Genealogy jottings

If your ancestors were in the Armed Forces, it may be that you will be able to obtain a copy of their service papers. Please be careful when searching online for these as I know that there can be some websites that will charge you for information that is freely available elsewhere. A good place to start is The National Archives. They have some superb research guides, which can be found here: <http://www.nationalarchives.gov.uk/help-with-your-research/research-guides/>

Not only is there help in finding the service records but also Army Operations in various wars. I recently found the records for a chap who fought in the Crimean War. He was abroad for 18 months, which ended suddenly with his being wounded at the Battle of the Alma on 20th September 1854. This led me to reading about the battle, finding out about his uniform and really getting a better understanding of what his life had been like. His army records also gave me the details of where he had been born, which has led me on to discovering who his parents were – something that I would not have been able to find without this help. I have

now managed to research back a further two generations as a result.

It may be that you have an ancestor who was killed in one of the conflicts. Have you checked out the Commonwealth War Graves Commission website? It may be found at: <https://www.cwgc.org/> If your ancestor is amongst those mentioned, you will be able to find out where their memorial is and also where they fought. Many of the records (where known) also name any parents, spouses or siblings who were left behind as well as the age of the casualty. The service number is also recorded, which can then help with further research. Something to bear in mind is that the CWGC website has records not just from Britain, but other Commonwealth countries as well. Very useful if your ancestor fought with the Australian Forces, for example.

Editor's notes

A couple of editions ago, we reported that Northamptonshire County Council (NCC) now seems to have its finances under control, and this is reflected in new figures showing a forecast underspend in 2018/2019.

The latest finance monitoring report shows a forecast year-end position of an underspend of £0.1m – an improvement on the £0.9m overspend reported last month. The current financial position is regarded as being such a move in the right direction that last week the Commissioners, who are currently overseeing the running of the authority, recommended that the Section 114 Notice be withdrawn from 1st April. The other side to this improvement is of course the cuts in services that the Council have had to make to achieve the savings.

Certainly though, it's not all sweetness and light at NCC! The long-standing Chair of the authority's Pension Committee, Councillor Graham Lawman, has been sacked after overseeing a vote over a £2m payment from the pension fund. Last week members of the Committee voted against a proposal to hold back £2m of the £6.73m employer pension contribution as a one-off reduction and instead to make it in the next financial year. Councillor Lawman, who has been a County Councillor for 10 years, said: "I'm extremely disappointed as I feel I had done an excellent job. The pension fund is performing extremely well."

Since the decision, Councillor Lawman, who has asked the Leader to reconsider his decision, said he's had several messages of support from Councillors of all parties.

Labour's Councillor Julie Brookfield, who was a member of the Committee until being removed last year, said: "I am deeply concerned by my County Council even considering raiding the pension fund. The Pension Committee took a decision not to accede to the NCC request for a £2m transfer because they have a fiduciary duty and need to have regard to the safety of the scheme."

It's difficult to understand the reasoning, if there was any, behind the tearing up of trees along the Greenway in Rushden reported elsewhere in this edition, especially when local people had put in so much effort in an attempt to improve the environment for everyone. This sort of vandalism obviously can't be compared with the increased level of knife crimes in some areas of the country; nonetheless, it ranks highly on the list of wanton, pointless and mindless actions which undermine our social fabric. We join the local Council in condemning it.

Speaking of local Councils, please note that the Thrapston offices and Customer Service Centres at Thrapston, Rushden and Oundle will close for the Easter weekend on Thursday 18th April and open again on Tuesday 23 April. More info can be found at www.east-northamptonshire.gov.uk/news

Rupert Shortt: Does Religion Do More Harm Than Good?

Friday 26th April at 7.45pm, St Peter's Church, North Street, Oundle PE8 4AL

History is littered with wars and atrocities apparently inspired by religion, and today there seems no end to reports of cruelty and violence carried out in the name of God. But is it belief in God that motivates these evils? Or do they spring from other motives?

At the same time, history testifies to numerous benefits to humanity brought about by religious individuals and movements. But despite these positive outcomes might it be



true, as some atheists suggest, that religion in general does more harm than good? Is religion itself inherently toxic?

Or could it simply be that there is good religion and there is bad religion, and we just need to learn to tell the difference?

"Religious rhetoric – from several quarters – is one of the things that most threatens the peace and sanity of the world." If even a highly respected faith leader such as Rowan Williams can voice such a claim, the case against religion

would appear compelling.

