NEWS IN BRIEF

North Northants
commemorates
80th anniversary
of VE Day

8th May marked the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day and as part of the commemorations, lights were lit and displayed across the local area.

Council offices across North Northamptonshire took part in the Lamp Light of Peace tribute with lamps being displayed in the Corby, Thrapston, Kettering, Rushden and Wellingborough offices.

Lamp Lights of Peace and beacons were lit at locations across the country to allow opportunities for individuals and communities to pay tribute to the service and sacrifice of the Second World War generation.

As well as the NNC lamp lightings, local town and parish councils led local community events in towns and villages across North Northamptonshire.

GARDENING GREATS GIVE ADVICE AND GET A PENNY FOR THEIR THOUGHTS

When young gardener Penny Moth was invited to meet a trio of famous experts, she did not expect to get another surprise invitation.

Eight-year-old Penny, who has her own 125 square metre allotment – it was a gift from Santa – has become something of a gardening star herself after winning the Best Junior Gardener award at Higham Ferrers Tourism’s horticultural show last September and then featuring in newspaper stories and on the BBC news channel.

Thus, when the trustees of The Friends of St Mary’s were organising the last of three events – Gardeners’ Question Time – to celebrate their recent Arts Weekend, they thought it was a good idea to invite Penny and her mum, Keeley, along to hear what the experts had to say.

Special front row seats had been prepared for Penny and her mum in the town’s Bede House, when the audience were introduced to the nationally renowned gardening guests: Bunny Guinness, a landscape architect,

Chelsea Flower Show Gold Medal winner and Radio 4 GQT panellist; Susie Pasley-Tyler of Coton Manor Garden and winner of the Nation’s Favourite Garden Award whose new book was on sale at the event; and Joe Whitehead, head gardener at Burghley House in Lincolnshire.

The audience’s questions came thick and fast, ranging from pruning and pollinators, to pests, pellets and potatoes (soil suitability... square holes or round holes... and black spot).

When Penny was introduced to the VIP gardeners, they told her it was very hard to get young people interested in gardening, but there were so many careers and opportunities available to them.

“Keep up your interest, you will find you can have the pick of jobs,” Joe Whitehead told her.

He advised her to learn all about plants and flowers and learn what



Penny also got the job of presenting the three gardening greats with gifts on behalf of The Friends of St Mary’s hosts.

ELECTION FOR THE HIGHAM FERRERS WARD OF NORTH NORTHAMPTONSHIRE COUNCIL TO BE REARRANGED DUE TO CANDIDATE DEATH

The election for the Higham Ferrers ward of North Northamptonshire Council, due to have taken place on 1st May 2025, will be rearranged following the sad death of candidate William John James Ratcliffe, also known as John Ratcliffe.

All other polls on 1st May 2025 across North Northamptonshire went ahead as planned, including the election for Higham Ferrers Town Council, Higham Ferrers Chichele Ward and parish council election for Chelveston-cum-Caldecott.

Adele Wylie, Returning Officer for North Northamptonshire Council said:

"We send our sincere condolences to John's family and our thoughts are with them at this sad time.

"By law, we must now postpone the election for Higham Ferrers ward on North Northamptonshire Council. The other candidates and electors have been made aware."

An election must take place by 23rd June 2025 and further details about a new date for the election will be announced in due course. New poll cards will be sent to all affected voters once the date is set. Any already returned postal votes for the North

Northamptonshire Council Higham Ferrers Ward will not be counted. Postal voters in this area will receive a new postal vote once the election has been rearranged.

The town council elections for the Higham Ferrers Chichele ward and the parish of Chelveston-cum-Caldecott went ahead as planned.

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

What about marriage records? One thing to remember is that, as I have mentioned before, the vicar would only go by what the couple told him – no evidence was needed. Therefore, you may find that ages, especially those of minors, might be massaged, as well as marital status.

Anyone under the age of 21 had to have parental or guardian permission to marry. Also, you may find the very unhelpful "of full age" comment in the age column. All this indicates is that the person was aged 21 or over. However, the names and occupations of the happy couples' respective fathers may help you to find the families a generation further back.

The names of witnesses can also be helpful as well – or amusing! One of the witnesses at my Gran's second marriage in 1929 was her former sister-in-law from the first marriage!

Please don't fret if you cannot find the General Register References. The GRO can undertake a search for you – it just takes longer. But if you can provide other information such as the

approximate age of the parties, or a father's name, that can help in the search.

If you obtain a copy of any certificates from the GRO, remember that they are just that – copies of the transcript that they hold. I have a certificate where the vicar's name is in the Bride's Father section, only to be crossed out. This was certainly a transcription error as, when I checked the original Parish Records, no mistake had been made there!

As I said above, the vicar would only go by what the couple told him – no evidence was needed. Therefore, you might well find that the groom is recorded as a bachelor, when in fact, he could still be married to his previous wife. Bigamy was known as the "Poor Man's Divorce". I have found example of this where the previous wife is still alive and kicking but might be recorded as a widow, perhaps to save face.

RHTS awarded grant for new floor

The Rushden Historical Transport Society is very pleased to announce that thanks to a grant from the Mick George Community Fund, a new floor has been laid in their large goods shed at their Rushden Station site.



