Proposed school move to Glenvale Park takes step forward

Following the receipt of two completed 'expressions of interest' for the relocation of an existing school into a new primary school at Glenvale Park, a panel has now met to consider the applications and recommend a school to move into the new facilities from September 2024.

The panel reviewed and assessed both applications from Little Harrowden Primary School and Wilby C of EVA Primary School recently. Both schools submitted strong applications and following a rigorous interview process a recommendation has now been put forward that Wilby C of E VA Primary School go forward to the next stage.

A formal public consultation will now be launched at the beginning of September, with the outcome informing the North Northamptonshire Council's Executive decision making process later in the year. If the recommendation is approved, it is anticipated that Wilby C of E School would move to the Glenvale Park development to

coincide with the start of the 2024/25 school year.

Cllr Scott Edwards, the council's Executive Member for Children, Families, Education and Skills, said: "Both applications we received were of a high standard and warmly received by the panel. After a long discussion and careful consideration, we have recommended that Wilby C of E Primary School move to the next stage and a public consultation will be launched in September so residents and parents can have their say on the recommendation.

The proposal to move an existing school to Glenvale Park was approved at Executive in lune. Glenvale Park will provide an additional 3,000 new homes and in preparation for new families moving into the area, the school, which has been built by the developer Glenvale Park LLP, is due for completion this autumn.

Local schools were asked to express an interest in relocating to the Glenvale site and expanding to meet future need as required.

With final preparations underway, I am looking forward to the new school opening its doors to all young people and their families in September."

"The Council is committed to continuing to support the development of the new school and ensuring the very best outcomes for all of the pupils who go there."

The Headteacher for the new school will be Mrs Kelly O'Connor, who is the current headteacher of Alfred Street Junior School.

Mrs O'Connor said: "I'm honoured to be appointed as the Headteacher of the new school, Alfred Lord Tennyson, and I am excited about our new journey with the children, staff and parents.

"There's lots going on as we make final preparations for our opening in September and I'd like to thank all concerned in the school community for their hard work and commitment."

A school website is currently being developed for the new school and will be ready for the opening in September.

As outlined in the terms of the amalgamation, Tennyson Road Infant School will close on 31st August and the new school Alfred Lord Tennyson School will open on 1st September.

The new school will open on the two existing school sites on 1st September with Nursery, Reception and Years 1 and 2 at the old Tennyson Road site and Years 3 to 6 at the Alfred Street location. Staff, pupils, parents, carers and the wider school community are being kept informed of further developments from now until September.

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

Did you know... Although Oundle was granted a Market Charter in 972, the market itself used to be held on a Saturday. It was a hundred years ago that the following notice was printed in the Stamford News of 11th July 1823:

"It is proposed to change the day of the market at Oundle, Northamptonshire, from Saturday to Thursday, that it may not be affected by Peterborough and other neighbouring Saturday markets.'

I stumbled across this as I was having a rummage through the newspapers for something else! How easily sidetracked am I!

Talking of being sidetracked, I have a large piece of paper and a pen at one side of my laptop when I am searching online. I have a note (or three!) about what I am researching, which helps me to keep to one subject at a time. It also helps if I have gone off piste, so to speak, and reminds me of what I am meant to be looking for. This can be very useful if

you suddenly discover an interesting nugget of information. I was totally distracted by the discovery that the husband of one of my great aunts was in prison for the manslaughter of his landlady. I had just been searching for what had happened to their son when he suddenly appeared with his father.

Sometimes you can be looking for a death of someone as their spouse had remarried, stating that they were widowed. This is not always the case as, in the early days, to be divorced was a bit of a stigma and therefore not always owned up to. So, after banging your head against a brick wall and coming up with nothing, it is always worth checking if the "deceased" spouse went on to live elsewhere, popping up in later records.