So, are the major spiritual traditions greater sources of discord than harmony? Or are conflicts widely blamed on faith differences fundamentally social and political?

In his rich but highly succinct book, Rupert Shortt offers even-handed guidance on one of the most disputed questions of our time. Among much else he sheds light on the contrast between good and bad religion, and on why the distinction is of urgent relevance in an era increasingly described as post-secular.

Rupert Shortt is religion editor of The Times Literary Supplement. His books include Benedict XVI (2005), Christianophobia: A Faith under Attack (2012), Rowan's Rule: The Biography of the Archbishop (2014) and God Is No Thing: Coherent Christianity (2016).

Candidates with STEM Potential Wanted

Oundle School's Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Potential programme is looking for candidates. The programme is modelled on the scheme of the same name at Imperial College London and is conducted

in partnership with the College. It aims to widen access to university by enabling pupils with academic potential and interest in STEM careers to access courses in scientific disciplines. Pupils will be supported through their GCSE and A level studies with workshops, lectures and non-residential summer schools over the course of each year at Oundle School.

At KS4 pupils take masterclasses in science, technology, engineering and maths to enhance their range of skills and experience, and to inform their choices for A-level. KS5 pupils will take part in workshops related to the subjects that they are undertaking at A-level and support with their university applications including course guidance and writing personal statements at appropriate times in their school career. Pupils who successfully complete STEM Potential in Years 10 and 11, and meet the entry criteria, will be offered a place on the post-16 STEM Potential programme which follows the same format through Years 12 and 13.

Current Year 9 pupils may apply for a place on STEM Potential to begin as they start Year 10 in September 2019. Tansor residents brave the elements to participate in #GBSpringClean

Residents of Tansor turned out on Sunday 17th March for the annual litter pick, which was part of Keep Britain Tidy's #GBSpringClean.

A staggering 64 bags of rubbish and recyclables were collected as well as eight tyres, seven hubcaps, a car seat, parts of a sofa, a couple of roadwork signs and a significant amount of building rubbish. A fantastic effort all round.

Around 40 volunteers of all ages were equipped with kit, split into groups and allocated stretches of the roads around the village and the footpath beside the A605. A sharp hail storm blew through just as everyone set off, but thankfully the sun came out shortly afterwards.

Wet wipes (which, contrary to popular belief, do not biodegrade) and fast food and 'on the go' food packaging continue to be the main sources of litter. Additionally regular litter pickers from the village estimate they have collected over 300 empty red wine bottles since the beginning of this year, thrown into roadside hedges.

Unusual items: a pair of tights, a stash of pornography found under a hedge, part of a truck's suspension and a stolen wallet which was returned to its Oundle based owner.

Lucy Garrett headed up a team from Tansor Trust to serve a well deserved cup of tea and chocolate biscuits to all returning litter pickers

in the village hall and Gill Tuck kindly took over from her.

Special thanks are given to Richard Insall for collecting bags using his motorised wheelchair and towing a trailer, to Jeremy and Anne Green from Tansor Wold who collected bags beside the road, to East Northamptonshire Council for providing the litter picking equipment, and to all who took part for their muscle power, sense of community and sense of humour, with a special mention to the many children who helped!

"Litter is an emotive subject – it is difficult to understand why people toss it so thoughtlessly and it is a shame we have to arrange litter picks to tidy up their mess," said Camilla Sherwin, one of the organisers of the Tansor Litter Pick. "Litter is a demonstration of a bigger issue – a lack of regard for the environment as well as recyclable materials and resources which mankind is using up much more quickly than they are being replaced."

Please remember that litter picking does not need to be limited to an annual village event. Leading by example will educate our children and hopefully encourage those who see litter pickers to think twice before throwing litter out of a car window. Whilst littering is a universal problem, as the Tansor Litter Pick proved, there is tremendous power in the small efforts of the masses.



Your Health – Glass Ankles

Glass ankles is a term for ankles that are prone to twists and sprains. And I bet you know someone who has them. The person who is always going over on their ankles, complaining of strains and sprains. Yes, that's the one.

Like glass, these ankles are fragile, and easily broken if not handled with care. For example, people with glass ankles should not kick heavy objects – lawnmowers, for example – or run on uneven ground in unstable, poorly fitting shoes.

Weak ankles can cause people to lose balance, or roll sideways on the ankle. The problem is often aggravated by joint hypermobility. To see if your ankles are wobbly, balance on one leg in front of a mirror. Hold onto something if you need to. Watch how much your foot and ankle

wobble. Can you maintain balance easily? Then try balancing while moving the other leg forward and back, as if running. Can you still keep your balance? If you're prone to falling over please DON'T try this!

