The Mill Birth and Wellbeing Centre at Duddington has become the latest venue – and the first in the area – to host Andy's Man Club.

This weekly group is designed to bring men together, to get them talking, and to help attendees weather the storms in life.

On average one man every two hours takes his life in the UK. It is said that a contributing factor is that men don't often talk about how they are feeling. That is why Andy's Man Club was formed: to help break down these stigmas and support men.

The sessions are free to attend, and you just turn up and talk as much or as little as you want. The sessions are peer-to-peer, which is one of the reasons it has proved so popular, with more than 1,700 men now attending the groups weekly across the UK.

The group at The Mill Birth and Wellbeing Centre will launch on Monday 7th March.

CELEBRATE THE QUEEN'S JUBILEE THIS SUMMER

Communities across North Northamptonshire are being encouraged to get involved in a bank holiday bonanza of special events for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee this summer.

Plans are under way to organise a packed weekend of activities across North Northamptonshire from 2nd to 5th June, including official beacon-lighting ceremonies on Bank Holiday Thursday, a countywide Jubilee Pageant through Northampton on the Saturday and a Big Lunch in the area on the Sunday.

Cllr Helen Howell, North Northamptonshire Council's Deputy Leader and Executive Member for Sport, Leisure, Culture and Tourism, said: "We're delighted to be working with the Lord-Lieutenant, local town and parish councils, as well as community groups and

volunteer organisations to celebrate such a momentous occasion.

"Teams are working hard to put together our plans for celebrating the Platinum Jubilee across North Northamptonshire, so please do keep an eye out for further announcements in the coming weeks."

Towns, parishes and communities countywide are being encouraged to get involved in this year's Jubilee celebrations, from lighting beacons and hosting street parties and big lunches to planting commemorative trees in their neighbourhoods.

Local community and

voluntary groups can also apply for a series of grants to help fund arts and sports projects commemorating the Jubilee, including Arts Council England's Let's Create Jubilee Fund and Sport England's Platinum Jubilee Activity Fund.


In addition, initiatives including The Queen's Green Canopy tree planting project will create a lasting reminder of The Queen's Jubilee.

WILDLIFE NEWS

Gazumping is a word used to expose the practice of putting up money to buy a house after an agreement has already been reached, cutting out the original buyer (don't expect to find details in this column!).

Similar unwanted cheating will by now be happening in our fields and gardens. Properties can be just as fiercely contested 'out there', without providing the necessary replacements.

The motto here, as in our everyday shopping, is to "get your retaliation in first", and any attractive nesting site will be challenged, sometimes by the size of the contestants – giving them a physical and muscular advantage – or by the quality and force of, say, its vocal cords (like growls or birds' songs).

Blackbirds seem to be starting earlier than usual, and already robins can be seen actively viewing selected properties, while other species are literally showing their "true colours" in an attempt to impress potential mates.

These examples have a head start, but it will not be long before others further south, in Africa for

example, are building themselves up for the journey of hundreds, more likely thousands, of miles for their summer break, with the prospect of this really being a "working holiday".

Birds, of course, are not the only home-makers. Many insects, mammals and other animals are looking for their own versions of "a house in the country". Many will not be thinking of the toil of actually building their quiet spots; insects may have spent at least part of the time in massive colonies, but that is a risky procedure if we are treated to a severe winter and they must wake up every day to use their energy to start their hunting.

Many species, having gathered in their large masses, will be losing the outer layers to die as insulation, and the survivors will provide that protection instead. It sounds gruesome, but there can be casualties even when the colony finds cover in wall crevices, warm bricks or other spaces protected from wind or wet.

Risky maybe, but if humans do not spoil the picture it will continue for centuries yet.

Have you had a look at the 1921 census yet? It is only available from Find My Past and sadly costs extra to view – even if you have a subscription.

I have been slightly circumspect with regards to viewing these documents; I have checked just those for my grandparents and great grandparents. Luckily, one set of grandparents were with my great grandparents, which saved some money, and then I found a great grandmother visiting her sister and my great, great grandparents.

My Gran always said that she met her first husband whilst she was working as a Nanny for the Stephensons, the father being the Managing Director of Woolworths. Well, I found my Gran on the 1921 census, which also shows the rest of the family, including three daughters. Gran always said that the Stephensons had a boat named the "Velsheda", named after these three daughters. The 1921 census has revealed that these were in fact their middle names, rather than their first:

Margaret Velma = VEL

Joan Sheilah = SHE

Lilian Daphne = DA

Oh yes – no sign of Gran's first husband, so it must have been a quick liaison as they wed in October 1923, my uncle being born a month later...

