NNC DISCUSSES FUNDS SHORTLIST

Funding bids worth a total of nearly £5.9 million which will help boost the North Northants economy were recently discussed by the Council's Executive.

The UK Community Renewal Fund was launched by the Government in March 2021 and this new fund aims to support people and communities most in need across the UK to pilot projects across four investment priorities:

- Investment in skills
- Investment in businesses
- Investment in communities and place
- Supporting people into employment

NNC received 23 applications from local organisations with ideas for projects. Cllr Steven North, Executive Member for Growth & Regeneration said: "Each of the projects recommended for shortlisting will, if approved and when complete, help North Northamptonshire thrive after what has been a difficult time for everyone."

The shortlisted projects will be assessed by Government with decisions on approved projects expected by the end of July.

WILDLIFE NEWS

This column started some years back hoping to arouse interest in various parts of our countryside, the ones we are likely to see on a short walk.

We have such a variety of wildlife in this county, some of this not disturbed for hundreds of years but others which were modified when the upper soil was removed to reach the gravel and iron ore stocks found under the surface.

But nature does not always do what we would like (current Covid difficulties show this) and inevitably some strangers turn up unexpectedly and top watchers find themselves trying to identify these 'rogues' – often travelling hundreds of miles to catch a glimpse (just like some sports fans).

Some animals have lifestyles which make finding them a challenge. Members of specialist organisations (like the RSPB or our local Naturalists' Trust based at Rushden Lakes) report less common species, like a nightjar earlier this year. They are

described as "crepuscular" because, like bats, they are active at dawn and dusk, when hunting times for their insect-based diet are most profitable and plentiful, and their mottled plumage provides camouflage.

Their food is similar to that of swifts, but the shrill calls which once echoed along our streets in those 'magic hours' are far less common than older readers will remember, suggesting that both groups are suffering food shortages. Their wide mouth allows the adults to "scoop up" large volumes of air and filter out the insects they look for.

One local version of its name (which perhaps should have died out by now) comes from a legend that the birds can somehow lap milk. This led to "goatsucker".

Now rare it may be; insect control it may offer, unusual-looking it may appear – but that is a bit too much to swallow!

Although I posted this list almost six years ago – have I been writing this column that long? – I thought it could do with an updated airing as many of us may have been rummaging on the internet for our ancestors during the various lockdowns. There are many websites that can help – my favourite ones being those that you can access for free! Here are some:

- FreeBMD (www.freebmd.org.uk/)
You can look up the General Register Office (GRO) reference numbers for births, marriages and deaths so that you may order copies from the GRO.
- GRO (www.gro.gov.uk/gro/content/)
To order a certificate from them, you will need to register your details first. You can currently order a pdf copy to be emailed to you for many birth and death certificates for just £7 currently. Marriage certificate copies still arrive through the post and cost £11. See the website for details.
- GENUKI (www.genuki.org.uk/contents/)
A comprehensive list of all places in the UK and Ireland. Search for the town/village of your choice and it will provide some background

information about the place plus it will tell you what genealogical records still survive and where they are kept.

- The National Archives (www.nationalarchives.gov.uk/)
Based in Kew, TNA is the official archive and publisher for the UK government, and for England and Wales.
- The Hospital Records Database (www.nationalarchives.gov.uk/hospitalrecords/)
If your ancestors were in hospitals at any stage, you may be able to access their records.
- Family Search (www.familysearch.org/)
This is a family historian's treasure chest, with baptisms, marriages and burials recorded for parishes all over the world.
- The Workhouse (www.workhouses.org.uk/)
Find out about any workhouse that your ancestor may have been in. Also, the 1881 census record for each workhouse is included where available.

We know how hard it's been to keep all the plates spinning.

"It was humbling to see thousands of people step forward at the beginning of the pandemic and volunteer their time to assist others. "So many of us had to adapt and work differently during the pandemic. In policing, we also had to change the way we did things in order to keep ourselves and our communities safe. I want to say a huge thank you to the officers and staff in my force for their fantastic 'can do' attitude, for going above and beyond, and despite the challenges we faced, their absolute determination to fight crime and protect people. Thank you, you've been outstanding."

The original idea for a national day of thanks was proposed by 13 individuals from different backgrounds and organisations, who called for a Thank You Day to take place. The day is now being supported by hundreds of organisations and businesses across the country, ranging from the Scouts and Guides to Rotary and the Royal Voluntary Service, NHS, The Mirror and the Sun, the Football Association and the Church of England. It's also being supported by celebrities, religious leaders and sports stars.

