Marina helps boaters stay safe

Boaters who sign up to join the Friends of the River Nene at White Mills Marina will each receive a 3 ply face covering to help them stay safe on their boating journey thanks to a new initiative.

White Mills had already handed out disposable masks and gloves to all of its boaters.

Debbie Skinner explained: "Once restrictions began to ease, we realised that many people were feeling quite vulnerable and exposed as they ventured out. To help alleviate their concerns, we decided to provide them all with a couple of masks and disposable gloves to help them on their way.

"We were so pleased with the response that once the comings and goings along the River began to increase, we thought it would be really nice to extend the idea to include boaters signing up to join the Friends of the River Nene.

White Mills Marina has been able to open the marina to overnight visitors and re-open its boathouse café, as well as welcome caravanners to its Certificated Camping and Caravanning Club site.

100k challenge raises close to £1k for Special Care Baby Unit

Twelve-year-old Willow Cooper has successfully completed her self-set challenge to run 100km in June.

Willow, a Year 7 student at Southfield School for Girls in Kettering, ran 3.4km every day for 30 days, so actually ran 102.4km, or the equivalent of two-and-a-half marathons over the month, which saw her running in hail as well as 20-degree heat, such is the British weather!

Kettering General Hospital's Special Care Baby Unit (SCBU) where Willow and her younger (by three minutes) twin sister Bronte were cared for for five weeks after being born eight weeks prematurely, weighing 2lb 14 and 4lb 7 respectively.

Willow hoped to raise £250 but so far, thanks to donations from generous friends and family and a number of anonymous donations, she is nearing £1,000.

Mum Naomi, 48, from Titchmarsh. who accompanied Willow on the run, said: "She did really well. It's a real achievement. Running every day is physically as well as mentally exhausting and I am really proud of her. We would like to thank everyone so much for their generous donations, especially those who gave anonymously so we are unable to thank them in person."

Nurse in charge at Kettering General Hospital's Special Care Baby Unit, Suzy

Edgar, said: "This is a great challenge set by Willow and it's brilliant that she has chosen to raise money for SCBU. We are lacking in developmental care items and would particularly like some Zaky hug hands which are heavy bean-filled bags which are given the scent of the parent and are laid across or alongside the baby and used as a comforter when the parent isn't there.

"At the moment, due to Covid-19, only one parent at a time, wearing a mask, is allowed to be with their baby and with restricted hours between 9am and 5pm, and parents can't stay overnight which is really impacting on parent bonding and breastfeeding. Zaky hands could really help with comforting the baby when their parents aren't there.

"They are expensive at £80 each so any fundraising towards them would be very gratefully received."

Some of the large organisations such as Ancestry and FindMvPast have the facility for you to upload your tree or just use it to record information - in as much or as little detail as you want. Ancestry will then create a basic story for each individual. You can also upload any photographs and copies of

But there are other family tree website hosts out there as well and worth having a look around for.

Having your tree on the

internet can be extremely helpful if you have family on the other side of the world - or even beyond visiting distance in this country – who are interested. You can keep control so that you are the 'webmaster' - the only one allowed to add or change details – but also the little internet spiderbots will pick up details and you could have contact from someone out of the blue with a nugget of information. Oh yes – a blog can also help attract new viewers. It does not have to be done regularly on a set day each week but general musings on what has been discovered, places visited (cemeteries are now open...), and any other happenings in your research journey all help. Post them every so often.

Teens tackle local litter problem

The Eco-Team of Manor School, Raunds have been doing litter-picks in our area in an effort to prevent an abundance of rubbish building up as the lockdown is eased.

In Northamptonshire, many areas are affected by endless amounts of litter being thrown onto our streets, and by the sides of roads. With the recent re-opening of fast food chains, the build-up of waste is getting worse.

Reducing litter is one of the three aims of the 'Eco-Schools' team at Manor School, Raunds (the others are increasing biodiversity and making more connections around the world). Eco-Schools is a global programme which engages 19.5 million children across 67 countries, with the aim of raising awareness and improving local communities. Its aims complement Manor School's

'Work, World, Wellness' ethos and curriculum, which helps to ensure that students are happy, healthy, employable and have a positive view of the world, by improving our environments, mental well-being and allowing students to practise new

Many of the students, inspired by the Eco-Schools committee, have filled up bags upon bags of litter from the streets, and fields. The waste, which consists of aluminium cans, crisp packets, cigarette packs and plastic bottles, has been sorted into recyclable and non-recyclable waste. If it had all been left, it would have taken years to decompose.