Back to the census: did you know that there was a date change of when it was to be taken? Apart from the one taken in 1841, all other censuses since had occurred in the March/April every 10 years. The one for 1921 was planned to take place on 24th April but strike action was threatened. The Miners' Federation were protesting against a reduction in pay and hoped to be joined by railwaymen and transport workers. The strike, planned to start on 15th April, would have severely damaged transport links and given an incorrect image presented in the returns. As it was, no general strike took place, but by then the date of the census had been moved – to 19th June.

Rushden school recognised for its commitment to remembrance

Members of the Royal British Legion in Rushden visited the town's Newton Road School to present the children with the Poppy Cup to mark their efforts in raising money during last November's Poppy Appeal.

The cup is awarded to schools that have held events connected with remembrance during the previous 12 months, including holding services, taking part in projects related to the World Wars or producing artwork or exhibitions related to the theme.

The judges heard how children from Newton Road School had taken part in The Snow Goose project, collaborating with actors and artists from Fabula Arts in an incredibly powerful project that engaged children in the theme of remembrance. The project was a resounding success and the school ended up taking around 80 children to St Mary's Church to watch the performance, where they were thrilled to see that the school's motivational messages had

been sewn into a sail and displayed at the church.

Assistant Principal Richard Bosworth said: "We're very proud to have won the Poppy Cup because remembrance is very much in evidence in the school. The sail from The Snow Goose now has pride of place in our foyer alongside a variety of activities the children have undertaken.

"When we took a group of children to the war memorial in November, we were proud to see how they conducted themselves, carefully placing the wreath and then bowing their heads in respect for the fallen.

"In school, on 11th November, every child, even the very youngest, took part in a two-minute silence, while children from Years 5 and 6 took responsibility for selling poppies and other merchandise linked to



Remembrance Day and the Royal British Legion.

"It's vitally important that those who made the ultimate sacrifice are not

forgotten and we are proud to have seen the school's efforts in that recognised."

The Poppy Cup was presented by a delegation from the Royal British

Legion, which celebrated its 100th anniversary in 2021. They were joined at the presentation by the Mayor of Rushden, Cllr Melanie Coleman.

Your Health – Extreme Gardening

Forget about extreme sports injuries. The grass is just starting to grow and that means the weeds are coming up too. Which means...

It's time for extreme gardening!

Bring on the:

- Knee pain
- Back pain
- Hip problems
- And lots of broken gloves from grubbing around trying to pull out the weeds.

As we've agreed in the past, gardening is not the slow, ponderous activity non-gardeners think it is. And trying to find a comfortable position to pull out weeds is nigh on impossible.

A few tips I've gathered from talking to gardening patients over the years:

- Don't stay in the classic "weeding stretch" for too long – move closer to the next patch of weeds.
- Take breaks – stand back and admire your work, or go and prune something after 20 mins.
- If kneeling hurts, get something really squashy to kneel on.
- Sit on a skateboard so you can

move around.

- Ask for help. We're all terrible at this, but remember that someone else might enjoy helping you.

I have to admit that I love the skateboard idea. A patient in London told me this was what he does. I guess the risk is that you'll fall off, so weigh up the risks before you try it. I don't want you to roll down a hill on your skateboard and not be seen again as the weeds will really take over if that happens.

Remember that you probably won't feel any aches and pains until the next day. Taking breaks will reduce the aches, so stand up and wriggle now and then.

As for me, I had a go at mowing grass with a slightly larger beast this week and can assure you that mowing grass on a tractor is no more fun than using that awful lawn mower. Except that it starts easily with a key rather than with a stupid piece of string.



FUTURE OF KERBSIDE GARDEN WASTE COLLECTIONS TO BE DISCUSSED BY EXECUTIVE

People in North Northamptonshire will be asked their views on the future collection of garden waste from their homes, if a report before the council's Executive is approved next week.

Following local government reorganisation last year, the new unitary council has inherited different approaches to the fortnightly kerbside garden waste collections from its predecessor authorities.

In Corby and Kettering, the service is provided year-round at no extra charge, whilst in Wellingborough, it operates between March and November with no additional cost for residents.

In East Northamptonshire, the year-round scheme has a £55 annual subscription fee.

North Northamptonshire Council now wants to harmonise waste collection across the area, so all residents receive the same service.

If agreed by the Executive, a consultation would start in March with the results reported back to a meeting of the Executive in July. The new service would begin by Autumn this year.

Cllr Graham Lawman, the Council's Executive member for Highways, Travel and Assets, said: "Now that we are one council across the North Northants area, we need to ensure there is a consistent service and whether there should be a charge across North Northamptonshire or not, for all our residents and we are now working to make this happen.

"It's important that we ask people for their views on this as it affects the majority of households in our area and certainly everyone who has a garden."