There isn't a strict plan for Thank You Day. People are encouraged to celebrate it however they want and to thank whoever they want. Some ideas proposed include celebratory BBQs, and picnics, and a 'cheers for volunteers' to raise a glass to all those who volunteered their time.

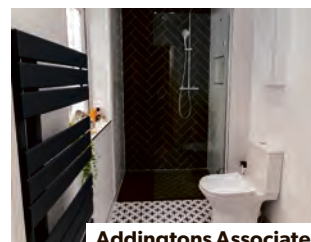

COUNCIL DISCUSSES PLANS TO ENHANCE BUS SERVICES IN RESPONSE TO PANDEMIC

A strategy to improve bus services in the North Northamptonshire Council area – particularly to respond to the impact that Covid-19 has had on the sector – has recently been discussed by the authority's Executive.

Forming part of the Government's National Bus Strategy – recommendations put before the Executive include forming an 'Enhanced Partnership' with bus companies, towns and parishes, passengers and businesses.

Such an arrangement would allow access to a £3 billion funding pot to assist with

sustaining and developing bus routes, which otherwise could potentially be lost as they would not be deemed commercially viable.

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council said: "The Covid-19 pandemic has had a huge impact everywhere and it seems no sector is untouched by this unprecedented situation.

"Government, both local and national plays a key role in situations like this to ensure all the relevant partners are connected so we can find pragmatic solutions that are of benefit to the residents of North Northants."

Cllr Graham Lawman, Executive Member for Highways, Travel and Assets, said: "A key priority for the

council is enhancing links between communities, particularly rural ones, as this has widespread benefits not just in the wellbeing of residents but also in terms of a healthy economy.

"The environmental benefits of us all making more journeys on public transport are also well known.

"Covid-19 has had a dramatic effect on all areas of our lives and bus transport has been very badly hit as services have been used less frequently because of lockdowns and increased working from home, at the same time as increased spacing has been required on buses.

"We are focussed on developing a strategy which will keep both bus routes and

demand responsive services alive in the most efficient way possible to make sure that North Northamptonshire is well connected and communities continue to thrive. This is an exciting opportunity to do just that."

Due to the need to ensure that essential journeys could still be made, the Government has supported the bus industry with the Covid-19 Bus Service Support Grant (CBSSG), however, this funding arrangement will soon come to an end.

Throughout lockdown, the Council has continued to support bus services in a number of ways. This includes continuing to underwrite concessionary fare payments to bus companies for bus passes at pre-Covid levels in order to give them financial certainty. The council has also worked together with them to provide greater capacity to deal with social distancing

requirements.

In March 2021 the Government published Bus Back Better, the National Bus Strategy for England to transform bus services and help the bus industry recover from the effects of Covid-19.

The strategy encourages councils to form Enhanced Partnerships with the bus operators which will enable delivery of improvements for passengers such as improved timetables and multi-operator ticketing.

In order to proceed with the strategy and access future Government funding for buses, the Department of Transport (DfT) has asked councils to demonstrate a commitment to develop plans by June 30, 2021, and requires councils to publish their own Bus Service Improvement Plan by the end of October 2021.

The DfT requires all Enhanced Partnerships to be in place by April 2022.

ENGAGED COUPLES TO BE CONTACTED FOLLOWING DELAY IN EASING RESTRICTIONS



North Northamptonshire Council's Registration Office will be contacting couples set to tie the knot in the coming weeks to go through how the delay in the easing of Covid-19 restrictions will affect their big day.

From 21st June legal restrictions on the number of guests attending weddings were lifted, but social distancing measures remain in place and it will be up to venues to decide how many people they can host whilst still being between one or two metres apart dependent on their risk assessment, and if the ceremony is indoors or outdoors.

Since the beginning of the pandemic around 1,700 weddings have been postponed throughout the county either due to government restrictions or by couples themselves wishing to wait until they could marry in

the presence of all their loved ones.

The council has recruited temporary members of staff to work through the backlog.

Leader of North Northamptonshire Council, Cllr Jason Smithers, said: "We currently have a dedicated team working tirelessly to contact couples and respond to queries as quickly as possible.

"We understand there are lots of couples who have been waiting anxiously for the recent announcement regarding weddings and we will do everything we can to

support those set to tie the knot, whether they decide to go ahead with their planned wedding date or would prefer to postpone."

