Conservation charity

Raunds cemetery buzzing with new habitats for nature

The 2nd Raunds Beaver Colony has brought a burst of biodiversity to Raunds Cemetery, creating bird boxes, bat boxes, and bug hotels to provide a haven for local wildlife.

The young Beavers, aged
6-8, crafted a variety of
nature homes using materials
supplied by Raunds Town
Council, learning practical
skills while fostering a deeper
understanding of conservation.

The newly created habitats will
provide shelter and breeding

grounds for various birds, bats,
and insects, enriching the
cemetery's ecosystem.

"The 2nd Raunds Beaver
Colony have spent a number of
weeks constructing dwellings
for all creatures great and small,"
said Scouts Leader, Karl Burnage.
"Busy Beavers built beautiful bug,
bird and bat houses with material
supplied by Raunds Town
Council."

The project not only
showcases the spirit of
environmental stewardship
among young people in
Raunds, but also strengthens
Raunds Town Council's
bid for accreditation in the
Northamptonshire Churchyard
Conservation Scheme.

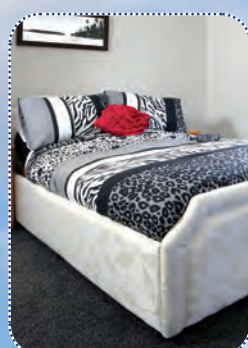
"Raunds Town Council is

HISTORIC NORTHAMPTONSHIRE VILLAGE LAUNCHES BLUE PLAQUE ROUTE

The vibrant and charming village of Nassington will unveil its Blue Plaque Route on 27th April at 12noon. The launch will take place outside early 17th-century Nassington House, on Church Street opposite the village green.

The Blue Plaque Route features 45 properties displaying some key points of interest for those following the route map, along with QR codes (linked to www.nassingtonhistory.com) which reveal further details of historical significance. An accompanying illustrated brochure is also available to buy locally.

Chair of the Nassington Parish Council, Sam Attenborough, will launch the Blue Plaque Route. Sam will be accompanied by Henry VIII and his six wives. Whilst King Canute once had a connection to the Prebendal Manor, also situated in the village, he was sadly unable to accept his invitation to attend.

The history of Nassington is carefully curated in an archive managed on behalf of the Parish Council by local historian and lifelong resident Karen Palenski. Karen has spent hundreds of hours sifting, sorting and recording papers, records, maps and images of

the numerous historic properties in the village. She has also interviewed residents and visitors about their experiences and recollections and delivered a host of illustrated talks about the social history of the area. With significant connections to Mary Queen of Scots and Richard III, the village has a wealth of history to explore and share.

Reflecting on the project, Karen says: "Nassington is a fascinating place. It boasts the oldest house in Northamptonshire (Prebendal Manor) and at one time comprised seven pubs, a dairy, two laundries, two bakeries, a tray maker, a tailor's shop, a draper, a wheelwright and a carpenter, among other businesses. The Blue Plaque Route is about creating awareness of the social and economic history of the village while also enabling ease of access to its engaging story."

Sam Attenborough adds: "The Parish Council is very pleased to support this project. Nassington has a rich history with regard to its buildings, as well as the human stories. Many of these involve generations of the same families, some of whom still live in the village today."

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

Last time, I mentioned certificate copies for events in England and Wales. In those early days, the Registrars also had to make house calls to record the information about those who had died. Where there was an outbreak of cholera, for example, I rather think that he would have been reluctant to visit such an area. Therefore, death registrations may also have been missed.

But remember: the information on a death certificate is only as good as the knowledge of the person registering the death. Therefore, ages may be slightly out from evidence gathered from elsewhere. Think back to how I mentioned last time that it was always a good idea to check a couple of years either side of a possible birth year.

It can also come as a bit of a shock to discover how an ancestor died. Do you remember that I mentioned a few weeks ago that I had discovered that an ancestor of a friend of a friend had died in a ditch following an epileptic fit? It explained why he

died at a relatively young age – 55.

One of my great, great grandfathers died at the age of 42 in 1867, his death certificate showed that he had "cut his own throat whilst not of sound mind"! It took me a further seven years to discover the circumstances by uncovering a newspaper report of the inquest, so never give up!

Also, remember that events were recorded in the area in which they took place. It is always good to check the registration districts surrounding the one where your ancestor lived but don't be surprised if the event happened further away. Accidents happen – my great uncle died in Kent whilst he was on a motorbike trip, so his death was registered in Maidstone. However, his home was in Hertfordshire in the St Albans registration district.

Wind farm funding powering local communities

More than £250,000 has been awarded to community groups, charities and volunteer-led organisations across rural Northamptonshire since 1st April 2024, from wind farm funds managed by Northamptonshire Community Foundation.

