Nominate your
leading councillors

Your local councillors could be in line for a national award at the 2025 Local Government Information Unit (LGIU) and CCLA Cllr Awards – the only national ceremony that celebrates the outstanding contributions of councillors across England, Wales, and Scotland.

For the 16th year, the Cllr Awards will once again shine a light on the achievements of local elected representatives. Nominations can be made by anyone who wishes to acknowledge a councillor's exceptional commitment to improving their community and achieving remarkable results over the past year.

The 2025 Cllr Awards has five categories: Community Champion; Leader of the Year; Young Councillor of the Year; Innovator of the Year and Lifetime Legend. Nominations close on Wednesday 11th June.

Submitting a nomination is free. Applicants must provide details about the nominees, outlining how they have positively impacted the community.

Winners will be revealed at ceremonies taking place at Glasgow City Chambers and the Guildhall, London in November.

OFFICIAL OPENING CELEBRATION AT PRINCE WILLIAM SCHOOL FOLLOWING £10M INVESTMENT

In recent years, the school, which is part of East Midlands Academy Trust (EMAT), has also benefited from a brand new science


block and a refurbished school hall.

Political group leaders announced for North Northamptonshire Council

North Northamptonshire Council has received formal notification from its political groups of who will lead each group following the recent local elections held on 1st May.

The Leader of the Council will be approved at Annual Council on 22nd May. Details of the new leaders will form part of a wider report on the new political make-up of the council which will be considered and approved at Annual Council.

Following the election the new political structure will be: 39 Reform UK; 13 Conservative; 8 Green; 4 Labour; 1 Liberal Democrat; 1 Independent; 2 Vacant seats (Higham Ferrers Ward). The proposed leaders for the political groups are as follows:

Reform UK – Cllr Martin Griffiths; Conservative – Cllr Helen Harrison; Green – Cllr Emily Fedorowycz; Labour – Cllr Mark Pengelly; Communities Alliance – Cllr Jim Hakewill

The report will also include electing a new Council Chair and Vice-Chair, appointing a new Council Leader and confirming the new Executive Members. Council will also need to agree the membership of the various committees that councillors sit on, along with representatives for a number of boards and forums.

The election for the Higham Ferrers ward has been rearranged to 12th June due to the death of one of the candidates.

GENEALOGY JOTTINGS

I was previously referring to civil registration in England and Wales. However, in Scotland, it only started on 1st January 1855, so you will not be able to find such certificates prior to this date and will have to rely upon Parish Registers. However, the information held in them is extremely helpful! They are also downloadable from Scotland's People (www.scotlandspeople.gov.uk) at a cost of 6 credits bought in advance, which works out at £1.50. Excellent value for money!

Those early birth certificates in 1855 contained the following information:

- Date, place and time of birth
- Full name
- Sex
- The parents' names (including maiden surname of mother)
- Father's occupation
- Name of informant and relationship to child
- Information on siblings
- The ages and birthplaces of

both parents

- The parents' usual place of residence
- The date and place of the parents' marriage.

However, by the following year, the information on siblings was removed, as were ages and birthplaces of parents and date and place of parents' marriage. But by 1861, the date and place of the parents' marriage was being recorded again.

Scottish death certificates – such a wonderful resource! As mentioned before, English and Welsh certificates have the name of the person, their occupation, ages, the cause of death, where they died and who registered the death.

Well, Scottish death certificates have all of that – and more!

The columns are:

- Name and Surname; Rank or Profession and whether married, single or widowed. (If married, they also record the name of the spouse!)
- When and where died – plus

the time of death!

- Sex
- Age
- Name, Surname & Rank or Profession of Father; Name & Maiden Surname of Mother – how fantastic is that!
- Cause of Death
- Name of informant
- When and where registered.

This extra information is invaluable if you are uncertain which James Stewart is yours, for example, and will enable you to track the family further either in census returns, newspapers or other such resources.

However, a word of caution: remember – as with anyone registering an event, the information is only as good as the knowledge of the person registering it.

carers who support each other in this vitally important role. One of the foster carers said: "Fellow foster carers have become like extended family."

Colin Foster, Chief Executive of NCT said: "It is wonderful to see so many amazing relationships formed through fostering, with the child or young person and the whole team around them. This gives our children and young people a sense of community and belonging, teaching them how to form positive relationships.

"It's heart-warming to see the incredible bond that our foster carers have with children and young people, each other and our practitioners."

Nationally there is a shortage of 6,000 fostering households and in the East Midlands Region, we need 360 additional fostering households. In Northamptonshire, we have

over 1,100 children in care who need loving, secure, stable homes.

