Volunteer Action needs you

Volunteer Action needs more volunteers to meet the growing demand for the services it offers to the local community.

VA operates in Oundle, Thrapston and 46 surrounding villages and for many years has run a community car scheme, with a befriending service started more recently. The latter provides one-to-one support and companionship for the elderly and those isolated by disability. Befrienders receive training from VA's staff and visit people in their own homes, usually twice per month. Demand for this service is growing, with people

on the waiting list, and additional volunteers are urgently needed so this valued service can be extended. The community car scheme aims to provide reasonably priced transport for those in genuine need who live in our area. Its 75 volunteer drivers take passengers to hospital, surgery or dental appointments as well as on social or shopping trips. 750 passengers are registered for the service and in the year to March 2017 over 11,500 trips were

made (almost 10% up on the previous year), with nearly 100,000 miles driven in total. Volunteer drivers give their time for free but are paid for their fuel and running costs. Again, demand for this service is growing and more drivers are needed. In particular, VA needs more drivers in Thrapston, Easton-on-the-Hill and Wansford. This would result in a better match between the locations of drivers and passengers, which would not only reduce VA's costs but would also reinforce the community-support aspect of the service. Drivers not only have the satisfaction of contributing to their local community but also get to meet an

interesting and varied cross-section of the people who live there. For many drivers it provides the

opportunity to be a valued member of a team and also to maintain a more active retirement.

Genealogy jottings

I love it when a certificate that I have ordered from the General Register Office (GRO) lands on my front doormat. What gems will I find therein? These, along with census returns, are the primary source of records when starting out on our ancestral trails. Costing £9.25 each, the costs can soon mount up – whoever said that this obsession... erm, hobby of ours was cheap was telling fibs!

Civil registration in England and Wales came into force for events from 1st July 1837 and many of the registrars had other jobs. They were paid per entry but, if they heard of a birth in their area, especially if it was a remote part of Cornwall for example, they might not think it worthwhile to make a four-hour round trip to record the event. Although it was the parents' responsibility for registering the birth, many did not, believing that by having the babe baptised, that would suffice. It is thought that up to 30% of these early births were not registered. The legislation was a bit woolly and open to interpretation and so it was not until 1874 that registration became compulsory and strict fines were imposed upon those

who did not comply. Also, births had to be registered within six weeks of the baby being born, otherwise a penalty would be incurred. Therefore, you might find the birth date on certificates differing slightly to those recorded in the baptism registers!

When ordering a certificate, it is useful if you know the references. These are the registration district, the quarter in which the event was registered, the volume and page numbers. The quarters were those ending March, June, September and December. One thing to bear in mind is that, like my grandfather who was born on 28th December 1896, his birth was not registered until a few days later in the January and so does not appear until the March quarter of 1897. It is always worth checking not only a quarter either side but also a couple of years either side of a possible date.

Editor's notes

It will be Remembrance Sunday before we print our next edition so here's a reminder that there will be a range of events for you to attend over the weekend of 11th/12th November. It's good to see that so many people are prepared to put aside at least a couple of hours to pay their respects to those who gave their lives in order that we might live in peace and security, notwithstanding that it seems to be an ongoing and at times apparently ceaseless struggle.

As noted previously, there has been a lot of good work on the local roads in the past few weeks and generally driving is a much more pleasant experience. However, there does seem to have been a tendency to cut corners when dealing with drains, whether as a cost saving or because of simple working short-cuts; the consequence is that some drain covers are now several inches below the level of the road surface and present a potential hazard if they cannot be avoided.

