Steven North re-elected as East Northamptonshire Council leader

Steven North was re-elected unopposed as Leader of East Northamptonshire Council at the 45th annual meeting in May. He is also leader of the ruling Conservative group and a member for Rushden Sartoris ward.

Councillor Glenn Harwood MBE was elected as deputy leader and pledged his support to Councillor North, to the council and to the district.

At the meeting, Councillor North said: "I am, once again, honoured to be asked to lead this council and remain as proud of our district as ever."

"Despite challenging local government finances, this council remains well run with one of the lowest Council Tax rates in the country. We remain in a reasonably sound financial position and yet again have delivered a balanced budget, without using the reserves to do so."

"We've seen the Joint

Core Strategy accepted which supports a sensible approach to the delivery of housing numbers and to delivering homes with an increased minimum plot size.

"As well as housing, we also look to deliver higher quality and better job choice in the district. Opportunities across the district will be developed with the help of our new head of commercial development, focusing on the growth agenda and a more commercial approach to service delivery."

"These are exciting times for East Northamptonshire with the opening of Rushden Lakes and all of its employment, retail and visitor opportunities;

the new contract with Freedom Leisure who now run our sports centres and healthy and active outreach programme; the Destination Nene Valley project which promotes the Nene Valley as a destination of choice for visitors and locals and, finally, a new waste contract which will continue to provide the excellent service that residents value, plus some improvements."

Acknowledging the support and confidence of those around him, Steven added: "None of this can be achieved without the hard work and dedication from staff and members, so thank you all. And thank you for your support."

Dear Editor,
Maybe a corner has been turned in the battle to save Fineshade Wood. In 2012 the Forestry Commission placed the wood on a secret list for development as a holiday resort by Forest Holidays. Aggressive planning applications were beaten off by means of a local campaign which culminated in East Northants planners unanimously rejecting the scheme. The FC hadn't realised that this Ancient Woodland was full of rich and precious wildlife. Nor did they realise how much this tranquil public forest was valued by local people. Despite their defeat, Forest Holidays have continued to make threatening noises.

Now Natural England and Butterfly Conservation are basing a high profile environmental project in Fineshade. 'Back from the Brink' will reintroduce the Chequered Skipper butterfly and carry out habitat work to benefit a range of other threatened species. We are delighted that the FC have decided to back the project and this summer they are also reviewing Fineshade's potential as an opportunity for Forest Holidays. Will Fineshade finally be free of the threat of inappropriate development? Perhaps FC managers will now decide to work with, rather

than against, the East Northants community. More details and how to help here: www.fineshade.org.uk.

Editor's notes

We have just had a general election like no other, with a distinct Presidential flavour to the campaigning and an outcome which seems to do little to enable the resolution of the larger issues confronting the government. We appear to be heading for a Conservative and Democratic Unionist Party coalition but Government by coalition is seldom the recipe for the much vaunted strong and stable leadership, so at what price will this one be held together? At least consistency was maintained in our area with Peter Bone and Tom Pursglove re-elected. Similarly, in terms of the District Council, Steven North has been re-elected Council Leader and the Council's mini-manifesto set out in this edition highlights sound financial management, housing, support services and employment opportunities as priorities; none of this may be surprising but as ever the devil will be in the detail of the delivery.

While on the subject of local Councils, it's encouraging to see that more communities in our District are getting to grips with their Neighbourhood Plans. These will give local people a voice in the development of their

towns and parishes, particularly in the context of housing development. However, the article on Neighbourhood Planning in this edition demonstrates that the majority of Town and Parish Councils still have not embarked on the planning process, so there remains much to do.

Commuters and anyone taking to the roads will do well to check for information about road closures before setting out. The County Council have embarked on a much needed programme to improve road surfaces but the necessary consequence is temporary closures and restrictions. Similarly, the area around the Rushden Lakes development is subject to disruption as the final touches are added to the local infrastructure.

As summer gets into gear there are plenty of events to keep us entertained and hopefully the details of most of what's on offer can be found on the pages of this edition of the Nene Valley News. So, whether it's visiting other people's gardens, beer and brass band concerts or fringe festivals, do take advantage of what promises to be some excellent weather and get out and about in the coming weeks.

to the West Midlands, staff held three fun-filled events throughout the month, helping to raise hundreds for the Stroke Association.

Lovingly-created cakes and cookies went up for grabs at bake sales, while staff also rooted through their wardrobes to dig out their favourite purple item of clothing on a designated 'Wear It Purple' day across the business.

The month culminated with the quirky Purple Tie

Challenge, which saw staff attempt to knot a tie using only their non-dominant hand to highlight the difficulties stroke can cause.

Genealogy jottings

Okay, so you have all of your notebooks and pencils, you have your folders, you even have a card index system – all of which I mentioned last time. But how many of you use the computer? I know, not everyone does, but they can be very useful.

I have family tree software downloaded onto my laptop which I can update as I discover things, delete folk who were added erroneously and even upload photographs. What is rather good is that it has a facility whereby I can pop a couple of people's names in and it will work out their relationship. It is nice to know that my great, great, great grandfather was also the grandfather of someone whom I am researching! You don't have to pay the earth for the software – many programmes are downloadable for free (I like free...) from the internet. Most will enable you to save your data in a GEDCOM format – GENEalogy Data COMMunication – which is invaluable for if you want to transfer information to other GEDCOM users or even to upload your tree into an online website. Also, look for free online tutorials for your software to help you make the most of what you have.

