Genealogy jottings

You find the census with your ancestor's wife and children, but the husband is nowhere to be seen. Why? What has happened to them? Are they still alive? Of course they are, as they show up 10 years later back with the wife! There are many reasons for not being at home on the night of the census as the person in question might be in the workhouse hospital, prison, lunatic asylum or working away. I have seen censuses where a policeman was on duty that night and so has been enumerated at the Police Station rather than at home. Mind you, I have also seen people counted twice – once at home and again with the person who they are visiting!

People sometimes also give false information on census forms, either for personal or political reasons. I know that there was quite a discussion on the television and radio when the last census was taken in 2011 as to whether or not people had the right not to be included, but nothing is new. A hundred years earlier, "If women don't count, neither

shall they be counted," was the rallying call for suffragettes on the night of the 1911 census in the UK. Therefore, if you cannot find your ancestor in that census, maybe they were one of the suffragettes who went out for the night. The form stated that it should contain the names etc of those who spent the night at that address. If they were not there, then they should not have been counted.

Mind you, names also changed – they could become anglicised if their owner came from abroad and they felt that they could be 'discovered' if they gave their true name. People have gone into hiding for many reasons from their homeland. Emmerich could become Eric, Petrus could become Peter, not to mention Scottish names dropping the Mc or Mac. Quite a minefield, eh?

Editor's notes

By the time you are able to read this edition of the Nene Valley News, Northamptonshire County Council (NCC) expects to have appointed a new Chief Finance Officer. The individual who takes the post will be charged with ensuring that the council balances its books this year. As well as reaching the end of 2018/2019 in the black, they will also need to incorporate £60m worth of financial savings with nothing in the reserves and a £35m deficit from the past financial year. A challenging task if ever there was one!

Highways England has started essential maintenance work on the A45 south of Thrapston, kicking off a programme set to last some seven months in all. This first phase, between Junction 13 of the A14 and the A45 Raunds services roundabout, is due for completion by the end of November.

A Highways England spokesman said: "This work involves upgrading some of the lighting columns and road signs along the A45 between the M1 Junction 15 and the A14 Junction 13 at Thrapston. We will also replace some of the safety barriers."

In an attempt to minimise inconvenience and disruption, the work will take place in phases overnight from 8pm to 6am, Monday to Friday. It's hoped that it will be possible to carry out the majority of the work with only slip road and lane closures. A fully signed diversion route, agreed with the

local authority, will be in place. Highways England has said they are maintaining access for residents and businesses. Further information can be found on the Highways England website at highwaysengland.co.uk/roadworks-search. You may recall that in December 2014, the Government confirmed that dualling of this busy stretch of the A45 would not happen until at least 2020-21.

Those living in the District should be aware that NCC are introducing a residents' waste disposal permit scheme which will be applicable to anyone using a commercial-type vehicle, or a car towing a trailer, to take rubbish to any of their 9 household waste recycling centres (HWRCs). The Council's website explains that HWRCs are provided for householders to dispose of waste from their own home, safely and conveniently for free; unfortunately, some traders use the HWRCs to illegally dispose of their commercial waste, leaving the Northamptonshire taxpayers to foot the bill for its disposal. However, the new scheme will limit users to six visits over a 12-month period.

It seems that a better solution might be to stop the illegal disposal of commercial waste; standby for an increase in fly-tipping! The new scheme starts on Monday 1st October and you can apply now for an e-permit on selfserve.northamptonshire.gov.uk/HWRC-E-Permits.

Fire shouldn't be the fright on Halloween night

Halloween festivities mean autumn can be a hectic, but fun-filled time for families.

These celebrations can also make it a busy time for Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service (NFRS), particularly when important safety practices are neglected.

Everyone at NFRS hopes that people across the county have plenty of fun during Halloween parties and organised events, but also would like to remind them to please stay safe.

District Liaison Officer Tina Collett said: "It's so lovely to watch children having fun at Halloween, but families will be able to relax and have more fun if they know everyone has taken the right safety precautions.

"Please be aware of the risk that fire poses to Halloween costumes and be careful how you dress to mark the spooky day. It is very important to keep these costumes, whether handmade or shop

bought, well away from any flames as many materials can be flammable."