To implement a harmonised kerbside garden waste service, the Executive has several key options and considerations which will need to be

explored as part of the consultation exercise:

- To determine which months of the year a kerbside collection service would operate.
- To establish whether a universal garden waste service would be provided to all residents without an additional charge.
- To establish whether a subscription-based garden waste service would be provided to residents who wish to subscribe to the service and pay a subscription charge.
- And, if a subscription charge were to be levied, the level of this charge.

Subject to Executive approval, more details of how people can take part in the consultation will be made available soon.

INTERNATIONAL WAENDEL WALK SET TO RETURN 13TH-15TH MAY

The International Waendel Walk will be hosted by North Northamptonshire Council (NNC) in Wellingborough and the surrounding area from Friday 13th to Sunday 15th May, following a two-year break – and registration for walkers is now open.

The three-day walking event will begin with a 5km and 10km Friendship Walk on the Friday evening, starting from the Castle Theatre, before participants can take part in walks ranging from 5km through to 42km on the Saturday and Sunday with routes covering Wellingborough and the surrounding North Northants countryside.

North Northants and, particularly, Wellingborough is the only place in England to host the IML Walking Association, which in previous years has attracted people from across the country and globe, reaching as far as Australia and America. The last event in 2019 saw 6,500 walkers take part across the

weekend and the team are hoping to match (or exceed) this figure in 2022.

North Northamptonshire Council, who are running the event, are encouraging as many people as possible to get involved and sign up to take part. Whether it's a family walk, a personal challenge, or to raise money for a charity close to your heart, the International Waendel Walk will have something for you.

Cllr Helen Howell, NNC's Deputy Leader and Executive Member for Sport, Leisure, Culture and Tourism, said: "It is excellent that the International Waendel Walk is being hosted by North Northamptonshire Council after a two-year break.

"We cannot wait to welcome walkers from across the country and further afield to Wellingborough and would encourage everyone to sign up to take part. It is great to have this event taking place in North Northants and there really will

be something for everyone – from the 5km Friendship Walk on the Friday through to the longer distances on Saturday and Sunday."

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of NNC, added: "We are extremely proud to host this event. The International Waendel Walk really puts North Northants, and Wellingborough, on the world stage.

"But we couldn't do it without the help of our partner organisations and volunteers who help each year to deliver a fantastic event."

The weekend begins with live music and activities on the Friday evening in the grounds of the Castle Theatre, prior to the start of the Friendship Walk.

Across Saturday and Sunday, the live music continues along with sports, fun activities for all the family and entertainment at the Castle Theatre – the start and finish point of all walks.

NEW IMPROVEMENT BOARD ROLE WILL OVERSEE PROGRESS OF COUNTY'S CHILDREN'S SERVICES

In 2019 the Department for Education (DfE) appointed a Commissioner to oversee improvements to Children's Services at Northamptonshire whilst they prepared to transfer to an independent trust in 2020.

Last year, the Commissioner advised the Minister for Children and Families that he felt that sufficient progress had been demonstrated by the new Northamptonshire Children's Trust and that the role of commissioner was no longer required.

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of North Northamptonshire Council, said: "I welcome reports of positive improvement in the services provided by Northamptonshire's Children's services.

"However, I am firmly of the view that independent oversight is still required, reflecting both the

importance of the service and the early position of the Trust's improvement journey.

"This is why we have worked with the government and insisted that there was a continuation of this oversight role so that Northamptonshire is in the best position possible to give our children and young people the best life chances in the future. I would like to welcome Jenny Coles who has been appointed by the DfE to the post of Independent Improvement Board chair."

Following the concerns raised by North Northamptonshire Council, the DfE has established a new role to oversee improvement

in Children's Services in Northamptonshire.

The Minister for Children and Families has appointed Jenny Coles MBE to the post of Independent Improvement Board chair, which will report on progress and provide assurance to Government.

Cllr Scott Edwards, the council's Executive member for Children, Families, Education and Skills, said: "It is pleasing to see that progress has been made but as there's still work to do. I welcome the new role of an independent improvement board chair to continue oversight of positive change. As such, I welcome Jenny Coles to this role."

PROJECTS SUITABLE FOR 'LEVELLING UP FUND' URGED TO COME FORWARD

North Northamptonshire Council (NNC) has launched an online survey designed to identify any plans in the area that could access the Government's Levelling Up Fund.

Any bid submitted to the Levelling Up Fund can be for a single project, or a package of related projects, up to a value of £20m.

NNC are currently identifying potential projects which could be put forward through various steps, including an online survey, to gather information about projects the council may have been previously unaware of.

Projects must be capital schemes (i.e. involve spend on a physical asset), and delivered by the end of March 2024 to support economic prosperity by investing in infrastructure.

