Feathered family fun at STANWICK LAKES

Families can enjoy a week of bird-themed activities this February half-term and learn about why the nature reserve at Stanwick Lakes is such an important haven for wildlife.



The Rockingham Forest Trust looks after the habitats on the site to make it the perfect home for birds such as oystercatchers, reed buntings and pintails, but it's not just nature reserves that can look after wild birds.

Visit Stanwick Lakes on Wednesday 19th and Thursday 20th February between 11am and 4pm for their Feathered Friends event and build a bird box or a bird feeder to take home to your garden.


Natural nest sites for birds, such as holes in trees or old buildings, are disappearing fast as gardens are

tidied up and old houses are repaired. Making a bird box and putting it up in your garden plays an important part in conservation, whilst also giving you the pleasure of watching the birds that visit it. The nest boxes can be easily made by children and adults without any previous woodwork experience and friendly volunteers will be on hand to help.

Once you have made your bird box, drop into the Visitor Centre between 11am and 3pm to meet some owls, thanks to bird rescuers Owls to Behold, and enjoy birdy crafts.

Throughout the half term, from Monday 17th to Sunday 23rd February, there will be a Birdy Trail around the Solstice Lake. Follow the clues around the mile-long lakeside path (which is accessible for wheelchairs and buggies), spot the clues and win a prize. Nene Valley News has been in circulation for over twenty years, reporting on current news in your district, being the voice of the area and promoting exciting events for all the family. Each issue of the newspaper has been a valuable source of information for those living, working and enjoying their leisure across East Northamptonshire.

KM Media & Marketing had worked with East Northamptonshire Council for over 10 years to design, print and distribute the newspaper and in 2013, after speaking with local advertisers and residents, we made the decision to continue publishing a fortnightly newspaper independently with the ongoing support of local businesses.

Nene Valley News has continued to be self-funded during these seven years, with careful management of the business model and each year making sure KM Media are getting best value from our suppliers.

Last autumn we had the opportunity to review our distribution contract and we received a much

more competitive quote from an alternative supplier. Consecutive minimum wage increments have made the previous model unviable. Taking on board the increasing print costs too, KM Media made the decision to move the distribution to TNLC (The National Leaflet Company).

TNLC use a different business model to the previous supplier and use their own national teams to fulfil the distribution. TNLC have advised us that there are no vacancies for distributors at the present time. If this situation changes we will place opportunities in Nene Valley News.

KM Media would like to take this opportunity to thank all those that have worked to deliver the paper over the years. Your hard work and dedication to ensure the paper was delivered has always been appreciated. We would also like to take this opportunity to thank the Whistl national team for their hard work and locally, Christine Charlton, who has been instrumental in managing the delivery teams for many years.

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

Have you ever hit a brick wall? Not the side of the house with your fist, but reaching what seems to be an insurmountable dead end in your research. How do you deal with it? A few weeks ago, I explained about great uncle Walter and that one of the things that I did was ask for help on my forum. (If you want to read the full story, do visit the forum – the link is under my name – and search for ‘Who was Walter’s Wife’.)

Other points of view can always help you look at your research differently and you never know, they might pick up on something that you have

overlooked. Also, other folk may have access to resources that you don’t and so that brick wall can come tumbling down! Be mindful of transcriptions. It might be that a transcriber has inadvertently written something incorrectly and so sends you down the wrong path. If you can see the original, then you can not only make your own decision but you might also find a hidden gem in the margin that a helpful parish clerk or original recorder has made.

Sometimes, it is worth going along a roundabout route. My maternal grandfather was

(allegedly) born in Dublin. All I had was his birth date, although the year did tend to change depending upon where you were looking, and that his father’s name was Patrick. However, I did know that he was in the Home Guard during WW2 – I have his photograph on my office wall. I ordered his Home Guard records from the Historical Disclosures section of the Ministry of Defence and that has provided me with the information that he was in the Connaught Rangers from 1914 to 1919. I am gradually chipping away at that brick wall.

EDITOR'S NOTES

The brighter weather during the past week has highlighted the lengthening periods of daylight at this time of the year. It's just seven weeks now until the clocks go forward and we welcome spring. However, the arrival of the new season doesn't necessarily mean an end to cold weather. Figures for the UK provided by the Met Office show that the warmest spring on record was in 2011, with an average daytime temperature of 9.2 °C, and the coldest was the spring of 1962, with an average of 5.8 °C; the average mean temperature for spring is 7.7 °C. It can also continue to be pretty wet; the wettest spring was in 1947 when there was 331.7mm of rainfall.

