**Vaccine clinics
for young people
aged 16-17 open**

Preparations have been made to extend the local vaccine offer more widely to people aged 16 and 17.

Those who are unable to attend the dedicated drop-in clinics can expect to be contacted by the NHS soon with details of how to book.

Anna Dorothy, Deputy Director of the Northamptonshire Covid-19 Vaccination Programme, said: "Drop-in vaccination sessions are continuing to prove popular with people who want the convenience of finding a vaccine site near them without having to spend time booking an appointment."

The Government is not publishing performance data for any schools or colleges this year due to the varying impact of the pandemic.

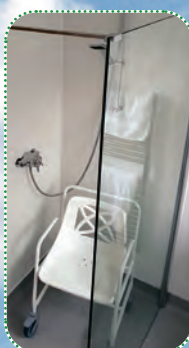

WILDLIFE NEWS

Our most important wildlife concern must be looking after our native animals and plants, but there will always be a little thrill, or at least a glow of satisfaction, for those working to protect those species of animals or plants in danger of disappearing altogether.

It gives a sense of achievement, too, to those workers who then see practical results, such as the reintroduction of beavers into a few (secret) areas of woodland, or the successful growth in the numbers of red kite after they became virtually extinct but are now seen flying over our streets as they did centuries ago.

Another report in recent weeks was the nesting of a member of the crow family – the chough. Unfortunately we are most unlikely to find this bird species around our local countryside, but there are extra projects in place in favoured (and protected) coastal places, as once featured on a TV episode of 'Doc Martin' which showed how easily the results of years of work can be destroyed.

The chough, like most of its cousins like the carrion crow, is not just a large black bird which loves the wilder spots; its bright orange legs help birdwatchers. The slightly smaller jackdaw adds its own contribution to the help-the-human choir with its call (Jack! Jack!) to the general mayhem.

The variety of noises from various members of this family makes us aware of their presence, particularly in the summer months; their calls, never quiet at the best of times, seem even louder in the absence of other traffic before the rest of the world has engaged first gear for the day ahead.

Some will, understandably, not be found unless the conditions are right for them, but the theme colour is black, following the saying "One rook is a crow, more than one are rooks".

Hopefully the demands of family life will soon be over for our local crow, which developed an annoyingly harsh edge to its 'caw' but monotonously calling just four or five times in each phrase. It is surprising how boring that can be at five o'clock in the morning!

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

Following on from last time, when I mentioned criminal ancestors, I was watching a television programme recently about Victorian Britain with Michael Buerk. This particular episode concentrated on Law and Order and showed the introduction of photographs being used to identify perpetrators, as well as the discovery of fingerprints.

There was a visit to the Birmingham Police Archives, where the oldest surviving prisoner photographs are kept. By the 1870s it was made law that all Police Forces had to take photographs of people in custody, which is when the first ledger of the Birmingham Police collection starts. Although the early photographs were taken in a nearby photographic studio, it eventually became the norm for them to be taken when the criminal was admitted to the prison. If you have discovered any criminals amongst your ancestors, it is certainly worth contacting the local Archives to see if they – or the local Police Archives – have such photographs.

I do like watching these types of programmes as they provide an insight into the social history of the day. It is all very well seeing how far back you can trace your family's history, but after a while there is a danger of the people becoming just a list of names and dates. What happened that might have tipped your ancestor over into criminal activities? There is a book called 'Reuben's Corner' by Spike Mays in which the author tells of their diet of stale bread (a farthing cheaper than fresh bread), skimmed milk and potatoes. His father had gone to Canada to see if he could prepare a better future for them. Money was initially sent home but this gradually stopped and so those left behind had no income. Spike resorted to stealing turnips from a farmer's field so they didn't starve. This was as recent as 1911 and certainly shows how one part of my family lived.

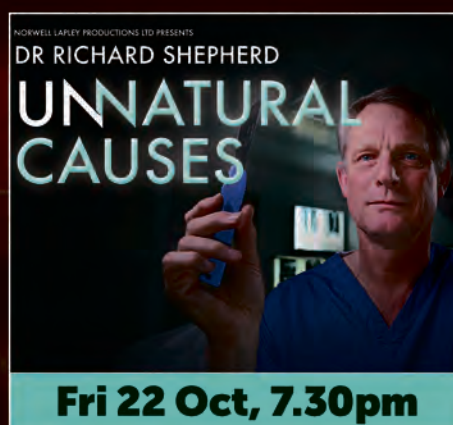
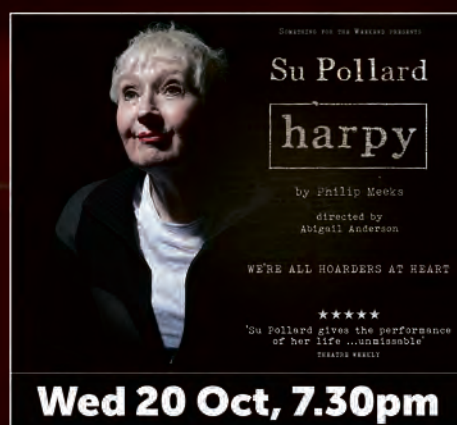
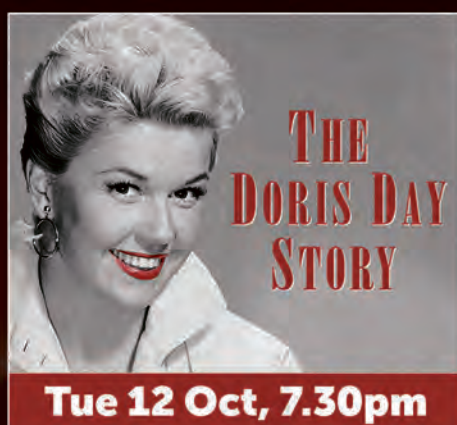

