Editor's notes

Perhaps to the surprise of no one, work on repairs to the Oundle North bridge are not going to start until September; it seems there will be something of a scramble if Northamptonshire County Council are to meet their earlier promise "to complete the work by December 2019". The bollards enforcing the current width restrictions are perhaps the most battered pieces of metal in the District because drivers have been bouncing their vehicles off them as they cross the bridge; local car body repair shops must be having a booming time.

There has been a deal of discussion recently in the national press about inexperienced drivers needing to serve some sort of 'apprenticeship' before they are considered qualified to drive with passengers or at night. There is no substitute for experience and one has to be in favour of any sensible moves which make our roads safer, but the big problem with most of the proposals is how to enforce them.

Certainly, it seems that local driving standards are reasonable but one particular problem revolves around the inability of drivers to keep their cars on the correct side of the road. This is particularly apparent on bends and at T-junctions; in the latter case many drivers turn too soon and stray onto the wrong side of the road without

consideration of what's approaching from the opposite direction. Finally on the subject of roads, don't forget that the county's extensive 'surface dressing' road repairs begin on Monday 29th July.

The weather has a strong influence on our lives; so it may be a relief that, by the time you read this, we expect to be back to a cooler, more showery environment and to be better able to concentrate on work after the high temperatures and thunderstorms of mid-week.

The one national topic which has been hogging the headlines is the election of the new Tory party leader and thus Prime Minister. Whatever your views about the new incumbent, or the manner of his election, with such a tiny proportion of the electorate deciding the outcome, there has to be some relief that we can now hope to move forward to resolve the range of national and international concerns which beset the country. Hopefully, this can be achieved without plunging the country back into financial gloom!

This weekend sees the second anniversary of the opening of the Rushden Lakes complex and there is a 2-day Festival with lots of additional events and activities to mark the occasion. For those who don't intend to visit, there is good reason to steer well clear of the area and not add to the likely traffic congestion.

Getting hitched?

A question often asked of family lawyers is: should I have a pre-nuptial agreement?

It is better to have one than not; particularly in those instances where pre-acquired wealth, such as a family business, needs protecting.

In law, a pre-nuptial agreement is not automatically binding in court. So what's the point? The fairness of upholding an agreement (or part of it) will be considered on a case by case basis. The court will attach more weight to an agreement if various formalities have been complied with at the drafting stage, and if it has been entered into freely; with a full appreciation of its implications.

The agreement must be fair and any potential children considered; or at least a mechanism put in place to review the

agreement. If not, this is likely to be the single greatest factor resulting in a pre-nuptial agreement failing. So having one drawn up properly, by an expert, is important.

There is much sway for the validity and enforceability of pre-nuptial agreements to be enshrined in statute, because the current situation can sometimes create uncertainty. Getting legal advice is therefore essential.

The message for now is, if you have assets to protect and your future spouse is willing: enter into a pre-nuptial agreement before you get married. Not having one could result in a final order being made on divorce, that costs you your assets and wealth that you had before you got married.

Manor School awarded STEM Exploration Grant

Manor School Sports College has been awarded a grant for £250 towards a new STEM research project.

The STEM Exploration Grants have been created by the STEM Clubs Programme to assist schools and colleges to cultivate a sustainable STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) project in collaboration with a STEM partner. The grant can be used for purchasing equipment, supporting idea development and the provision of training related to the demands of the project.

Eliza Wilford, the ICT teacher who applied for the grant, said: "This is a fantastic opportunity for students to work on a project within the community and develop their skills across a range of STEM subjects. We are looking forward to seeing what ideas the students come up with."

Wildlife News

Most creatures we see flying around in the countryside are insects – flies of various sizes, alongside bees, wasps, butterflies and moths, are good examples. There are two groups of warm-blooded creatures which have managed the big change and overcome the force of gravity to spend some, or in certain cases almost all, of their lives in the air – birds and bats.

We all see various species of birds, because they rely on sight to find their way around, and to capture their food, animal or plant. Bats do not reveal their presence easily because they do not use visible light to look around and find their food; they have an echo-sounding system sending out rapidly vibrating 'squeaks' and the sound to come back to build a 'picture' of their surroundings. Human ears cannot hear those sounds very well (the wrong frequency) but devices are able to change the bats' signals to an audible level; it does not always name what species are around, but the differences do help.

The real reason for this method of 'seeing

in the dark' is, of course, nothing to do with whether our own eyes are working well; these little creatures, looking rather like mice with a couple of large leathery wings attached to their bodies, are out hunting for the moths and other insects which form their diet (and different bats need different menus).

We see moths gathering round a light as twilight falls, so the ideal time for insects to appear is as daylight is fading, and the bats' hunting habits must fit in with the best times for finding their meal (animals active at these times are described as 'crepuscular'). This radar/sonar-like system is essential for these animals, giving them an advantage, but it does make life harder for us nature-watchers.

Therefore many wildlife trusts, including our own local organisation, supervise walks in various spots (the reserves along the Nene valley are ideal) to introduce the less experienced to some delights of the darker hours; and don't worry, whatever you have been told, they won't harm you.
