Walking challenge encourages all residents to boost fitness

**Northamptonshire
residents are being

million steps over a
weekend in September.**

Northamptonshire has the fifth fattest population in the country and Northamptonshire County Council (NCC) is determined to tackle this issue by getting people to go out for a walk. By increasing the amount of physical exercise and activity they do, people in the county can have an increased sense of wellbeing, more self-

confidence and a better life expectancy.

NCC started a walking campaign last September and achieved nearly 25 million steps. In addition, they promoted a Health and Wellbeing Week in January this year through their LibraryPlus scheme. To continue this work, NCC are now challenging everyone who lives or works in the county to join in with one of their planned walks over the weekend of 18th–20th September. Families, couples, individuals, community

groups, businesses, societies and clubs, in fact everyone, is being asked to take a walk and then log the number of miles they covered and how many people completed that distance.

NCC are setting up special event pods at their country parks to give information and advice as well as running guided and educational ranger-led walks at these locations. LibraryPlus will run events for all ages and abilities, including buggy walks, town trails, history walks and many more,

accommodating all interests.

There is also marketing material for venues to use to promote themselves as somewhere people can visit to take part in the drive to 20 million steps and beyond.

And that's where you come in. The county can only succeed in this challenge if all residents work together; the organisers are hoping that as many people in the county as possible will take part. All venues, regardless of whether they are council-owned or not, are being encouraged to see this as an opportunity to market themselves, to drive up visitor numbers and at the same time help improve the county's health and wellbeing. Community groups and organisations located in the county could see this as a chance to pull people together and take on a walking challenge anywhere they choose; on rights-of-way in their community, at one of the

Libraries or country parks, at other outdoor attractions or indeed simply up and down their road – anywhere they can to help reach the target. The council hopes that local walking groups will also join in and use this event as part of their schedule of walks, or even as a recruiting campaign for themselves.

If this is something you think you could get involved in and make use of, either as part of a desire to help get more people walking or as a new way to market yourselves, then talk to NCC. They have a full range of marketing and promotional materials being prepared as well as 'Event Packs' for those running linked events – contact Project Manager Debbie Foster defoster@northamptonshire.gov.uk.

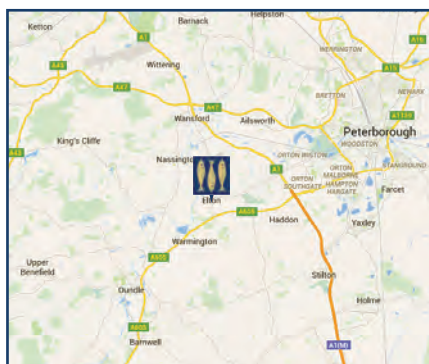

Firms invited to launch of new healthy eating award scheme

Food businesses across Northamptonshire are invited to the launch of a new scheme to reward caterers who make it easier for their customers to make healthy choices when eating out.

The Eat Out Eat Well award scheme will be unveiled at the Corn Market Hall, London Road, Kettering on Tuesday, 19th May and will be attended by The High Sheriff of Northamptonshire, Dr Ahmed Muhktar. The event will run from 10.30am to midday, with trade stands and speakers from local businesses present.

Accredited by nutrition experts, Eat Out Eat Well encourages food businesses to offer healthier options on their menus. It also aims to show how healthier cooking practices, such as grilling instead of frying, and the use of lower-fat ingredients where possible, can make a big difference.

There are three levels of the award scheme – bronze, silver and gold – based on a scoring system that takes into account the type of food on offer, how it is prepared, and how it is promoted to customers.

Initially developed by Surrey County Council, Eat Out Eat Well is being rolled out across Northamptonshire following successful pilot projects by both Daventry District Council and Kettering Borough Council.

Some of the businesses that signed up to the scheme during the pilot will become the first in the county to receive the new awards at the launch event.

The Eat Out Eat Well scheme is managed by Environmental Health Northamptonshire, through the County Food Liaison Group and co-ordinated by Environmental Health Teams at District and Borough Councils. It is open to any business serving food to the general public, including takeaways, cafes, sandwich shops and restaurants.

Those that sign up will be visited by specially-trained officers, who will look at the menu, the type of food offered, how it is prepared and how healthy options are marketed to customers.

Environmental Health Teams will also work with businesses and offer nutrition training and education. It replaces the Heartbeat scheme, which also rewarded food businesses for providing healthy options on menus.

Cllr Chris Millar, District/Borough Representative on the Northamptonshire Health and Wellbeing Board, said: "We are fortunate in Northamptonshire to have a lot of fantastic cafes and restaurants. We want to work with those businesses to help them improve further by providing healthier options to customers.

"Not only will this make it easier for our

residents to make healthier choices when eating out, but it will also give the businesses involved a competitive edge. Receiving an Eat Out Eat Well award shows you are a responsible business that puts its customers first and I would urge caterers to contact their local Health Protection teams to find out more."