To help people stay safe this Halloween, NFRS is providing some important safety messages to remember when enjoying the fun of the season.

Halloween safety tips:

- 1 Stay away from candles, such as in pumpkins. Avoid using real candles in pumpkins. Battery operated lights are the safer option.
- 2 Costumes can be flammable. When buying them, look for labels which say flame retardant.
- 3 Masks can obstruct a child's vision. This is dangerous, especially when they are crossing roads. Consider using face paints instead.
- 4 Plan your trick or treat route beforehand. Only go to houses where you or your friends know the residents. Always go in groups.
- 5 Remember that eggs and flour are for baking. Don't allow children to take these items out and don't throw

them.

- 6 Ask children not to eat any sweets or other treats they are given until they get home. Check their treats before they eat any. Sweets and foods still in their

original wrappers are safest.

- 7 Remind everyone to respect posters displaying 'no trick or treat'.
- 8 If clothes do catch fire, remember to 'stop, drop and roll'. Don't run around

as you could make the flames worse. Lie down and roll around as this then makes it harder for the fire to spread. Smother the flames with a heavy material like a coat or blanket.



'Network' Scout Group trek WWI battlefields

Four members of the 'Nene Valley Network', the fifth and final section of The Scout Association, are currently on an expedition to the World War I battlefields in Flanders (France/Belgium). The members – Matt, Steph, Luke and Dan – are all aiming to achieve one of the most prestigious awards in Scouting: the Explorer Belt.

The expedition started at Amiens on Sunday 2nd September. They walked to Corbie following the course of the River Somme. A challenge had been set to compare this Corbie with Corby in Northamptonshire. They visited the Somme 1916 museum which was located in the old town's medieval tunnels. The group have had many incredible experiences including a visit to the Lochnagar Crater, Thiepval Memorial and the Newfoundland Memorial

Park. Travelling to this latter memorial, the group went through No Man's Land, passing several war graves at which they paid their respects. Two of the members, Luke and Matt, have relatives who lost their lives in WW1. They have managed to locate their memorials – Dainville British Military Cemetery and Tyne Cot Memorial – and hope to pay their respects to their lost relatives. The group will also be laying a wreath at the Menin Gate on 8th September and hope to locate Edgar Mobbs' name on the memorial.

It is several years since anyone from the Nene Valley District has achieved the Explorer Belt, so over six months of planning has gone into the trip to ensure its success. The group hope to be able to share their experiences with the local groups on their return.

Local pupils raise hundreds for charity with Junior Dragons' Apprenticeship Challenge

East Northamptonshire Council in partnership with Community Voluntary Service Broxbourne and East Herts (CVSBEH) invited primary schools across the district to take part in Junior Dragons' Apprentice Challenge, a pilot business competition.

The six-week challenge offered a springboard into the world of business for Year 5 students. Teams were tasked with investing £50 into a new business and to turn the investment into as much profit as possible for their chosen charity.

The challenge saw teams of entrepreneurs from three local schools – Oundle CE Primary School, Titchmarsh CE Primary School and Whitefriars Primary School – develop their business ideas and create a product or service to sell within their school or community.

The competition concluded with the schools presenting their business experience to a panel of

SuperDragons including Councillor Colin Wright, local businessman and Managing Director of the WTY Group Lee Wilkes, and Dawn Cummins, Chief Executive of the local voluntary infrastructure organisation Voluntary Impact Northamptonshire.

A whole host of awards were up for grabs with the 'Overall Winner' being awarded to Titchmarsh CE Primary School and the 'Courageous Owls' business. Youngsters created bags to showcase the village of Titchmarsh, which they sold along with home-made cakes and plants outside the Village Shop, who were their chosen charity.

The success of the group

saw them raise over £400 for the shop and pick up the award for the 'Most Money Raised'. The school scooped a further three awards – 'Most Innovative Business Idea', 'Best Partnership with Dragon' and 'Best Presentation'.

