## Genealogy jottings

Last time, I was talking about visiting the areas in which our ancestors lived. But what about visiting Record Offices and Archives? First, check their opening times. The Northampton Archives at Wootton Hall, for example, are only open Tuesday to Thursday from 9am to 5pm so no use popping down there on a weekend! However, many of the offices have online catalogues that you can browse, so that should save you time when you actually get there.

I was at the Northampton Archives recently and, because I had undertaken some research before my trip, was able to provide the reference number of the documents that I wanted to read. It is all very well seeing records online, but there is nothing better than holding the original papers from 200 years ago!

Make a plan of action – who do you want to research? It might be best to concentrate on just one or two people, otherwise you could find yourself working sideways and the staff are waiting to lock up before you have found out what you went there for in the first place! If you are visiting an archive

a fair way from home and plan on spending the day there, do check out the refreshment facilities. If the office is based in or near a town centre, do take a break at lunchtime and go for a walk in the fresh air. However, not all are. The Essex Archives in Colchester used to have a sandwich van call round and an announcement was made over the tannoy when it arrived! Failing that, take sandwiches – there is nothing more annoying to your fellow researchers than the noise of a rumbling tummy!

Also, remember what I said a few weeks ago about taking breaks. Make sure that you get up and walk around, look at things other than the microfilm or paperwork so as to give your eyes a rest. But remember – not everything needs to be done in one visit and therefore several trips could be necessary.

## Editor's notes

Homeowners in Northamptonshire are being encouraged not to buy goods or particularly services from cold-callers after a rise in the number of complaints about suspected rogue traders. Northamptonshire County Council's (NCC) Trading Standards Service has received calls from people who have been offered maintenance work on their property or garden by doorstep traders.

In one case, an elderly lady was quoted £9,500 for a new roof and was taken to the bank to withdraw the money. Luckily the bank followed the 'Bank and Building Society Protocol' and did not release the funds. A subsequent independent assessment of the roof indicated that the maximum cost of the work should only have been £3,000; Trading Standards are now making further enquiries and they stress that their advice is never to buy goods or services from a cold-caller on the doorstep, even if it is claimed that the work needs doing as a matter of urgency. Instead, homeowners should find a Trading Standards approved trader to carry out any work through the national 'Buy With Confidence' scheme or 'Trustmark', the Government Endorsed Quality Scheme.

NCC Cabinet Member for Highways and Place, Jason Smithers said: "The mild weather seems to have sparked a spate of suspected rogue traders who are cold-calling on elderly and vulnerable residents

trying to pressure them into unnecessary work on their home at an inflated cost. All too often, this work is unnecessary, never completed or carried out to a poor standard. Our advice is clear, do not pay for goods or services from a doorstep trader. If you do need work carrying out, the 'Buy With Confidence' scheme will help you to find a reputable tradesperson who has been approved by Trading Standards."

NCC, in partnership with Northamptonshire Police, can provide 'No Cold Calling' stickers. Call the Citizens Advice Consumer Service on 0345 04 05 06.

They can also provide you with advice about your consumer rights. If you are concerned about a caller at your door or suspect that rogue traders or distraction burglars are operating in your community, contact the dedicated Doorstep Crime Action Network on 0345 23 07 702.

Elsewhere in this edition we report on the success of local students in A level and BTEC examinations and we offer our congratulations to all those who have done so well. However, we should also take time to spare a thought for those who have not done so well. They should consider that, while they might not be on the path they expected, they could be on a better one. Remember that there are different routes to the same destination; even if you have your heart set on a specific career, you can find another way to get there.

# Beat the Street helps get East Northamptonshire moving

The Beat the Street initiative in East Northamptonshire is being hailed as a success after a new report shows that the challenge has helped get people walking and cycling across the area.

More than 8,000 walked, ran and cycled 73,000 miles together for Beat the Street from March to May 2019. The initiative saw special sensors called Beat Boxes placed on lampposts around East Northamptonshire which could be tapped with cards while walking or cycling in return for points towards your school or workplace.

Funded by East Northamptonshire Council

in partnership with Freedom Leisure and The National Lottery through Sport England, the initiative aimed to encourage families to ditch the car and become more physically active by exploring their local community. A new report produced by Intelligent Health – who delivered the initiative – has shown that players became more physically active as a result of taking part, helping improve the health of people across

East Northamptonshire.

Participants were surveyed at the beginning and immediately after Beat the Street to see if they had made any changes in behaviour. Key results from the report include:

- Before Beat the Street, 21% of adult players were completely inactive (doing less than 30 minutes of exercise per week). After the game this dropped to just 12% of players.