There is what appears to be good news for local residents on the energy supply front. East Northamptonshire Council has approved a planning application for a gas peaking plant adjacent to the existing Chelveston Renewable Energy Park, further increasing its overall efficiency. The purpose of the plant is to generate electricity at times when the wind farm and solar arrays on the site are unable to produce sufficient power to meet peak requirements – such as when there is little wind or at night, often in winter conditions. The proposal will ensure grid stability and assist in enabling local supply to match demand. The development is an integral and supportive part of the larger energy park designed to deliver renewable energy. The plant will use

natural gas which has a significant role as part of the transition to a low carbon economy and supports the national drive towards increased energy sustainability. Overall, the Park will produce sufficient power for 60,450 households, offsetting some 78.75 tonnes a year of CO2 emissions from other power stations. The application is subject to certain conditions being met by the developer.

Meanwhile, Northamptonshire County Council has introduced an app which is intended to make life easier for users of public transport. The Smart Mover App is designed to be intuitive to use, allowing people to understand how to access real time information about public transport and plan a journey; it also offers a personalised “Next Stop” announcement on planned and favourite trips. The app can also help people navigate to bus stops – holding the phone up and utilising the phone’s camera to ‘look through the phone’ enables directions to be overlaid on the phone display. The idea is to encourage people to use alternative transport to cars, thus helping to reduce traffic congestion. This not only cuts pollution but a free-flowing road network can also help boost the local economy. The Smart Mover App is part of the wider Smart Move Northamptonshire initiative, which uses technology to manage the road network more efficiently, provide live traffic and travel information, and facilitate new and better services.

RAUNDS MUSIC FESTIVAL

Are you looking forward to the Raunds Music Festival? It takes place on the first weekend in May. Normally this is a bank holiday but this year the bank holiday has changed – so be sure to mark these dates: Thursday 30th April–Sunday 3rd May 2020.

The four-day annual indoor festival concentrates mostly on folk, roots and acoustic music, but the festival includes local performers, community groups, Song 'n' Tune free sessions, grassroots and established artists.

The Saturday night special will feature two brilliant bands. There have been many requests for the return of Fred's House, a Cambridgeshire band who got the Saxon Hall rocking a few years ago and now get promoted to the evening concert. The Rosellys add a different dimension.

You will get a great variety of music at the Festival. On Sunday the festival will end with Brooks Williams, a musician at the crossroads of blues and American roots music.

The festival has also secured another great booking in the folk band The Trials of Cato. Their debut album won Best Album

at the 2019 BBC Radio 2 Folk Awards, with BBC Radio 2's Mark Radcliffe hailing them as "one of the real discoveries on the folk circuit in recent times". Not to be missed, book up early!

There are afternoon concerts too – great value. If you have not been to one of these before why not look up details on the Raunds Festival website. For example on Sunday afternoon there is a great chance to see Pamela

Ward and Paul Cherrington. They are acclaimed songwriters and finalists in international songwriting competitions. Some of their work has been recorded and performed by other artists on the UK folk circuit.

No festival would be complete without a Friday night ceilidh. The combined talents of Tautas Roks and Ock 'n' Dough blend to provide the exciting high energy sound

that is guaranteed to get you onto the dance floor.

As usual there will also be a strong focus on local talent. Raunds itself will be represented by the Raunds Community Choir, the Ukulele Orchestra and the choir A Different Direction. Again there will be Song 'n' Tune Sessions. Whether you sing, play an instrument or compose, this is your chance to perform in a welcoming and

friendly atmosphere. See the website for details.

The Festival is mostly staged in the Saxon Hall, with

the opportunity to choose from Real Ales, soft drinks, hot drinks and food to keep you going.



Your Health – Chronic pain

I think you misunderstood me last time! From the messages I received it's clear I need to clarify: chronic pain doesn't mean you're making up the pain. It doesn't mean you're faking it. The pain is real, and it can be unbearable. It's certainly not to be laughed at or trivialised.

Chronic pain is pain that is ongoing and lasts longer than normal healing time, usually more than 3-6 months, despite medication or treatment.

What we are now learning is that pain does not depend on what is happening in the tissues; pain depends, entirely, on what the brain thinks is happening in the tissues. So your pain is 100% real, but it no longer accurately indicates damage.

Given the right exercises you can start to retrain your brain. This is one of the reasons pilates is so popular. Karen Grinter, from Northants Pilates, works with a lot of people in chronic pain. She

says: "Chronic pain sufferers are often frightened to do exercise. We try to help you understand that the right movement can make you feel better."