Olivia Ives, Assistant Director of Corporate Parenting said: "We need more foster carers in Northamptonshire and welcome people from all walks of life to come forward and find out about fostering. There is no such thing as an ideal foster carer, you can foster regardless of your age, identity, sexuality or religion.

"You could make a real difference to the lives of children and young people by becoming part of our fostering team where lasting relationships are made."

Rural North Northamptonshire voluntary and community sector organisations invited to bid for grant opportunity

Voluntary and community organisations across the rural areas of North Northamptonshire are being urged to come forward and apply for capital grants of up to £10,000.

Organisations including parish councils, charities, community and voluntary groups, clubs, not-for-profit organisations and school Parent Teacher Associations are all encouraged to check their eligibility and apply for the Shared Prosperity Fund (SPF) Rural Community Capital Funding online at North Northamptonshire Council's website.

'Friends of' groups, health charities and religious bodies can also apply if their projects benefit the wider community and support the SPF Rural Community Capital Funding aims.

Organisations will be eligible to apply if they can demonstrate that the funding will be used

to support the creation of or improvements to local rural green spaces, existing cultural, historic and heritage institutions or active travel enhancements e.g. community transport.

North Northamptonshire Council's SPF Rural Community Capital Funding has been allocated from the Rural England Prosperity Fund; a government grant which supports activities that address the challenges faced by rural areas.

The council has a total allocation of £80,000 from which to make capital grants.

George Candler, North Northamptonshire Council's Executive Director of Place

and Economy said: "The Rural England Prosperity Fund is designed to support local communities living in rural areas. It is great that North Northamptonshire Council can offer SPF Rural Community Capital Funding capital grants of up to £10,000 this year, as part of our ongoing commitment to support communities across rural North Northamptonshire."

"If you are a member of an organisation or community group that operates in one of the rural areas of North Northamptonshire, I encourage you to take a look at the information online and apply for a grant before the deadline."

Applications are open from Monday 19th May until 12 noon on Monday 23rd June 2025.

Reduction in children entering care in Northamptonshire

The has been a reduction in the number of children needing care in Northamptonshire following commitment by local leadership and the workforce to support children to remain living with their parents or within their family networks, whenever it is safe to do so.



Northamptonshire Children's Trust supports families to access the right support at the right time, focusing on prevention rather than late intervention, meaning families can access timely, tailored support to build resilience, promote well-being, and overcome challenges.

Ofsted has recently published its latest focussed visit inspection letter regarding the Children in Care service. It cited the reduction in the number of children coming into care and also noted the focus on continual improvement. Inspectors found a number of key improvements, including increased workforce stability, enhanced quality of assessments for children in care, and significant progress in reducing the number of children living in unregistered children's homes through a comprehensive sufficiency strategy.

Ofsted also noted the strong political and corporate support from the council's contributing to addressing sufficiency needs by providing more homes for children in the county, as well as investing in transformation such as 'Circle to Success', which has had impact on improving outcomes for children and young people.

In their report, inspectors said: 'When children do enter care, social workers are increasingly prioritising the importance of achieving permanence without delay.'

'Most children in care enjoy positive relationships with consistent social workers who know them well. Social workers speak about the children they support with pride and warmth.'

When children are unable to continue to live with their family, the Ofsted inspectors found that they are living in homes that meet their needs, where they have positive experiences and make progress in various aspects of their lives.

Julian Wooster, Chair of Northamptonshire Children's Trust said: "It is pleasing that Ofsted have seen the decrease of the number of children coming into care, something that has been a key focus for us. Wherever possible we want children and young people to remain with their family or family network when it is safe to do so."

"Every child deserves to have a sense of belonging and opportunity to thrive and it is heartening to see that Ofsted recognised the commitment we have to ensuring all children and young people have this."

"We know that there are still improvements to be made as outlined by Ofsted and we are committed to progressing these."

Cllr Kathryn Shaw, Cabinet Member for Children, Families and Education at West Northamptonshire Council, added: "Ofsted has acknowledged the strong and steady focus on making things better — especially the progress we've made in creating more stability across the workforce. We're committed to keeping that momentum going. The council will continue working side-by-side with Northamptonshire Children's Trust to keep raising the bar, so that every child gets the support, safety, and opportunities they truly deserve."

During the recent visit, Ofsted found that 'Social workers expressed unanimous positivity about working for NCT, feeling valued and well-supported by managers and leaders at every level of the organisation. Staff cited this level of support, comprehensive training and development opportunities, and manageable caseloads as key reasons for their continued commitment to NCT, with some agency workers even converting to permanent positions as a result.'




