THE TRAIL, THE TALES AND A TOWN'S FASCINATING HISTORY – HIGHAM FERRERS TOURISM UNCOVERS THE BLUE PLAQUE STORIES

Higham Ferrers Mayor, Councillor Nigel Brown, always wondered what the full stories were behind the Town Council's 18 Blue Plaques on sites in the historic town...

Now, thanks to an intensive two-year research project by the town's Tourism Committee, he will be able to find out all about the various places and people behind the blue plaque locations.

The Mayor told of his curiosity about the plaques at the recent Mayor's Market, on the final day of the Coronation celebrations, when he launched the Tourism Committee's Blue Plaque Trail at the committee's promotional market stall

Armed with a four-page brochure, the Mayor will now be able to walk the trail, either taking his time over several days or doing it all at once.

And just like others who are interested in the tales of the town, he will also be able to discover the full fascinating

stories by logging on to the new website www.blueplaquetrail.

"I always wanted to know more than the brief details on the blue plaques. Now I have the chance to find out more. I think this is a great scheme: you have done a fantastic job," the Mayor told the committee.

A small team of committee members, aided by local

researched the stories and special mention was made at the launch of the hard work of Brenda and Pam Webbley, who produced the brochure and website.

The website tells of a 500-year-old walnut tree which has its own blue plaque; details the background about buildings linked to people in the region's shoe and boot trade: and features landmarks associated with Higham's most famous son, Archbishop of Canterbury Henry Chichele (1364-1443), who founded the town's Chichele College in 1422 from the proceeds from his properties in Essex, London and Higham, including the revenue from his local pub. The Swan Inn.

Chichele's birthplace, 67 High Street, has a blue plaque as does 2 College Street, where the prolific local author, H.E. Bates – of The Darling Buds of May fame-used to visit his grandparents.

The Old House at 5 Market Square, which was built in the late 16th century, still retains the original key, which has to be inserted upside down to open the original oak front door.

The website reveals that the Market Cross in the town centre, which dates from the 13th century, was used to bind oaths and contracts and is historically the focal point of proclamations such as the death of a monarch. It was there where a proclamation was made about the succession of Charles III on Sunday 11th September 2022.

The Market Cross site was also the spot where public whippings were once carried out and where people were put in the stocks as a form of humiliation.

Website visitors will also discover that even though Chichele College was meant for a community of priests, as well as a warden, choristers and fellows, that some of the activities were less than lawabiding.

"In 1433, the fellows of the college were in trouble at the Duchy Court for poaching fish in the River Nene... There were numerous complaints about the lax attitude of the inhabitants. These included the fellows being far too fashion-conscious and wearing their gowns cut very short."

As for the chaplain, he was charged with "haunting suspicious places, particularly the houses of Elizabeth Bere and Margery Chamberlayne, ladies of ill repute."

There is a printer-friendly version of the trail's map on the website. Alternatively, visitors can collect the brochure from the Higham Ferrers Town Hall on the Market Square or from the Discover Northamptonshire Hub at Rushden Lakes Shopping Centre

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

A thought: how often do we read the war memorials in our towns and villages? Listing the names of those brave men – and women – who gave their lives for us in the two world wars, many of the local families lost one or more of their family in these conflicts. A few years ago, I was involved in the research of those listed on the war memorial of a local village. It was quite poignant to discover what was happening in their lives before they went off to fight for their country.

Have you visited the Commonwealth War Graves Commission website? (http://www.cwgc. org/) This covers not just those British soldiers, sailors and airmen who died, but also those from Commonwealth countries. Not only that, civilians are also recorded who died as part of enemy action. One such person was Leonard Albert Wright, the son of Mrs Kate Wright, of 5 Council Houses, Eastonon-the-Hill, who died aged 20 on 23rd February 1941. Kate was a widow, her husband Frederick having died in 1938 at the age of 54. The family may

be seen in the 1921 census where Frederick is shown as working as a Limestone Quarry Foreman in the Ketton Quarry.

On the CWGC website, you will find details of the person's memorial, where their name is recorded within a War Graves cemetery or burial plot as well as, for non-civilians, details of the battles that were fought in which they died. One such memorial is to Patrick Dudgeon, who was captured in Italy whilst on a secret mission and shot by the Germans on 3rd October 1943. Aged just 23 when he died, Patrick had been a pupil in St Anthony's House at Oundle School from 1934 to 1938 and now has an award made to students each year in his name.

It goes to show that you never know where a memorial to your ancestor or their siblings might turn