The funds support communities close to wind farms in various rural areas, including Clay Coton, Crick, Lilbourne, Yelvertoft, Winwick, Cold Ashby, West Haddon, Guilsborough, Burton Latimer, Cranford, Rushton and Pipewell.

Recently awarded grants from the Winwick Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund have enabled the provision of a new Automatic External Defibrillator for Winwick village and replacement floodlights to benefit West Haddon Junior Football Club. From the Burton Wold Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund, recent grant awards have supported the creation of a community garden at Burton Latimer Library and the running of 12 free women's self-defence and keep fit workshops.

Northamptonshire Community Foundation has been managing wind farm funds for 12 years. The charity's Chief Executive, Rachel McGrath, said: "Small, rural towns and villages are so often

overlooked when it comes to funding, and we are committed to changing that.

"From our longstanding wind farm funds to our more recently established Rural Community Needs Fund, the funding distributed by Northamptonshire Community Foundation reaches all four corners of the county and supports our most vulnerable communities. In fact, 3 in 20 Northamptonshire residents were impacted by our grant making during the 2023/24 financial year."

The foundation is also focused on tackling climate change in Northamptonshire and has recently re-opened the Creative Climate Action Fund and launched the Small Green Arts Fund.

Both funds aim to raise awareness of the climate crisis. In 2025, the Creative Climate Action Fund will support up to three local groups with grant awards of up to £50,000 for creative projects that build awareness around climate change and encourage people to make behavioural changes to protect the environment.

From the Small Green Arts Fund, grants of up to £3,000 will be awarded to arts, culture and craft projects across the county, which are responding to and raising awareness of the climate crisis.

Northamptonshire Community Foundation is the county's largest independent grant maker. During the 2023/24 financial year, the foundation awarded more than £2.9 million in grants to grassroots charities and community organisations across the county. Read more here: <https://www.ncf.uk.com/impact>

NATIONAL TRUST EMPLOYEE JOINS THE RACE FOR NATURE, RUNNING THE LONDON MARATHON TO RAISE MONEY FOR LYVEDEN

Bradley Danahar, Property Operations Manager at Lyveden, a National Trust property in Northamptonshire, will be taking on the London Marathon this month to raise money for the National Trust. All funds raised will go towards vital conservation work and creating exciting visitor experiences at Lyveden.

After seeing first hand the importance of their work protecting natural and historical places, Bradley was inspired to help raise funds for his charity. Since accepting the marathon challenge, Bradley has spent the best part of this year training, getting his friends and colleagues involved in the process.

Bradley said: "I set myself a goal of running at as many National Trust properties as possible and running with as many staff members as I could. I knew this would help motivate me by seeing the amazing work done by the National Trust and our people. I have since run at seven National Trust places and with loads of staff!

"The best part of my training, which I didn't expect, has to be the social element. I have been

posting regularly on my social media platforms and began calling my journey 'Running with Bradley'. What started as a bit of a joke has turned into a small running club.

"I have run with so many different people over the past four months. Running has opened the door to meeting new people and brought me closer to friends and colleagues, while giving me the opportunity to have meaningful conversations and ask others how they are, as well as

opening up myself. I would never have thought of this benefit when I first said yes to doing the marathon."

Having beat his original fundraising target of £1,000, Bradley is now hoping to raise £2,000. All the funds raised will go towards supporting the conservation efforts at Lyveden as well as creating accessible and engaging experiences for visitors. Places allocated for children starting in Primary and Infant schools in North Northamptonshire in September 2025

A total of 3,789 reception places have been allocated to children across North Northamptonshire.

A total of 92.7% of applicants (3,514 children) have been allocated a place at their first preference school in 2025 (93% for 2024).

4.9% of applicants have been allocated a place at their second preference school in 2025 (4.5% in 2024) while 0.7% have been allocated a place at their third preference school in 2025 (0.6% in 2024).

98.3% of applicants have been allocated a place at one of their preferred schools in 2025 (98.1% in 2024), while 98% of applications were made online in 2025 (98.5% in 2024).

Parents/carers who applied online before the closing date for their places in Reception are able to check their offer on the council's website.

Junior school places (Year 3)

There were 972 applications, with 100% of pupils being allocated a place at their first preference in 2025 (99.8% for 2024).

Charisse Monero, Director of Children's Services, North Northamptonshire Council said:

"I would like to pass on my best wishes to every pupil starting a new school in September – supporting all children in their education is a priority for the council.

"Starting school is a huge step to take and I wish all the new students well as they embark on their learning journey."

Where children have not been successful in getting a place at a preference school, parents have the right to appeal (through the independent appeals process).

The next round of Primary School place allocations (for late applicants) will take place in May 2025.