Whitefriars Primary School's 'Business Bees' won the award for the 'Best Partnership with Community Group/Charity'. Pupils sold handmade bookmarks, and carried out a school car wash, helped raise funds for the Rushden Night Shelter and they showcased in their presentation to the judges the importance of their chosen charity. The school also won two more awards for 'Best Poster'

and 'Outstanding Individual Achievement', which was presented to 10-year-old Marty Dangerfield for his hard work throughout the challenge.

'Super Wash' from Oundle CE Primary School picked up the last award for 'Best Teamwork'. Their business held a very successful car

wash raising money for Volunteer Action Oundle and pupils were presented with this award for creating a short video presentation at the last minute, which was a real testament of teamwork for the smallest competing team.

The challenge proved to be very successful with the schools, whose students reported that they loved the experience and gained valuable new skills and confidence. They also learnt an awful lot about

running a business and the importance of teamwork.

Councillor Colin Wright, said: "The Junior Dragons' Apprentice Challenge provided young people from across the district with the opportunity to use their creativity and imagination to create successful businesses and raise money for fantastic local charitable causes. All of the pupils demonstrated innovation and worked together to win a number of brilliant awards."

Yorkshire artist exhibits in the Yarrow Gallery, Oundle

whose uplifting, vibrant and energetic style captures the essence of the places and the things she paints. She works in charcoal, acrylic, pen, ink and oil and draws coastlines, landscapes and still lifes. She takes her inspiration from the beauty and drama of the English countryside and coastline whilst incorporating some of the colours seen in the art of South Africa (where she grew up). Colleen exhibits in

London, Bristol, Edinburgh and North Yorkshire, where she lives. She also runs courses from her own studio to help others develop their love of drawing.

"I am looking forward to exhibiting in Oundle," said Colleen. "People who buy my work always say it makes them feel cheerful, so please come and take a look, even if you don't have the intention of buying something. I hope it will brighten up your day."

Thrapston Town Band celebrates its 160th anniversary in 2018!

Records show that Thrapston Town Band was formed in 1858 by Mr Nathaniel Smith, a Director of Smith and Grace, Iron Foundry which was based in Midland Road, Thrapston. It is reported that Mr Smith believed that keeping the workforce occupied would stop them from spending

money in the public houses.

A tea was held on Easter Sunday, 6th April, 1858 in Raunds and the band led a grand procession which paraded the streets. It is likely that this was the first performance given by the newly formed band. It is believed that Thrapston

Town Band is the oldest surviving band in the county.

Today, Thrapston Town Band continues to serve Thrapston and the surrounding area as a community based concert band with an emphasis on teaching new players and bringing brass band music to everyone.

Higham Ferrers Town Charters to be conserved thanks to Lottery funding

Higham Ferrers Town Council in association with Higham Ferrers Tourism, Business and Community Partnership has received a Heritage Lottery Grant of £29,900 to enable the conservation of the Town Charters. Thanks to money raised by National Lottery players, the project enables the professional conservation of the five Town Charters and Byelaw currently held in the Town Hall.

The essential conservation work commences this month and will take nine months to complete. The conserved Charters will be stored at Northampton Record Office. However, to allow the public to view them, digital images of the Charters will be taken. From the images full size prints of the Charters will be framed, and alongside interpretative material, they will go on a touring exhibition in the town and wider area next summer. A variety of volunteer opportunities will go in hand with the touring

exhibition, with volunteers given training so they can help share the importance of these Charters and their heritage value. The digital images will also be online through a dedicated website charting the progress of the conservation work and essential project information.

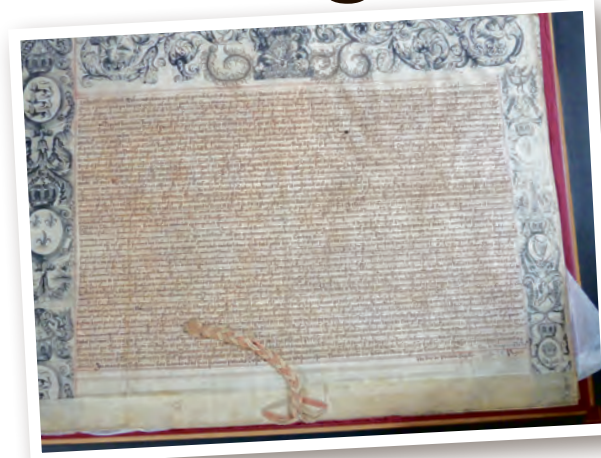
In addition to the conservation work the project incorporates an exciting educational programme being taken to schools, initially Higham Ferrers Junior School. A Charter week is scheduled at the junior school for May 2019 where the children will take part in fun activities to raise their awareness and understanding of the Charters and their historical context within the town. The week will incorporate the children writing a script, storyboarding, filming, directing and starring in their own commemorative Charter film. They will also be developing a commemorative booklet and children's town trail.

