Dog walkers urged to take the lead

The Wildlife Trust in Northamptonshire is calling on dog walkers to keep dogs on short leads to help ground-nesting birds this spring and summer.

Many people think of nests being high in trees, but a surprising number of species nest on the ground or just above in low bushes. At nature reserves, in fields or woodlands these can often be hard to see and so are at risk of trampling, disturbance and harm.

Birds such as skylark and meadow pipit – whose numbers are in worrying decline – make fragile nests tucked away safely in long grass. Willow warblers nest at the base of trees and bushes, while garden birds such as dunnocks and blackbirds may also nest close to the ground.

An exuberant dog, bounding through grass can all too easily disturb wildlife, possibly trampling eggs or scaring adult birds off nests.

The law states that you must keep your dog on a lead no longer than two metres between 1st March and 31st July, when on any open access land to protect ground-nesting birds. For safety, always keep dogs on a lead around grazing animals.

Aldwincle Pre-School and Jollys Toys help bring smiles to Ukrainian children

Like so many other organisations looking for the right way to help the people affected by the crisis in Ukraine, they have been able to lend support via the Packed With Hope campaign.

Packed With Hope is the brainchild of Little Toller Books in Dorset and Blue Moose Books from West Yorkshire. Their aim was to raise £75,000 to send 10,000 backpacks filled with books, comforts and essentials, including head torches, toothbrushes, hot water bottles and socks, to the Ukrainian border for children displaced by the war.

Whilst the initiative attracted national attention, it was also backed locally by Jollys Toys in Thrapston, who learned of the campaign and wanted to get involved. Jollys is a popular destination for many pre-school families, and owner Charlotte Croser wanted to add as many soft toys as possible to the backpacks and so Aldwincle Pre-

School donated 27 toys on behalf of their 27 children on roll.

"As a committee and staff, we were looking for ways to make a meaningful contribution to this desperate situation. When we saw Charlotte promoting Packed with Hope, we were struck by how kind this was and knew it was the right way for us to play our small part and donate something our children are so fortunate to take for granted," commented Anna Watts, Chairperson of Aldwincle Pre-School Committee.

Children at the pre-school, aged between two and four years old, also drew some pictures to accompany the toys, which all carried a personalised message. Jollys also donated some extra goodies free of charge for every

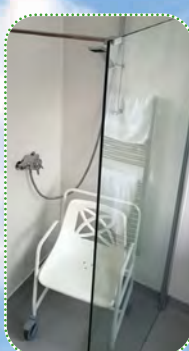
soft toy purchased online or in-store.

"Our toy shop is a magical place for children, and we wanted to share some of that magic with children who are experiencing a very traumatic time, perhaps many having left home without their favourite toys. The idea of sending a small soft toy along with activities and books via Packed With Hope is to send a hug with love and kindness from our community to each of them," says Charlotte of Jollys.

WILDLIFE NEWS

Do you think that the 'countryside' is a quiet space where we can go to look at animals and flowers which do not (often) appear in our gardens, where we can see or hear wildlife we have watched on TV programmes? Or simply an open parking area?

The spring has now arrived, reminding us that gardens are 'unnatural' extensions of the countryside between our (ever-expanding) towns and villages.

Our local countryside does not have the rolling hills of other counties, or their impressive moorlands, but we do have the mix of plant and animal life along the river valley and drainage dykes blended together to give us the "wetlands". At this time of year, however quiet it may look as we pass through, it is also an area of hard work – both for animals and plants. The chase for food means that for two or three weeks the females have extra demands to produce their eggs, and other creatures also need this period to get their production under way, though perhaps

it is easier to imagine what is needed by the birds. Some, of course, are already living here, but others have journeyed many miles (thousands, actually) to find their summer home. They are not all colourful, but add to the country feel by the quality of songs, which are courting calls. By this stage of the process, from mid-May onwards, those sounds will fade away, but not before giving the general name of 'warbler'; a dozen or more different species can be seen in the hedgerows during a walk, especially along the river valley, but need alert eyes, as they blend easily into the surroundings. That ability to 'melt' into the background is why they are often referred to as "little brown jobs", or LBJs, though that includes a range of plumage, including gentle yellows and olive-greens, all with the basic brown. They are shy birds, not often gracing gardens, but if you do come across one or more, you will know the plants are well protected by this section of the insect-eating army, and be glad they made that very long journey to favour us with their (summer) presence.