One student even persuaded his local football team, the Thrapston Warriors, to do a litter-pick around



their area. Another student remarked: "It all starts with one piece, then it's everywhere. We aren't the problem: we are the solution for a brighter

The Eco-Schools team are working hard to keep encouraging students to pick up litter if they see any on the floor or by the roadside.

If you have been inspired to do any litter-picks, make sure you wear reflective clothing so you can be seen, always use a litter-picker or gardening gloves when handling rubbish and be aware of your surroundings.

Wildlife **NEWS**

Our lives are often governed by time; when to go to work, or take our meals or catch our train, all seems to depend on the watch, or the calendar. Yet in the 'real' world of nature that is not the case; dates on the calendar may guide us as to when certain events are likely to take place, but that is all, and we have to be ready when it happens.

For example, at certain times during the year we see spring flowers, or migrating birds arriving (or leaving – our local cuckoo is still calling us at unearthly hours, though textbooks tell us they should be heading back to Africa, but they cannot read), or butterflies flapping their doddery way across the garden, but not because it is a booked time or date. It is just 'the right time of the year'

Two or three weeks ago weather conditions, both now and earlier in the year, combined to give us a good 'crop' of amphibians' eggs - frogs and toads and, hopefully, newts. After

the spawning, then the hatching of the eggs in their bubbles, finally they were ready to clamber out of their watery world and enter the air-filled space above. They all grew up under similar conditions and came out of the water at around the same time of the same month, with perhaps a few days' variation either way because of what those conditions did to growth; but the net result brought open surfaces covered in a mass of little crawling figures, and we realise that large numbers are necessary because they are easy pickings for many predators, such as herons and grass snakes to name but two, which are hanging round hoping for just such an unexpected feast for their

This year's population explosion has almost passed, but for every little animal making it to new hunting grounds there could be hundreds which do not; we may avoid treading on those whose paths cross ours (if we see them in time) but motor vehicles pose larger dangers. Never imagine that because there are large numbers of any creature (or plant) they are any less deserving of attention and care

SUPPORT FOR WELL-BEING OF

CARE WORKERS AND CHILDREN

Children's author, BJAS Addy, who was a peripatetic crisis nursing home manager in Northamptonshire, wanted to support care workers who have been and still are carrying an especially heavy burden due to coronavirus, so is donating royalties to support them from one of a new series of children's books.

The semi-retired nurse, who has worked in both NHS and social care sectors, had an "Enid Blyton moment" that led to the 'Our Cat in Our House and Friends' series of books published on Amazon designed to support children's well-being and a proportion of the royalties from the second book 'Our Cat in Our House in Lockdown: When she cannot visit her friends or play outside' will be donated to well-being for Care as well as being a living memorial to a grandparent taken too soon, a victim not of the virus but the restrictions.

The books explore four themes: remote playing with a friend, virtual relationship with extended family, reassurance for children and the imagination word game.

"Lockdown may be easing," said the author, "but it isn't over. Not all children will be going back to school and the books aren't just for now, they can be read any time and can help with the transition after lockdown. And carers will need support for their well-being for some time into the future. Now we've stopped clapping for our key workers we mustn't forget them and it can be more difficult for carers as they lose people they've looked after for years, not just the days or weeks

The books can be used after lockdown as a way of allowing young children to express how they feel to help their long-term well-being and can be read as stories at any time. The lockdown imagination game is educational and not specific to now.

The author added: "The government talks about extra money for social care but it has been channelled via bureaucracy not direct to homes. What carers really need is support for them. Ideally I would like to sell enough books to provide appropriate training for one member of staff in each home to be able to give information to colleagues on where to get advice and support.

"My father-in-law may not have had the virus but his GP practice wouldn't see him and his treatment was delayed. There will be other elderly people we've lost prematurely and carers feel strongly the loss of residents who they've looked after for months or years."