The Charters and Byelaw are legal documents which mark phases in the progress of self government of the town. The Charters date from 1556 to 1886, with the Byelaw dated 1616. There were also two earlier Charters and from copies of these we know that freedom was given to 91 people of Higham Ferrers in 1251.

To celebrate these Charters and the town's heritage a historical event day is planned in Higham Ferrers for June 2019 focusing on the medieval charters period. There will be medieval encampment displays featuring living history demonstrations and the public will be able to have a go at medieval trades and entertainments. The day will coincide with the monthly Farmers' Market and the public will experience present day market stall holders joining with medieval period traders for an unforgettable celebration.

Higham Ferrers Town Council and the Tourism Partnership are also providing funding for the project and are supported by a grant from East Northamptonshire District Council.

Commenting on the award, Anna Sauntson, Town and District Councillor and Member of the Tourism Partnership said: "We are delighted to have received this support thanks to National Lottery players. The Charters



have played a pivotal role in the heritage of Higham. It is wonderful to know that we are not only preserving these documents for future generations, but enabling them, through the exhibition and activities in the town and wider community to now be shared with and appreciated by so many."

Jonathan Platt, Head of HLF East Midlands said: "Thanks to National Lottery players we have been able support the conservation and interpretation of these historic Town Charters. As well as preserving these important documents, this project will provide an opportunity to let people know about the important role they have played in the development of rights that local people still enjoy today."

Your Health – Are you snacking?

You know as well as I do that we've all become the slaves to sugar snacks and sitting still. Neither of which are good for us. So how about some Movement Snacks instead?

Movement Snacks force you to take a break from being still. Oh, don't roll your eyes like that, this is really important. It's so easy for us to be busy but inactive these days. We have to get out of the addictive belief that having a break means sitting still.

And you don't have to be sitting at a desk to need a Movement Snack. Who do you know who is doing a repetitive job? That person needs Movement Snacks just as much as a desk-bound office worker.

So how do you choose which snack to have? At the clinic in Higham we're

producing a live Movement Snack on our Facebook page at 1.15pm every Wednesday, so you could join us for that, or you can make up your own. And get other people around you to join in. Just get up, swing your arms around, wriggle your bottom, stomp your feet, or do some little rotations with your body. Don't turn the movements into stretches – keep them loose and wriggly. Just enough movement to get the blood flowing and the muscles moving.

Once you've done a few of these you'll see just how much your achy joints and muscles like them!

If you are injured or have problems balancing, make sure you hold on to a kitchen surface or table when you do your Movement Snacks. And remember Movement Snacks aren't rehabilitation exercises. These exercises are to free up sleepy bodies, they're not a substitute for proper rehab.

If you're looking for something a bit more serious, or if you've forgotten your rehab exercises you need to speak to a professional so that you know you're doing the right things. Don't try to do rehab exercises without some kind of supervision.

Wildlife News

We are coming into the season we know as autumn, though on the other side of the Atlantic the word "fall" is used; this is when plants other than evergreens lose the parts of the plant which have worked through the summer producing the growth but have stopped using the sun's energy in that work. Yet some leaves will not reach the falling-off stage because they themselves are food for other creatures.

