who was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury 600 years ago.

The choir of some 40 men, women and juniors had wanted to celebrate the Chichele anniversary in music, and was invited to sing at this, the most important cathedral in the Church of England. They had spent the last year raising money to pay for transport and

all overnight expenses.

On the Tuesday a second coach went from Higham taking parishioners on a Canterbury pilgrimage. Tuesday evening saw the choir concluding evensong, by singing William Byrd's Sacerdotes Domini around the beautiful Chichele tomb.

Music Director, Tony Edwards said: "It was a marvellous experience for all of us, a great privilege and a very moving experience for the choir to be able to honour Henry Chichele in this way, on behalf of the whole town. Now it's back to psalms and anthems each Sunday at St. Mary's."

LNR cadets pay tribute to Rushden Lance Corporal

On 28th August members of the Leicestershire, Northamptonshire and Rutland (LNR) Army Cadet Force (ACF), whose units are affiliated to a number of local regiments including the 9/12th Lancers, gathered in Rushden to remember and celebrate the life of Lance Corporal Harry Knight.

Harry was from Rushden and was a member of the 12th Lancers when he was killed in battle, exactly 100 years earlier; he was the first soldier from Rushden to be reported killed.

It was on 28th August 1914 that the 12th Lancers made a charge against the Prussian Dragoon Guards near the village of Moÿ-de-l'Aisne, northern France. This was one of the last events of its kind in modern

warfare and was where Harry Knight lost his life to an enemy bullet, just a month after the start of the conflict.

Major Tony Turner, Officer Commanding, D Company, LNR ACF, said that the members of Leicestershire, Northamptonshire and Rutland Army Cadet Force were proud and honoured to be present

to represent the regiment and stand with the family of Lance Corporal Knight to pay tribute to a 'Brother Lancer'.

He commented: "We do not forget, we remember; we remember Lance Corporal Harry Knight and give thanks for his life and his sacrifice, simply saying 'Thank you Harry, may god bless you and watch over you, we will never forget'."

Ferdi's Kitchen

Verdure Verdi con Aglio e Olio d'Oлива / Green Vegetables with Garlic and Olive Oil

Serves 4 to 6

INGREDIENTS

- 50ml olive oil
- 4 large garlic cloves (or 6 small cloves) finely sliced
- 100g broccoli crown and stem (approx. ½ medium broccoli crown)
- 100g green beans (ends trimmed) sliced in half
- 100g helda beans (ends trimmed) sliced into three
- 1 lemon – juice and zest
- Boiling water to just cover the vegetables
- Salt and pepper
- Finely chopped parsley (optional)
- Extra virgin olive oil for drizzling (optional)

METHOD

- Place a deep-lipped frying pan or wok onto a medium-low heat, add the olive oil and garlic and gently fry for a minute. Be careful not to burn or brown the garlic too much as this will make it bitter.
- Turn the heat up to medium.
- Add all the vegetables, the lemon zest and a pinch of salt and pepper.
- Use two wooden spoons (metal spoons tends to cut the vegetables) and gently toss the vegetables to coat them well with the olive oil and garlic.
- Continue to toss and gently fry the vegetables for about five minutes.
- Boil enough water to just cover the vegetables.
- Once you have finished frying the vegetables, turn the heat to high and add the boiling water. Add salt to taste to the water.
- Boil rapidly until the vegetables are just done but still a bit crisp. You can test this with the point of a sharp knife.
- Drain the vegetables and put into a serving bowl.
- Sprinkle the vegetables with lemon juice (all the juice of the lemon or to taste). Optional: add some finely chopped parsley; add a drizzle of good quality extra virgin olive oil. Toss gently and serve.

Oundle Music Trust will present a rich and wide-ranging season of Music in Quiet Places concerts, in venues in Oundle and Geddington this autumn.

Introducing street songs from Shakespeare’s time, taking in music and poetry from the Front during the First World War and culminating in music from a Schubert-based folk-rock band this is a wonderfully diverse and engaging programme from the Trust’s new Artistic Director, Kenneth Richardson.

“This varied and unusual line up of concerts in my first Music in Quiet Places series,” he explains, “and should appeal to a broad audience. I hope it might tempt some who maybe think classical music is not for them to come and try it out.”

Launching the season on Friday 26th September at 7.45pm in St Peter’s Church in Oundle will be ‘Letters from the Front’ – a

combination of songs inspired by a world at war and soldiers’ letters, performed by Adam Sullivan (tenor), Joseph Padfield (baritone) and Gavin Roberts (piano).

The events of four long years during WW1 inspired an outpouring of extraordinary words and music from some of the greatest writers and composers of the age – on both sides of the conflict – Butterworth, Elgar, Fauré, Gurney, Hindemith, Korngold, Poulenc and Puccini among many others.

As well as poetry and music, these years also produced writing of a more intimate and personal nature as young soldiers wrote letters to keep their families up to speed with life on the Front Line. Read by young men from Oundle and Prince William schools, this evening is a tribute to the fallen and to those left behind.

On Friday 10th October in the Church

of St Mary Magdalene in Geddington at 7.30pm folk/early music specialists Alva will entertain the audience with street songs from Shakespeare’s time. In those days the streets were full of singers, competing to be heard. With cries and songs they spread the latest news, spun fabulous tales or sold their wares. They even brought Shakespeare himself to the streets with ballads telling gripping tales of King Lear and Titus Andronicus, or the mad pranks of Puck.

