

THE 'INVISIBLE DOGS OF SPAIN'

Two-hundred people and 100 Spanish rescue dogs will march from the Embassy of Spain to Trafalgar Square in London on 3rd February, demanding an end to hunting with dogs in Spain, where up to a massive 100,000 hunting dogs are cruelly killed or abandoned at the end of the season every year.

Joining the march will be Vanessa Munnings of Oundle, with eight-monthold podenco Pablo, who was found alone and left to starve to death as a puppy, in a dustbin in the Almeria region of Spain.

The podenco and galgo breeds of Spain are not recognised as pets by the country's animal welfare laws as they are merely regarded as 'hunting tools', which has earned these dogs the moniker of 'the invisible dogs of Spain'.

Residents reminded of the need for photo ID when voting

Residents wishing to vote in the upcoming parliamentary constituency by-election in Wellingborough on 15th February are reminded to ensure they bring photo ID.

Following new legislation introduced in May 2023, all residents voting in person must remember to bring a form of photo ID with them.

Accepted forms of ID include:

- A UK passport
- A passport issued by an EEA state or Commonwealth country
- Photo driving licence (including a provisional one)
- Certain concessionary travel passes
- An identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards

Scheme hologram (PASS card)

Expired IDs are acceptable, as long as the photo still bears a true resemblance. Only original documents are accepted, photos of your ID, copies of digital versions or digital versions saved on phones and smart devices will not be accepted.

Details of all forms of approved photo ID are available on the Elections pages of the NNC website.

If you don't have any form of photo ID from the accepted list, or your ID no longer looks

like you, you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. Applicants must already be registered to vote. The deadline for applications for a Voter Authority Certificate for the upcoming by-election is 5pm on 7th February 2024.

You can apply online for a Voter Authority Certificate via the Government website.

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

One branch of my family came from Sussex, deep in the countryside of a county that I did not know very well. Off I went and bought OS (Ordnance Survey) maps of the area as well as town plans so that I could get a better idea of where they lived. Please note: this was in the days before maps and street views were available online!

Whilst this was a good idea in itself, places do have a tendency to change over the years – towns expand and hamlets can all but disappear. If you have a look at a map of Oundle even as late as 1926, for instance, you will find a windmill at the back of Glapthorn Road. It is long gone and houses now stand in Millfields, the name being a legacy of what was once there.

I grew up in St Albans in Hertfordshire and was always fascinated as to why there



was a Ladysmith Road and a Kimberlev Road - where had these names come from? The answer was the Boer War, where sieges and battles had taken place at Ladysmith and Kimberley. These gave me the clue that I would be unlikely to find any houses there prior to 1899 and so would not find the streets in the 1891 census. However, in those censuses there was no Normandy Road off which they ran, although the Workhouse – now St Albans City Hospital – was very much in evidence. Then the penny dropped: Normandy Road used to be

called Union Lane, named after the Parish Union that was responsible for the Workhouse. The road was renamed after the Second World War to remember the Normandy landings.

Roads are also named after people. There is a house called 'Wuddy's Cottage' between Ashdon and Steventon End in Essex, named after Wuddy Smith. one of my ancestors. I didn't realise that it was there until I discovered it on a visit to the area. I was rather chuffed to find that.



Lakeside Healthcare at Oundle is introducing Anima, soon to replace Doctrin, and patients are encouraged to create a new account.

Here are the key dates to remember:

- Doctrin closed on Tuesday 30th lanuary 2024
- Anima will open on Tuesday 6th February 2024 During the move, from

the closure of Doctrin until Anima opens, patients who use Doctrin can contact the practice by calling or visiting in person. The practice will be working thoroughly to complete all patient requests made through Doctrin. Patients with an open request in Doctrin need not take any action, the practice will contact them directly.

Dr Sabine Lijesen, Non-Executive Director at Lakeside Healthcare at Oundle, said: "A large number of our patients have taken the step to create an Anima account. They are ready to use it once it opens. This means they can contact



Patients can easily track the

progress of their online form and receive updates by text message or email. Anima is also user-friendly, especially for patients with hearing difficulties or those whose first language is not English.

While the patient experience may feel a bit different, the overall process with Anima is mostly unchanged compared to Doctrin. Patients will access Anima by clicking on the option on the website, which will replace the Doctrin button.

To use the online form. patients will follow some simple on-screen instructions, answering multiple-choice questions similar to those a doctor might ask during an appointment. The more information a patient can provide, the better the practice can assess symptoms and offer appropriate



advice, treatment, or further assessment. If a patient needs to be seen by a clinician or other healthcare professional, then an appointment will be arranged.

Patients who use Doctrin must create a new account with Anima for continued online access to the practice. If patients already have an NHS login, they can use the same

details. Otherwise, they can create an account with their email address. All patients are encouraged to create an Anima account before it

Choir members save life of colleague

During a rehearsal of Northampton Male Voice Choir (NMVC) in late November, Associate Musical Director and chorister Paul Darnell collapsed following a sudden heart arrest.

Fortunately, due to the immediate response of members of the choir in providing first aid resuscitative care - including the necessary deployment of a defibrillator – Paul had already regained consciousness when the ambulance arrived to rush him to Kettering General Hospital.

The following Monday, Paul had an ICD pacemaker implanted in his chest and he was discharged the next day. Recovering at home, Paul said: "I'm now back home with a bucketload of pills and a supersonic IDC embedded in my chest and I'm hoping to make a gradual return to singing. My wife, Marion and I would like to reiterate how

very grateful we are to my friends at NMVC for saving my life and for all the support offered after my 'event'."

NMVC Chairman, Mark York, said: "We were all extremely shocked to see Paul's sudden collapse during our rehearsal and I can't speak highly enough of our First Aid Team on the day for its life-saving actions. We're all so very glad that Paul's now making a good recovery and we're looking forward to having him back with us. Without the use of our defibrillator the outcome might not have been so positive. I'd like to thank Paul and Marion for their generous donation of a replacement defibrillator and I strongly recommend all other choirs and similar organisation to invest in one of these lifesaving devices.