Plenty of animals in the fields look for plant leaves to provide their diets. Not the obvious ones like rabbits and hares, nor farm animals like cows and sheep, nor even the traditional enemies of gardeners and farmers, the caterpillars of moths and butterflies for example. There are many much smaller than those already mentioned, and also often dully coloured so they do not catch our eye, but we can see evidence that they have been there in the leaves themselves – or at least what is left of them – and learn something about the creature which has been working, and eating, there. The larger animals may eat the whole leaf (which could even include grass, of course) but these smaller ones

also have smaller mouths, so they choose the parts they can manage. The remains, found more easily at this time of year, might look skeleton-like because the soft material has been eaten leaving just the tougher framework which supported the leaf through the summer (as with some of my raspberry plants this year), or perhaps a network of little tunnels between the top and bottom skins of the leaf, or even the little pieces nibbled away in confetti-sized slices to be taken away for an insect form of 'farming'.

Many species of insects can be responsible for the different methods; cutting the little slices are probably leaf-cutting bees and ants, while some moths (in their caterpillar stage) somehow manage to tunnel through the middle of the leaf. All of them have particular qualities, like strength or ingenuity, suitable for their lifestyles, but for us, we have a chance to see some secrets of the natural world, often at our feet. One last thought – they all have their own preferred foods, so we have plenty to look for.

W. B. Bartlett: Richard the Lionheart

Friday 5th October, 7.45pm at St Peter's Church, North Street, Oundle

This is the first full-length biography of Richard I in 40 years. He was known to history as 'Richard the Lionheart', after his reputation for bravery exhibited fighting the 'Saracens' whilst crusading in the Holy Land.

Whilst Richard I is one of medieval England's most famous kings he is also the most controversial. He has variously been considered a great warrior but a poor king, a man driven by the quest for fame and glory but also lacking in self-discipline and prone to throwing away the short-term advantages that his military successes brought him. In this reassessment W. B. Bartlett looks at his deeds and achievements in a new light. The result is a re-evaluation of 'The Lionheart' which finds that the King is every bit as remarkable as his medieval contemporaries

found him to be. This includes his Muslim enemies who spoke of him as their most dangerous and gallant opponent. It also shows him to be a man badly let down by some of those around him, especially his brother John and the duplicitous French king Philip. His character foibles are also exposed to the full including his complicated relationships with the key women in his life, especially the huge contemporary figure of his mother Eleanor of Aquitaine and his wife Berengaria with whom he failed to produce an heir leading to later suggestions of homosexuality. This is a new Richard, one for the 21st century, and a recapitulation of the life story of one of the greatest personalities of medieval Europe.

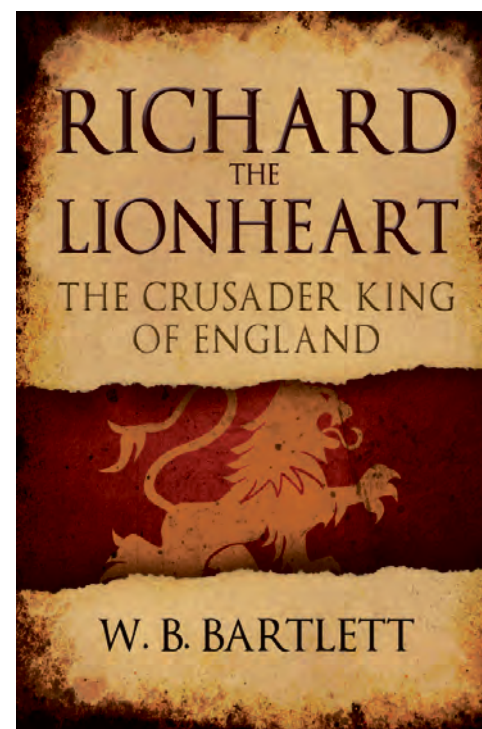

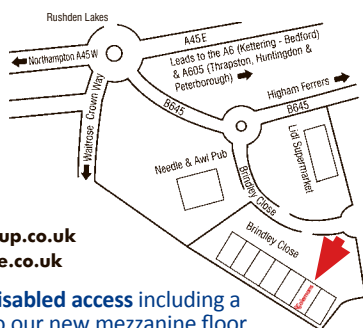

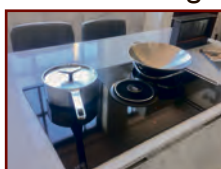