While on the subject of driving, we will be doing more of it in the hours of darkness since the clocks went back and this raises another potential hazard. The proliferation of high intensity, super bright, vehicle headlamps and self-adjusting and self-dipping lights on new vehicles is being blamed for increasing numbers of vehicle accidents. Back in 2014, investigators reported this as

an influence in 10 fatal crashes, nearly 70 serious accidents and more than 250 other accidents; overall, this was an increase of 11 per cent on 2010. Research shows that the effect of the glare of modern lights is greater as we grow older, the main problem being light scatter. The eye's lens and cornea are not perfectly clear, so when bright light is shone through them some gets scattered around the inside of the eye, making images blurred or blank; at night your pupil opens wider to let in more light, and when your eye meets a headlamp you get more scatter and can't see. There seems to be little prospect of any recognition of this problem, much less action to resolve it, from the vehicle manufacturers or their trade association, the Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders; they maintain that there is no evidence that factory fitted high-power lights distract drivers and that lamp-levelling technology ensures they are safe. It seems all we can do is attempt to be doubly careful when driving at night.

Finally, another email scam to watch out for. This time it's an attempt to extort money from motorists by telling them they have been caught speeding. If you receive such an email you should delete it without clicking on any links; Northamptonshire Police use a paper-based system to issue speeding tickets rather than emails.



Exciting new finds for budding archaeologists

The archaeological dig pit at Stanwick Lakes has new artefacts thanks to a donation of £500 from the Francis and Maisie Pryor Charitable Trust.

The dig pit is an important part of the educational activities at Stanwick Lakes as it gives people the chance to get 'hands-on' with history. Visitors, including schoolchildren, use the dig pit to learn the basic skills of archaeology and unearth artefacts, just like the archaeologists who excavated the Nene Valley in the 1980s.

The funding has allowed the Rockingham Forest Trust, which manages

Stanwick Lakes, to buy items such as Iron Age silver bracelets, Saxon glass beads and medieval cast iron keys. There is also a great selection of pottery, including a Bronze Age Beaker, Roman mortarium and a Nene Valley hunting cup, made by Graham Taylor of Potted History, who made the replica pots for the Stonehenge visitor centre. The new artefacts are accurate replicas of items that would have been

used in the daily lives of the people who lived in the Nene Valley over the last 6,000 years and are a great way for visitors to make a connection to their past.

Alyson Allfree, Director of Rockingham Forest Trust, said: "We are very grateful to the Francis and Maisie Pryor Charitable Trust for this donation. Their vision is for the public to be inspired by archaeology and the environment and here at Stanwick Lakes we fulfil this with our Heritage trails, walks and activities such as the dig pit."

Council continues to prosecute fly tippers

A Rushden woman has been fined hundreds of pounds for fly tipping in her hometown.

East Northamptonshire Council (ENC)'s waste team received a report in March 2017 that furniture and household waste had been dumped in Rushden's Station Road car park.

Evidence from the rubbish led investigations to Ms Catherine Bell, who failed to respond to council correspondence, an Environment Act notice as well as a notice from the Magistrates' Court.

Bell's case was forwarded to LGSS for prosecution and proceeded in her absence. She was found guilty and ordered to pay £355, made up of a £200

fine, costs of £125 and a £30 victim surcharge.

ENC Leader, Councillor Steven North, said: "Fly tipping has a really negative impact on the area and is totally unfair on the vast majority of people who dispose of their rubbish properly. It's not acceptable for people to do this and the council will always take action whenever possible, thanks to our hardworking waste team."

Neighbourhood Planning update

Throughout 2017 substantial progress has been made with the preparation of Neighbourhood Plans across East Northamptonshire. Neighbourhood Plans allow communities (led by town and parish councils) to set their own (town/parish level) planning policies for determining planning applications, adding local direction and distinctiveness to the East Northamptonshire Local Plan and national planning policies.

This year the following milestones have been reached in Neighbourhood Plan preparation:

- Rushden Neighbourhood Plan submitted to East Northamptonshire Council for examination – consultation takes place 3rd November – 18th December 2017
- Raunds Neighbourhood Plan “passed” in September 2017 and is due to go to referendum

on Thursday 16th November

- Chelveston cum Caldecott and Stanwick Neighbourhood Plans were overwhelmingly supported at referendum during the summer and subsequently adopted by East Northamptonshire Council on 17th July 2017, now forming part of the statutory development plan for the district
- Consultations for the

1st draft Brigstock, Glapthorn and King's Cliffe Neighbourhood Plans took place during summer/early autumn 2017 – it is hoped that these will be submitted for examination in 2018

In addition to eight Neighbourhood Plans (so far) that have reached publication stage and beyond, a further eight Neighbourhood Areas are also designated: Barnwell, Barrowden and Wakerley,

Collyweston, Deene and Deenethorpe, Duddington with Fineshade, Irthlingborough, Oundle and Warmington. It is anticipated that further Plans will come forward during 2018.

