Youngsters get healthy and active at council conference

Over 30 young people in East Northamptonshire got together to take part in a healthy and active lifestyles conference in Rushden recently.

Genealogy jottings

So far, we have looked at obtaining copies of certificates for birth, marriage and deaths in England and Wales. These copies currently cost £9.25 each. Civil Registration started from 1st July 1837 for all three events but the dates are different for certificates from Scotland and Ireland.

Civil registration in Scotland only started on 1st January 1855, so you will not be able to find such certificates prior to this date and will have to rely upon Parish Registers. However, the information held in them is extremely helpful! They are also downloadable from Scotlands People (<https://www.scotlandspeople.gov.uk/>) at a cost of 6 credits bought in advance, which works out at £1.50.

Those early birth certificates in 1855 contained the following information:

- date, place and time of birth
- full name
- sex
- the parents' names (including maiden surname of mother)
- father's occupation
- name of informant and relationship to child
- information on siblings

- the ages and birthplaces of both parents
- the parents' usual place of residence
- the date and place of the parents' marriage.

However, by the following year, the information on siblings was removed, as were ages and birthplaces of parents and date and place of parents' marriage. But by 1861, the date and place of the parents' marriage was being recorded again. This is fantastic news if you discover that a couple had moved to Scotland from Ireland but then had children in Scotland. I found a couple recently whose son's Scottish birth certificate stated the date of his parents' marriage and that it took place in Letterkenny, County Donegal. That certainly has helped trace the couple as the censuses just stated that they came from Ireland – which is a big place!

Scottish marriage and death certificates are also a lot different to those from England and Wales, which I will explain next time.

Editor's notes

It was a beautiful early winter Sunday afternoon, ideal for a walk in the country. Duly kitted out for an off-road stroll, all was peace and quiet 'til a group of motorcyclists came into view, in fact they were audible long before they came into sight. Obviously, one of the hazards of walking along footpaths or bridleways is the uneven and soft going but, as long as one is careful, the only damage is likely to be muddy boots. However, the approaching bikers were not concerned with their own sartorial state nor, as it turned out, with that of anyone else; no slowing down and no attempt to avoid the standing water in their path. The consequence was the proverbial 'early bath' for the walkers – home and rev up the washing machine. The relatively recent increase in the number of 'green-laning' motorcyclists means an increased level of use of those areas and the need for all to recognise that sharing them and showing consideration for others is paramount; in this case the bikers still had to learn that lesson.

What are the odds on a white Christmas this year? The recent cold snap, including significant snowfall across the District, has caused many to wonder whether a traditional white Christmas might be in the offing. Surprisingly perhaps, Met Office records show that at least one snowflake has fallen on Christmas Day in the UK 38

times in the last 54 years, which means that statistically there is a 'white' Christmas at least once every two years. However, single drops of snow don't constitute what most think of as the white Christmas of our imaginings, where there is a good covering on the ground; this is much more unusual and has happened only four times in the last 51 years. The Met Office say it's difficult to accurately predict snow more than five days in advance but some bookmakers have already released their odds and for London they are offering 3/1. The official prospects for snow in our area currently stand at 25%.

We must add our congratulations to the team at the Fox Inn in Thrapston after they were voted the Northants Pub of the Year. The pub, which is in Thrapston's High Street, was one of just 10 to make the final shortlist. Landlady Katie Buncombe was delighted to hear of their win and she was joined by staff last week as they were presented with the trophy and certificate which they can display to share their success with customers. Many happy returns as young stand-up joins comedy legend on stage

Rushden Academy Sixth Form student Joe Brady has been developing his talents as a stand-up comedian from a young age. Recently he was given a special opportunity to share the stage in Blackpool with his hero and friend, Sir Ken Dodd OBE.

From the age of 7, Joe has been performing stand-up comedy to audiences across the country and his hero is one of Britain's most famous comedians, Sir Ken Dodd OBE.

