NEWS IN BRIEF

Band brings more silverware home
In January, Rushden Town Band were promoted to the Second Section of the Brass Band world, having won the Third Section last year.

On Sunday 8th March, they went back to Bedworth to compete in the Second Section of the Midland Area Championships. This is the first time in the band's history that they have competed at this level in the Areas.

Having played sixth out of 12 bands, they had to wait over two hours for the adjudication. To their delight, they were placed second. This means that, for the second time in two years, they have qualified for the National Brass Band Championships at Cheltenham Racecourse in September.

OPS Epee Club fencers showered with British Championship Gold

Oundle, Peterborough & Stamford (OPS) Epee Club have enjoyed two weekends in a row of amazing national success.

The club, which runs its main club sessions in Peterborough and Oundle, has not yet been

in existence four years but the success so far has been remarkable.

The club's head coach, Chris Howser, recently added the 2015 British Veterans title to his Commonwealth title, which he won in 2014 (Veterans are classed as over

40 years old in fencing).

After a 10 out of 10 winning record in the preliminary rounds, Chris was second seed going into the knockout stage of the event. Storming through the field of 80 fencers, Chris pretty much dismantled his opponents through to the semi-finals, with the closest match 10-6 to that stage.

In the semi-finals he met Nigel Fancourt, a former senior GB squad fencer, and a far tighter match ensued, which at one point was 8-8; however, Chris scored the final two points to win 10-8. The final against Steven Domek, who also on occasion comes to OPS Epee Club to train, started well for Chris, pulling out a lead from the start, and following a mix of in-fighting and long distance hits, Chris won his first National Veterans Championships with a 10-7 scoreline.

At the other end of the age scale, fencers from OPS Epee competed one week earlier at the British School Team Championships at Brunel

University, with even more success.

Kings School Peterborough scored a marvellous win in the Year 9/10 Girls event, with Grace Wyr-Roberts, Holly Elkington and Chloe Elkington beating possibly Britain's most successful sporting school, Millfield School, in the final. This was then followed up with a Bronze for the Year 9/10 Boys team by Marcus Arnold, Harvey Stephens Dunn and Henry Hart.

Oundle & King's Cliffe Middle School continued the local success, with the Year 7/8 Girls team defending their Epee title; however, also tripling up by winning the Sabre and Foil titles as well. This is the equivalent to winning Rugby League, Rugby Union 15 a side and Rugby 7s in the same weekend.

With no team getting closer than 45-21 this was a complete domination and with this being the last ever OKCMS appearance at the championships, with the school closing in the summer,

it was a great way to finish.

Well done to Ellie Taylor, Maisie McCormack and Rachel Lever for winning all three, as well as Amber Yarland and Taylor Sheehan who joined their medal winning team in the Epee.

For a fairly newly established club to have its fencers winning four British School Team championships, as well as an additional Bronze medal, shows how hard the kids work to reach the top of their potential.

Well done to all those involved, including the other local school teams who attended and gained great experience ready for future year's events.

With OPS Epee Club now running the Yarwell Musketeers Club for younger kids, fencing locally is available for those from five years and older and with the next beginner courses starting soon, now is a great time to get into the sport. With less than 100 days to go before the General Election, I'm rallying readers to get behind Cancer Research UK's Cross Cancer Out campaign and urge their candidates to help save lives.

New figures show one in two of us will be diagnosed with cancer at some point in our lives, so it's absolutely vital that the NHS is fit to offer all cancer patients the best chance of surviving.

We cannot underestimate the devastating impact the disease will have on families in Corby now and in the future. Local statistics show there are 24,500 cases of cancer each year in the East Midlands.

I am an oncology nurse, therefore I see the daily struggles patients go through when fighting

cancer. I also see the sadness and heartbreak that cancer brings to families and patients. I am passionate about beating cancer, so no one ever has to suffer with this awful disease. I hope for the day where I'll be able to say to all patients, 'You are cured'.

Cancer Research UK is calling for all election candidates to back measures to ensure people with cancer receive the best treatment and are diagnosed early enough for that treatment to make a difference. These must be key priorities if the next Government is to save more lives.