Shirley Plenderleith, Head of Environmental Health at Kettering Borough Council, said: "Kettering has been one of the pilot authorities

for the introduction of the Eat Out Eat Well award. We have been really pleased with the level of enthusiasm that the businesses on the pilot have shown for adopting new approaches to offering healthy food within their menus.

"As a result of those experiences we are looking forward to helping more of our businesses to attain the award and giving the public a range of healthier choices when they eat out."

Genealogy jottings

Hello again. Last time, I touched upon newspaper articles other than obituaries and funeral notices. The sort of thing I mean are coroners' inquest reports, accident reports from the journalists of the day as well as bankruptcy announcements and the like.

I have two great great grandfathers from different branches of my family, who committed suicide. Their death certificates just stated that they had killed themselves "whilst not of sound mind". This told me nothing. However, I did know that there would have been an inquest, so off to the newspapers I went.

The first one told how the chap had walked out in front of a train on the main Ashford to London line. Lots of details were to be had in the newspaper report, concluding that the poor chap had not recovered from the death of his wife 10 months earlier. The other great great grandfather was a house painter. In Victorian times there was a lot of lead in the paint which, if you came into contact with it enough, could

poison you. This chap was suffering from a persecution complex, no doubt brought on by lead poisoning, and so killed himself. Full details were in the newspapers.

It was not just 'the common man' to whom this fate could befall. Back in 1832, one William Balderston, a surgeon who lived in St Osyth's Lane in Oundle, shot himself. In the Stamford News, the report started with the words, "A melancholy act of self-destruction was perpetrated at Oundle last week." Flowery language by today's standards but typical of the day. It went on to report in full, gory detail what a servant boy had found upon entering the room and also mentioned the coroner's inquest, where a verdict that the deceased "destroyed himself in a fit of temporary derangement" was reached.

Not for the faint-hearted, but those newspaper reports can certainly add colour to the bare facts!

Dog warden strikes once again with fine for irresponsible dog owner

Another dog owner in Rushden is paying the price for not picking up after their pooch.

On Monday, 11th May the East Northamptonshire Council dog warden spotted a woman on Newton Road, Rushden allowing her dog to foul and not clearing it up. Her explanation of not having any bags with her was not considered a good enough excuse and a Fixed

Penalty Notice has been issued for the offence.

East Northamptonshire Council dog warden, Carena Black explained: "If you own a dog you are responsible for it, so always be aware of where your dog is and what it is doing at all times. Carry plenty of bags for clearing up its mess and then you and your dog can continue your walk hassle free. Those who continue to ignore the rules

will receive a Fixed Penalty Notice which can mean an expensive dog walk."

Most dog owners are very responsible and do pick up after their pets, but some people choose to ignore the rules. Dog owners are encouraged to bag their dog's mess and get rid of it safely and for those that continue to ignore the rules, a Fixed Penalty Notice may be issued.

Council checks cabs for safety and cleanliness

The vehicles were then sent to Rushden's Park Road Motors where DVSA mechanics did an MOT-type roadworthy test.

The op was arranged by a police officer from the East Midlands Operational Support Services and took

place in Rushden at ENC's request.

Rita Groves, Licensing Enforcement Officer at ENC, said: "We take public safety very seriously here at the council and so we're glad to be working proactively with the police and DVSA to ensure our residents and visitors can travel safely around East Northants. I'm pleased the op was so well received by both drivers and operators."

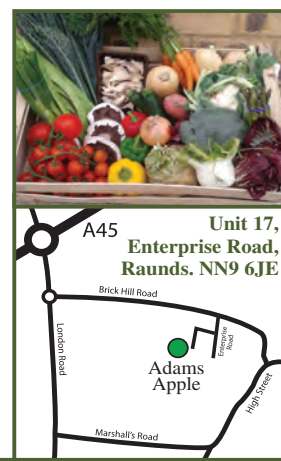

Raunds Music Festival celebrates great success

Four days of roots music, dance and local heritage events

The programme for this local music festival, now in its 14th year, provided another wide variety of musical and dance sessions and this year the organisers worked in conjunction with 'Trading Places' to bring a heritage fringe to it.

Thursday 30th April the Festival got off to a cracking start with over 50 people enjoying the atmosphere in the Snooks Club when Ock 'n' Dough and Tautas Roks hosted a Open Song 'n' Tune Session. There were plenty of singers wanting to 'voice' their talent including many members of the Raunds Ukelele Orchestra, who wowed everybody with their rendition of 'Teddy Bears Picnic'.

Friday 1st May daytime saw the culmination of nine weeks of tuition at Manor School, when 11 musicians took to the stage and played their melodeons, and 90 children took part in some enthusiastic folk dancing.