- The proportion of children who were inactive decreased from 22% before the game to 11% immediately afterwards.
- Using NICE's Return on Investment Calculator, it is estimated that Beat the Street will lead to healthcare savings of £504,802 over the next five years.

Additionally, many players reported that Beat the Street had helped encourage them to walk or cycle more often, visit new places and spend more time with their friends and family:

"It helped me to walk to school and encouraged me to take the longer route to get more points. I joined the gym which I have never done before and kick-started us

all as a family into a healthier lifestyle."

"It enabled my son and I to exercise before and after school. We used our walks to have a good chat together. We both felt good about earnings points for his school. We met new people along the way. I saved a lot of petrol by walking. It's encouraged me to go swimming as an alternative way of exercising."

In addition to getting residents more active, Beat the Street has also helped support the work of the local Children's Air Ambulance. Players were able to support a local charity while playing and the charity that received the most points over the course of the game would receive £500. Players travelled

more than 589 miles for Children's Air Ambulance and they received a donation from Beat the Street on Tuesday 30th July presented by Cllr Helen Howell.

Speaking about the success of the initiative, Cllr Steven North, Leader of East Northamptonshire Council, said: "We're really encouraged by these results from Beat the Street. ENC is committed to getting its residents more healthy and we hope to help improve the health and wellbeing for those in East Northamptonshire. In the coming months, Beat the Street will continue to engage with local residents and make sure that these changes continue long after the game's finish."

## Rushden & Higham Ladies v Towcester Roses

Rushden & Higham Ladies' first game was always going to be special and it fell to Towcester Roses to be their first opposition, a team that are a couple of years further on in their development and have already secured league promotion.

The game was billed as a rugby 10s pre-season friendly although it was a match that both teams wanted to win. As Rushden Ladies walked out, resplendent in their new yellow shirts, the atmosphere from both the supporters and the teams was a mix of excitement and nerves.

Rushden kicked off and the game was on, for the first 7 minutes both teams tested each other's defences, with both teams throwing in tackle after tackle. Whoever said that ladies were the gentle sex had never met these ladies.

As the nerves settled it was Towcester that finally managed to break through Rushden's lines and score the first try with the Towcester number 10 crossing the line with Rushden's number 10 hanging off her. This try had obviously whetted Towcester's appetite as they tried to break through Rushden's lines again only for some spirited defending from the Rushden players to deny Towcester the opportunity to ground the ball. Towcester kept up the pressure scoring another two tries although going through the centre was becoming more difficult as Rushden tightened up their central defensive line, although this opened up some gaps on the wing that Towcester's 15 welcomed for Towcester's fourth try.

While the wind might have been knocked out of Rushden's sails, they never gave up and continued probing Towcester's line for weaknesses only to be denied with the try line in sight and for Towcester to mount a counterattack down the wing to score again.



Unfortunately for Rushden the same thing happened to Towcester's next two tries. At half-time Towcester had scored seven tries.

The second half started as the first half finished with attacks by Rushden being converted into Towcester tries, three in almost as many minutes. For the next 10 minutes Rushden seemed to find that magic of silencing Towcester's wings while protecting their centre and cutting down on the handling errors. While this stopped Towcester scoring, Rushden were unable to find a way through Towcester's lines to score themselves. Unfortunately, this state was not to last with Towcester scoring two more tries near the end, resulting in five tries for the second half and 12 for the match.

Officially the match ended Rushden and Higham Ladies 0 Towcester Roses 12 although this hides the charges that Rushden made only to lose the ball within sight of Towcester's try lines – but in truth every player won, especially those who were playing their first match. Rushden can now look forward to playing their first away match against Wellingborough Ladies on 25th August at Cut Throat Lane.

We are also proud to support family members/carers of ABI survivors, not only helping them to understand and process the effects of ABI and offer advice and counselling, but also to signpost them to further services likely to be of benefit.

# Farming for the future

With farming at a time of change with all the implications of Brexit, the push for more environmentally friendly methods to be adopted is being taken up in the Nene Valley.

A unique piece of equipment, a rotary ditcher, has just completed a week's work creating swathes of channels and shallow ditches totalling more than 7km across 15 fields and reserves in the Nene Valley for breeding and overwintering wading birds.

With the use of special LIDAR maps, the Wildlife Trust in Northamptonshire have been planning the optimum areas to create these channels for the past year. Matt Johnson, the Trust's Living Landscape Manager for Northamptonshire said: "This rotary ditcher project has been a fantastic opportunity to work with six local farmers to create over 7km of ditches and 10 scrapes across the Nene Valley thanks to the Farming for the Future project, part of the National Lottery Heritage Funded Nenescape project.