To help glass ankles, try to work on your balance whenever you can. Using a wobble board at home or in the gym can help ankle sprains. If you don't have a wobble board there are plenty of easy exercises you can do at home. If you're prone to falling over you need more individual advice. A pathway to heaven

A celebratory coffee morning was held at Ringstead Baptist Church this weekend in recognition of the splendid new footpath that has been installed to improve safety and accessibility, in and around the same community amenity.

Courtesy of a £15,000 grant from local construction firm Mick George Ltd, the existing walkway which runs the full length between High Street and Black Lane, has been replaced with a durable, resin-bound gravel sidewalk.

The pathway in question is extensively used as the gradient is considered less steep than the parallel road (Cherry Street).

In addition to the aforementioned improvements, a new set of double doors have been added at the Church entrance, as well as the creation of a striking Indian Sandstone slabbed area, further enhancing the location's appearance for all visitors and passersby.

Angela Davis, Administrator at Ringstead Baptist Church said: "The grant has enabled us to

transform the footpath, making it safe and accessible for all members of our community. Our limited resources would only have allowed us to carry out the bare minimum of repairs. However, the funding provided by Mick George Ltd has allowed us to improve the whole appearance and practicality of the surface, making it adequate for buggies and mobility scooters, as well as walking pedestrians."

The project arose after safety concerns were raised as to the suitability of the previous combination of roughly layed tarmac and concrete which was increasing the likelihood of accidents.

Stuart Costello, Marketing Director of Mick George Ltd commented: "Ringstead is an area that we have operated from for many years and the support that we have received from the local community during that time, has been incredible. That is something we very much appreciate."

Wildlife News

We guessed right: the unusual, even record-breaking, weather as winter drew to a close held a sting in its tail, with overnight frosts as normal for this time of year. This can pose extra problems for gardeners, as pests may get a head start on breeding before enough hunters – of all sizes and species – come out from wherever they have spent the winter months. And the small (but growing) number of those pest-hunters will not keep up with the pests until the spring migration rush of birds reaches our shores – even if they only pass through they will hunt for food before journeying on.

Those staying in our countryside will be faced with a problem which is important in our own society – somewhere to live. Humans face shortages of suitable houses because the population has grown so rapidly and demand outstrips supply. For our wildlife friends the trouble is often due to human interference including destruction of suitable habitat, land used for housing development, suitable food plants removed, agricultural additives attacking pests and increasing crops, or

other changes.

After the problems of getting here the birds (or is it a job for just one of them?) must find a suitable 'plot' and face the difficulty of all builders – supply and delivery of materials. A very wide range is needed to meet the demands of the bird population: smaller species will need good insulation, because little bodies do not have much warmth to spare either for stopping the eggs from developing or, later, keeping the tiny young ones alive; nests will probably contain feathers (hundreds or even thousands, quite a task for the parents-to-be) or even moss.

Large birds can meet heating demands but the greater nest weight requires more strength, using sturdier twigs than leaves used by smaller birds. A pair of turtle doves were working on the front lawn a few days ago because a nearby silver birch in recent strong winds left numerous fine twigs on the ground. And just like some humans, if the twig's length did not fit there was only one way to correct the problem – throw it away and find a better one!

Wellingborough's Tresham College campus to receive a new lease of life

Planning permission has been granted for Tresham College's Wellingborough campus to be regenerated to provide modern post-16 educational facilities in the town centre.

The college will provide first-class facilities for up to 1,000 additional students by 2021, and create employment opportunities for residents across the borough.

The Borough Council of Wellingborough, which is the local planning authority, granted planning permission on Wednesday 6th March to redevelop the external façades of the main tower of the existing campus.

100 car parking spaces will be provided where part of the building has been previously demolished and a new vehicle access point will be created off Queen Street, as well pedestrian access from Church Street.

The council is working with key partners to redevelop areas of the town as part of the town centre's regeneration, and work started earlier this month to renovate the external appearance of the historic Hind Hotel.

Leader of the Borough Council of Wellingborough, Cllr Martin Griffiths, said: "This is one of the most significant developments to take place in Wellingborough. Councillors and staff at the council are working closely with colleagues at Tresham College, and SEMLEP, who have provided funding of £7.5 million through the Local Growth Fund, to deliver this ambitious project and I would like to thank everyone involved.

"I look forward to seeing this key site take shape, and the brand new facility being fully open in September 2020. Providing