REPAIR WORKS COMPLETED AT THRAPSTON'S NINE ARCHES BRIDGE

All works at the Nine Arches Bridge in Thrapston have now been completed with the road fully reopened to traffic.

Work started on strengthening and repair works in February, initially under a full road closure.

Northamptonshire Highways were able to keep the road open for much of the duration of the scheme. For the last few weekends the road was closed for resurfacing over the bridge.

Cllr Graham Lawman, North Northamptonshire Council's Executive Member for Highways, Travel and Assets, said: "I am sure you will join me in congratulating our expert team who have worked in some extreme weather conditions, much of the time from a pontoon under the bridge, for completing this scheme on

programme.

"We realise how important this bridge is to the community and are delighted the road is fully reopened, traffic lights functioning and all traffic management removed."

Leader of North Northamptonshire Council, Cllr Jason Smithers, said: "These works were essential to keep the bridge safe and I'm delighted that they have now been completed.

"The bridge is a valuable heritage asset, which everyone in the local area will be familiar with, so it's important that we carried out the works while maintaining its historic integrity."

Higham's haven

A once-muddy mess that has been transformed into a spectacular garden has been hailed a "Higham haven" by the town's Mayor, Councillor Tina Reavey.

Cllr Reavey was speaking after officially opening the Duchy Barn Garden in Higham Ferrers, which was followed by a fundraising summer music festival – the first Higham Ferrers Tourism Committee-hosted event this year since lockdown.

Higham Ferrers vicar, Rev Michelle Dalliston, also heaped praise on the garden, telling the 100-plus guests at the weekend function that the transformation had been "miraculous".

Volunteers spent a total of 798 hours working on the garden.

The Duchy Barn Garden is alongside the 15th-century Chichele College and the four barns at the site are used by local community organisations, including Higham Ferrers Tourism.

But one month after the entrance was cleared of brambles and ivy, a legacy of mud was left on the route to the barns. It was a challenging time for the Tourism Committee as members were preparing for the annual Christmas Sparkle and had to keep wading backwards and forwards through the mud.

That was when Committee member Carol Fitzgerald, who project manages Chichele College, saw

the potential of the site, envisaging that it could be turned into a hard and clean pathway with the addition of a community garden.

Expert garden designer Jill Stewart helped draw up the plans, which evolved over time as excavations revealed various interesting finds and funding came in.

The Tourism Committee allocated funds and grants came from the Duchy of Lancaster's Covid Benevolent Fund, Nenescape, the Mayor's Charity, Higham Charter Book Profits Fund, individual donors as well as the Co-op, which also sent a team to dig and plant vegetable and flower borders.

The Nenescape grant as well as an additional grant from the Duchy of Lancaster enabled a wheelchair-friendly vegetable bed to go in as well as a pathway to be built from the entrance, around a donated apple tree and a tree seat, which was also donated.

The Gateway Club, a social and leisure charity for adults with learning disabilities and run by volunteers, which plans to hold weekly meetings at the Duchy Barn Garden, received a Lottery grant to combat loneliness during Covid, and that was

used to buy seating, tables, a birdbath and an arch.

"The Fab 4" – Olwen Mayes, Pat Barber, Angelika Meachen and Mary Garratt, all members of the Higham Ferrers Archaeological and Research Society (HiFARS) – spent hundreds of hours excavating, scraping away tons of soil to reveal cobbles.

And Higham Ferrers historian Brenda Lofthouse, spent 41.5 hours scraping ivy off six large stone walls, using a pair of secateurs and a piece of broken fork.

"You really had to get behind the ivy to get it out," she recalled.

Archaeologist Steve Morris, a member of HiFARS, was the archaeological adviser on the project, while professional landscape gardener Shane Hill was the appointed contractor.

While Carol Fitzgerald told the opening gathering it was impossible to name everyone who had helped, she thanked them for their time, money, gifts and skills, adding that the funds raised from three weekend music events would go to finishing off the garden.

"This has been a wonderful community effort. It's spectacular. The garden is going to give us a sense of wellbeing for many years to come," she said.