When the railway fully closed in the 1960s, use of the goods shed ceased. It was subsequently used by Northamptonshire County Council, who laid a heavy duty floor for use as a vehicle and materials storage depot. The Society purchased the goods shed in 2018 and has made extensive improvements to bring the shed into being a key venue for society fundraising events and importantly for general hire by

individuals, groups and commercial companies.

The new 150mm thick screeded floor with damp-proof membrane has produced an excellent smooth surface with no water ingress, made its use much safer and has made disabled access easier. Although the original floor had been coated and levelled where practical, the ingress of water continually damaged the coated surface. The Mick George grant has removed all of the old floor's problems.

Several events have already been held in the shed and the new floor has been acknowledged as a great

improvement and much better for any activities.

The Goods Shed is available for hire at essentially any time and the Society can be contacted on venuehire@rhts.co.uk or give us a call on 0300 302 3150.

The Goods Shed is always open on Wednesdays and Saturdays, please call in and have a look.

The Society would like to express its sincere thanks to Mick George and Grantscape for awarding the grant, which is a significant fundraising factor in the development of the Society and also helping to maintain what is a community asset to Rushden.

YOUR HEALTH - HEADACHES

Headaches - whether it's the throbbing tension kind, or a full-blown migraine - can really ruin your day. But before you reach for yet another painkiller, have you considered... needles?

Wait, don't run away! We're talking about acupuncture - the ancient Chinese practice that's been around for over 2,000 years and is surprisingly good at easing headaches.

What the research says:

- A 2016 review published in Cochrane Library looked at 22 studies and found that acupuncture can reduce the frequency of migraines and tension-type headaches.

Some lucky participants even had their headache days cut

in half!

- The National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) recommends acupuncture for tension-type headaches and migraines.
- One theory is that acupuncture stimulates the nervous system, causing the release of natural pain-relieving chemicals like endorphins and serotonin. Why acupuncture might help you:

- Reduces stress - many headaches are tension-related, and acupuncture helps calm the nervous system.
- Improves circulation - better blood flow = less pain and

pressure.

- Relaxes muscles - especially around the neck and shoulders, where tightness can trigger head pain.
- Less reliance on medication - great if you're tired of popping pills or dealing with side effects. Bonus perk: Most people find acupuncture surprisingly relaxing. Some even fall asleep mid-session (yes, with needles in!). In fact, I'm having acupuncture treatment for shoulder pain at the moment and it's incredible how relaxing it is, yet how energised you feel afterwards.

So, next time your head starts to throb, give acupuncture a try.

"HENRY VIII" VISITS HISTORIC HIGHAM FERRERS ADDING A MEMORABLE TOUCH OF MAJESTY

A young Henry VIII has visited Higham Ferrers – and the imposing king, dressed in his historically accurate Tudor costume of fine clothes and jewels, received a right royal reception.

Although a hush fell over the packed audience when the handsome larger-than-life Henry VIII (aka David Smith) first entered the Hope Methodist Church, they were soon applauding him.

King Henry, played by a professional historical costumed re-enactor, was holding court where his young subjects – pupils from Higham Ferrers Junior School and Henry Chichele Primary School – entertained him with a range of typical Tudor dances.

Henry had been invited along by the Friends of St Mary's group of volunteers, who were celebrating the first of three events marking their annual Arts Weekend.

Earlier, Carol Fitzgerald, a Friends of St Mary's trustee, said that the children were studying the Tudor period at school and that Henry VIII always went down well with them because of his brutal beheading of two of his wives.

However, as the re-enactor explained later, the young Henry VIII who was visiting Higham Ferrers was aged about 30 and was still married to his first wife Catherine of Aragon, and there was hint of divorce.

Another VIP, Higham Ferrers deputy mayor, Gary Salmon, had also been invited to the event and after Carol and fellow Trustee, Brenda Lofthouse, recounted some of the historical facts about Tudor times to the audience, the children took to the floor.

They first danced Greensleeves, a medieval court dance, with the music said to have been composed by Henry VIII himself; then they showed off their Hornpipe skills, followed by the Galliard dance. The dances were choreographed by Kitty Denton with the Tudor-era music played by Rosemary Nayyar.

Both schools danced the Hornpipe together at the end of the Tudor festivities, with parents being invited to join in. Henry did not stand on ceremony and surprised the audience by

taking up the offer and showing off his own dance moves. Then, addressing the court in his booming voice, he told pupils that he was a dancer himself and that "it was joyous to see you perform...keep you well and good health," he said.

'Henry', who is based in Essex, carries out some 12 similar costumed engagements a year and as well as running historical workshops for schools, two notable dates in his diary this year are the Hampton Court Palace Festival in June (Hampton Court was the home of Henry VIII) and the 500th anniversary celebrations of Christ Church College, Oxford, in July.

After the dance performance, the Friends of St Mary's took Henry on a tour of the medieval town, which has connections with the famous Tudor king.

"The town lost a castle and most of Chichele College under Henry VIII's instruction. We had to show our Henry the college," Carol Fitzgerald explained.