Friday evening in the Saxon Hall saw the Northants based band Ock 'n' Dough take to the stage for the sold out Festival Ceilidh. Audience participation was encouraged and many took to the dancefloor immediately to learn the dances and have a go, come what may! Many younger members of families were also very keen to dance in a more traditional style alongside their parents – could this be a change for the better?

During the interval entertainment came from the ever more popular 30-piece Raunds Ukulele Orchestra, which performed an intriguing and beguiling range of musical gems from the past through to the present.

Saturday 2nd May heralded more events including dancing on Raunds Square with the Moulton Morris Men, Cross Key Clog and Tap 'n' Sync alongside community stalls and traditional craft displays. Over lunchtime, at The World Upside Down, Tautas Roks hosted the Fast and Furious Tune Session whilst at The Saxon Hall, the Raunds Community Choir took to the stage to sing an eclectic mix of folk and popular songs. The afternoon concert featured Northampton's King's Gambit band, playing original folk tunes but

with a banging beat ensuring everyone was tapping their feet. They were supported by The Old Speckled Men, which appears to be a misnomer, when you realise Hilary is not only vocals but also the double bassist as well.

The evening's entertainment started with a set of contemporary songs from the Raunds Manor School band, The Fallen Mavericks, and from their reception this is one local band to follow as they have a lot of talent between them. Then the atmosphere changed into a 'rocked up' folk evening of full blown blasting folk tunes from support band Tautas Roks, who previously at Raunds have opened for many big name artistes including The Blockheads and The Albion Band. This is a band going great places and they had the audience well and truly bouncing.

Then on came Blackbeard's Tea Party, a contemporary Folk Rock Band who explore more exotic musical genres. Their multi talents in playing a selection of instruments as well as their searing vocals and stage antics brought the audience to fever pitch and so fulfilled another great evening's entertainment.

Slowly Sunday morning saw the lunchtime Festival Folk Club limber up, with Ock 'n' Dough and special guests ensuring everybody had an opportunity to relax and enjoy the ambience of good locally sourced real ales and food to sustain them for the remainder of the sessions.

The afternoon's entertainment was a return visit by the Raunds Temperance Band playing a selection of their prize-winning numbers and their award-winning performance is well deserved.

There were two sessions to round off the festival. Firstly, a concert from the renowned multi-instrumentalist and singer Steve Turner, who has been performing since the late 1960s and has worked alongside many of the greats in British folk roots including Nic Jones, Martin Carthy, Peter Bellamy and Martin Simpson. Steve was ably supported by Northamptonshire's truly unique local singer Kevin Buxton playing guitar and blowing a

very mean and sometimes moody harmonica.

The final evening concert was a true triumph, as the artists were Brooks Williams and The Miranda Sykes Trio. Miranda has one of those 'back of the neck' voices and was joined by her regular musical partner Rex Preston, who has developed an exuberant and flamboyant style of playing his mandolin – and with USA based Grant Gordy on guitar and banjo, the audience were treated to a 'real cracker' of a performance. Miranda is also well known as a regular sideman for Show Of Hands.

Brooks Williams had just completed an eight-day European tour, and had to hotfoot it from Zeebrugge overnight in order to make it in time onto the stage at Raunds. He thrilled the capacity audience with his virtuoso guitar playing, along with his silky smooth singing of heritage blues and original stunning songs. These two acts brought to a close a magnificent four-day festival of folk roots music, dance and heritage culture in the East Northants district.

Portuguese Tomatada / Portuguese tomato sauce

This is the third of five Southern European tomato sauce recipes. Each with its own subtle difference in taste. You can use this on its own or as a base for other recipes. It's a great time-saver if prepared in bulk.

You can freeze suitable sized portions for later use and it makes for a quick and easy start to preparing a delicious meal. Halve or double the recipe as desired.

Grill a thick tuna steak or oily fish, such as mackerel or sardines, and top with a few spoonfuls of this flavoursome sauce. Sprinkle a little fresh chopped parsley, oregano or dill as a garnish. Add chopped fresh chillies and cilantro for a spicy sauce for roasted or barbecued chicken.



METHOD

- 1 Add the olive oil to a large saucepan on medium heat. Sauté the onions and bell peppers for 3 minutes or until onions are soft. Add the garlic, chilli and anchovies and sauté until the anchovies have dissolved.
- 2 Add the sugar and spices and stir. Add the rest of the ingredients and stir.
- 3 Cook on low heat, semi-covered with the lid, for 1 – 1 ½ hours. Stir every 20 minutes or so. Break up the tomatoes whilst stirring. If the sauce thickens too much, add a little water and continue cooking.
- 4 Remove from heat and taste for seasoning. Adjust with salt, pepper or a pinch of sugar if necessary. Allow to cool. Remove the bay leaves.
- 5 Place in containers of suitable portion size and freeze. If you prefer a smooth sauce process it in batches in a food processor, electric blender or in the pot with an electric stick blender until the desired smoothness is achieved.
