**£5,000 grants
now available**

North Northamptonshire Council has opened the latest round of community funding grants for 2024/25 – with grants of up to £5,000 available.

In total £120,000 of grant funding is available for voluntary and community groups to apply for, to help improve the quality of life for local residents and increase community involvement.

The scheme is open to community and voluntary sector organisations, registered charities, town and parish councils and not for profit organisations including clubs, School PTAs and 'Friends of' groups.

To be considered for a grant of up to £5,000, projects need to demonstrate how they support one or more six key commitments outlined in the Council's Corporate Plan. These include helping people live healthier, more active, independent and fulfilled lives, ensuring communities are connected to one another and providing sustainable, modern public services.

The application form along with full details of the criteria and guidelines is available on the Council's website. The closing date for applications is 2nd December 2024.

High Sheriff raises more than £4,000 to support local community foundation

Since May 2024 Amy Crawford JP, High Sheriff of Northamptonshire, has raised £4,151.70 to support local grant making charity Northamptonshire Community Foundation in its work to improve the lives of the county's most vulnerable residents.

In May, Amy undertook five 10km treks across Northamptonshire alongside Northamptonshire Community Foundation Chief Executive Rachel McGrath

and raised £2,750 for the High Sheriff's Initiative Fund. The fund is managed by the foundation and awards grants to local charities and community organisations

working to reduce levels of crime and anti-social behaviour across the county.

In October, the High Sheriff hosted the Northamptonshire Courts Service at All Saints Church, Northampton, at which donations made by attendees raised £1,401.70 for the same fund, bringing the total raised this year to £4,151.70.

Rachel McGrath, Chief Executive of Northamptonshire Community Foundation, said: "We are incredibly thankful to the High Sheriff. The funds that Amy has raised will make a huge impact. Every penny will be distributed through the Northamptonshire High



Sheriff's Initiative Fund, as grant awards to local groups carrying out vital work to prevent crime and anti-social behaviour in our community.

"Generous fundraisers and supporters like our High Sheriff enable us to continue our charitable work and target our county's most urgent needs. We're very grateful."

In previous years, grants awarded from the Northamptonshire High

Sheriff's Initiative Fund have funded projects including training volunteers to offer practical and emotional support to vulnerable families in their own homes; wellbeing courses aimed at diverting young people away from crime, and supporting those already in the criminal justice system, and music workshops and training for young people from disadvantaged backgrounds.

North Northamptonshire Council awarded £210,000 grant to help identify future of the Chester House Estate

North Northamptonshire Council has been awarded a grant of over £200,000 from The National Lottery Heritage Fund to commission a piece of work which will help shape the future governance and long-term options for the Chester House Estate.

The grant, which was made possible thanks to National Lottery players, follows on from internal scoping work completed in 2023 which looked at how best to run the council's cultural, tourism and heritage assets.

The work identified that the Chester House Estate is now in a financial position to move forwards into a new governance model, and all options will be explored. Other cultural,

tourism and heritage assets under North Northamptonshire Council's control are not currently in a place to be considered.

The council owns several other excellent assets, such as Stanwick Lakes, which are leased to charitable trusts to operate, with the council providing funding and officer support as appropriate under relevant contractual or legal agreements.

The grant received will cover two parts:

- Trust scoping – the council needs to explore how a trust would work including finances, ownership of asset, future council liabilities, what the trust model would look like and how to make the next steps a reality. Once this phase has been completed, a full proposal with options will be taken to North Northamptonshire Council's Executive and Full Council for consideration.
- If the proposals are approved and a decision is taken to proceed with moving the Chester House Estate into new governance, funds will be used to implement the charitable trust and new governance.

At present, no decision has been made on how the Chester House Estate should operate in the longer term. But council officers will start work on scoping out options in the coming weeks.

Cllr Helen Howell, North Northamptonshire Council's Deputy Leader and Executive Member for Sport, Leisure, Culture and Tourism, said: "Since opening three years ago, the Chester House Estate has gone from strength to strength, developing the offering on site and growing the number of events throughout the year, whilst providing a home for small, growing businesses, opportunities for students and visitors along with access

to acres of parkland to enjoy and a beautiful farmhouse cafe. The Estate is designated as an ancient scheduled monument with Grade II* protected buildings, and 10,000 years of history for visitors to access.