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

Many of our ancestors were law-abiding people, going about their business and working hard to make ends meet to feed their families. However, once in a while, up pops a criminal ancestor! I do love these as, if they have been in trouble with the authorities, then there is likely to be more documentary evidence about them that sheds some light on the people they were.

A couple of years ago, I was researching a family for someone and discovered that a several times great grandmother had a criminal history as long as your arm. However, the prison records were fascinating. They covered 17 years in total and started off with the woman being 5'1" tall with black hair and blue eyes. She had a "sallow complexion" and weighed just over 8 and a half stone. However, those 17 years took a toll on her and over the years lost her upper and lower back teeth, her hair went grey and she developed an abscess on one cheek. These are things that we would not know if it had not been for that prison record.

Similarly, as I have mentioned before in these pages, my great grandfather John Smith spent two weeks in Saffron Walden Gaol for threatening Farmer Hagger with a hayfork. John had been one of the ringleaders in the North Essex Agricultural Labourers' Strike of 1914 and was offered the choice between paying a fine or going to prison. Being rather short of funds, he opted for prison – which I am glad he did. Otherwise, I would not have known that he was 5' 8" tall, had fair hair and blue eyes. The only photograph that I have of him is in black and white and so does not provide these details.

Now that archives and county records offices are opening again. It could well be worth the trip to see if they hold records of any of your criminal ancestors.

PLACES ALLOCATED FOR PRIMARY-AGED PUPILS IN NORTH NORTHAMPTONSHIRE

A total of 3,857 reception places have been allocated to pupils across North Northamptonshire.

This is the first year that places have been allocated specifically within North Northants, following on from local government reorganisation last year.

92.7% of applicants – 3,576 children – have been allocated a place at their first preference (94.3 % for Northamptonshire as a whole in 2021).

4.3% of applicants have been allocated a place at their second preference (3.8% in NCC in 2021) while 1.5% have been allocated a place at their third preference (0.8% in NCC in 2021).

98.5% of applicants have been allocated one of their preferred schools (98.9% in 2021). 98.8% of applications

were made online (up from 98.5% for NCC in 2021).

Families who applied for their primary school place online and within the deadline are able to check their offer on the council's website.

Looking at the figures for Junior School applications (Year 3), where there were 1,011 applications, 99.8% of pupils were allocated a place at their first preference (99.5% for 2021) while 100% were allocated one of their preferred schools (99.75% in 2021).

Cllr Scott Edwards, North Northamptonshire Council's Executive Member for Children, Families, Education and Skills, said: "I would like to pass on my best wishes to every pupil starting a new school in September and hope this is the start of an exciting new journey.

Supporting all children in their education is a priority for the council.

"We continue to work hard to create additional school places across North Northamptonshire to meet the demand caused by our growing population, through building new schools and expanding existing sites across the area."

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "Starting school is a huge step for all children to take and I wish them all the very best as they embark on their education."

Any parent has the right to appeal (through the independent appeals process) against refusal of a place at any school for which they have applied.

The next round of primary school place allocations (for late applicants) will take place in May.

Two weeks until the International Waendel Walk returns

After a two-year break due to the pandemic, the International Waendel Walk will return to Wellingborough and the surrounding North Northamptonshire countryside next month and tickets are selling fast.

The prestigious event takes place from 13th to 15th May and the team at North Northamptonshire Council are working hard with partner organisations and a dedicated team of volunteers to ensure the event is a success.

The International Waendel Walk is the only event of its kind in the country and will start on the evening of Friday 13th May with two Friendship Walks of 5km and 10km. These walks are followed by a weekend of different routes through

It's so exciting that the International Waendel Walk is back and now only a month away.