Joe's unlikely friendship with his hero started four years ago when he went to watch him perform and then managed to speak with Dodd after the show, a conversation which lasted for hours! They have stayed in touch ever since. To celebrate his 18th birthday, Sir Ken gave Joe the unique gift of being the only person ever to have a work placement with him. The 90 year old, whose career has spanned more than six decades, invited Joe along to the Grand Theatre in Blackpool. On arrival,

Joe stood on the stage and watched in awe as the curtain rose to reveal the theatre in its full glory. It holds an audience of 1,100 and no one is more than 60 feet away from the stage, which means performers can make eye contact with everyone. As part of the placement, Joe was in the spotlight for 10 minutes during one of Sir Ken's shows, where he performed various solo sketches and routines. At the end of his spot, Sir Ken joined him on stage, where they sang a duet of 'Happiness' followed by an impromptu comedy routine involving audience participation.

The experience was so much more than Joe expected. He said: "Blackpool is the best place

on the planet and I got to perform alongside my hero! The audience was so happy that I didn't get nervous and it seemed as if they were all friends. I felt they appreciated

the fact that I am a new young comedian on the scene who doesn't swear and isn't rude, offensive or derogatory."

Joe said of his hero:

"Although Ken is 90 years old, once he gets on stage its like he is 20 years old again and his singing voice is amazing. He is completely mad and doesn't stop talking! I've watched so many comedians perform live but no one else can touch him, he is in a league all of his own."

After his A Levels, Joe is planning to either go to

University/Drama School or go on tour across the country with his stand-up comedy show.

Lifetime Achievement award winner, Sir Ken Dodd OBE, said of his protégé: "I want to wish Joe a very happy 18th birthday. I am a huge fan of his work and I have no doubt that he will be a future star."

Alex's charity Kilimanjaro climb challenge

In the summer of 2017 Alex Harpin made the decision to climb Kilimanjaro. She had visited South Africa in 2015 and wanted to go back to see a more traditional side of Africa.

Kilimanjaro is in Tanzania, close to the Kenyan border. It's the tallest mountain in Africa as well as the tallest free standing mountain in the world, at 5,985 metres/19,340 feet.

Alex decided to undertake this challenge for national charity Dogs for Good, based in Banbury, which was previously known as Dogs for the Disabled. Their main aim is to train and provide autism assistance dogs for children, as well as assistance dogs for children and adults with a range of disabilities.

Alex's fundraising target was £4,100 and with such a large target she had to rack her brain as to how to raise money. It involved lots of early mornings, late nights and cold evenings at many craft and Christmas fairs. Alex is a keen baker and so did lots of bake sales

for her workplace, as well as for many others within her circle of supporters.

With much support from her family and friends and other contributors Alex achieved her target and went beyond.

She had the wonderful opportunity to meet someone who had been supported by the charity. The lady she met had developed a number of health conditions which meant she had to move to sheltered accommodation to allow carers to come in and help.

With the support of Dogs for Good and the support of Tula, her new dog, she no longer needed carers to help her, as Tula was able to help on a day-to-day basis. Tula also provided a form of support that wasn't expected; she helped reduce social isolation and improved the

whole family's wellbeing and positive mental health outcomes. Seeing the impact that Tula had, Alex was more determined than ever to achieve her fundraising target and reach the top of Kilimanjaro.

On 12th October Alex set off for Tanzania. It was much tougher than she had expected and unfortunately altitude sickness got the better of her. However, she did manage to get to 4,300 metres and is incredibly proud of her achievement.

Your Health – Fitbit sleep monitors

Hoping to get a little bit of rest and relaxation over the Christmas period? Thinking of catching up on sleep? If you do get some rest between family meals and washing up you may well be monitoring that rest with a Fitbit or something similar.

The notions of 'clean sleep' and 'sleep hygiene' are very fashionable at the moment. Now, we provide training to osteopaths, chiropractors and physiotherapists around the world and recently interviewed sleep expert Dr Neil Stanley. We asked him about Fitbits and other sleep monitors, and were surprised at the answer.

He told us that sleep monitors do NOT give any meaningful data on the quality of your sleep. That doesn't mean they can't count your daily footsteps, or measure

the calories you burn, but when it comes to sleep, they're hopelessly inaccurate (35% at best). This is hardly surprising – measuring the different stages of sleep is amazingly complex. Really it can only be done accurately by monitoring brain activity. I should add that Dr Stanley set up the largest sleep research facility in Europe at the University of Surrey. He is one of the world's experts in sleep, so he knows what he's talking about.