Even if you don't have your own computer, your local library does. I know that you cannot download onto them but they are certainly useful for accessing genealogy websites. Northamptonshire Libraries will give you free access to Ancestry, Find My Past and the British Newspaper Library. Pop along and have a go.

Another technical piece of kit that is rather useful is a digital camera. Many records offices and archives will let you use them – some do charge a fee, so check before you go. However, these can be fantastic in saving you time from copying down entries – especially if you are having trouble reading a particular article. Take a picture of the document, upload it to your computer once you are back home and then pop a copy on a forum (maybe genealogy-specialists.com?) to ask for a second opinion of what it says.

A new adult literacy project for Wellingborough – How can you make a difference?

We're so used to reading road signs, books, newspapers, birthday cards, emails, labels in supermarkets, that most of us never give it a second thought. But what if we couldn't make out any of the hundreds of messages that appear in front of us every day? It would be like being outsiders in an alien world. But the shocking truth is that 1 in 20 adults in this country have exactly that problem. They've never learned to read. This is rarely a reflection

of intelligence, but rather of missed opportunities. Those who can't read may have many other skills, as well as much untapped potential that can be released by learning. Now there's an organisation that can help them.

Read Easy aims to change people's lives by helping them to learn to read, not in a class, but one-to-one. Everyone who wants to learn has their own individual reading coach. This means that learning progresses at the reader's own pace and, most importantly, the whole

process remains confidential.

A new Read Easy branch is currently being set up in Wellingborough and we're looking for people who would like to volunteer to get the project off the ground. In particular, we need people with a bit of time and some initiative to help form the Management Team. It's a

great opportunity to use the skills and experience you have gained in your own life, to help others. The work of the team is wide ranging, so whatever your skills there is probably something you can offer. Later on we will also be looking for people interested in becoming volunteer reading coaches.

Shoe Aid initiative kicks off

Windmill Primary has become the first school in the county to step up and help shoe charity.

Children at Windmill Primary School in Raunds were inspired to help a charity called Shoe Aid after reading about them online

in an Eco Schools meeting. The children were looking for a way to help their local community and the wider world and they decided that Shoe Aid was a great

place to start.

Shoe Aid was established to raise awareness and help the 300 million children worldwide who, due to devastating poverty,

do not have the ability to obtain a pair of shoes, necessary for hygienic and health reasons, and for work and school. Shoe Aid has several collection points in various counties in England, but Northamptonshire has yet to get involved. Windmill Primary School changed all this when they contacted Lee Todd, the founder of Shoe Aid, to arrange for their school to become a temporary collection point.

Children, parents and staff at Windmill Primary School cleared out their cupboards and brought in all the unwanted shoes they could find. The school also held a 'mufti day' where children could make a donation to Shoe Aid and wear their own choice of shoes to school for the day. The principal of Windmill even got involved, wearing flip-flops with his suit! The day helped to raise over £100 for Shoe Aid. The founder of Shoe Aid will be

visiting Windmill Primary School in person to meet the children and collect all the shoes on Friday 9th June.

Lee Todd hopes that this will be that start of many more collections in Northamptonshire and that Windmill will inspire other schools to get involved. If you would like to find out more, have a look at the school blogs at windmillprimary.co.uk or on the Shoe Aid website shoeaid.co.uk.

Neighbourhood planning update

Many communities across East Northamptonshire are working to prepare their own Neighbourhood Development Plans. Neighbourhood Development Plans (or 'Neighbourhood Plans', as they are commonly known) provide additional local parish-level planning policies, supplementing those in the Local Plan Part 1 (North Northamptonshire Joint Core Strategy 2011-2031, adopted July 2016). Along with the Local Plan, East Northamptonshire Council (the local planning authority) will use Neighbourhood Plan policies to determine planning applications.

Neighbourhood Plans are prepared at a parish level. The plan-making process is led by the relevant town or parish council.

Neighbourhood planning is popular in East Northamptonshire. Of 51 town and parish councils, 15 are currently designated Neighbourhood Areas, the first stage in preparing a Neighbourhood Plan. Most recently, on 6th June Warmington Parish Council applied to designate that parish as a Neighbourhood Area. The statutory notice for Warmington is set out on page 15. It is likely that this designation will be confirmed by August.

The first Neighbourhood Plan (Higham Ferrers) was 'made' (adopted) by East Northamptonshire Council last year (April

2016) as part of the statutory development plan. This year, significant progress has also been made, with major milestones being reached for several plans:

- Chelveston cum Caldecott Neighbourhood Plan 2016-2031 was passed at referendum on 4th May 2017 (over 88% in support, on a 55% turnout);
- Stanwick Neighbourhood Development Plan 2016-2031 passed its independent examination on 13th April, and is now due to go to referendum on 29th June 2017;
- Raunds Neighbourhood Plan was submitted for examination on 11th November 2016 and it is anticipated that the independent examination will conclude later in the summer;
- Consultation for the 1st draft version Rushden Neighbourhood Plan, run by the Town Council, took place between 17th March and 2nd May 2017 inclusive.

It is also expected that other draft Neighbourhood Plans will be published for consultation over the coming months.