"We are very grateful to National Lottery players and The National Lottery Heritage Fund for supporting this piece of work. This work is about securing, protecting and future-proofing such an excellent asset for the whole of North Northamptonshire. The site attracts visitors from across North Northamptonshire and further afield – the Chester House Estate has become the area's go-to destination for family-friendly events and we hope this continues to be the case as the site moves forward."

Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "We are now in a position where we should look to the future of the Chester House Estate and the governance options for the site to ensure it continues to thrive for many years to come. The grant we have received from National Lottery Heritage Fund will help us look at the options, scope out the site's future and make a measured decision."

More details on the progress and next steps will be published through the council's channels.

Tread carefully. There might be family secrets that have remained hidden for more years than you can imagine.

When researching my tree, I discovered that one set of my great great grandparents on my Dad's side married 6 months after my great grandmother was born. Her daughter (my Dad's mother) was always a bit of a snob – everything had to be "just so" and she looked down her nose at anyone who might not be "upright and honest". When I told Dad what I had found, he roared with laughter and said, "I bet your Grandma is spinning in her grave that you have discovered that!" Oh yes, her father (my great grandfather) also spent 2 weeks in Saffron Walden gaol for "threatening Farmer Hagger with a hayfork." Not such a squeaky clean background after all!

But don't be at all surprised if you do uncover secrets. My Gran (Mum's Mum) never celebrated her wedding anniversaries. She never even mentioned that "today would have been my nth anniversary if Jim was still alive." After Gran died, I discovered why. She was 7 months pregnant with my uncle when she married her first husband and 3 months with my Mum when she wed my Grandad. Today, such happenings are almost

part of daily life but back then...

Treat family information about birth and marriage dates with caution unless you have concrete evidence such as certificates.

Grandma always said that she was the youngest of eight children. The 1911 census shows how many children the woman had in that marriage and, when that census was released, I then discovered that there were three other children! More to research! However, Grandma could be forgiven for getting the numbers wrong as two had died before she was born and the other died when Grandma was under two years old. She had obviously never been told – and she was not the youngest after all!

NORTH NORTHAMPTONSHIRE ESTATE SHORTLISTED FOR MULTIPLE AWARDS

The Chester House Estate – a heritage site based in Irchester – has been shortlisted for three awards, celebrating their unique heritage programmes and progress since their opening in 2021.

The Estate has been shortlisted for a national Archaeological Achievement Award by the Council for British Archaeology for the Irchester Field School, a collaborative community research and learning project in partnership with the University of Leicester.

The Irchester Field School is core to a wide-ranging partnership between the University of Leicester (UoL) and North Northamptonshire Council. In summer 2024, more than 10,000 people attended collaborative programmes and events focused on the archaeology of the small Roman town of Irchester and the Nene Valley. The Northamptonshire Archaeological Resource Centre, which houses more than 20,000 boxes of archaeological finds from Northamptonshire, is located at the Chester House Estate. This combination of a nationally significant heritage site, an incredible blend of knowledge and expertise, and hands-on research and learning

opportunities for all ages, make this collaboration unique.

The Estate have also been shortlisted for two awards at the Northamptonshire Chamber of Commerce Business Awards, 'Small Business of the Year' and 'Business Person of the Year' for Head of Culture, Tourism and Heritage at North Northamptonshire Council, Jack Pishhorn.

Cllr Helen Howell, Deputy Leader and Executive Member for Sport, Leisure, Culture and Tourism said: "As the site celebrates its 3rd birthday, this award nomination really is the icing on the cake and is testament to the dedicated staff and volunteers who work daily to ensure the Estate's success.

"The programme has seen 10,000 people engaging with the Estate's unique history since 2021, through research alongside professional archaeologists, volunteering with conservation and finds washing, school trip visits and international students engaging in studies."

Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "The Chester House Estate has always been about locality - local visitors, history and businesses and now a finalist for local awards to recognise the success of the Estate, alongside national recognition for the Irchester Field School.

"We are extremely proud of the Estate and all that it has achieved over the past three years, I have my fingers crossed and hope that the team come away with the top prize – it really would be testament to the staff, volunteers and partners."