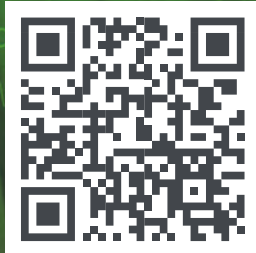

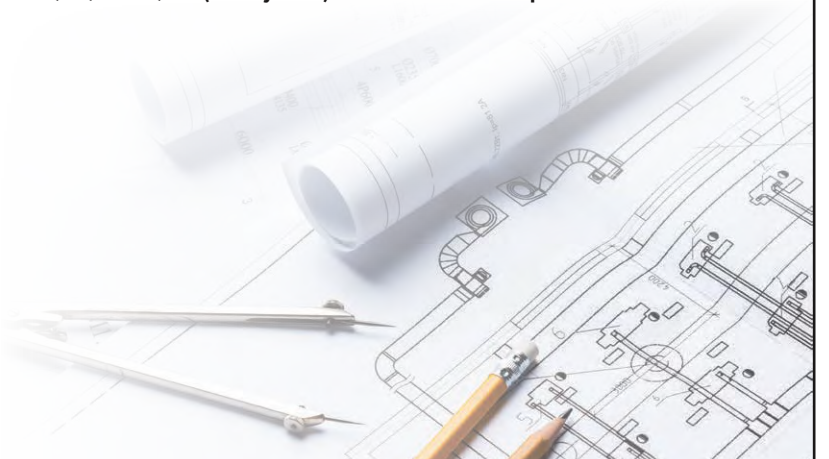

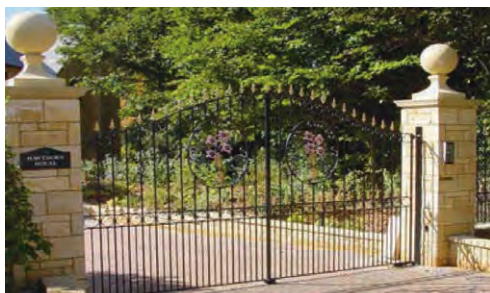

Scheme to eliminate sexual harassment launches in Northamptonshire

The first bars, pubs and clubs in the county to have achieved Shout-Up! certification have been announced.

Shout-Up! will be delivered by Northamptonshire Rape Crisis and funded by the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner Stephen Mold.

The scheme seeks to upskill those working in Northamptonshire's night-time economy so they can identify sexual harassment and intervene safely.

The Picturedrome, The Old White Hart, and NB's Cocktail Bar and Club in Northampton are the first venues to have had all their staff complete Bystander Intervention Training to be able to spot sexual harassment and make situations safe. The training comes ahead of a wider campaign by the commissioner to target violence against women and girls.

Certification, which lasts for two years with six-

monthly assessments, also requires establishments to have a publicly available sexual harassment policy, to implement practices that protect staff and patrons from sexual harassment and have a documented procedure for dealing with incidents.

And it is anticipated that this trio of bars will be the first of many to fulfil these requirements and declare themselves 'sexual harassment-free zones'.

As part of Shout-Up! (which originally started in Newcastle upon Tyne in 2017, with Northamptonshire the first area outside the North East to adopt it), certified venues must:

- have all staff complete Bystander Intervention Training
- write and share sexual harassment policies

protecting staff and patrons

- have a publicly available procedure for dealing with incidents of sexual harassment
- commit to making their venue a sexual harassment-free zone
- display visible signage explaining their participation in the scheme and what patrons can expect to happen in the event of sexual harassment
- commit to undertake six-monthly reviews on policies, procedures and training that they must pass to retain their certification.

A total of 40 individuals have been through the rigorous process so far, and more are due to complete shortly.

Commissioner Mold said: "I'm really happy to support in the funding of this Shout-Up! training and it comes

ahead of a wider campaign we have coming up that specifically targets and tries to prevent violence against women and girls.

"Sexual harassment has a huge impact on the lives of those who have suffered from it, and as the commissioner I need to ensure we make Northamptonshire as safe as it can be for everyone who lives or works here.

"This training will help hospitality staff to recognise the potential signs and trigger points of sexual harassment, to intervene in a safe manner and offer appropriate support to victims. Ultimately, we hope it will help Northampton to provide a safer and more enjoyable night out for everyone."

Suzy Keeping, Director of both The Picturedrome and The Old White Hart Inn said: "We're thrilled to have our venues be the first to take part in the Shout-Up! campaign.



We have a zero-tolerance policy on sexual harassment in our venues and are proud to be able to celebrate that by becoming Shout-Up! verified.

"It is so important to us that all our customers and staff come into the venue feeling safe, with nothing else to think about but the great night ahead. There is no place in Northampton's nightlife scene for sexual harassment.

Everyone should get on board to show it's not welcome in this town.

"Shout-Up! training also enables pubs and venues to understand how they can intervene for their staff too, as too often harassment of staff is normalised. We look forward to working with venues in the coming months to protect their staff and patrons from harassment."