This doesn't mean that activity monitors are useless, of course. The very fact that they get us fired up to do more exercise is a great thing. One patient even reported having mown the lawn in

order to get his number of steps up to 10,000. Sadly, it wasn't my lawn, nor did he offer to fix that monster lawnmower I broke in the summer.

One of the other interesting things we got from Dr Stanley was confirmation that blue light (from iPads, phones and Kindles) suppresses melatonin. This means you take longer to fall asleep and have worse sleep if you look at them late at night.

So, if you want to get good sleep over Christmas, try curling up with a book rather than an electronic device.

Council protects residents from untrustworthy taxi driver

An Irthlingborough taxi driver was fined nearly £4,000 for a number of offences including lying and driving without a licence.

Mr Shahid Ahmad, owner of Easy Cars, was licensed with East Northamptonshire Council (ENC) to run a private hire business from an address in Irthlingborough.

In May, a member of the public made a complaint when Easy Cars failed to fulfil a booking she had made.

This instigated an investigation by ENC officers which led to proof that Mr Ahmad did not operate his business from Irthlingborough but instead from his home address in Wellingborough.

Mr Ahmad had lied to

obtain the correct licences required to run his taxi business. He was operating illegally, putting the public at risk and so an ENC licensing panel revoked Mr Ahmad's licences (his operator's licence, private hire vehicle licence and driver's badge).

Given the seriousness of the offences uncovered during the investigation and the fact that Mr Ahmad misled officers at ENC to obtain his operator's licence, ENC decided to prosecute.

On 28th November at Northampton Magistrates Court, Mr Ahmad was found guilty under the Local Government (miscellaneous provisions) Act 1976.

He was fined £750 for lying to obtain an operator's licence, £500 for operating a vehicle without a valid

operator's licence and £500 for failing to keep correct paperwork. He was also ordered to pay £2,000 towards costs and a £75 victim surcharge.

Leader of ENC, Councillor Steven North, said: "The safety of our residents and visitors is important to the authority and where that safety is compromised, as it was in this case, it was important to ensure all enforcement measures were utilised. We hope this serves as a warning to all who believe they can lie to get a licence.

"With the festive period upon us, we would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone to only get into licensed taxis and ensure your journeys are planned in advance."

A presentation evening was held on Thursday 30th November, when the certificate in recognition was presented to the Club President, Hubert Dickens, by Felicity Howlett of Northamptonshire Sport, who was accompanied by Alex Le Guevel, Lecturer in Sport for SCL Education Group, who was responsible for the assessment.

Rushden is only the second club in the county to receive this accreditation, following Wellingborough BC, and these join just 22 bowls clubs in the country to be so recognised.

The occasion was marked by the attendance of Her Worship the Mayor of Rushden, Councillor Barbara Jenney, and

her consort, husband David Jenney, and in her comments after the certificate had been presented, Mrs Jenney spoke highly of the value of the club to the Community of Rushden & District.

Tresham Garden Village project secures £275k in Government funding

A project to develop the old Deenethorpe Airfield site into a garden village has received a funding boost from the Government to help move plans forward.

This is the second year of capacity funding since Tresham (previously referred to as Deenethorpe Airfield Garden Village) was selected as one of 14 garden village projects that the Government is supporting through capacity funding and assistance from the Homes and Communities Agency. This support is helping East Northamptonshire Council and the North Northamptonshire Joint Planning and Delivery Unit to work with the landowner in preparing a detailed masterplan and delivery strategy.

Andrew Longley, Head of the North Northamptonshire Joint Planning and Delivery Unit, explains the benefit of the funding to the development of the project: “This funding will pay for extra staff capacity, specialist advice including design and viability, community engagement, and various studies. It is allowing us to work with the landowner to prepare a masterplan which will give a broad overview of what will go where including housing, employment, schools, green space etc. as well as basic details on access and movement across the site, and how the site will connect with the wider area. The masterplan will go out for consultation early in the New Year so people can give their views on the proposals. If it is agreed by the Council, it will provide the basis for a planning application later in 2018.”