I still intend to give you some tips about how to

approach exercise when you're in pain, but if you need help sooner, talk to Karen or the chronic pain physiotherapist in Higham. You don't have to suffer.

Until then, be active, but don't overdo it.

GREENLIGHT FOR extension to renewable energy park

East Northamptonshire Council's Planning Management Committee has approved plans for a "forward-thinking" extension to Chelveston Renewable Energy Park.

The Council has approved the planning application for the proposed gas peaking plant which will sit adjacent to the existing energy park, further increasing the overall efficiency. The purpose of the plant is to generate electricity at times when the wind farm and solar arrays on the site are unable to produce sufficient power to meet peak power requirements – such as during times of low wind or at night, often in winter conditions. Elected members resolved that the application is subject to certain conditions being met by the developer.

The proposal will ensure grid stability and assist in local supply and demand, matching local demand as it arises.

The development is an integral and supportive part of a larger energy park, which is designed to deliver renewable energy. The plant will use natural gas, which has a significant role as part of the transition to a low carbon economy and supports the national drive towards increased energy sustainability. The Chelveston Renewable Energy Park overall will produce sufficient power for 60,450 households, offsetting some 78.75 tonnes

a year of CO2 emissions from other power stations.

Once it is open the scheme will provide back-up power, but will not replace the present renewable energy supply, which will remain the National Grid's preferred source of power.

Engineering Manager at Wykes Engineering, Robert Taylor, added: "We are pleased with the granting of planning permission from East Northants Council. We are committed to ensuring Chelveston Renewable Energy Park contributes to the wider decarbonisation of the National Grid by providing a wide range of energy production on this site. This application supports the renewable energy production on the site and contributes to the growing need for energy security at both a local and national level."

Plans for creation of Wellingborough Town Council resolved

Wellingborough Town Council, which will be formed on 1st April, will deliver limited services in its first year to allow for its elected councillors to decide which services the council wishes to undertake.

Councillors at the Borough Council of Wellingborough at a council meeting on Tuesday 28th January, resolved to not transfer any services in year one to allow the town council to decide on the services it would like deliver.

the views of our residents and believe that the town councillors, who will be elected in May, should decide which services they should deliver and allow sufficient time to determine which services and assets we transfer.

"We look forward to working with the town council in our final year to ensure that the needs of our residents and businesses are met."

 • Land to the west of Rushden Lakes – development of 450 houses, employment related uses and green infrastructure; and
 • Land between Newton Road and Chelveston Road (west of Moulton College), Higham Ferrers – development of a new 145 place secondary school for pupils with Special Education Needs (SEN) with associated access, facilities etc.

RUSHDEN EAST MASTERPLAN
 The **Rushden East Masterplan**, sets out details of the Council's aspirations for the development of the major sustainable urban extension to the east of the town. This site was allocated for development in 2016 in the North Northamptonshire Joint Core Strategy 2011-2031 (Local Plan Part 1) and makes provision for the delivery of 2700 houses, an equivalent number of jobs, schools, a local centre and green infrastructure.

SUCCESSFUL POLICING OPERATION to be replicated across the county



A Northamptonshire Police operation which has been hailed a success following its launch in Northampton last year, is to be replicated across the county.

Since October, more than 150 people have been arrested as part of Operation Lily – a crackdown on crime in Northampton town centre. Now officers in Kettering and Wellingborough are looking to repeat this success.

As part of the operation, the towns' Neighbourhood Policing Teams will be focusing on those communities that have been the most affected by crime and anti-social behaviour.

An enforcement day on Monday 27th January saw five warrants executed in Wellingborough as part of the operation's launch which resulted in large quantities of money and Class A drugs being seized.

With the support of colleagues from across the Force, officers will be stepping up patrols and carrying out targeted operations, to tackle those involved in crime as well as protect those who suffer as a result.

Area Commander of the North Local Policing Area, Superintendent Dennis Murray, said: "Operation Lily has made an enormous difference to those who live and work in Northampton town centre, and we will be striving to repeat this success among our communities.

"Working with our partners, we will be disrupting those who are intent on causing misery to our most vulnerable communities, which have been hardest hit by crime and anti-social behaviour.

"The majority of people living or working in these communities are hardworking, decent members of society and they do not deserve to live in fear as a result of the illegal activities of a small minority.

"Operation Lily aims to improve confidence and empower local residents to take back their communities and help to support our more vulnerable members of the community."

As part of the local policing operation, officers will be carrying out additional high-visibility patrols across the Hemmingwell and Queensway wards in Wellingborough and the town centre area of Kettering.