Other town and parish councils have also

expressed an interest in preparing Neighbourhood Plans, so it is also likely that further Neighbourhood Areas will be designated over the coming months. East Northamptonshire Council is keen to encourage and support any communities (led by town/

parish councils) who seek to prepare Neighbourhood Plans.

Rushden Neighbourhood Plan

Consultation for the Rushden Neighbourhood Plan commenced on 3rd November. Representations regarding the Plan will need to be received by 4pm on Monday 18th December 2017. Full details regarding the “Regulation 16” consultation set out in the statutory notice on p15.

Wildlife News

November is well known not only for allowing us to celebrate a certain Guy Fawkes for trying to blow up Parliament but also for bringing typically cool, dull, miserable and ever-shorter daylight hours – it really can be a miserable time, especially if the months before it have been relatively dry and mild, like this year. But plants do not let us down; this is the season of the “fall”, as it is called on the other side of the Atlantic, and some of the most vivid colours which nature has to offer can brighten up our walk on the dark dismal days.

This is nature's version of recycling. Leaves, however small and simple they may look, are actually quite surprising chemical factories, taking in raw

materials from air, water and soil to produce new, often complex, chemicals using solar energy. The amount of sunlight is decreasing rapidly, and all those leaves make a load of waste to get rid of, and this is when the colours start to appear. Actually most of the colours have been there all the time, just hidden by the green of chlorophyll, the essential substance capturing that sunlight energy; it is no longer needed, and disappears, letting the others show their true colours, with shades of red, yellow and brown in different tree species, giving the brilliant scenes we call “autumn colours”.

These millions of tons of leaves add to the loads of scrap in the countryside,

but unlike most rubbish from irresponsible humans this leafy trash becomes part of nature's recycling programme, much carried out by invisible bacteria and microbes; gardeners will know the value of compost and leaf mould in improving soil and crops, all coming from the activity of those unseen helpers. At this season the browns of rushes and reeds in our local lakes may not be the main points of interest, but the coloured leaves of the surrounding trees and shrubs, like the reds and yellows of the guelder rose I walk past regularly, will soon drop in the lower temperatures, and the rotted leaves will be added to the soil ready for next year's displays.

School supports sustainability

In our quest to become more environmentally sustainable, The Ferrers School has invested in new LED lights which have had a fabulous impact in classrooms and corridors and will be especially beneficial with the winter months approaching! We are delighted that our Governing Body agreed to release reserves to support this project.

The installation took place over three phases and saw 826 old fittings of varied wattages replaced with 873 new LED fixtures. These LED lights are up to 90% more efficient than traditional incandescent bulbs, as 95% of the energy is used to emit light and only 5% is

wasted as heat energy.

This initiative was undertaken to improve the efficiency of lighting within the school, as well as reduce energy consumption and CO2 emissions. The change in lighting will also encourage pupils to learn about environmental responsibility, which links with the Year 9 curriculum where students learn about global climate change.

Annually, these new lights will save 107.1 tonnes of CO2 per year. The Ferrers School also supports other environmental initiatives like; computer shut down, recycling and automatic light switch off in some communal areas.

And secondly: on Sunday 12th November following the 11am Remembrance Service at the New War Memorial, there will be “The Walk of Remembrance” from the War Memorial to the Oundle Road Cemetery, where the five Poppy Crosses laid on the Memorial during the service in memory of the five war dead who rest in the cemetery will be taken to the cemetery and placed on their respective graves