Steven North, Leader of East Northamptonshire Council, said: “This funding is a strong endorsement of our work so far on Tresham. It will help us to ensure that the Garden Village proposal is of the highest possible standard of design and sustainability, with the mix of housing, employment and community facilities needed to develop a new high-quality community, not just new housing estates.”

Police urge people to take note of safety advice this festive season

With the Christmas party season now in full swing, Northamptonshire Police is encouraging people to plan ahead for a safe night out.

As towns across the county get busier with Christmas shoppers and festive party-goers, officers are keen to share useful crime prevention tips and personal safety advice to help everyone have a safe and enjoyable time.

On a night out:

- If you’re having a night out, plan how you’re getting home before you go
- If you intend to take a taxi, either book it in advance or take it from the taxi rank
- Always keep the number of a reliable firm with you and know where the taxi ranks are
- Avoid minicabs or private-hire cars that tout for business – they should always be pre-booked
- When the taxi arrives, check it’s the one you booked. If in doubt, don’t get in
- Stick with your friends and choose a meeting point where you’ll wait for each other if you get separated
- Never accept a lift from a stranger – there are plenty of licensed taxis in our towns
- Be aware of what you are drinking – if someone offers to buy you a drink, go with them to the bar and watch the drink being poured
- If you notice someone who appears vulnerable, tell someone such as a door supervisor, street pastor or police officer,

- or call the police on 101 or 999 in an emergency.
- Stay together and travel together. Don’t go off on your own and keep an eye out for your friends. It may sound obvious, but avoid walking through unlit areas, such as alleyways or churchyards.
 - It’s also sensible to keep a charged mobile phone with you and if you get separated, use it to call one another. If you feel at risk, call 999.

General advice:

- When out in your car, look out for Park Mark car parks and remove all items from your vehicle when you leave it
- Don’t leave your key in the ignition, even when filling up with fuel or popping into the shop
- De-clutter your handbag – take only what you need and avoid carrying large amounts of cash
- When you’re out shopping, keep all bags firmly closed and on your person at all times
- Carry wallets in inside pockets of jackets or coats, not in the back pocket of trousers
- When using your credit or debit card, shield your PIN and take the time to make sure you safely put away your purse or wallet
- Never leave your bag unattended on the back of trolleys or pushchairs
- Don’t be tempted to return to your car and drop off your shopping bags – keep them with you or take them home

Drink and drug drive campaign arrests: week one

The first week of Northamptonshire Police’s annual drink and drug driving operation saw 15 people arrested for driving under the influence.

Between 1st and 7th December, there were 12 arrests for drink driving and three for drug driving on the county’s roads.

The results include a static operation in Northampton on Friday 1st December, where two people were arrested for drink driving and three for drug driving.

A second operation on the Corby-bound carriageway of the A43 in Kettering on Saturday 2nd December, saw one drink drive arrest and one drug drive arrest.

A total of 91 breath tests were recorded that evening, with eight positive results, of which one was over the legal limit of 35 micrograms of alcohol in 100 millilitres of breath. Another driver who blew 34mg, just below the legal limit, was not allowed to continue his journey, but agreed to have his car parked up and make his own way home.

More than 350 checks were carried out on vehicles, occupants and licences on the night. A total of 20 motoring offences were dealt with, and three vehicles were seized for offences including no insurance and no tax.

The other arrests made between 1st and 7th December took place during routine policing operations, including roadside checks following road traffic collisions or other incidents.

Take care with your Christmas decorations

The festive season is meant to be a time of celebration with your family, close friends and colleagues.

Regardless of whether you decorate your home for an intimate or bustling party, remember to decorate safely or you could expose yourself and guests to potential injuries.

