## TAPESTRY CREATORS PAY THEIR RESPECTS TO HENRY CHICHELE IN CANTERBURY

Two talented craftswomen who spent seven years on a tapestry tracing the life of their town's most famous historical figure have just been on a special journey of their own.

Fay Caddick and Susan Waters were part of a team of eight women who called themselves The Material Girls. They worked on the unique tapestry, which is on permanent display in the historic Bede House, next to St Mary's Church, in Higham Ferrers.

The fabric and thread tapestry, created using applique and various embroidery techniques, follows the life and times of Higham Ferrers-born Henry Chichele, who became one of the country's longest serving Archbishops of Canterbury, holding office for 28 years in the 15th century.

The tapestry is made up of five panels: four plot Chichele's life, with the fifth being an introductory banner which explains what the tapestry is all about.

The Henry Chichele Timeline tapestry was the brainchild of Fay, a retired art and design teacher, who assembled The Material Girls for an earlier tapestry, or Mapestry as it was known, as it mapped out the town's heritage buildings.

The minute that was finished, she turned her attention to the Henry Chichele timeline tapestry, and although two years were "lost" because of the Covid-19 pandemic, The Material Girls eventually finished the final and fifth panel earlier this year.

Susan Waters got the job of putting the last stitches onto the banner as "she does the neatest

stitches you have ever seen," Fay explained when the tapestry was unveiled at a special ceremony.

It was the first of several events marking the 600th anniversary of the founding of Bede House and Chichele College in 1422 by Henry Chichele.

Now, to complete their Henry Chichele journey, Fay and Susan have just visited Canterbury Cathedral, where the huge, spectacular and colourful Chichele tomb was completed long before the Archbishop's death.

Their pilgrimage fulfilled their wish to pay their respects now that the panelled tapestry has been installed in the Bede House, Susan explained.

"As pilgrims used to leave small offerings at the Cathedral shrines, we took a card on behalf of The Material Girls showing the final panel," she said.

Inscribed around the edge of the tomb in Latin is 'I was a pauper born, then to primate here raised, now I am cut down and served up for worms – behold my grave. Whoever you may be who will pass by, I ask for your remembrance...'

Fay and Susan said that they certainly do remember Henry Chichele, especially in this, the 600th anniversary year of the foundation of the Bede House and Chichele College. Susan, a noted poet, also wrote a special poem 'A Time To Dance' which she read at the recent 600th anniversary celebration party at Chichele College. The Bede House is open for a coffee morning every Thursday as well as the last Saturday of each month.

NNC are currently offering two traineeships programmes for those coming out of education and looking to gain employment skills, whilst apprenticeships are also available for those wanting to go down this route.

The Study Programme based in Kettering town centre is available as an alternative to sixth form or college. The six-week Empower programme starts on 12th September. It will focus on helping students to build confidence and support them with challenges in learning, with team building activities and projects.

## GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

#### **WORDS BY** JAN PEARSON

Talking of censuses, which I was last time, if you notice large age gaps between the children in a family, do you just leave it or do you investigate further? I always have a rummage to see if there is anyone missing.

Looking at a branch of my own tree recently, I saw that children had been born quite regularly every couple of years – apart from one gap of four years. Was this the mother just having a rest or could it be a missing child? I had a poke around. FreeBMD (www.freebmd.org.uk/) was my starting point and then the GRO Certificates (www.gro.gov.uk/gro/content/certificates/) website. FreeBMD gave me the chance to check births and deaths within a timescale and area for that particular surname and then the GRO website enabled me to check the mother's maiden name on the baby's birth registration. It also provided the age at which the child died, as this did not appear on the FreeBMD index before 1866. Yes, there was a missing child.

My grandmother always said that she was

one of eight children. It was not until the 1911 census was published that I discovered that she was actually one of 11. It was on this census that the wife of the Head of Household was required to state how long she had been married plus how many children there had been from that marriage, noting also how many had died and how many were still living. This was the first census on which this handy information appeared. Of the three missing siblings, I discovered that two had been born and died before my grandmother was born plus another had been born and died when Grandma was only 2 years old, meaning that she probably could not remember her.

However, remember that births and deaths were only registered at the GRO in England and Wales from 1st July 1837. Before that, it will mean scouring those parish registers and trying to decipher the handwriting - as I mentioned a few weeks ago!