Wedding venues throughout the county have been contacted to ensure they understand how the latest update affects them.

The council aims to respond to emails within 14 working days, but their focus will be on couples who are due to be married between now and 19th July 2021. Enquiries will be dealt with in order of original ceremony date.

all those who have suffered bereavement, loss and rising levels of anxiety during

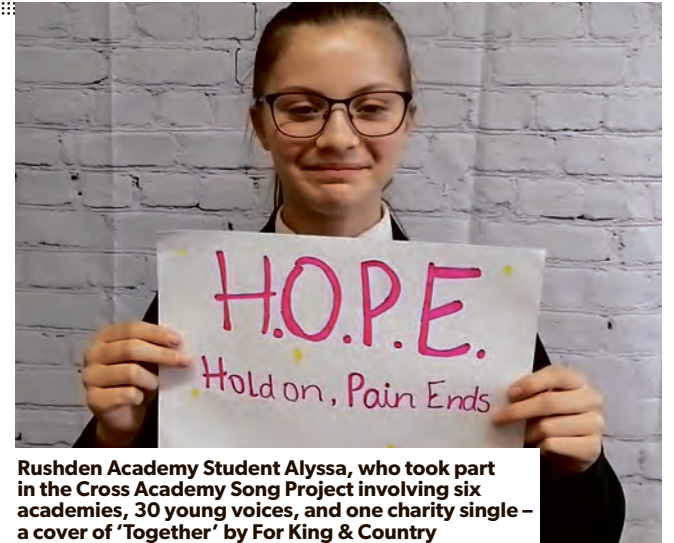
lockdown.

DROP-IN VACCINE SESSIONS NOW HOSTED SEVEN DAYS A WEEK

Northamptonshire's Covid-19 Vaccination Centre in Moulton Park has extended drop-in vaccine sessions to seven days a week through to the middle of next month.

To make it even easier and more convenient for people to come forward for their Covid jabs, bonus late-night drop-in sessions will also be taking place this weekend, Saturday 26th and Sunday 27th June until 9.30pm.

People who prefer to book their appointment in advance can continue to do so for both first doses and second doses at the centre, off Summerhouse Road, Moulton Park NN3 6BJ.

Chris Pallot, Director of the Northamptonshire Covid-19 Vaccination Programme, said: "Over the past few days we've been really pleased to

welcome hundreds of people taking advantage of the first opportunities to get their first dose of the Moderna Covid-19 vaccine without an appointment at our Vaccination Centre.

"Now that the vaccination programme is open to everyone aged 18 and above, we want to continue to offer the flexibility of daily drop-in sessions in addition to the usual bookable appointments. We're therefore delighted to confirm that drop-ins for first appointments will be extended to every evening through to Sunday 18th July.

"Vaccination is our best protection against coronavirus and our pathway back to normal life – so if you've not yet had your first dose then please do take advantage of these extra opportunities to get the jab.

"We're also reminding people aged 40 and over who had their first dose eight weeks ago or more that they are now eligible to have their second dose now, and they can book or rebook their appointments by visiting the NHS website, calling 119 or contacting their GP practice."

YOUR HEALTH – FLIPPING PAINFUL

After all that rain it might seem unlikely that the sun will ever shine again. Hopefully it will peek out from behind the clouds soon, and when it does, what are you going to put on your feet?

If you start getting pain on the sole or top of your foot, or if you feel your Achilles tendon at the back of the ankle is stiff in the morning, it might be that you've chosen to wear the wrong shoes. Or it might mean you've put the wrong shoes on for too long, too soon.

When the sun comes out and our socks come off it's very easy to put on a pair of flat sandals, like flip flops. For a lot of people this causes no problems, but every year we see people in the clinic with terrible foot or leg pain that started after they switched from shoes to sandals.

To avoid becoming one of these people, my suggestions are:

- Don't switch to full-time sandals. If you've gone from wearing supportive shoes, wear those shoes occasionally so you make a transition

from supportive to flat.

- Look at the inner sole of your most comfortable shoes and see if you can find a similar shape in a sandal.
- If you have previously had foot or leg pain in the summer, consider getting sandals with a bit of support. There are many brands now that have a little bit of an arch support.
- If the pain you got last summer hasn't really gone away, get a podiatrist to look at your feet.

So if you're planning your summer footwear, even if Covid means you're not going abroad to find sunshine, make sure you get something that won't upset your feet.