Currently, survival rates in the UK are still lagging behind the best in Europe and too many cancers are diagnosed at an advanced stage, when they are harder to treat successfully.

Council Tax frozen for 2015/16

East Northamptonshire Council has frozen its share of the Council Tax bill in a bid to support residents who are struggling with their household finances.

Councillors agreed the move at this year's budget meeting that East Northamptonshire Council's portion of the Council Tax, for a Band D property, will remain at £123.65 per year. However, the amount residents pay in Council Tax overall could still increase, depending on decisions reached by Northamptonshire County Council, The Office of Northamptonshire Police and Crime Commissioner and the other precepting authorities, including the district's towns and parishes.

At the same time as announcing the freeze, Council Leader, Steven North summarised the successes of the past year:

"I'm delighted that very careful handling of our finances allowed me to recommend a zero increase in Council Tax for the forthcoming municipal year. Despite a difficult financial climate, we've managed to balance the budget and make effective use of funding streams such as the New Homes Bonus to continue providing quality services. We've used over £500,000 on community projects and supported the roll out of superfast broadband.

"Local government has faced significant cuts in funding this year but we have quietly got on with it, making the necessary changes and protecting the taxpayer where we can, including freezing our portion of Council Tax."

East Northamptonshire Council currently has the lowest Council Tax of any council in Northamptonshire, and one of the lowest in the country.

Genealogy jottings

Hello again, I have a friend who lives in Hertfordshire and, when I moved to this area, her eyes lit up! One branch of her family were Hudsons and she had found traces of them through the censuses in Glapthorn, Deene and Bulwick. I think that I might have a visitor staying with me when the weather warms up.

I managed to find some of the gravestones in the churchyard of St Leonard's, Glapthorn that belonged to her ancestors and so was able to take some photographs and send them to her to whet her appetite. It can be frustrating trying to read the gravestones as some have weathered better than others, but have you tried looking for those belonging to your ancestors at all?

When I was a child, I was taken to my local cemetery on a regular basis to visit the grave of my grandfather, who had died nine years before I was born. This led me to have a morbid fascination with the diverse gravestones that had been erected as memorials. There is quite an array of different designs that can be found, many of the older ones depicting the trade or occupation of the person in the grave. I have an ancestor who was a blacksmith and his grave has an anvil carved into the headstone. In graveyards close to the coast, some headstones have anchors carved into them, depicting that the person below was once a sailor.

The next time that you are near gravestones, perhaps taking a short cut from one part of the town to another, take a moment to have a look at the craft of the stonemasons. You may see something that you have not noticed before.

Ringstead village gridlocked by history exhibition

Ringstead Heritage Group's recent inaugural Coffee Morning brought traffic to a standstill as up to 300 people visited the Village Hall to look at over 60 old photographs, read about past farming memories from the 1940s, view press clippings of events from the 20th century.

A prominent exhibit was the lost painting of Ringstead School, by J.L.Carr, Interim Headmaster during 1952.

There were also a number of Be Be Dolls and Toys on loan including a four-foot tall teddy bear, which once belonged to Albert Fox, General Manager of Be Be Dolls of Ringstead.

During the event an anonymous donation was given to the group: a blue and pink bear, made by Be Be Dolls, which will now be a permanent memento of that company's past association with the village.

David Ball, author of two Ringstead People books, was able to encourage and advise other residents to begin tracing

their family ancestry. He sold out of all his books at the coffee morning, but is reprinting second editions which will be available to purchase at future events.

BBC Radio Northampton's Saturday Treasure Quest programme featured the Coffee Morning as the last clue for Helen Blaby to guess, and that morning she well and truly trounced the opposition from BBC Three Counties Radio.