"The work on the ground is the conclusion of a year's work of planning and partnership working and is restoring wetland features to priority breeding wader sites identified by the Trust in 2002. It's been great to see the enthusiasm for the project from both the farmers and other conservation organisations working in the valley and we are delighted with the dramatic changes to the sites. We look forward to seeing the results of the work next spring when the wetland features should be providing

prime habitat, encouraging waders such as lapwing and redshank (both of which have declined in the valley) to stay and breed."

The rotary ditcher is the only one of its kind in the country, bought from America in 2013 by the RSPB, and now hired out for wetland conservation projects via contractors RC Baker, based in Banbury. At Peartree Farm, Aldwinckle, farmer Tim Hankins watched as the ditcher was operated by first setting the laser equipment – one machine on a step ladder sending signals to a receiver on the back of the ditcher. Roaring into action, once the ditcher lowers the central cutting blade to dig a channel to the depth set by the laser, turf and earth fly dramatically from the extractor shoot, widely distributed onto the surrounding area.

Tim Hankins has been putting wildlife friendly practices into action at Peartree Farm for nearly three decades and embraced the opportunity to create the new habitats: "We are custodians of the land for future generations, I've always enjoyed the wildlife side of the farm and have been following wildlife schemes for the past 27 years – planting in hedges, creating wildlife corridors. By summer this field will be greened in again and we look forward to seeing the birds. We'll always do the best we can for wildlife."



**Farming for the Future** is a three-year project working with farmers and landowners in the Nene Valley from Northampton to Peterborough funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund through Nenescape to help restore and create meadow and wetland habitats as well as undertake vital infrastructural improvements to tackle diffuse pollution and aid water quality.

## Wildlife News

A few days ago one of the garden plants did not "look quite right". Closer examination showed that it was covered in caterpillars of the cinnabar moth, which has several features of interest to amateur naturalists (more correctly 'lepidopterists'). This moth makes life easy for the occasional watcher; the caterpillars are distinctively coloured – alternate rings of black and a bright yellow give the appearance of a hooped jacket often favoured by sports clubs; the insect itself, on the other hand, has a shade of red with sufficient contrast making the dark moth clearly visible.

The caterpillars emerge at this time of year, with only weeks in summer for them to feast on available food supplies and make their growth, and those weeks must coincide with the right time for the particular plants which the caterpillar needs. Moths, and their cousins the butterflies, usually feed on a limited range of plants (humans with similar eating habits might not be popular in a restaurant!); with this moth choices commonly include ragwort and the garden weed groundsel. A few days later another inspection of the plants showed far fewer caterpillars, suggesting that the food

supply had shrunk considerably, and the plant skeleton left behind confirmed that; presumably the others had either moved on to better-stocked eating areas – or perhaps they had themselves provided food for other predators. Whatever the reason they are still, from a colour viewpoint, welcome visitors even helping by attacking other unwanted plants.

The bright colours make insects much more open to attack from other creatures (many night-flying moths are more sober in appearance, to our eyes at any rate) and wearing easily seen colours ought to make life more hazardous for the insects and their offspring. It appears, though, that in reality they are warning those other feeders that they should keep away, and these warnings are more meaningful than the alarm boxes often fixed to house walls to deter thieves. Both the insect and the caterpillar are poisonous, or at least distasteful, to most other forms of animal life, possibly as a result of the plants they have been feeding on; how kind of the insects to give the alarm against possible 'suicide by eating'!

# Terry Waite: Travels with a Primate

Friday 27th September at 7.45pm – St Peter's Church, North Street, Oundle

**W**e join the Archbishop Robert Runcie, his unflappable Chaplain, Terry and a host of other colourful characters as they travel around the world.

Along the way, the Archbishop meets the Pope in Ghana, has a photocall with koalas and tries his hand at fishing in Australia, and meets the crowd via an 'archmobile' in Canada. He and his staff experience extreme weather conditions – from the drought-ridden landscapes of Nigeria to splashing through a flooded church in Scotland to stormy flights preceded by prayer from the pilot – as well as some rather unusual local customs, entertainment and souvenir gifts, and an array of

unfamiliar food and drink. Whether navigating huge crowds or temperamental sound systems or dealing with the fact that their party has arrived at the wrong place or on the wrong day, the Archbishop remains affable and good natured, even when, despite Terry's and the team's best efforts, events descend into – in Runcie's own words – 'a bit of a shambles'. Terry's engaging narrative also sheds light on the history of Lambeth Palace and the way in which the role of Archbishop of Canterbury has evolved over the years.

of Hostage UK and Y Care International, and President of Emmaus UK.