The online survey is now open and includes questions on the description and

purpose of the project, priority themes, and how it would align with local and national policy and priorities, amongst other key questions.

Cllr David Brackenbury, NNC's Executive Member for Growth & Regeneration, said: "The Levelling Up Fund looks at projects across three key investment themes: transport, regeneration and town centre and cultural, and we are looking for projects that come under any of these themes.

"It could be a smaller project, which could be put forward by NNC as part of a group of themed projects, or a large-scale project that will help to transform the local area and North Northants."

Cllr Graham Lawman, NNC's Executive Member for Highways, Travel & Assets, said: "This funding

is designed to support economic prosperity and our net zero carbon ambitions through investing in infrastructure, so it is vital that we seek every opportunity to take advantage of it.

"To that end, we are starting to put together a list of potential projects that could be submitted, but we also want to hear from Town and Parish councils, businesses and other organisations about suggestions and projects across North Northamptonshire that might be important to them.

"We want to give every part of the district the opportunity to contribute, so, if you currently have a project in the pipeline, just an idea or an issue that needs resolving, please come forward and complete the online survey."

The survey is online now and can be accessed via NNC's Citizen Space and will close on 20th February.

Well Northants Programme under way to address health inequalities in Northamptonshire

Public Health Northamptonshire welcomes the Government's commitment to set out its strategy to tackle the core drivers of health inequalities this year through a Health Disparities white paper.

This intention, along with those in the Government's Levelling Up White Paper, fit well with a recently launched project within both unitary authorities.

The Well Northants Programme has been put in place to work with communities in Northamptonshire who are most at risk of health inequalities – to understand their needs, map existing support, and identify community health and wellbeing needs.

Six Community Development Workers have been recruited and are already working either embedded in communities in Corby, Kettering, Wellingborough and Northampton, or with inclusion health groups.

Empowering communities is central to this programme, which is why a participatory budgeting model, directly involving communities in making decisions about how to spend public money, is being used. The Community Development Workers will have access to a pot of money to issue grants which will be used to put in place interventions to address local need, designed in partnership with those communities.

Lucy Wightman, Director of Public Health Northamptonshire, says: "This programme is key to addressing health inequalities. It gives power back to local communities, involving their populations in discussions and solutions around public health and wellbeing.

"By empowering these communities they can become more connected, more resilient and involved in improving their health and wellbeing.

"There is strong evidence that this community assets based approach can address inequalities and will support the Levelling Up agenda [...] West Northamptonshire Council's Anti-Poverty Strategy and North Northamptonshire Council's focus on Levelling Up mean both councils have a strong commitment to the Well Northants project.

"This is an exciting programme that presents an opportunity to engage with our most vulnerable residents, to empower local communities to take action to improve their wellbeing. It presents both Unitary Councils with opportunities to learn about a new way of working with communities which then has the potential to be expanded to other areas in Northamptonshire."

The first phase of the programme is about engaging with local communities and key stakeholders – to develop local action plans, with grants to be used to fund projects.

'No Smoking' rule for Country Parks play areas

Country Parks across North Northamptonshire and West Northamptonshire Councils have committed to play areas becoming smoke-free zones.

Signage is now up in Country Park play areas in both unitary authorities banning smoking in a bid to stop youngsters from picking up the habit. A concerned member of the public flagged the issue after witnessing smoking around her children.

The proposal for the signage was put forward by Public Health Northamptonshire and backed by both North and West Northamptonshire Country Parks. It takes action in a practical way to reduce the exposure to, and visibility of, smoking.

Sadly smoking remains the leading cause of death and ill health in the United Kingdom, and every day more than 200 people die from a smoking related condition in England alone. Smoking places an enormous strain on our health service, social care system, and economy.

Every day in England 280 children start smoking, and two-thirds of these children will go on to become daily smokers.

There are approximately 96,000 smokers in our county. Every year in Northamptonshire smoking is responsible for more than 7,000 hospital admissions, 300,000 GP appointments, 30 house fires, and over 1,000 deaths.

Councillor Helen Harrison, Executive Member for Adults, Health and Wellbeing for North Northamptonshire Council says: "Our Country Parks play an important role in helping our residents explore the great outdoors with friends and family, and thousands flock to enjoy these areas every

year, myself included. Despite our Country Parks being the epitome of a healthy and active lifestyle, exposure to second-hand smoke whilst enjoying these areas is sadly not uncommon, even in children's play areas."

Councillor Matt Golby, Portfolio Holder for Adult Care, Wellbeing and Health Integration for West Northamptonshire Council concludes: "It is really important to make smoking less visible to our younger residents. Implementing a no-smoking rule in all of our Country Parks children's play areas ensures that these environments remain a safe and fun place for adults and children alike."