And if you're mowing the lawn, be careful. People really have run over their feet with that awful machine!

Have a good week, even if the sun doesn't make it out just yet.

EXTRA FUNDING INJECTION FOR NORTH NORTHAMPTONSHIRE GARDEN COMMUNITIES

North Northamptonshire Council has secured £500,000 to plan for infrastructure linked to new growth provided by Garden Community developments in the area.

This is in addition to £125,000 funding to enable the Council to work on these projects, bringing the total to over £5 million since 2015.

The Council is planning to use the latest funding to undertake technical work on the following projects:

- Midland Road, Wellingborough – design of improvements for pedestrians and cyclists on this key link between the Stanton Cross Garden Community and the town centre.
- Station Gateway, Wellingborough - masterplan and implementation strategy for the area around the railway station, linking to Midland Road.
- River Ise cycle/ footpath links

- design work and delivery of improvements along the route in Kettering.

- Isham-Wellingborough Improvement (IWIMP) - traffic modelling and assessment of options to address constraints on Glenvale Park Garden Community.
- Rushden East Connectivity - a feasibility study for a possible bridge crossing over the A6 to link the Garden Community with the town.

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council said: "We welcome this funding for North Northamptonshire as an important step in developing the infrastructure which is essential for our growing communities.

"We want North Northants to prosper and flourish and be an area that creates great opportunities for our residents, while at the same time being mindful of our environment.

"Garden Communities are an innovative way of managing long term growth and I'm

delighted to see these projects moving forward."

Cllr Steven North, the Council's executive member for regeneration and growth welcomed the Government's continued commitment to

the North Northamptonshire Garden Communities and said: "These developments are among the biggest in the country and, over the next 20 years, will provide over 25,000 new homes and associated

jobs and facilities.

"It is a huge undertaking for the Council to plan and manage these projects to deliver the high quality development and infrastructure that our communities rightfully

expect. The funding from the Government recognises this. It will enable plans to be worked up for specific schemes, putting us in a good position to bid for the investment needed to deliver them on the ground."

PUBLIC HEALTH NORTHAMPTONSHIRE LAUNCHES NEW SUBSTANCE MISUSE TEAM

Public Health Northamptonshire have launched a dedicated new multi-disciplinary substance misuse team, providing holistic support to the homeless residents of Northampton Town.

The initiative, which sees Public Health Northamptonshire, West Northamptonshire Council, Change Grow Live, The Bridge Project and The Hope Centre come together in a multi-disciplinary team, adds to the existing services which support the local homeless population and some of the county's most vulnerable individuals.

Public Health Northamptonshire were awarded a 'Rough sleeping drug and alcohol treatment grant' worth over £400k

from the Ministry of Housing Communities and Local Government (MHCLG), Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) and Public Health England (PHE).

The funding is targeted at the 43 local authorities identified by MHCLG in the summer as having had the highest numbers of people sleeping rough who have been moved into emergency accommodation during the Covid-19 pandemic.

The grant will fund specialist support for individuals to access and engage with drug and alcohol treatment and move towards longer-term accommodation, supporting the work of wider homelessness and rough sleeping funding. The new multi-

agency team aims to reduce the number of homeless people in Northampton by removing the barrier of drug and alcohol addiction.

Northampton's multi-disciplinary Rough Sleeper Drug and Alcohol Team will be managed by a Coordinator and provide the treatment and recovery service with additional capacity and expertise to meet the multiple, complex needs of those who are sleeping rough and are problematically using, or dependent on, drugs and/or alcohol.

The Rough Sleeper Drug and Alcohol Team has initial funding for a year, with a view to extend after this period.

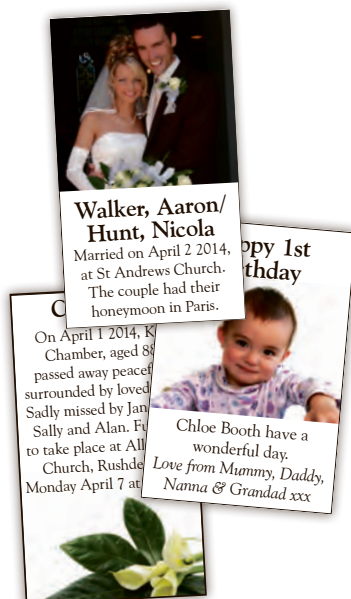