NEW BRIDGE TO REPLACE THE OLD **'RED BRIDGE' AT THORPE MEADOWS**

Nene Park Trust is pleased to announce that the structure will be installed in the autumn, helping to reconnect Peterborough city centre and Thorpe Meadows.

For 38 years, the old 'Red Bridge' spanned an inlet from the River Nene to the rowing lake on the edge of Thorpe Meadows. The bridge was on a footpath that followed a picturesque riverside route from the city centre to the western edge of Peterborough and beyond but in 2021 it was deemed unsafe due to rotten wooden beams and was removed in 2022. Since then there has been no crossing point of the river in this location.

Thanks to a combination of funds from Peterborough City Council and Nene Park Trust, as well as generous donations from Tarmac Landfill Communities Fund and FCC Communities Foundation, Nene Park Trust is now able to proceed with the bridge replacement.

This project will install a new 20m long, 1.2m wide steel and timber footbridge which will have a lifespan of 50-100 years, helping to build the resilience of this area of Nene Park.

The new bridge will reopen a popular walking route to Nene Park and the Boardwalks Nature Reserve from the city centre. It will also provide a foot/

cycle entry point to Thorpe Meadows Gateway, allowing pedestrians/cyclists to avoid having to use a busy main road.

It is anticipated that the reopening of the bridge will help encourage more people to visit Thorpe Meadows under their own steam to

enjoy the outdoors and feel the related health and wellbeing benefits.

Greg Higby, Nene Park Trust Park Manager said: "The opening of the new footbridge will be pivotal in reconnecting access between Peterborough city centre and Thorpe Meadows.

"The bridge will play a fantastic role in giving our local communities and visitors an extra incentive to walk to Thorpe Meadows and explore the wider Nene Park. Many thanks to our funders for helping to make this happen."

Colin Ellis, Operations Manager for Tarmac's South East operations, said: "I am happy to hear that the Thorpe Meadows Bridge replacement can now go



ahead due to the donation received from the Tarmac Landfill Communities Fund towards this project.

"I look forward to seeing the new bridge in place when it has been built.' Cheryl Raynor, FCC

Communities Foundation Grant Manager said: "We are delighted to support the Trust with this important project. It is exciting to think that once completed, the community will once again be able to safely cross the

river and visit the Park and reserve.

The new bridge works will take place in September-October 2023 with the new bridge expected to be open for use by the end of October.



Your Health – Arthritic pains

We've had more arthritic problems in the clinic recently. I'm hoping that this means more people are starting to understand that you don't have to put up with arthritic pains.

As you already know, osteoarthritis is a form or wear and tear in your joints, but did you know that the amount of wear and tear seen on an x-ray does not necessarily match the pain you're in? It's true. This matters because the research behind this has taught us that with help you can often stop or reduce the pain.

Two of the things we hear people struggle with most are men not being able to shave because of wear and tear in the elbow, and both men and women having difficulty walking due to knee or hip problems.

When you have these sorts of problems and pain it's easy to get frightened and to revert to the popular expression that I hate: "It's my/ your/her age". Of course, there are times when it's appropriate to use these words, but only if you've tried working with a physical therapist to get yourself back on track. Don't give up at



the first sharp pain. Stay optimistic, stay active and find out what you can do to help yourself at home.

And you'll be amazed at how we can turn everyday movements into your rehab, so you don't have to spend hours doing exercises. Even mowing the lawn with that horrid machine can be rehab (if you can start the wretched thing, that is!).

I hope I don't have to tell you that you need to check with a rehab expert if your exercises are painful, but I hope this article encourages you to take those first steps towards reducing or stopping your pain.







Higham Ferrers has clinched two coveted awards and local volunteers behind the double win could not be more delighted.


At a special event at Chester House, representatives of Higham Ferrers Tourism as well as The Friends of St Mary's received awards from the Northamptonshire Heritage Forum.

The documentary was made possible thanks to £500 provided by the Nene Valley Festival as part of the National Lottery-funded Nenescape initiative.


