Grants for rural organisations in **North Northants now available**

Organisations across the more rural areas of North Northants are being encouraged to come forward and apply for capital grants of up to £15,000.

Using the area's allocation from the Rural England Prosperity Fund, North Northamptonshire Council is currently taking applications for rural organisations that meet certain criteria.

Organisations including parish councils, charities, community groups and school PTAs are all being encouraged to check their eligibility and apply online.

Organisations can apply for capital grants of up to £15,000 if they can demonstrate that the funding will be used to support:

- creation and improvements to local rural green spaces
- existing cultural, historic and heritage institutions
- active travel enhancements e.g. community transport

Cllr David Howes, the Council's Executive

Member for Rural Communities and Localism, said: "The Rural England Prosperity Fund is designed to support those in the more rural areas of North Northants. It is great that we are now able to offer grants of up to £15,000 to organisations that will truly make a difference to rural communities.

"So, if you have a project in the pipeline that, for example, could improve a green space or heritage scheme that needs a funding boost, do get in touch."

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "If you are a member of an organisation or community group that operates in one of the rural areas of North Northants, I would encourage you to take a look at the information online and apply for a grant before the deadline."

Applications are open until 31st July 2023, with full criteria and how to apply on the council's community funding pages.

This project is funded by the UK government through the Rural England Prosperity Fund.

Moulton College students support conservation projects at Rushden Lakes

Construction students from Moulton College have been putting the final touches on a series of new projects at Rushden Lakes in collaboration with the Wildlife Trust Beds, Cambs & Northants.

It follows the success of last year's Gateway Project, which saw students from the College's Higham Ferrers campus team up with North Northamptonshire Council and other partner organisations to deliver heritage-themed planters in the shape of a train.

Over the last few months, a group of Level 1 and Level 2 Carpentry and Bricklaying students have created new furniture and carried out maintenance work at the vibrant Rushden Lakes complex and Nene Wetlands

nature reserve. The projects have included a new gate for the pond dipping platform, and benches and stools in the Wildlife Trust's Education Area, where the charity runs community group visits and family events to help the public learn about nature.

The students have also worked in partnership with The Wildlife Trust and Rushden Lakes on their new community garden project. This project allows local groups to get hands-on, growing wildlife-friendly plants and herbs, as well

as fruit and vegetables that will be donated to local community food initiatives.

Alan Turner, Carpentry
Lecturer at Moulton College
says: "A number of our cohort
have been involved in this
year's projects, working
closely with the Wildlife Trust
and Rushden Lakes to carry
out maintenance work and
deliver new projects. It's
been a fantastic opportunity
for our students to get
hands-on experience while
contributing to the local
community and conservation
efforts."

Crackdown on unlicensed multiple occupancy households

Illicit households of multiple occupancy have been targeted in North Northamptonshire in a bid to improve housing standards and make communities safer.

North Northamptonshire Council joined forces with Northamptonshire Police in the crackdown which targeted 76 private properties in the East Northants, Kettering and Wellingborough areas.

Of the houses inspected during the week of action, four were discovered to be unlicensed, 68 were houses of multiple occupancy (HMO) that did not require a licence because of their size, while four are still being investigated. One property was found to be the location of a cannabis factory.

The landlord of any HMO is required to meet certain requirements under regulations and those HMOs of five or more tenants need to be licenced. HMOs that are poorly managed and badly maintained can put an extra burden on local services and have a negative impact on an area.

A financial penalty of up to £30,000, plus a repayment of rent order, may be imposed if a landlord is operating a licensable HMO without a licence

The Council is urging any landlord who has yet to register their HMO to apply for the relevant licence.

The authority is also asking any residents who

suspect an unlicensed HMO in their area to make contact by emailing: privatesectorhousing@northnorthants.gov.uk. This can be done anonymously.

Cllr Mark Rowley, the Council's Executive Member for Housing, Communities and Levelling Up, said: "It is important that authorised officers of the Council identify and inspect unregulated HMOs and tackle those landlords that choose to ignore the law, so that these properties can be properly managed moving forward and to ensure the safety of tenants which is paramount. This week of action has been successful and future planned ones will continue."

Neighbourhood Inspector for Corby and Kettering Paul Cash, of Northamptonshire Police, added: "The partnership working we do is so important in supporting a good quality of life for our communities.

"Joining these visits enabled us to support the HMO team, building partnerships while identifying any criminal activity and supporting and safeguarding any vulnerable people.

"At one address in Kettering we also located a cannabis grow which is now being investigated, and I'm sure its removal is a relief to all who will have been affected by it."