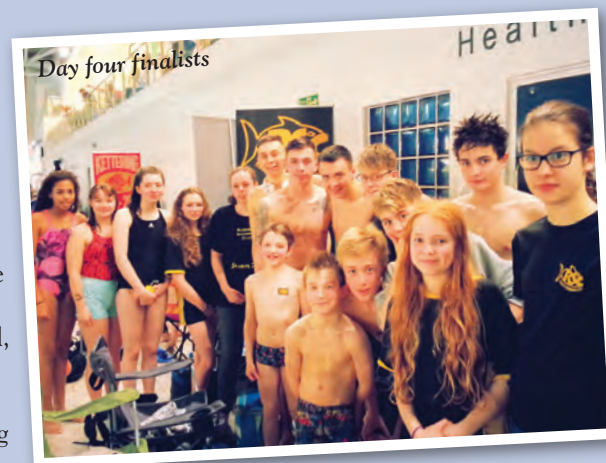

Commemorative service – Battle of Gallipoli 1915–1916

The Rushden Branch of the Royal British Legion is to hold a short commemorative service at Rushden’s War Memorial on Saturday 25th April commencing at 10.45am to both mark the start of the Battle of Gallipoli and remember the fallen.

Taking place in Gallipoli, Turkey, the Gallipoli Campaign of 1915–16, also known as the Battle of Gallipoli or the Dardanelles Campaign, was an unsuccessful attempt by the Allied Powers to control the sea route from Europe to Russia during the First World War.

The campaign began with a failed naval attack by British and French ships on the Dardanelles Straits in February and March 1915 and continued with a major land invasion of the Gallipoli Peninsula on 25th April 1915, involving British and French troops as well as divisions of the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps (ANZAC).

Lack of sufficient intelligence and knowledge of the terrain, along with a fierce Turkish resistance, hampered

the success of the invasion. By mid-October 1915, Allied Forces had suffered heavy casualties and had made little headway from their initial landing sites. Evacuation began in December 1915, and was completed early the following January.

The commemorative service is to remember the nine military personnel from Rushden who died during the Battle of Gallipoli. Their names are inscribed on the War Memorial and they are:

Rusty players strike the right note

When 20 people from the Oundle area met in a pub in 2009 to discuss the possibility of forming an amateur orchestra, they never envisaged that, six years later, their numbers would have grown to more than 60, with almost every orchestral instrument represented.

They did, however, recognise that adults of any age can welcome the chance of taking up an instrument again, or even of starting to play one.

Typically, people may have learned to play in their youth, but the pressures of work, family and life in general have often squeezed actual playing out of their lives.

Later on, some of these pressures may have relaxed and they rediscover their instrument, unplayed in its case!

Others may have kept up

their playing, but have taken up a second instrument as well, and they may be looking for a chance to play this additional one. There are also people who have taken up an instrument later on in life, who are now keen to play with others.

For all these categories, the Rusty Players of Oundle (RPO) provides the chance for players of a wide spectrum of ability to play a variety of music in a sociable and supportive environment.

"The trick is to aspire to a reasonable standard of performance, while at the same time maintaining a feeling of fun and being tolerant of the odd wrong note or timing," says Conductor Vince Davy.

The orchestra has grown steadily, with players attracted through word of mouth or via the RPO website. Rehearsals



take place twice a month, with breaks during January and June to August, to allow for family holidays, etc. Subscriptions are extremely low, at only £30 per year, to

cover the costs of venue hire and sheet music purchase.

After tentative beginnings, the RPO now aims to give at least one free concert each year, sometimes two, aimed mainly at family and friends but open to others as well.

Typically, these are held in local churches such as Fotheringhay or Titchmarsh, and have proved popular with the village communities.

"At last summer's gig in Titchmarsh Church," says

clarinettist Peter Irving, who in common with many players, drives some distance to participate, "we included an arrangement of the 1812 Overture, equipping the audience with paper bags for them to burst, to augment the effect of cannon fire. They loved it!"

Asked what targets still remained for the orchestra, secretary Chris Gill said: "It would be great to have a bigger percussion section, where our

self-taught Caroline Hawkins valiantly hits her timpani, and many other things besides, all by herself.

"There must be drummers out there, banished to their spare rooms or garden sheds, just dying for the chance to play percussion in an orchestral setting! More trombones would be good, too."

East Midlands Housing organisations unite to support national Homes for Britain campaign

Nine regions, six events, one housing crisis...

A shortage of housing threatens the potential growth and development of local communities and economies. As East Midlands based housing providers, we are well aware of the challenges that exist in our region alone.

