NEWS IN BRIEF

EARTH BUND INSTALLED TO BEAT FLY-TIPPERS

A notorious fly-tipping hotspot on the busy A605 has had preventative measures installed to combat the littering that has blighted the lay-by near Lilford Woods.

Waste enforcement officers from North Northamptonshire Council worked with Northamptonshire Highways to first clear the site and then build an earth bund which will restrict vehicle access.

Money for the project came from the Office of the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner from funding set aside for landowners who are suffering from fly-tipping.

Since 2018 there have been 21 complaints of fly-tipping at the location. In this instance the team cleared waste including hundreds of full bin bags and empty oil cans, not only making it unsightly but potentially putting lives at risk.

Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner Stephen Mold said: "Fly-tipping is anti-social and has a negative impact on how people feel about the area in which they live. It's a criminal act, it causes pollution and costs a significant amount of public money to clean up.

"I have set aside funding that will go some way to providing the tools needed to deter fly-tippers and support landowners who find often dangerous and hazardous waste, dumped on their land. The funding can be used to cover the cost of having fly-tipping removed, as well as to fund prevention measures to make land less vulnerable to fly-tippers in future."

Fly-tipping is a crime which blights communities, poses a risk to public health and the environment, and costs nationally up to £392 million a year. Local authorities dealt with 1.13 million fly-tipping incidents in 2020/21, up by 16% from 2019/20.

Incidents of fly-tipping can be reported to the council.

People are encouraged to log local fly-tipping hotspots and note number plates of vehicles seen dumping waste.

However, they should remain safe and are discouraged from approaching or photographing fly-tippers or investigating the waste themselves.



WILDLIFE NEWS

Energy (or at least the need for, and lack of, it) is one of the commonest topics of conversation nowadays. Our demand for it is continually growing and showing what could happen if extreme conditions leave us without power. Yet in its varied forms it is essential, supplying all of the power requirements from its basic source – the sun. Plants and animals rely on receiving sufficient energy, and find their own best way to use it; they depend upon it, and the only input is the sun.

When the overnight CCTV clips from the garage (unlit) were reviewed the first screenful did not show anything understandable until the subject started to move away and then we saw the toad (initially too close for the camera to focus). Obviously an animal of some size, though at this time of year baby "toadlets" would be more likely, in greater numbers.

Frogs and toads have hatched from their spawn and now will build up their energy reserves; they may look quite similar, but as they develop further differences become more evident. For example frogs are the ones which may startle us by leaping

out from a hiding-place as we pass by, whereas the toad is more likely to sit still and hope we have not seen it; this is also a great help when hunting, especially if he/she has found an ambush point which will attract flies and other flying insects.

The closer look on the camera shot gave another marked different sign in identification – the legs and feet of the toads give a feeling of size and strength to build on. As the warmer weather is now here the next generation will gain their own supply of energy before the autumn eventually arises (how sad! Already thinking about the end of year!).

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

The other weekend I took a little trip to Ashdon, near Saffron Walden, in Essex. It is where my Smith family came from and I thought that it was about time that I paid it another visit as I had not been there for about 15 years. It is rather useful if you live not too far from where your ancestors may be found. Castle Camps (Cambridgeshire) is only 3 miles up the road from there and so I was able to visit those ancestors as well. I think that a trip to visit my Sussex forefathers will involve an overnight stay...

It was great to catch up with Glen, the curator of the local museum. He started the museum back in 1995 following a lifetime of collecting artefacts from in and around the village. Always interested in local history, Glen has researched about 130 local families and has been a wonderful resource for my own research. He also knows that, should he receive any enquiries from others researching my family, he can put them in touch with me. That is how I made contact with

some distant cousins in Australia. We share the same great, great, great grandparents! Also, on the wall of the museum is a photograph of the wedding of my great uncle Harry taken in 1898, the first wedding to have taken place at Ashdon Baptist Chapel. One of the children in that photograph is my grandmother, the earliest picture otherwise is of her at her wedding in 1917. It is always worth visiting museums in the area where your ancestors once lived, but do check opening hours first as some, like both Ashdon and also Oundle Museum, are just open at weekends. Ask the questions – you never know what you might discover! But not only that, the museum could well be interested in information that you have. My father left me a small suitcase of old photographs, some of which are of my great grandmother, who married an Ashdon Smith. Copies of those are now winging their way over to Glen to add to his collection.

EXECUTIVE APPROVES NEW PREFERRED ROUTE FOR THE A509 ISHAM BYPASS

Recently, North Northamptonshire Council's Executive considered an update on the work which has been and will be undertaken on the A509 Isham Bypass.

During the meeting, the Executive agreed a change to the Preferred Route for the scheme, as set out in the recommendations of the report and agreed to delegate authority to the Executive Member for Highways, Travel & Assets to procure and award a contract to provide professional services to support the delivery of the A509 Isham Bypass.

Work on the A509 Isham Bypass has continued with varying degrees of progress since the early 1990s. The Executive has been forced to change the current preferred route for the A509 Isham Bypass to tie in to the improvements to the A509 which are being constructed as part of the Symmetry Park

development on a different alignment to the original approved application.

Work is currently underway to develop a new planning application and the Outline Business Case for the scheme. These are due to be submitted in October 2022. A further

public consultation and exhibition will be held before the planning application is submitted.

Further progress will then be dependent on securing the necessary statutory permissions and further Government funding. Following the granting

of planning permission, it is expected it will be necessary to publish new Compulsory Purchase and Side Roads Orders. If there are objections to these orders, the Secretary of State will hold a public inquiry. Once the Orders are confirmed, a Full Business Case will be

submitted to the Department for Transport to secure funding to construct the road.

It is currently projected that construction will start in November 2024, with the bypass opening in November 2026.

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader

of the council, said: "We know that villagers have been campaigning for decades for it to go ahead and we agree it's of tremendous benefit to them and the wider area.

"We'd encourage people to share their views at the public consultation and exhibition."

SPLASH PARK AT THE EMBANKMENT SET TO REOPEN

Following detailed discussions by North Northamptonshire Council's (NNC) Executive, a solution has been found that means that Splash Park at the Embankment will open to the public.

Now children and their families from Wellingborough and further afield will be able to enjoy the amenities on offer,

including water fountains and play equipment.

The Park will be open, subject to favourable weather conditions, between 12 noon and 6.30pm:

- Until Sunday 17th July (weekends only)
- Saturday 23rd July – Wednesday 31st August (daily)

- Saturday 3rd September – Sunday 25th September (weekends only)

To ensure the popular attraction can open throughout the summer, the council have been working hard, including checking the water safety and are asking that visitors work with NNC by following signage and rules on site. An emergency

contact number will always be on display too.

Cllr Graham Lawman, the council's Executive Member for Highways, Travel and Assets, said: "As a local Wellingborough Councillor, I know how well used and loved this facility is, so I am really pleased that we have been able to get the park open.

"Our teams have worked hard to open the Park and it is great that, from this weekend, children and their families will be able to enjoy the facilities on offer.

"I would ask that everyone reads the signage on site, and follows the rules to ensure the Park is kept clean and tidy and safe and can remain open."