Sarah Scott, Professor of Archaeology, University of Leicester, said: "The Chester House Estate has become a very special place for our students and staff.

"It is fantastic to investigate and celebrate everyday life in Roman Irchester with colleagues from the Estate and the Archaeological Resource Centre, including volunteers with amazing local knowledge, expertise and a passion for making archaeology accessible to all."

consultation launched on Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy

North Northamptonshire Council has launched a review into a Hackney Carriage and Private Licensing Policy to ensure it reflects the transition to an area wide hackney carriage zone from 1st April 2025.

The revised policy, currently out for consultation, also takes into consideration updates to Department for Transport guidance, impacting legislation and operational learning including feedback from the Trade.

From 1st April 2025, the current four hackney carriage zones will be replaced by a single North Northants' wide zone and this consultation is one part of the process, alongside a separate review of the current geographical knowledge test for hackney carriage drivers and joint hackney carriage and private hire drivers and the adoption of new Hackney Carriage Byelaws which will also take place before the new zone is introduced.

Cllr David Brackenbury, the council's Executive Member for Growth and Regeneration (which covers taxi licensing), said: "Now we have agreed that there will be one taxi zone for the

whole of North Northants from 1st April 2025, it is important that we look at the related policy and how it should be updated to reflect the changes made, both at a local and national level.

"We want the updated policy to enable the best service and we welcome comments from the Trade and all stakeholders and residents, so please do get involved."

Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "Since the decision was taken to move to one zone, officers have been looking at all impacted areas to ensure everything is ready for April 2025 and this consultation will be supported by a wider piece of consultation work about the knowledge test that many drivers undertake."

Have your say on blueprint for protecting biodiversity in North Northamptonshire

People are being asked to have their say on a blueprint for how biodiversity can be restored and enhanced across the local area.



The draft North Northamptonshire Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS) has a focus on protecting and restoring key habitats and priority native species.

The draft strategy links green spaces to improve wildlife movement and strengthen the area's resilience to climate change.

The delivery of the LNRS will rely on collaboration between local authorities, environmental organisations, landowners and the community. The draft strategy provides a framework for guiding conservation efforts to create a thriving, sustainable landscape which would benefit everyone.

Cllr Harriet Pentland, North Northamptonshire Council's Executive Member for Climate and the Green Environment, said: "The Council has long recognised that the success of our natural environment is intrinsically linked to the wellbeing of our communities.

"Protecting and enhancing biodiversity is not just an environmental imperative but a social and economic one as well. In alignment with this vision, we have committed significant resources and

effort to ensuring that our Local Nature Recovery Strategy is robust, evidence-based, and responds to local needs."

This strategy is part of a broader national effort driven by the UK Government's 25 Year Environment Plan and the Environment Act 2021, which mandates the creation of LNRSs across the country.

Under the local LNRS, North Northamptonshire is divided into three landscape areas, which are based on Natural England's defined 'National Character Areas' but have then been informed by local understanding and geography.

Rockingham Forest – A historic area of ancient woodland, rolling farmland, and villages. Once a royal hunting ground, it is rich in wildlife and biodiversity. Here the focus is on restoring ancient woodlands and supporting species like the Red-shanked carder bee and hazel dormouse.

Nene Valley – Following the River Nene, this area has wide floodplains, wetlands, and historic towns. It is known for its scenic views and diverse birdlife. Here the strategy prioritises protecting

internationally important wetlands and managing recreational pressures on bird populations.

Ise Valley – A rural valley shaped by the River Ise, with gentle hills, farmland, and a network of settlements. It is a key wildlife corridor with scenic walking routes. Here, efforts are to conserve wetlands and implement species-specific practical actions for water vole and birds such as the curlew.

Jason Smithers, Leader of the Council, said: "The goal of this strategy is to create a thriving, sustainable landscape where nature flourishes, ecosystems are resilient and local communities benefit from a healthier environment.

"We have some wonderful natural areas here in North Northamptonshire each with their distinct character and it's essential that every effort is made to conserve and enhance them.

"I would encourage as many people as possible to have their say on the strategy to make sure that we've got everything right and we have stable foundations to move forward on a very important piece of work."