GRANTS AVAILABLE TO HELP RESIDENTS HEAT HOMES AND **REDUCE ENERGY BILLS**

Residents living in private homes (both owned and rented) with a gross household income of less than £31,000 are being encouraged to apply for a government grant to help improve the energy efficiency of their homes.

ECO4 Flex is a government scheme, funded by energy companies, that supports households on lower incomes or those particularly vulnerable to the impacts of living in a cold home.

Funding is available for things that can improve the energy efficiency of your home, including insulation and heating systems.

Improving the energy performance of your property through different methods could save you hundreds of pounds in fuel bills each year. For example:

- Loft insulation up to £500
- External wall insulation up to £350

- Energy efficient boiler up to £200
- Cavity wall insulation up to £250

As well as households on a low income, residents who are more vulnerable to the cold are being encouraged to speak to their GP, who may be able to complete an NHS Eco Flex referral and you will not be required to undertake a means test

Cllr Mark Rowley, North Northamptonshire Council's Executive Member for Housing, Communities and Levelling Up, said: "We estimate there are approximately 3,000 households eligible for ECO4 Flex funding across North Northamptonshire, which is why we are encouraging residents to come forward and

"Households with a gross income, after deductions and mortgage or rent, of under £31,000 are eligible, as are households that do not meet the income threshold but have a household member with a health condition that makes them more susceptible to the cold. Simple changes like a new energy efficient boiler could save you up to £200 a year on fuel bills - something which is more important than ever, with heating bills at a high level."

DPD robot deliveries heading to Raunds

Autonomous robot deliveries to be rolled out to 10 UK towns and cities in the next 12 months following successful Milton Keynes trial.

Leading parcel delivery company DPD has confirmed plans to expand autonomous robot deliveries to 10 UK towns and cities in the next 12 months, starting with Raunds in Northamptonshire, following a successful trial in Milton Keynes.

Based at DPD's depot at Warth Park on the western edge of Raunds, the robots will deliver to nearby residential areas within a mile of the depot, via the existing network of footpaths. In Raunds, the robots will have three separate parcel compartments, instead of just one in the original trial, and an extended battery life of up to 12 hours.

DPD parcel recipients in Raunds will be notified of a robot delivery in advance, and once they confirm that they are at home to accept the parcel, the robot will be dispatched.

Customers will then be able to track the robot's progress on a map and are notified when it reaches their property. They then use a code to open the secure compartment and access their parcel. Once the compartment is closed, the robot will either continue to its next delivery or return to the depot.

DPD has worked closely with North

Northamptonshire Council on the introduction of the robots in Raunds.

Cllr Graham Lawman, North
Northamptonshire Council's
Executive Member for Highways,
Travel and Assets, said: "We are
delighted that DPD is introducing
delivery robots in Raunds. The
council is committed to the
environment and supporting clean
and green alternatives to traditional
forms of transport to reduce
emissions. It is great to be able to
help bring this innovation to North
Northamptonshire."

DPD first introduced the Cartken robots in Milton Keynes in July 2022 and they have since travelled almost 500 miles and successfully performed over 2,500 trips delivering parcels to DPD customers.

Tim Jones, Director of Marketing, Communications & Sustainability DPDgroup UK commented: "The trial in Milton Keynes has been a huge success for us. The robots have exceeded our expectations, and the feedback has been fantastic. We can see people's reactions when they meet them, and it is overwhelmingly positive. We set out to understand the role that delivery robots could

play in certain locations in the UK and the trial has helped us identify more sites where we could deploy the robots successfully.

"Our aim is to be the UK's most sustainable delivery company and that means investing in innovations and trying new things. We are well on our way to decarbonising our van fleet with EVs and we are also making a big step forward by switching our HGVs to renewable biofuel, but we are also interested in brand new solutions that can help us transition to a smarter, more sustainable future."

The announcement extends DPD's relationship with Al-powered robotics and last mile delivery specialists, Cartken and follows work by DPD that identified up to 30 UK depot locations which could potentially deploy robots.

Cartken's level 4 autonomy and leading micro-AV technology platform is regarded as one of the safest last mile delivery solutions on the market and enables full autonomy on footpaths with only cameras – one of the only companies in the autonomous vehicle delivery space to achieve this with a purely vision-based system.



Cartken Co-Founder and COO, Anjali Jindal Naik, commented: "Autonomous mobility will be a key lever for decarbonisation, as it transforms last mile transportation into a much greener process. By partnering with delivery companies, such as DPD, we're propelling this transformation forward, making sustainable delivery the norm, rather than a nice to have.

"2023 has been a year of tremendous growth for Cartken and we're only in Q2. Developing our partnership with DPD is a critical step in expanding our presence globally, beginning with the UK, while also being at the forefront of sustainable last mile delivery by cutting down on C02 emissions."