On average, 1,000 people are injured each year while decorating their homes during the Christmas and New Year period, according to the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents. To ensure that you and your family can celebrate the festive season without concern, adopt the following guidance: avoid using artificial snow because it can irritate lungs if inhaled; inspect each strand of fairy lights before you string them up to identify any potential damage in the wire coverings, or light bulb sockets, which could cause an electrical fire; all lights should conform to the British Standard for luminaires; in addition, plug all cables into a surge protector; use a timer for your fairy lights to help control electricity usage; hang fairy lights away from any tissue paper or other flammable materials; place all fairy light strands and other electrical decoration cables away from common areas with any amount of foot traffic to prevent slips, trips or falls; use a stable ladder when hanging decorations in high places and be sure to have another person hold it to keep it balanced; and finally, always decorate with at least one other person – in addition to making the experience more enjoyable, it helps avoid unnecessary risks.

Traffic chaos

There was a good deal of traffic chaos in Oundle on 2nd December when the town held its Christmas Market. The event encouraged hundreds of visitors to the town for whom special traffic and parking arrangements had been made because of the necessary town centre road closures. However, shutting the A605 south of Oundle at the same time, which caused additional drivers to try to get through the town, led to traffic chaos.

A spokesman for Northamptonshire County Council said: “We have extensively communicated re: this work and anyone using Oundle was doing so independently of our diversion as we did not recommend or sign this. Northamptonshire Highways letter dropped affected local residents and contacted the parish councils affected by the A605 works and made them aware of the works being carried out. We did not receive any challenges against the works being carried out.

“With regards to the closures, these have been advertised for a number of weeks with the digital signs that have been in place on the route since September. There were also individual signs in place prior to closing the specific sections. The works last Saturday involved the major re-construction of the A605 to the Barnwell Junction (approximately 3 miles from Oundle High Street) with the diversion route running on the A14 to the A1(M). No diversion information sent traffic through Oundle. There may have been traffic trying to bypass the closure by using an unpublished and illegal route, which we try to stop wherever possible, but is a difficult task as drivers will determine their own best route. This is particularly prevalent where local people choose their known best route.

“The works being carried out are essential and had to be carried out within our works programme. Having now completed them the improvements will be in place for many years to come. Northamptonshire Highways do all we can to mitigate any inconvenience and to ensure road users are aware of the works in advance and the recommended diversion route.”

Wildlife News

Wildlife in our countryside can surprise us in many ways, particularly when the animals (or plants) have managed – by accident or design! – to get themselves into an unexpected situation. A few days ago we found a good example.

At first sight it looked like a thin, black, dead leaf which might have come from a willow and been picked up on footwear and brought unknowingly into the house. Closer examination before removing it showed a much more unexpected 'find'.

It had four legs on a dark tapering body, slowly dragging itself across the floor. We were being treated to a visit from a newt!

There are three species likely to be found round here: the great crested, smooth and palmate newts. At this

time of year they are not too easy to identify, but size and colour suggests it was probably a female palmate.

How it came to be there remains a puzzle. It clearly came from the reserve only a few yards away, where vegetation and areas of water make ideal breeding areas for an animal which, while not yet rare, is finding that local developments are making suitable living areas increasingly scarce. But to reach the middle of our floor would have meant negotiating a significant doorstep at either front or

back door, probably too much of 'a mountain to climb'. It almost certainly did come in very much as a dead leaf could, by sticking to a shoe, or even the bottom of a trouser leg, before dropping off.

A more important question, from the newt's point of view at any rate, would be "Why?" did it come to be there. All species of newt will have been feeding up during the summer, eating plenty of minute animals, possibly too small for us to see, because they are among our hibernators, who go to sleep through the winter until food becomes available again. Yet here was one who had not buried herself deeply enough into the decaying leaf litter to be protected fully; let's just hope that she found a suitable place to settle in for her winter sleep.

Become a Beanstalk reading hero in 2018 and help ensure no child is left behind

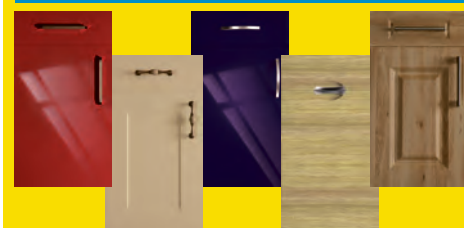