"As part of raising the profile of the Homes for Britain campaign and the national housing rally, joint events like the one we have co-ordinated are fundamentally important to ensuring that the housing crisis is at the forefront of the minds of politicians and the general public ahead of the election.

Rushden Academy teacher to visit Bosnia

Jo Holmes, Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural (SMSC) Development lead at Rushden Academy, an Education Fellowship academy, has been invited to visit Bosnia on a four-day study tour from 18th–21st May by the national charity Remembering Srebrenica.

The charity has been increasing its engagement with young people in schools and universities across the UK in order to teach a new generation about the impact of hatred and intolerance through learning about the Srebrenica genocide.

Jo is delighted to be one of a small group of educational representatives from Northamptonshire invited on the tour following Rushden Academy's involvement with the charity last summer.

She said: "Remembering Srebrenica has attracted a number of 'Champions' – including

Inspector Inam Kahn from Northamptonshire Police – who are delivering a flagship educational programme called 'Lessons from Srebrenica'. They organise events and workshops locally to raise awareness of the impact of genocide, and work towards the rejection of racism and extremism in our community.

"At the end of the summer term 2014, Rushden Academy became involved in a community project, taking part in a poster competition to commemorate lives lost in Srebrenica. One of our students, Karl Mercado, now in Year 10, designed the winning poster for the county with his thought-provoking art work. The project was part of a wider SMSC educational opportunity within our school, embedded in promoting fundamental British values for our students.

"The study tour includes visiting Sarajevo itself, meeting key representatives from

the Muslim community, visiting a forensic anthropological unit and a war cemetery and travelling extensively throughout the region to gain a greater understanding of the atrocities. I am passionate about sharing the learning gained from this experience with our students and keeping these stories as alive as possible."

Jo will be putting together a programme to educate Rushden Academy's students on a war that took place only a short time before they were born, in a disputed land not that far away. From a historical perspective it will take into account consequences of the Second World War, including the Iron Curtain and Communism, as well as exploring the cultural and religious groups who were expected to co-exist under Tito's rule.

Follow-up work will allow the exploration of the spiritual and religious impact on Bosnia, how the war affected the survivors socially, financially

and culturally, the moral aspect of genocide and the impact all of this has had 20 years later on family and community life.

This work will include delivering assemblies to all year groups, writing a scheme of work for the Citizenship and PSHE curriculum, and delivering a seminar to sixth form students.

Making a hash of dinner

Although some days spring feels as if it's definitely breaking through the grey of winter, on others comfort food is still just what you need. If you can make that food fast, easy, cheap and nutritious, all the better.

Salt has been used as a preservative for many generations, with corned beef getting its name from the 'corns' of salt used to produce it. Corned beef also owes some of its heritage to 'pemmican'. This is a dried meat product, notably used by the Inuit but found in many traditional diets, made by drying lean meat and mixing it with an equal quantity of fat –

producing a highly stable, sustaining food which can remain edible for years.

Replacing the potato usually included in this dish with swede, butternut squash or sweet potato lowers the carbohydrate content considerably, but you can lower it even further by using cabbage or kale instead. Using only one pan saves on the washing up and makes this an ideal dish for bedsit cooking too.

INGREDIENTS – TO SERVE 2 OR 3

340g can corned beef
1 onion
2 cloves garlic

Medium sized swede (or alternative)
Lard for frying

METHOD

Chop the swede into small cubes and boil until just soft but not falling apart. Leave to drain well. Chop the onion and garlic and fry gently until translucent. Turn up the heat, add the swede and fry until the corners start to colour. Add the corned beef and fry altogether until heated through and looking tasty. Try this with a fried egg on top and a side of kale steamed and dressed with butter, lemon juice and chilli to put an extra spring in your step.

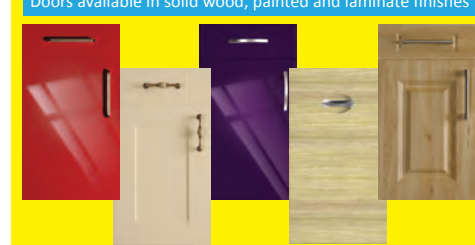
