HIGHAM FERRERS HAS A NEW AND MUCH GREENER LOOK THIS COMING FESTIVE SEASON

"We have exchanged the previous artificial trees that grace the buildings in the town for real trees," explained Liz Barnatt, Chair of Higham Ferrers Tourism, which is responsible for the annual tree project.

Artificial trees have decorated the town for some 16 years, but now Higham Ferrers Tourism has opted for real trees in the interests of going green.

Committee members turned out at Chichele College recently to attach the fairy lights to the 79 trees that have now been positioned at various homes and businesses in the town.

Liz went on to say: "This year we had very generous sponsorship from Lee Lackford of CVL Systems Ltd, a local security company whose directors live in the town. This is the first time we have had sponsorship – but not only that, a team at CVL

Systems brought in two cherry pickers and arranged for their staff to put the trees up on the buildings.

"There were a lot of safety issues to consider, so we are very grateful for CVL's help."

The lights were switched on during the town's Christmas Sparkle event on Saturday 18th November, which also saw the return of Santa's Grotto at Chichele College.

The tourism committee's next event will be the Christmas Celebration Coffee Morning on Saturday 23rd December in the Bede House (adjacent to St Mary's Church) between 10am and 12 noon.



NEWS IN BRIEF

Those aged 65 and over urged to get their flu vaccination

Flu is a highly contagious infection that anyone can catch, with many experiencing unpleasant symptoms such as a high temperature, headache, and sore throat. However, for vulnerable people, which includes those aged 65 and over, flu can lead to serious complications such as pneumonia, and can even be fatal.

In Northamptonshire there is a slight increase in respiratory infections across all age groups, therefore residents who are eligible are being urged to get their free flu and COVID-19 vaccinations to stay protected this winter. Almost 38% of our population aged 65 and above have not yet received their flu vaccination, putting them at risk.

Cllr Helen Harrison, Executive Member for Adults, Health and Wellbeing at North Northamptonshire Council says: "I'm urging over 65s to please get your vaccinations, to help reduce the need for GP appointments and hospitalisations this Winter."

North Northamptonshire Council Community **Managed Libraries Programme completed**

A long-term project to transfer Libraries to become community managed in North Northamptonshire has now been completed.

Raunds Library is the final library to be transferred with the Creating Tomorrow Academy Trust and the **Raunds Community Library** Trust selected to run the library in partnership.

Cllr Helen Howell, North Northamptonshire Council's Deputy Leader and Executive Member for Sport, Leisure, Culture and Tourism, said: "It

has been quite a journey to get to where we are today but I am thankful that we have managed to complete the transition to Community Management while preserving what libraries have to offer.

"With the support offered by the Council, which includes the provision of books and e-lending items, computer and self-service access and

professional support and training for volunteers, our community managed libraries are able to continue to offer valuable services in their communities

"We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to all of the volunteers who have stepped up to work with us to find ways to keep their libraries open even throughout the

pandemic, and who continue to work tirelessly for their customers

"Together we have developed a sustainable model of library delivery that goes from strength to strength."

The transformation of the Library Service in Northamptonshire began in 2019 under the predecessor authority. Northamptonshire County Council. The programme sought to keep some libraries directly under the local authority management with the remainder managed by community groups.

Since the creation of North Northamptonshire Council in April 2021, the Council has been continuing the programme of transferring some libraries into community management, with the transfer of Irchester Library in October 2022 and Rothwell in May

Next step for adoption of East Northants Local Plan

The final, to be adopted, Local Plan Part 2 for North Northamptonshire aims to help with future developments.

If the East Northants Local Plan Part 2 is adopted, there will be a full, up-todate picture in terms of strategic and local planning policies for the whole of North Northants.

All councils are required to have a plan for development in their area, which is known as the Local Plan. The plans are expected to set out a range of development proposals, as well as planning policies and support the delivery of the vision for the area.

Local Plans have to be submitted for examination to the Secretary of State and the Local Plan for the East Northants area is the final one from the legacy councils to go through this process.

Following the receipt of the Inspector's report it has been identified "as sound" and with modifications agreed can now proceed to the adoption stage, which requires approval at Executive and Full Council.

If adopted, the East Northants Local Plan Part 2 will sit alongside the other Local Plans across North Northants, whilst acknowledging the distinctiveness of the local geographical area.

It also provides more guidance on the delivery of a garden village to the east of Rushden, support for the network of green infrastructure across the area, proposals to encourage tourism and cultural

developments as well as policies designed to assist town centre improvements and setting out specialist housing needs.

Cllr David Brackenbury, the council's Executive Member for Growth and Regeneration, said: "The East Northants Local Plan Part 2 is the final piece of the jigsaw for strategic planning across North Northants.

"As well as helping the Council make decisions when assessing future developments, Local Plans also take into consideration the needs of local communities, addressing housing, employment and infrastructure needs which have enormous benefits to residents

"Alongside this work, we are reviewing all our strategic policies through the North Northamptonshire Local Plan and will also be moving forward with a Gypsy and Traveller Local Plan, both of which will be consulted on next year."

