## Rules for bird keepers in Oundle

Bird keepers within a 3km Avian Influenza Protection Zone (AIPZ) and a 10km Avian Influenza Surveillance Zone (AISZ) must now follow a set of rules, following an outbreak of Avian flu at a rural premises near Oundle on 7th Nov.

Within the 3km Protection zone, bird keepers must:

- follow the rules for 10km surveillance zones and 10km temporary control zones
- keep poultry and other captive birds housed
- follow the instructions from your veterinary inspector to dispose of any bird carcasses
- not spread poultry litter, manure, or slurry, or remove them from your premises
- not move poultry or other captive birds onto or off your premises without a licence (there are exceptions for pets)
- not move eggs without a licence (you can move table eggs to wholesale or retail premises to be sold directly to consumers)

## **WILDLIFE** NEWS

What wildlife memories have you been storing through the year? There are several weeks still to go, but we will all have our own "horror stories" about the days and weeks when very little or no rain fell and the traditional picture of what summer should look, and feel like changed. As we relax and hopefully "rebuild" our bodies, out in the fields the energy from the sun is collected in the body of the plant or animal to be used in the next stage of growth particularly the flowers or prey.

The surprising summer has now given way to cooler days - and "closed for the winter" signs will soon dominate; all part of the essential life-

We will recall the plants and animals which showed themselves during what always feels to be the shortness of the 'midsummer season'. This year has been exceptional, but much of the effect will only be seen in coming years, and there are species in our natural envrionnment which

are suffering, possibly needing some assistance from gardeners and farmers to improve survival chances, because weather conditions may vary

For example we made some additions to our garden plant list which then had to be adjusted to try to meet the requirements of bumblebees which had found suitable conditions under a wooden shed! Some of our visitors were not too happy with the prospect of a colony of these usually quite placid insects out simply to build up the strength of their community.

It is not difficult to work out that with plants and animals, with their different ways of drinking, it is not enough to provide just an occasional drop of water in a tin lid. Obviously a hedgehog will need more fluid than, say, a mouse, or a dandelion.

So next year's planning, as summers are becoming hotter, should try to cover the needs of a wider range of the millions of species all chasing that supply of the vital liquid.

## GENEALOGY **JOTTINGS**

Now, you should know by now that I have been visiting Oundle Library on the first Wednesday each month to offer free help and guidance to folk who are researching their family trees. However, there is no need to fret if you could not make it. There is free access on the Library computers to subscription websites such as Ancestry, Find My Past and the British Newspaper Archives (BNA). Many years ago, I used to visit the BNA when they were in Colindale, north London, and had a wonderful time scouring the newspapers. Luckily, I worked in Edgware at the time, so it was just down the road. Oundle Library also has a fair number of family history reference books covering both the local area as well as other general help. Ask the Library staff and they will be able to point you in the right direction.

However, if you are unable to visit the Library, or you want to research from home, it is worth checking out the different commercial websites as, although they offer the same ideas, the

actual records differ. For example, at present, the 1921 census is only available from Find My Past. But if your ancestors came from London. chances are that you might discover a copy of the original marriage register on Ancestry. Use their offers of "free access" that pop up from time to time in order to have a scout around and see which suit you. But don't forget to cancel any subscription details before the offer ends!

If, like me, your ancestors came from places further afield, it could well be worthwhile joining one of the Family History Societies (FHS) local to that area. Many have transcribed parish registers, census returns and other records and may publish them online. I have a friend in Melbourne. Australia who has a branch that came from Essex. She has joined the  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{FHS}}$ that covers those towns and villages and has received some invaluable help.



CONSULTATION takes place between 14th November 2022 and 31st December 2022. DETERMINATION of school admission arrangements by admission authorities must be completed by 28th February 2023.

PUBLICATION of admission policies should happen as soon as possible after 28th February 2023 and must be completed by 15th March 2023 (published on schools' websites with copies sent to the LA).

## THE PRESENT FROM THE PALACE IS UNPACKED – AND THEN COMES ANOTHER SURPRISE

A surprise gift from Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II to Higham Ferrers has finally been unveiled.

Back in August, Morcea Walker MBE, the Vice Lord-Lieutenant of Northamptonshire, told guests at the 600th anniversary of the town's Chichele College, that Higham Ferrers was going to get "a present from the Palace". But the gift had to remain a secret until later in the year, she said in an interview at the time.

Now however, the mystery has been solved as the secret of the special gift is out. Higham Ferrers has just received a "Tree of Trees" tree which was planted in the Chichele College garden recently by the Vice Lord-Lieutenant of Northamptonshire and Paul Parsons, the Queen's Green Canopy chairman for Northamptonshire. Chichele College, a Scheduled Monument, is owned by the Duchy of Lancaster and Higham Ferrers Tourism cares for the day-to-day management of the site through an agreement with English Heritage.

The special tree – Higham Ferrers selected a hazel – came from the Queen's Green Canopy "Tree of Trees", an impressive sculpture made up of 350 British trees, which stood tall outside Buckingham Palace marking the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations and seen on televisions around the world.

The new Higham Ferrers tree, which joins more than a million trees already planted across Britain

as part of the Queen's Green Canopy, has now become a living legacy in honour of Her Majesty. Based on the population of Northamptonshire, the county was gifted four "Tree of Trees" trees.

Higham Ferrers, which boasts a team of active volunteer gardeners at Chichele College, was an "obvious choice" to receive one, the Vice Lord-Lieutenant said after the planting ceremony. The other towns were Kettering, Northampton and Brackley.

The hazel tree came in a special metal pot embossed with Her Majesty's cypher and it will be used for floral displays in the historic Chichele College, Carol Fitzgerald, chair of the Chichele College Management Committee, said.

The Vice Lord-Lieutenant told guests at the ceremony that the hazel tree would add to the town's history.

But it was not the only special gift that the town received that day

Professor Peregrine Horden, the Fellow Librarian of All Souls College, Oxford, said that Higham Ferrers-born Henry Chichele, who founded Chichele College and became Archbishop of Canterbury, had also founded All Souls College.

To mark the continuing association with Chichele College, the Warden and Fellows of All Souls had decided to sponsor £500 a year for five years towards the College's local educational initiatives.

Another VIP guest Victoria Wicks, granddaughter of famous local author HE Bates, told how he loved Higham Ferrers, having spent as much time as he could at his grandparents' farm, which is now the



Chichele College garden.

The acclaimed author wrote that while Higham Ferrers might not be the most beautiful town in England, "I will simply say it is closer to my heart".

A poem, 'The Queen's Canopy', written by local poet Susan Waters, premiered at the ceremony and was read by Paul Parsons.