A captivating cast of Shakespearean characters make an appearance during the programme together with fairies, ghosts, goblins, and even the devil himself, in this concert which celebrates the 450th anniversary of the Bard’s birth.

And to round off the autumn season will be the wonderfully inventive Schubert-based folk-rock band, The Erklings. Comprising three classically trained multi-

instrumentalists, the band will perform new arrangements of Schubert’s finest songs in fresh and original English translations. Equally comfortable in an elegant concert house or a noisy club, The Erklings are the only group around getting audiences dancing to Goethe and Schiller.

The band was founded by American baritone and classical guitarist Bryan Benner after finally discovering a way to mix his passion for modern songwriting and his love of Schubert’s Lieder. Bryan joined forces with Austrian percussionist Thomas Toppler and Austrian cellist/brass specialist Gabriel Hopfmueller and thus The Erklings were born. Taking place on Friday 7th November at 7.30pm in Prince William School hall, Oundle, this is one concert not to be missed.

Tour of a lifetime



Oundle School hockey club

This summer saw Oundle School's girls' hockey club make the most of the long school break, with a three-week overseas tour.

In the heat and humidity of Malaysia, the sun of Sydney and the rain of New Zealand's winter, the group of 34 girls played a total of 20 matches against local schools and clubs. They soon found that playing on tour is very different to playing school matches during the hockey season – one of the major benefits of such tour experiences.

Large squads and some challenging conditions (not to mention weather variances) helped develop the players' understanding of the fast and frequent substitutions that are now part of hockey. The girls made the most out of the opportunity to play in new positions, therefore gaining a better understanding

of different types of defensive press and formations.

New skills and ideas were tested out in competitive matches, something which is not always possible during term time. This helped boost the girls' confidence and soon saw them trying aerials, drag-flicks and transferring the ball more often, improving their game considerably.

Overall, the tour offered much in the way of developing the pupils' hockey, not least by playing both club sides and school teams whose patterns and ideas were well established. The girls were also lucky enough to train at Sydney's Olympic Stadium under the guidance of Larry Macintosh, Head Coach at the NSW Institute of Sport.

Throughout the tour, the standard of hockey was well balanced, with the Oundle girls winning nine, drawing three and losing

eight of their games. For coaches, such balance on tour is important as it shows that the challenges faced were appropriate for developing the teams.

As with any school tour, time away from pitches and planes is a must as it gives pupils valuable opportunities to expand their cultural and linguistic horizons. Highlights are often those times spent with host families, with the pupils learning about the places they are visiting.

Time was spent exploring the cities, with surfing in Sydney and climbing the iconic Sydney Harbour Bridge being two memorable experiences. Malaysia and Australasia offered tremendous contrasts, from the bustle of Kuala Lumpur's markets and temples to Sydney's Taronga Zoo and then on to the crafts and culture of New Zealand's Maoris.

Travel, matches and exploring meant a packed and challenging itinerary, but the girls returned eager to start the hockey season in September and with a strong appetite to explore the Far East further in future years.

The Great War commemoration on 4th August coincided with the tour's stop in New Zealand, and the girls took the opportunity to mark 100 years since war was declared, by laying a wreath at the New Zealand Cenotaph in memory of the Old Oundelians and the ANZACS who gave their lives.

Gareth Terrett, Head of Hockey at Oundle, commented: "The tour offered a tremendous amount for the girls. Not only did they have a lot of fun travelling together and exploring new places, but they improved their level of hockey significantly thanks to the amount of tour time dedicated to matches and skills.

"Ideas on the pitch have now been established and these will filter into teams at

all levels in the school. All the tour members had the opportunity to play against older and more experienced players. In doing so, they learned a great deal about team play and ways in which to develop their own skills. I am now very much looking forward to seeing their experiences being put into practice this coming season."

I also enjoyed the Proms in the Park in Rushden Hall Park. Having started this now annual event when I was Mayor of Rushden five years ago, it is wonderful to see that it has become a Rushden tradition and is enjoyed by many people every year.

September sees the start of a busier period for Mayors and Chairmen with lots of events after the relative quiet of August. Let's hope we get a bit more sunshine before autumn sets in.

In a couple of articles recently I've highlighted leading chess players making basic errors in competition matches. This must be particularly galling for them knowing that their schoolboy errors will come under scrutiny from players around the world.

One such error occurred in this year's Politiken Cup. This competition is held annually in Denmark and has a long history stretching back to 1979. It attracts many of the top players and gives an opportunity for up and coming players to pit themselves against the Grand Masters.

Round One of this year's competition saw Richard Rapport, a Grand Master from Hungary competing against Tim Rogers from Hackney. Although Tim is not a Grand Master he has a very high ranking and should not have been out of his depth. Rapport was playing white and started with the king's pawn moving two squares – this is regarded as one of the most popular openings, as

it frees the queen and the king's bishop. Richard later moved his queen to e2 which was crucial to the checkmate that came after five moves.

Tim was beaten in less time than it took him to consume the coffee and rye bread breakfast in his hotel that morning. One can only speculate about his reception at Hackney Chess Club. I'm sure they treated him very gently.

For those of you who want to reproduce Tim's embarrassing blunder and are familiar with chess notation, the game is as follows: 1. e4 c6 2. Nc3 d5 3. Qe2 dxe4 4. Nxe4 Nd7 5. Nd6# {Checkmate.}