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "Since North Northamptonshire

Council came into existence, teams have been working together to ensure policies and plans cover the whole area, whilst reflecting the geographical differences of the legacy areas

"Local Plans take time to be examined and adopted and the work on this one for East Northants predates this Council, but Lam

pleased we are now in a position to discuss adopting the East Northants plan which will mean we have a complete, up to date set of plans for the whole North Northamptonshire area."

As we went to press the Executive were due to discuss the report. If approved, the plan will be taken to Full Council.

Council Tax Support proposals in North Northamptonshire

to be discussed at Executive

Assistance available to people paying their Council Tax in the North Northamptonshire Council area is set to remain unchanged from previous years.

A report due before the authority's Executive will recommend that - under the Local Council Tax Support Scheme – help for the 2024-2025 financial year would stay at the same proportion as for 2023-2024.

This would mean all working age claimants would only have to pay a minimum of 25% towards their Council Tax liability.

Cllr Lloyd Bunday, the Council's Executive Member for Finance and Transformation, said: "Due to the cost of living crisis the Council is aware that residents may be struggling to pay their bills, therefore I'm delighted that we're able to maintain the scheme at the same rate as for the previous few years

"I would encourage Council Tax payers to apply for Council Tax Support, more information can be found on how to apply and the qualifying criteria on the Council's website.

In addition to the Council Tax Support scheme, the Council has a scheme in place where people can apply for a Council Tax Discretionary Discount, which is used to mitigate any unforeseen or exceptional

hardship circumstances that threaten taxpayers' ability to pay the Council Tax.

The Council's revenues and benefits social inclusion team is on hand to help customers apply for Council Tax support, Council Tax discretionary discounts and also other areas such as discretionary housing payment applications, personal independence payment applications, utilities and general money and debt advice.

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "I'm pleased to see this recommendation going before Executive for approval prior to going to Council as it demonstrates our continuing support for our

"It's important that people pay their Council Tax as it delivers a much-needed income stream to support our vital services - but it's also essential we provide the right level of assistance to payment, which we're doing here."

Draft budget proposals for the financial year 2024-2025 are due to appear before the Executive next month.

Cash boost for North

Northamptonshire swimming pool

A North Northamptonshire Council swimming pool is set to benefit from a cash boost after a successful bid for Government funding.

The Splash Leisure Pool in Rushden, which is run by Freedom Leisure, will be awarded £114.206 from the **Swimming Pool Support Fund** (SPSF), which is administered by Sport England.

An increase in energy costs meant that without the money the pool would have had to greatly reduce its offer.

Cllr Helen Howell, the Council's Deputy Leader and Executive Member for Sport, Leisure, Culture and Tourism, said: "We're delighted to have received this funding to help with the running costs of one of our pools - higher energy costs meant that without the money the facility would have really struggled.

"Not only is swimming a great way of keeping fit but it's also a lovely way of meeting up with friends, keeping people socially active too.

The Swimming Pool Support Fund provides a total of £60



million to local authorities in England as a support package for public leisure facilities with swimming pools and is split into two phases

A revenue fund of £20m is available to support facilities with swimming pools with increased cost pressures, leaving them most vulnerable to closure or significant service reduction

Meanwhile a capital stream of £40m is available from the government for capital investment to improve the energy efficiency of public facilities with pools in the medium to long term.

The contractual arrangements for the Splash Leisure Pool meant that it was eligible to make an application to the revenue fund.



£545,000 grant funding on offer to

organisations offering cost-of-living support

North Northamptonshire Council is offering nine grants to local councils and voluntary organisations currently supporting with the cost of living.

The grants, which are an allocation of the Government's Household Support Fund, funded by the Department for Work and Pensions, can be applied for by organisations, or groups of organisations.

Applications will need to demonstrate that the funding will be used to support low-income and vulnerable households across both town and rural communities in North Northamptonshire.

Town and Parish Councils, charities, community and voluntary groups, clubs and non-profit organisations are invited to apply. They are also encouraged to come together to bid.

Councillor Helen Harrison, Executive Member for Adults, Health and Wellbeing, said: "If you are an organisation working to help others during the cost-of-living crisis then we are urging you to come forward and apply.

"We are encouraging collaborative working of provider organisations in making applications to help us make best use of the money, and to ensure North Northamptonshire benefit as much as possible."

Cllr Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "We are extremely proud of the continuing work of our local councils and the voluntary sector in North Northamptonshire. These groups are invaluable in making sure that people who require it, receive timely financial and compassionate support.

"These grants prioritise those people who are being impacted the most by the costof-living crisis and our local councils and voluntary sector organisations have a deep understanding of where that help is needed

Successful applications will be awarded grant funding on receipt of a signed agreement and must be spent by 31st December 2024.

The Panel will be responsible for the assessing and recommendations which will be put forward to the Oversight Board. The Oversight Board will then make the final awarding decision. A decision will be provided within two months of
