NEWS IN BRIEF

COMMUNITY PROJECTS URGED TO APPLY FOR GRANT FUNDING

North Northamptonshire Council (NNC) are encouraging organisations and community groups located within a 10-mile radius of Auegan Plc sites (in King's Cliffe and Thornhaugh) to come forward and apply for grant funding.

Revenue funding is available up to £10,000 for project costs such as administration costs, running costs and feasibility studies. Capital funding is available up to £5,000 for one-off expenses including equipment purchases, defibrillators, benches and park equipment.

The Auegan Revenue and Small Capital Grants Fund (previously known as the ENRMF Fund) was set up as part of the planning consent for the East Northants Resource Management Facility. It aims to support any organisation with a constitution/charitable status that directly benefits the community within a 10-mile radius of the sites.

Residents to have their say on the Barnwell Neighbourhood Plan

North Northamptonshire Council (NNC) is inviting residents and stakeholders to submit views before 3rd May.

A public consultation for the Plan was launched on Monday 21st March and will run for six weeks. The council is inviting formal representations on the Regulation 16 draft of this Plan.

The Neighbourhood Plan for Barnwell will be a key document in the determination of planning applications within the District. It provides local detail to support the strategic policies of the North Northamptonshire Joint Core Strategy 2011-2031 and the emerging Local Plan Part 2.


The Neighbourhood Plan, supporting documents and details of how to respond are available on the Barnwell Neighbourhood Plan page.

We actively support involvement from all communities to make sure they take up every opportunity to express their thoughts and concerns on development in their area."

The Public Consultation



will run until Tuesday 3rd May 2022.

ROUTE MAP SETS OUT NORTH NORTHAMPTONSHIRE COUNCIL'S COMMITMENT ON CLIMATE

A Climate Change Route Map setting out how North Northamptonshire will work towards carbon neutrality was the focus of a paper brought before the Council recently.

The authority has already declared its commitment to be carbon neutral by 2030 with £1million to be spent over the next three years to kick-start carbon reduction initiatives.

The route map shows how the council's commitment to be carbon neutral will need to be embedded in policy making decisions as

well as through a number of bespoke projects.

The blueprint shows how strategic planning policy will need to be guided by climate mitigation objectives while transport policy will include a continued drive for active travel projects such as electric bikes, the installation of more electric vehicle charging

points and ongoing work with transport providers to explore the accelerated adoption of electric vehicles.

The climate agenda will also influence procurement procedures in the council with work undertaken to explore how the authority can make best use of local suppliers who have a commitment to

reduce carbon emissions and promote green practices.

The council will also produce a carbon management plan which sets out the means of capturing carbon emissions from buildings and vehicles.

Cllr Harriet Pentland, the council's Executive Member for Climate and Green Environment, said: "At a meeting of the council in July 2021, we declared a Climate and Environment Emergency which was a very important commitment for us to make as a new council.

"While we have set a goal to be carbon neutral by 2030, addressing climate change is a much longer-term commitment that will require innovation and widespread change.

"This route map is a significant step forward in showing tangible evidence of how we are going to

work towards that goal.

The actions we take must be kept under review and I will want to bring back the Carbon Management Plan to the Executive later in 2022 in order to build on this and provide further actions that we will need to undertake to meet our 2030 target.

"We have an important journey ahead of us which we are committed to seeing through so that by 2030 we do not look back and wish we had done more when we had the chance."

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "This is an excellent piece of work which sets out clear plans of how we aim to reduce carbon emissions and mitigate the effects of climate change.

"Cllr Pentland and her Executive Advisory Panel have done a great job at moving this forward in a very short timeframe."

Since its inception as a new council, a great deal of activity has been undertaken such as instigating a tree-planting initiative which has seen more than 2,000 trees planted in the past three months as well as continuing a campaign to 'feed the bees' by allowing wildflowers to flourish in some roadside verges, where appropriate.

The authority also hosted its own conference – NN Climate 21 – in November, to showcase pioneering measures already in place and in development to reduce carbon emissions in the North Northamptonshire area.

The specific budget of £1million funding over the next three years to tackle climate change will be allocated as £500k for the 2022/23 budget and £250k in both 2023/24 and 2024/25.

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

The past couple of years have been difficult – to say the least! However, we have had fantastic resources available to find vaccines against the various strains of Covid, and without them the results hardly bear thinking about. Just over 100 years ago, the 1918/19 influenza pandemic claimed over 50 million lives worldwide and in the UK, 1918 was the first year that the number of registered deaths exceeded the number of births. Sobering thoughts, eh?

How did people manage before the modern advances in science? Back along, there were many potions and treatments to help remedy ailments. To stem possible infection following a wound, lily leaves steeped in brandy were used to make a poultice. In the north of England, sphagnum moss was used for dressing wounds.

Have you ever used a hot water bottle to aid an aching shoulder or knee perhaps? Before rubber was used, stone bottles were filled with hot water – or warming pans of hot coals could be used to heat up cold beds. However, they would be no good for wrapping round an

aching joint. That's where wheat bags would be used. Not a recent invention, cloth bags of wheat – or even cherry stones – would be gently heating in the range or close to the fire, ready to pop around the tenderness. Microwave ovens tend to take the place of ranges or open fires for this today!

Herbs played their part in healing and many country folk had a herb garden that they could call upon at a moment's notice. Some of those grown include: scullcap (*Scutellaria baicalensis*), the flowers reputedly being a cure for insomnia; celandine (*Chelidonium*) to treat ailments of the liver, including jaundice; and maidenhair fern being used to make a lotion for baldness.

Many villages had their own "wise woman" who was the most knowledgeable person regarding herbs and such cures, although centuries earlier it was the monks with their herb gardens who were called upon.


